PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 17th day of December, 1929, and known as the Somaliland Order in Council, 1929 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order), provision was made for the administration of His Majesty's jurisdiction in the Somaliland Protectorate and generally for the peace, order and good government thereof:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Principal Order as hereinafter is set forth:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Article 18 of the Principal Order is hereby revoked and the said Order shall be read and construed as if the said Article had not been included therein.

2. This Order shall be read as one with the Principal Order and shall be deemed to have commenced and come into operation on the same date as the Principal Order.

3. A copy of this Order shall be kept exhibited conspicuously in the principal office of the Protectorate at Berbera.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of January, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Burythorpe and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of East Acklam, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of
