At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 17th day of December, 1929.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Territories of Africa known as the Somaliland Protectorate are under the protection of His Majesty the King:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction in the Somaliland Protectorate:

And whereas by the Somaliland Order in Council, 1899, provision was made for the exercise of His Majesty's jurisdiction in the Somaliland Protectorate for the administration of justice, the raising of revenue, and generally for the peace, order and good government of all persons resident therein:

And whereas the said Order has been amended or added to by divers other Orders of His Majesty in Council:

And whereas it is expedient to consolidate the said Orders in Council and to make further and other provision for the administration of His Majesty's jurisdiction in the said Protectorate and generally for the peace, order and good government thereof:

Now therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers on this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

 This Order may be cited as the Somaliland Order in Council, 1929.

2. The Somaliland Order in Council, 1899, and the other Orders in Council specified in Schedule I hereto are hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order.

Provided as follows:-

(i) Any law practice or procedure established by or under the said revoked Orders shall remain in force until other provision is made under this Order.

(ii) Every appointment of a Judge or other officer and every Court established and existing at the commencement of this Order, shall, until other provision is made, continue to be as if this Order had not been passed.

(iii) All legal proceedings begun under the said revoked Orders and pending at the commencement of this Order, shall be continued as if this Order had not been passed.

(iv) All Rules of Court and other provisions made under the said revoked Orders shall be and remain in force until otherwise provided under this Order.

3. In this Order-

(i) "The Protectorate" means the territories for the time being comprised in His Majesty's Somaliland Protectorate;
(ii) "The Secretary of State" means one

(ii) "The Secretary of State" means one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of

State;

and Commander-in-Chief for the time being of the Protectorate and includes every person for the time being administering the Government thereof;

(iv) "British subject" means a subject of His Majesty by birth or naturalization and includes a British protected person, that is to say, a person (a) who being a native of any place beyond the Protectorate which is under the protection of His Majesty or in respect of which His Majesty has accepted a Mandate from the League of Nations, is temporarily within the limits of this Order, or (b) who by virtue of "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise enjoys His Majesty's protection in the Protectorate; (v) "Resident" means having a fixed

place of abode in the Protectorate;

(vi) "Native" means an indigenous in-

habitant of Africa or Arabia; (vii) "Foreigner" means a subject or citizen of a State in amity with His Majesty, not being a native as hereinbefore defined;
(viii) "Protectorate Court" means the

Court held by the Governor, or other Court exercising the principal civil and criminal jurisdiction in the Protectorate;
(ix) "The Court" means the Protectorate

Court and any Court subordinate thereto, as

- the case may be;
 (x) "Treaty" includes any Convention,
 Agreement, or Arrangement with any State or Government, King, Chief, people, or tribe, made by or on behalf of His Majesty, or to the benefits of which His Majesty has succeeded;
- (xi) "Ship" includes any vessel used in navigation, however propelled, with her tackle, furniture, and apparel, and any boat or other craft;

(xii) "Offence" means any act or omission made punishable by any law for the time being in force;

(xiii) "Imprisonment" means imprisonment of either description, as defined in the Indian Penal Code;

(xiv) "Month" means calendar month.
(xv) "Will" means will, codicil, or other

testamentary instrument;

(xvi) "Person" includes Corporation;

(xvii) "Crdinance" means any Ordinance made under this Order and includes any King's Regulation and any Ordinance made under any Order hereby repealed;

(xviii) "Crown Lands" means all public lands in the Protectorate which are subject to the control of His Majesty by virtue of any Treaty, Convention, or Agreement, or of His Majesty's Protectorate, and all lands which shall have been acquired by His Majesty for the public service or otherwise howsoever;

- (xix) Words importing the plural or the singular may be construed as referring to one person or thing, or to more than one person or thing, and words importing the masculine as referring to females (as the case may require).
- 4.—(i) Where this Order confers a power or imposes a duty, the power may be exercised and the duty shall be performed from time to time as occasion requires.
- (ii) Where this Order confers a power or imposes a duty on the holder of an office, then, unless a contrary intention appears, the power

(iii) "Governor" means the Governor | may be exercised and the duty shall be performed by the holder of the office for the time being, or by a person duly appointed to act for him.

> (iii) Where this Order confers a power to make Rules, Regulations, or Orders, the power shall be construed as including a power, exercisable in the like manner and subject to the like approval and conditions (if any) to rescind, revoke, amend, or vary the Rules, Regulations, or Orders.

(iv) Expressions defined in this Order shall have the same respective meanings in any Rules, Regulations, or Orders made under this Order unless other provision is made or the

context otherwise requires.

5. The powers conferred by this Order shall extend to the persons and matters following in so far as by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means His Majesty has jurisdiction in relation to such persons and matters, that is to say: (a) British subjects; (b) foreigners; (c) the property and all personal or proprietary rights and liabilities in the Protectorate of British subjects and foreigners, including ships with their boats, and the persons and property on board thereof, or belonging thereto; and (d) natives, in the cases and according to the conditions specified in this Order, and not otherwise.

Provided that jurisdiction over any foreign ships under this Article shall not be exercised otherwise than according to the practice of the High Court in England in the exercise of

jurisdiction over foreign ships.

6. All His Majesty's jurisdiction exercisable in the Protectorate, for the hearing and determination of suits, or for the maintenance of order, or for the control or administration of persons or property, or in relation thereto, shall be exercised under and according to the provisions of this Order, so far as such jurisdiction relates to British subjects foreigners. Jurisdiction over natives shall be exercised only in such matters and to such extent as the Court in its discretion thinks fit.

PART II.—ADMINISTRATION.

7.—(i) There shall be a Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Protectorate and appointments to the said office shall be made by Commission under His Majesty's Sign

Manual and Signet.

- (ii) The said Governor and Commander-in-Chief (hereinafter called the Governor) is hereby authorised, empowered, and commanded to do and execute all things that belong to his said office, according to the tenour of any Orders in Council relating to the Protectorate, and of such Commission as may be issued to him under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, and according to such Instructions as may from time to time be given to him under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, or by Order in Council, or by His Majesty through the Secretary of State, and to such laws as are now or shall hereafter be in force in the Protectorate.
- (iii) Every person hereafter appointed to fill the office of Governor shall, with all due solemnity, before entering on any of the duties of his office, cause the Commission appointing him to be Governor to be read and published in the presence of such of His Majesty's Officers in the Protectorate as can conveniently attend, which being done, he shall

then and there take before them the Oath of Allegiance in the form provided by an Act passed in the Session holden in the Thirty-first and Thirty-second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to amend the Law relating to Promissory Oaths"; and likewise the usual oath for the due execution of the office of Governor, and for the due and impartial administration of justice, which oaths the principal officer of the Protectorate Government or some other of His Majesty's Officers then present is hereby required to administer.

(iv) In the event of the death, incapacity, removal, or absence from the Protectorate of the Governor for the time being, all and every the powers and authorities by this Order granted to him shall, until His Majesty's further pleasure is signified through the Secretary of State, be vested in the Secretary to the Administration or other principal officer of the Protectorate Government for the time being in the Protectorate. Such officer shall, before assuming the duties of administrator, first take the oaths hereinbefore directed to be taken by the Governor and in the manner herein prescribed, which being done, the administrator as aforesaid is hereby author-ised, empowered, and commanded to do and execute, during His Majesty's pleasure, all things that belong to the office of Governor according to the tenour of this Order, and according to His Majesty's Instructions as aforesaid, and the Laws of the Protectorate. Provided that the Governor during his passage by air or water to or from any part of the Protectorate, or when, in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties by this Order in Council or otherwise conferred or imposed upon him, he is in any territories adjacent to or near to the Protectorate, shall not be considered to be absent from the Protectorate.

8. The Governor shall keep and use the Public Seal of the Protectorate for sealing all things whatsoever that shall pass the said Seal.

9.—(i) The Governor may, with the approval of the Secretary of State, by Proclamation define any boundaries of the territories for the time being within the limits of this Order, and divide those territories into provinces or districts in such manner and with such subdivisions as may be convenient for purposes of administration, describing the boundaries thereof and assigning names thereto.

(ii) If a question arises whether any place is or is not within the Protectorate, or within any province or district, and such question does not appear to be determined by any such Proclamation, or other evidence, it shall be referred to the Governor, and a certificate under his hand and seal shall be conclusive on the question, and judicial notice shall be taken thereof.

10.—(i) All rights of His Majesty in or in relation to any Crown lands shall vest in and may be exercised by the Governor for the time being in trust for His Majesty, or, if the Secretary of State at any time with respect to all or any such lands by order under his hand so directs, in such other trustee or trustees for His Majesty as the Secretary of State may appoint.

(ii) The Secretary of State may, when he thinks fit, by a like order remove any trustee

so appointed, and may appoint any new or additional trustee or trustees.

(iii) The Governor, or such other trustee or trustees, may make grants or leases of any Crown Lands, or may permit them to be temporarily occupied, on such terms and conditions as he or they may think fit, subject to the provisions of any Ordinance.

(iv) All mines and minerals being in, under, or upon any lands in the occupation of any native tribe, or any members thereof, or of any person not possessed of the right to work such mines and minerals, shall vest in the Governor, or such trustee or trustees, in like manner as the mines and minerals being in, under, or upon any Crown lands.

11.—(i) The Secretary of State, or the Governor, subject to the directions of the Secretary of State, may, on behalf of His Majesty, appoint, or authorise the appointment of, such public officers for the administration of the Protectorate, under such designations as he may think fit, and may prescribe their duties.

(ii) The Governor may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, dismiss any public officer not appointed by virtue of a Warrant from His Majesty, whose pensionable emoluments do not exceed two hundred pounds sterling a year, provided that in every such case where the officer has not been convicted on a criminal charge the grounds of intended dismissal are definitely stated in writing and communicated to the officer in order that he may have full opportunity of exculpating himself, and that the matter is investigated by the Governor with the aid of the head for the time being of the Department in which the officer is serving. If such an officer is convicted on a criminal charge, the Governor may call for the records of the trial and form his decision thereon, with the assistance, if necessary, of the officer who tried the case.

