Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Article 18 of the Principal Order is hereby revoked and the said Order shall be read and construed as if the said Article had not been included therein.

2. This Order shall be read as one with the Principal Order and shall be deemed to have commenced and come into operation on the same date as the Principal Order.

3. A copy of this Order shall be kept exhibited conspicuously in the principal office of the Protectorate at Berbera.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of January, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Burythorpe and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of East Acklam, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of

Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Burythorpe and East Acklam duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of York and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of York signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Burythorpe is now full, the Reverend Frederic William Moore being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of East Acklam is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Frederic William Moore (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Burythorpe and the said Benefice of East Acklam shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Burythorpe with Acklam and Leavening' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Buckrose but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Frederic William Moore if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Burythorpe shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate or occasional clerical or lay assistance and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge and other endowments of the said Benefice of East Acklam shall be charged with a sum of £150 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate or for occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid which said fund of £150 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Archbishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £150 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of a Curate or the expenses of occasional clerical or lay assistance as aforesaid.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Burythorpe shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as

conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of East Acklam and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of East Acklam having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Burythorpe having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of York has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be

united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the rearrangement of the said Benefices of Wrenbury, Baddiley, Acton and Nantwich, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chester, and therein recommended (1) the union of the said two Benefices of Wrenbury and Baddiley, and (2) certain alterations of the boundaries of the said Parishes of Wrenbury, Baddiley, Acton and Nantwich, and the terms for effecting the union and alterations of boundaries, and the said Bishop of Chester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alterations of boundaries, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

That both those two detached portions of the Parish of the said Benefice of Wrenbury which are situated within the area of the Parish of the said Benefice of Acton (both which portions are shown upon the said Map or Plan and thereon coloured brown) shall be severed from the Parish of the said Benefice of Wrenbury and shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Acton.

"4. That all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Acton which is comprised within the areas of the Civil Parishes of Badington, Austerson and Coole Pilate, shall be severed from the Parish of the said Benefice of Acton, and shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Nantwich.

That with the consents of the said John Webster, Herbert Moore, and Charles William Montgomery Bromley (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), the said union and alterations of boundaries shall take effect immediately upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council, affirming this Scheme, and the said John Webster, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wrenbury, shall become and be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Baddiley and Wrenbury.

“Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ladbroke is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Alexander Hamilton Wheeler, M.C., J.P., D.L., of The Old Prebendal House, Shipton-under-Wychwood in the County of Oxford, a Captain (retired) in Your Majesty’s Army:

“And whereas the said Alexander Hamilton Wheeler is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ladbroke now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Coventry for the time being:

“And whereas the Right Reverend Lisle, now Bishop of Coventry, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Lisle, Bishop of Coventry, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:
