MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order in Council to require imported ice skates to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.

Attention is called to the fact that, while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

ROPE, TWINE AND NET TRADE BOARD
(GREAT BRITAIN).PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES
FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY Minimum Rates of Wages for certain classes of work and certain classes of workers.

Particulars of the proposed variation may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 28th March, 1930.