(iii) The Governor may, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, suspend from the exercise of his office in the Protectorate any public officer, which suspension shall continue and have effect only until His Majesty's pleasure therein shall be made known and signified to the Governor. In proceeding to any such suspension, the Governor is strictly to observe the directions in that behalf given to him by any Instructions as aforesaid.

(iv) Subject to the provisions of any Ordinance the Governor may appoint, or may authorise Heads of Departments to appoint, such clerks and other subordinate officers as may be required; and unless other provision is made all subordinate officers shall be removable by the respective officers by whom they were appointed.

12. In all cases, civil and criminal, to which natives are parties, every Court (a) shall be guided by native law, so far as it is applicable and is not repugnant to justice and morality, or inconsistent with any Order in Council or Ordinance, or any regulation or rule made under any Order in Council or Ordinance; and (b) shall decide all such cases according to substantial justice, without excessive regard to technicalities of procedure and without undue delay.

13. The production of a grant of probate or of letters of administration shall, notwith-

standing any provision to the contrary contained in any Indian Act or Law in force in the Protectorate or in the Principal Order, be necessary to establish the right to recover or receive any part of the estate or effects of any deceased person situate in the Protectorate.

14. In the event of the Governor having occasion at any time to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government, or, in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by His Majesty, or through the Secretary of State, to visit any territories adjacent to or near to the Protectorate, he may by an instru-ment under the Public Seal of the Protectorate, appoint any person to be his Deputy within any part of the Protectorate, during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor as shall in and by such instrument be specified and limited, but no others.

Every such Deputy shall conform to and observe all such instructions as the Governor shall from time to time address to him for his guidance. Provided, nevertheless, that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than His Majesty may at any time hereafter think proper to direct.

PART III.-LEGISLATION.

- 15.—(i) The Governor may make Ordinances for the administration of justice, the raising of revenue, and generally for the peace, order, and good government of all persons in the Protectorate. In the making of any Ordinances the Governor shall conform to and observe all rules, regulations, and directions in that behalf contained in any Instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet.
- (ii) The Governor shall observe any general or special instructions of the Secretary of State with respect to the previous submission to the Secretary of State of draft Ordinances, to the making of Ordinances for particular purposes, to the amendment of Ordinances or draft Ordinances, and to other matters in relation thereto; but nothing in this provision shall affect the validity of any Ordinance.
- (iii) In making Ordinances the Governor shall respect existing native laws and customs except so far as the same may be opposed to justice or morality.
- (iv) The Governor shall sign every Ordinance made by him, and shall at the first available opportunity transmit an authenticated copy thereof to the Secretary of State.
- (v) His Majesty may disallow any Ordinance, wholly or in part, and upon such disallowance being publicly notified, the provisions so disallowed shall thereupon cease to have effect, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done or suffered thereunder.
- (vi) The Ordinances of each year shall be numbered consecutively, and each may be cited by its number and year, or by its short title, if any.
- (vii) Where a date for the commencement of an Ordinance is not fixed in the Ordinance, it

shall come into force on the day on which it is promulgated by the Governor.

(viii) An Ordinance may apply to the Protectorate any Act or law of the United Kingdom or of any legislature of India or of any Colony, subject to any exceptions and modifications.

(ix) The Governor may by Ordinance repeal or amend with respect to the Protectorate any enactments, Acts, laws or ordinances which are made applicable or have been brought into operation in the Protectorate by or under any of the provisions of any Order in Council by this Order repealed.

(x) Every Ordinance shall, unless a contrary intention appears, extend to natives and may in relation to natives comprise such special provisions, modifications and penalties

as the Governor may think fit.

(xi) The Governor shall, at the first available opportunity after any rules or regulations are made under any Ordinance by any person or body authorized, transmit an authenticated copy thereof to the Secretary of State.

(xii) An Ordinance shall not be repealable by any rules or regulations made under an Ordinance.

(xiii) An Ordinance varying or affecting any Order in Council relating to the Protectorate shall not come into force unless it has been previously approved by the Secretary of State, and such approval shall be recited therein.

PART IV.—Application of Law of British India and of the United Kingdom.

- 16.—(i) Subject to the other provisions of this Order, and to any Treaties for the time being in force relating to the Protectorate, His Majesty's criminal and civil jurisdiction in the Protectorate shall, so far as circumstances admit, be exercised on the principles of, and in conformity with, the enactments for the time being applicable as hereinafter mentioned of the Governor-General of India in Council, and of the Governor of Bombay in Council, and according to the course of procedure and practice observed by, and before, the Courts in the Presidency of Bombay beyond the limits of the ordinary original jurisdiction of the High Court of Judicature at Bombay according to their respective jurisdiction and authority, and so far as such enactments, procedure, and practice are inapplicable, shall be exercised under, and in accordance with, the Common and Statute Law of England.
- (ii) The enactments mentioned in Schedule II to this Order shall continue to be applicable to the Protectorate.
- (iii) Any Act of the Governor-General of India in Council, or of the Governor of Bombay in Council, whether passed before or after the commencement of this Order, amending or substituted for any Act of either of those Legislatures which has been made applicable to and brought into operation in the Protectorate shall, subject to the provisions of this Article, also apply to the Protectorate.
- (iv) For the purpose of facilitating the application of any such enactments as before mentioned—
 - (a) The Court may construe any such enactment, with such alterations not affecting

the substance, as may be necessary or proper to adapt the same to the matter before the Court;

- (b) The Secretary of State may by order direct by what authority any jurisdiction, powers, or duties incident to the operation of any such enactment, and for the exercise or performance of which no convenient provision has been otherwise made, shall be exercised or performed;
- (c) Any order of the Secretary of State made in pursuance of this Article shall be published in the Protectorate and in India, in such manner as he directs, and shall have effect as from a date to be specified in the order.
- 17. The enactments described in the first Schedule to "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," shall apply to the Protectorate as if it were a British Colony or possession, but subject to the provisions of this Order and to the exceptions, adaptations, and modifications following, that is to say—
 - (i) The Governor is hereby substituted for the Governor of a Colony or British possession, and the Protectorate Court is hereby substituted for a Superior Court or Supreme Court and for a Magistrate or Justice of the Peace of a Colony or British possession.
 - (ii) For the portions of the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1854 and 1867, referred to in the said Schedule shall be substituted Part XIII of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894."
 - (iii) In section fifty-one of "The Conveyancing (Scotland) Act, 1874," and any enactment for the time being in force amending the same, the Protectorate Court is substituted for a Court of Probate in a Colony.
 - (iv) With respect to "The Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881":-
 - (a) So much of the fourth and fifth sections of the said Act as relates to sending a report of the issue of a warrant, together with the information, or a copy thereof, or to the sending of a certificate of committal and report of a case, or to the information to be given by a Magistrate to a fugitive, shall be excepted, and in lieu of such information the person acting as the Magistrate shall inform the fugitive that in the British possession or Protectorate to which he may be conveyed he has the right to apply for a writ of habeas corpus or other like process.
 - (b) So much of the 6th section of the said Act as requires the expiration of fifteen days before issue of warrant, shall be excepted.
 - (c) The Governor shall not be bound to return a fugitive offender to a British possession unless satisfied that the proceedings to obtain his return are taken with the consent of the Governor of that possession.
 - (d) For the purposes of Part II of the said Act, the Protectorate, Aden, Zanzibar, the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, and the Uganda Protectorate, and British India shall be deemed to be one group of British possessions.

PART V .- JUDICIAL.

(a) Criminal Matters.

18. Subject to the other provisions of this Order, the Code of Criminal Procedure and the other enactments relating to the administration of criminal justice in India, for the time being applicable to the Protectorate, shall have effect as if the Protectorate were a Presidency of India.

For the purposes of those enactments-

- (i) The Protectorate Court established in pursuance of the Somaliland Order in Council, 1899, shall continue to exercise jurisdiction. The said Court shall be held either by the Governor or, at the Governor's discretion, by the Secretary to the Administration and shall have all the powers of a Sessions Court in India.
- (ii) The Protectorate Court shall in relation to all Courts within the Protectorate have the same appellate jurisdiction and the same powers of revision as are possessed by a High Court in India; and
- (iii) The powers both of the Governor-General in Council and of the Local Government under those enactments shall be exercisable by the Secretary of State, or with his previous or subsequent assent, by the Governor
- 19.—(i) In cases of murder or culpable homicide, if either the death or the criminal act which wholly or partly caused the death happened in the Protectorate, a Court acting under this Order shall have the like jurisdiction over any person charged either as a principal offender or as an abettor, as if both the criminal act and the death had happened in the Protectorate.
- (ii) In the case of any offence committed on the high seas, or within the Admiralty jurisdiction, by any person who at the time of committing such offence was on board a British ship, or by any British subject on board a foreign ship to which he did not belong, a Court acting under this Order shall have jurisdiction as if the offence had been committed within the Protectorate.
- (iii) In cases tried under this Article no different sentence can be passed from the sentence which could be passed in England if the offence were tried there.
- 20. The Governor may, if he thinks fit, by general order prescribe the manner in which, and the places in the Protectorate at which, sentences of imprisonment are to be carried into execution.
- 21. When any crime or offence has been committed within the Protectorate, or for which the offender may be tried therein, the Governor may, as he shall see occasion, in His Majesty's name and on His Majesty's behalf, grant a pardon to any accomplice in such crime or offence who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the principal offender, or of any one of such offenders, if more than one; and further, may grant to any offender convicted in any Court, or before any Judge or other Magistrate, within the Protectorate, a pardon, either free or subject to lawful conditions, or any remission or commutation of the sentence passed on such

offender, or any respite of the execution of such sentence, for such period as the Governor thinks fit, and may remit any fines, penalties, or forfeitures due or accrued to His Majesty.

- 22.—(i) Where it is shown by evidence on oath, to the satisfaction of the Governor, that any person subject to this Order has committed, or is about to commit, an offence against this Order, or is otherwise conducting himself so as to be dangerous to peace and good order in the Protectorate or is endeavouring to excite enmity between the people of the Protectorate and His Majesty, or is intriguing against His Majesty's power and authority in the Protectorate, the Governor may, if he thinks fit, by order under his hand and official seal, prohibit that person from being in the Protectorate, during any time therein specified, not exceeding two years, or may order him to be deported in manner provided by this Order.
- (ii) If the person named in the order of prohibition fails to obey, or acts in contravention of the order—
 - (a) He shall be guilty of an offence against this Order, and on conviction thereof, shall be liable to imprisonment for any term not exceeding two years, without prejudice to the operation of the order of prohibition.
 - (b) Whether the offender has been convicted of, or imprisoned for, that offence or not, the Governor may, if he thinks fit, order him to be deported.
- (iii) The Governor, by order under his hand and official seal, may vary any order of prohibition (not extending the duration thereof), and may at any time revoke the same.
- (iv) The Governor shall forthwith report to the Secretary of State every order made by him under this Article, and the grounds thereof, and the proceedings thereunder.
- 23.—(i) Where a person is convicted of an offence the Court before which he is convicted may, if it thinks fit, require him to give security to the satisfaction of the Court for his future good behaviour, and for that purpose may, if it thinks fit, cause him to come or be brought before the Court.
- (ii) If any person required by an order under this Article, or under the law relating to criminal procedure for the time being in force, to give security for good behaviour or for keeping the peace, fails to do so, the Court may, if it thinks fit, order that he be deported from the Protectorate.
- (iii) Any order of deportation not made by the Governor must be approved by him.
- 24.—(i) Any person ordered to be deported under this Order shall be, as soon as practicable, and in the case of a person convicted, either after execution of the sentence, or while it is in course of execution, removed in custody, under the warrant of the Governor, to the place named in the warrant and there discharged from custody.
- (ii) The place shall be a place in that part (if any) of His Majesty's dominions out of the United Kingdom to which the person belongs or in some other part of those dominions the Government whereof consents to the reception therein of persons deported under this Order, or a place under the Protectorate of His

Majesty, or in the country out of His Majesty's dominions to which the person belongs.

- (iii) The Court, on making an order of deportation, may, if it thinks fit, order the person to be deported to pay all or any part of the expenses of his deportation, to be fixed by the Court in the order.
- (iv) The Governor shall forthwith report to the Secretary of State every order of deportation made under this Order, and the grounds thereof, and the proceedings thereunder.
- (v) If a person deported under this Order returns to the Protectorate without permission in writing of the Governor or Secretary of State, he shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two months, or with fine which may extend to 1,000 rupees, or with both.
- (vi) He shall also be liable to be again deported under the original or a new order, and a fresh warrant of the Governor.
- (vii) The Governor may at any time revoke or vary any order or warrant of deportation.
- 25.—(i) Where, under this Order, a person is to be sent, or removed, or deported from the Protectorate, he shall, by warrant of the Governor under his hand and seal, be detained, if necessary, in custody, or in prison, until a fit opportunity for his removal or deportation occurs, and then, if he is to be deported beyond sea, be put on board one of His Majesty's vessels of war, or, if none is available, then on board some other British or other fit vessel.
- (ii) The warrant of the Governor shall be sufficient authority to the person to whom it is directed or delivered for execution, and to the Commander or master of the vessel, to receive and detain the person therein named, in the manner therein prescribed, and to send or remove and carry him to the place therein named, according to the warrant.
- (iii) In case of sending or removal for any purpose other than deportation, the warrant of the Governor shall be issued in duplicate, and the person executing it shall, as soon as practicable after his arrival at the place therein named, deliver, according to the warrant, with one of the duplicates of the warrant, to a constable, or proper officer of police, or keeper of a prison, or other proper authority or person there, the person named in the warrant, to be produced on the order of the proper Court or authority there, or to be otherwise dealt with according to law.
- 26. The Governor and every officer for the time being exercising the powers of a Magistrate, shall have in and for the Protectorate, province, or district, as the case may be, all the power and jurisdiction appertaining to the office of a Justice of the Peace.
- 27. A sentence of imprisonment under this Order, or any Ordinance made under this Order, may be with or without hard labour, in the discretion of the Court, unless it is expressed to be without hard labour.

(b) Civil Matters.

28. Subject to the other provisions of this Order, the Code of Civil Procedure, "The Bombay Civil Courts Act, 1869," and the other enactments relating to the administration of civil justice for the time being applicable to the Protectorate, shall have effect as if the Protectorate were the Presidency of Bombay.

- (i) For the purposes of these enactments the Protectorate Court shall be deemed to be the High Court, and the Court authorised to hear appeals from and to revise the decisions of District Courts;
- (ii) District Courts shall be established under the provisions of "The Bombay Civil Courts Act, 1869," as applied by this Order; and
- (iii) The powers both of the Governor-General in Council and the Local Government under those enactments shall be exercisable by the Secretary of State, or with his previous or subsequent assent, by the Governor.
- 29. The following enactments of "The Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890," that is to say, section 2, sub-sections (2) to (4), sections 5 and 6, section 16, sub-section (3), shall apply to the Protectorate Court as if in the said sections the said Court were mentioned in lieu of a Colonial Court of Admiralty, and the Protectorate were referred to in lieu of a British possession.
- 30.—(i) Every District Court shall endeavour to obtain, as early as may be, notice of the death of every British subject or foreigner dying leaving property to be administered, and all such information as may serve to guide the Court with respect to the securing and administration of his property.
- (ii) On receiving notice of the death of such a person, the Court shall put up a Notice thereof, at the Court-house, and shall keep the same there until probate or administration is granted, or, where it appears to the Court that probate or administration will not be applied for, or cannot be granted, for such time as it thinks fit.
- (iii) The Court shall, where the circumstances of the case appear so to require, as soon as may be, take possession of the property in the Protectorate of the deceased, or put it under its seal (in either case, if the nature of the property or other circumstances so require, making an inventory), and so keep it until it can be dealt with according to law.
- (iv) All expenses incurred by the Court in so doing shall be the first charge on the property of the deceased, and the Court shall, by sale of the property, or part thereof, or otherwise, provide for the discharge of these expenses.
- 31. Where a British subject or foreigner dies intestate, his property in the Protectorate shall, until administration is granted, vest in the Governor.
- 32. If a person named executor in a will, to the establishment of whose title, as such, it is necessary to obtain probate of that will, takes possession of, and administers or otherwise deals with, any part of the property of the deceased, and does not obtain probate within one month after the death, or after the termination of any proceeding respecting probate or administration, he shall be liable to be punished with fine, which may extend to 1,000 rupees.
- 33. If any person other than the person named executor, or the administrator, or a person entitled to represent the deceased, without obtaining probate or letters of administration, or an officer of the Court, takes possession

- of and administers, or otherwise deals with, any part of the property of the deceased, he shall, as soon as practicable, notify the fact and the circumstances to the District Court, and shall furnish to that Court all such information as the Court requires, and shall conform to any directions of the Court in relation to the custody, disposal, or transmission of the property, or the proceeds thereof, and in case of any contravention of this article, he shall be liable to be punished with fine, which may extend to 1,000 rupees.
- 34.—(i) When the peculiar circumstances of the case appear so to require, for reasons recorded in its proceedings, the District Court may, if it thinks fit, of its own motion or otherwise, grant letters of administration to an officer or practitioner of the Court.
- (ii) The person so appointed shall act under the direction of the Court, and shall be indemnified thereby; and, if he is a practitioner, he shall not act otherwise than as administrator in relation to the estate.
- (iii) He shall publish such notices, if any, as the Court thinks fit in the Protectorate, Aden, the United Kingdom, and elsewhere.
- (iv) The Court shall require and compel him to file, in the proper office of the Court, his accounts of his administration at intervals not exceeding three months.
- (v) The accounts shall be audited under the direction of the Court.
- (vi) All expenses incurred in behalf of the Court in execution of this Article shall be the first charge on the estate of the deceased in the Protectorate; and the Court shall by the sale of the estate or otherwise, provide for the discharge of those expenses.
- (vii) For the purpose of this Article and of Articles 13, 30, 31, 32, and 33 of this Order "Administration" means (unless a contrary intention appears from the context) letters of administration, including the same with will annexed, or granted for special or limited purposes or limited in duration.
- 35.—(i) Every agreement for reference to arbitration to which a person subject to this Order is a party may, on the application of any party, be filed for execution in the proper office of the District Court.
- (ii) The Court shall thereupon have authority to enforce the agreement, and the award made thereunder, and to control and regulate the proceedings before and after the award, in such manner and on such terms as the Court may think fit.

PART VI.-MISCELLANEOUS.

36. Subject to the approval of the Secretary of State, the Protectorate Court may frame Rules of Procedure and other Rules, consistent with this Order, for the better execution of the provisions herein contained in respect of civil or criminal proceedings, and for regulating the conditions on which persons other than parties may be permitted to practise as advocates or solicitors in any Court, and for suspending or excluding (subject to a right of appeal) such persons from practice in case of misconduct.

37.—(i) The Governor may, with the approval of the Secretary of State, make rules imposing fees leviable in respect of any proceedings in, or processes issued out of, any Court established

under this Order, and in respect of the registration of any instrument under this Order.

(ii) But the Court may in any case, if it thinks fit, on account of the poverty of a party, or for any other reason, dispense in whole or in part with the payment of any fee chargeable in respect of such matter.

(iii) Nothing in this Order shall affect any Order in Council prescribing a table of fees to be taken by Consular officers; and, where a fee is taken under that Order, no fees shall be taken in respect of the same matter under

this Order.

38.—(i) All fees, charges, expenses, costs, fines, damages, and other money payable under this Order, or under any law made applicable by this Order, may be enforced under order of the Court, by attachment and sale of goods, and in case of deficiency by imprisonment (without hard labour) which may extend to one month.

(ii) Any bill of sale or mortgage, or transfer of property, made with the view of avoiding such attachment or sale, shall not be effectual to defeat the provisions of this Order.

(iii) All fees, penalties, fines, and forfeitures, levied under this Order shall be paid to the public account, and shall be applied in such manner as the Secretary of State may direct.

- 39. Subject to the other provisions of this Order, all expenses of removal of prisoners and others, and the expenses of deportation and of the sending of any person to any part of His Majesty's dominions or Protectorates, including expenses of maintenance, shall be defrayed in such manner as the Secretary of State directs.
- 40.—(i) If an officer of any Court employed to execute an order loses, by neglect or omission the opportunity of executing it, then, on complaint of the person aggrieved and proof of the fact alleged, the Court may, if it thinks fit, order the officer to pay the damages sustained by the person complaining, or part thereof.
- (ii) The order may be enforced as an order directing payment of money.
- 41.—(i) If a clerk or officer of the Court, acting under pretence of the process or authority of the Court, is charged with extortion, or with not paying over money duly levied, or with other misconduct, the Court may, if it thinks fit, inquire into the charge in a summary way, and may for that purpose summon and enforce the attendance of all necessary persons as in an action, and may make such order for the repayment of any money extorted, or for the payment over of any money levied, and for the payment of such damages and costs as the Court thinks fit.
- (ii) The Court may also, if it thinks fit, on the same inquiry, impose on the clerk or officer a fine not exceeding 50 rupees for each offence.
- (iii) A clerk or officer punished under this Article shall not, without the leave of the Protectorate Court, be liable to an action in respect of the same matter; and any such action if already or afterwards begun, may be stayed by the Court in such manner and on such terms as the Court thinks fit.
- (iv) Nothing in this Article shall be deemed to prevent any person from being prosecuted under any other law for any act or omission

punishable under this Article, or for being liable under that other law to any higher punishment or penalty than that provided by this Article: Provided that no person shall be punished twice for the same offence.

42. The Governor, or any other officer of the Protectorate Government appointed by him in that behalf, may exercise any power conferred on any Justices of the Peace within His Majesty's dominions by any Act of Parliament, for the time being in force, regulating merchant seamen or the mercantile marine.

- 43. Not later than the Thirty-first day of March in each year the Governor shall send to the Secretary of State a Report on the operation of this Order, up to the Thirty-first day of December in the previous year, showing for the then last twelve months the number and nature of the proceedings, criminal and civil, taken under this Order, and the result thereof, and the number and amount of fees received, and containing such other information, and being in such form as the Secretary of State from time to time directs.
- 44. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, may from time to time revoke, add to, alter, or amend this Order.
- 45. This Order shall be proclaimed within the Protectorate and shall thereupon commence and come into operation.

46. A copy of this Order shall be kept exhibited conspicuously in the principal office of the Protectorate at Berbera.

AND the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of

State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of All Souls College, in the University of Oxford, on the 17th day of March, 1930, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

ALL SOULS COLLEGE, OXFORD. AMENDMENT TO STATUTES.

Whereas the University of Oxford Commissioners under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, did, by an Instrument under their Seal, dated the 4th day of February, 1925, approve certain Statutes thereunto annexed for your Petitioners who are therein described as "The College of the Souls of all Faithful People deceased in the University of Oxford."

And whereas such Statutes were approved by His Majesty King George the Fifth in Council on the 25th day of June, 1925:

And whereas at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for that purpose, and held on the 27th day of June, 1929, it was unanimously resolved, by those present and voting at the Meeting, that the alterations in and additions to the said Statutes hereinafter specified should be made (that is to say):—

In Statute VIII there shall be inserted immediately after Clause 7 thereof the Clauses following (that is to say):—

8. Except as hereinafter provided the Warden and Fellows shall effect a policy or policies of assurance upon the life of each Fellow elected after the 31st July, 1930, under Statute III, Clauses 1, 9, 12 and 13, within four months of his election under the scheme known as the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Universities. The Warden and Fellows shall deduct from the annual emolument as hereinafter defined of each assured person five per cent. of such emolument and shall pay this sum annually, together with a sum out of the revenues of the College appropriated to the purposes of these Statutes equal to ten per cent. of the said emolument, as the premium on the said policy or policies, and shall conform in regard to the effecting of new policies from time to time and in all other matters concerned with the assurance to the regulations of the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Universities, except in so far as anything in such regulations may be repugnant to any provision in these Statutes. Provided that the transference to the College of a policy or policies effected under the Federated Superannuation Scheme by some other Institution upon the life of a Fellow shall be deemed to be equivalent to the effecting of the policy by the College.

9. If it shall appear to the Warden and Fellows that owing to his age at the date of his election or to any other special circumstances no adequate provision for the pension of a Fellow can be made by means of a policy or policies of assurance effected by them as aforesaid, they may with his consent instead of effecting such policy or policies, deduct each year from the emoluments of his fellowship a sum equal to five per cent. thereof and invest it for his benefit, together with a sum equal to ten per cent. of his emolument contributed from the revenues of the College appropriated to the purposes of these Statutes, in any securities in which trust funds may The income arising legally be invested. therefrom shall be accumulated and invested from time to time in like manner, in accordance with the provisions of the Federated Superannuation Scheme, and all sums invested under this clause shall be dealt with under the provisions of that Scheme.

10. (i) For the purposes of the two preceding clauses the annual emolument of an assured person shall be deemed to include the emoluments of any Fellowship or College Office held by him.

(ii) The two preceding clauses shall cease to apply to a Fellow elected under Statute III Clause 1 after the expiration of two years from the day of his election unless he is re-elected under Clause 6 (ii).

(iii) A Fellow who was elected to a Fellowship under Clauses 1, 6 (ii), 9, 12 or 13, of Statute III prior to the 31st July, 1930, may with his consent but not otherwise be brought under the provisions of the two preceding clauses.

(iv) No pension shall be granted under Clause 7 of this Statute to any person benefitting under this and the two preceding clauses.

In Statute VIII the existing Clauses 8 and 9 shall be renumbered as Clauses 11 and 12 respectively.

Now, we, the said Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby submit the aforesaid alterations and additions made by us in the Statutes governing our said College to the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.

BOROUGH OF SWINDON.

BYELAWS AND REGULATIONS made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Swindon (hereinafter called "the Corporation ") as the owners of omnibuses under the powers conferred on them by Section 46 of the Tramways Act, 1870, and Section 23 (2) of the Swindon Corporation Act, 1926.

1. The Byelaws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all omnibuses of the Corporation, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to

make byelaws and regulations.
2. Throughout these Byelaws and Regulations, the following words shall have the meanings hereinafter respectively assigned to them,

that is to say:-

"Omnibus" means any omnibus run by the Corporation for the conveyance of passengers.

"Driver" means any servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive an

"Conductor" means any servant of the Corporation having the charge of or helping in the charge of an omnibus.

No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any omnibus in motion.

4. No person, except a passenger, or intending passenger shall enter or mount any omni-

5. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any omnibus, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

6. No person shall spit in or on, from or

against any omnibus.

7. A person in a state of intoxication shall not enter or mount upon any omnibus, and if found in or upon any omnibus shall leave the omnibus immediately on being requested to to do so by the conductor.

- 8. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any omnibus, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.
- 9. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any omnibus, omnibus station, waiting room, or premises used in connection with the Corporation's omnibuses.
- 10. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the omnibus, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any omnibus. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these byelaws and regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.
- 11. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the omnibus, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not mount, enter or remain on or in any omnibus, and may be prevented from so doing, and, if found on or in any omnibus, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned: Provided that on omnibuses specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on an omnibus under the provisions of this byelaw, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employ-
- 12. Each passenger shall immediately upon demand, and in case no demand shall have been made, before leaving the car, pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation, the fare legally demandable for his journey and accept a ticket therefor. Such ticket shall not (except as expressly provided for by these Byelaws and Regulations) be transferable, and shall be (except as aforesaid) available only for the journey and on the omnibus for and on which the same is issued, except in the case of a special return or transfer ticket. Any passenger leaving an omnibus except in the case of a passenger holding a transfer ticket changing omnibuses at the recognised transfer point shall be deemed to have completed his journey.
- 13. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do, to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation and shall also, when required so to do, either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.
- 14. A passenger, not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Corporation, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, or mechanics, or daily labourers.
- 15. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation, in the execution of his duties, shall travel on the steps or platform of any omnibus, or stand on the upper

deck, and any person so travelling, standing, or sitting, shall cease so to do immediately on request by the conductor.

- 16. No person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any omnibus, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.
- 17. When any omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such omnibus when warned by the conductor not to do so.
- 18. No person shall take a dog or other animal which might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers, into or on any omnibus after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any omnibus shall be removed from the omnibus by the person in charge of such dog or other animal immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.
- 19. No passenger shall travel in or on any omnibus of the Corporation with loaded firearms.
- 20. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any omnibus of the Corporation and no person other than the conductor or driver shall change or remove the route indicators or destination boards or interfere with the controllers, brakes, lights or any other part of an omnibus or its equipment.
- 21. If at any time an omnibus becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall upon the request of the conductor, leave the same, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available omnibus, so far as its carrying capacity permits, the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged omnibus.
- 22. No person shall ring, or cause to be rung, any of the signal bells upon any omnibus, so as to effect the unnecessary stoppage of any omnibus, nor signal any omnibus to start.
- 23. Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any omnibus, any breach of these byelaws and regulations, shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the omnibus by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.
- 24. The conductor shall enforce these Byelaws and Regulations and prevent the breach thereof to the best of his ability.
- 25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each omnibus in use and in or about each omnibus station or waiting room a printed copy of these bylaws and regulations.
- 26. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Byelaws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

27. These Byelaws and Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1930.

28. From and after the date of the coming into force of these Byelaws and Regulations, the Byelaws and Regulations made by the Corporation on the 4th October, 1904, and certified by the Board of Trade on the 27th December, 1904, are hereby repealed, without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof.
