Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trinity House (Increase of Establishment) Order, 1930.

2. Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by Section 737 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct as follows:—

1. Anything which is, under the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1923, authorised to be done by, to, or before a British Consular Officer may be done in South West Africa by, to, or before the Officer for the time being acting as Collector of Customs at Luderitz.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Administration in Mandated Territories) No. 1 Order, 1930.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, of the Union of Benefices

Measure, 1921, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Ingworth and the Benefice (being part of the United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham) of Blickling and (2) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Calthorpe and the Benefice (being the remaining part of the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham) of Erpingham, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefices of Ingworth and Blickling and (2) of the said Benefices of Calthorpe and Erpingham duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Ingworth, the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham, and the said Benefice of Calthorpe, are all now full, the Reverend Samuel Harvard Harvard-Watts being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham, and the Reverend John Harrison Duphoy Grinter being the present Incumbent of the said Benefices of Ingworth and Calthorpe which he holds together in plurality under the authority of a Dispensation:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said John Harrison Duphoy Grinter (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Ingworth and the part of the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham which consists of the said Benefice of Blickling shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Blickling with Ingworth' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the said Benefice of Calthorpe and the part of the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham which consists of the said Benefice of Erpingham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Erpingham with Calthorpe' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham shall be vacant then the said

unions shall forthwith take effect, but if upon that day the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham shall be full then the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham and if at the date when the unions shall take effect in either of the events hereinbefore described the said Benefices of Ingworth and Calthorpe are held by separate Incumbents the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ingworth shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Blickling with Ingworth and the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Calthorpe shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Erpingham with Calthorpe but if at the date when the unions shall take effect as aforesaid the said Benefices of Ingworth and Calthorpe are held in plurality by one Incumbent such Incumbent shall become the first Incumbent either of the United Benefice of Blickling with Ingworth or of the United Benefice of Erpingham with Calthorpe as he shall then by his own choice determine.

"4. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House situate at Blickling and at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Blickling with Ingworth and (b) the Parsonage House situate at Erpingham and at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Erpingham with Calthorpe.

"5. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the respective United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, (a) the right of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice of Blickling with Ingworth shall belong wholly to the Patron or Patrons of the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham and (b) in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Erpingham with Calthorpe after the union, the Patron of the said Benefice of Ingworth shall have the first turn, the Patron or Patrons of the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham shall have the second turn and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Calthorpe shall have the third turn.

"6. That upon the unions taking effect all the glebe land situate within and all the Tithe Rent Charge arising within the Parish of Blickling and now belonging to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham together with all (if any) capital sums, stocks, securities, or other property being or representing the produce of any sale or sales of glebe situate within the said Parish of Blickling or sales, redemptions or other conversions of Tithe Rent Charge arising within the said Parish of Blickling shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Blickling with Ingworth, and all the other or remaining endowments of the said United Benefice of Blickling with Erpingham shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Erpingham with Calthorpe.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or Measures or of any other Act of Parliament or Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alteration in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

(3) All that piece of land containing in the whole half an acre or thereabouts situate in the Parish of Kinver in the County of Stafford bounded on the west by the road leading from Stourbridge to Kinver on the north in part by the towing path of the Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal and in other part by the Lock Inn and on the remaining sides by land belonging or reputed to belong to James Smith and which said piece of land is part of the enclosure numbered 1033 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map Staffordshire Sheet LXX-16 Edition 1919.

16. To empower the Company for the purpose of providing convenient access to parts of the added area to open and break up in the urban district of Sedgley the road known as the Himley Road and to lay down and place pipes conduits and other works therein and to make provision as to the rights obligations and liabilities of the Company in respect of such pipes conduits and other works.

17. To repeal alter or amend all or some of the provisions of the Brierley Hill Gas Act 1865 the Brierley Hill Gas Order 1924 and the Brierley Hill Gas (Charges) Order 1924 and any Act or Order relating to the Vendors or their undertaking.

18. To make provisions as to the declaration of the calorific value of and to define the price which may be charged by the Company for gas supplied within the added area (including provisions empowering the Company to charge different prices for gas supplied by them in different parts of the added area) and to empower the Company to declare and supply gas of different calorific values for and in different parts of their limits of supply.

19. To authorise the Company to raise additional capital by the creation and issue of further amounts of Consolidated Ordinary Stock or by the creation and issue of further amounts of Consolidated Preference Stock or wholly or partly by either of those modes respectively.

20. To repeal Section 31 of the Dudley Gas Act 1853 and to provide a new scale of voting in respect of the Consolidated Ordinary Stock of the Company.

21. To increase the amount of money which the Company may borrow on mortgage or raise by the creation and issue of debenture stock in respect of their existing capital.

22. To empower the Company to raise additional money by borrowing on mortgage and by the creation and issue of debenture stock or by either of such means.

23. To make provisions regulating the raising of additional capital and as to the rights, privileges and liabilities of the holders of stock therein and of mortgages and debenture stock of the Company and prescribing the minimum holdings of stock and debenture stock of the Company.

24. To make provisions as to the sale of Consolidated Ordinary Stock and Consolidated Preference Stock in the capital of the Company by auction or tender.

25. To empower the directors of the Company to reserve a proportion of any future issue of capital for exclusive offer to consumers of gas and to the employees of the Company and to make provisions as to the conditions of issue.

26. To repeal Section 16 of the Dudley Gas Order 1929 (hereinafter called "the Order of 1929") and to empower the directors of the Company to issue so as to be redeemable preference stock and debenture stock, to make provision with respect to the redemption of such stock either by a payment in cash or by the issue of other stock (redeemable or otherwise) and to authorise the creation and issue of new stock for any such purpose and the re-issue of any redeemable preference stock or debenture stock after redemption.

27. To make further provision with reference to the Company's affairs including provisions to relieve the Company of any obligation to see to the execution of trusts to which their shares or stock or debenture stock may be subject as to the holding of annual meetings the manner of voting at meetings as to voting rights and as to the number and qualification of directors.

28. To make provisions as to the appointment of the Directors of the Vendors as Directors of the Company.

29. To make new provisions as to the calorific values of the gas to be supplied by the Company and to enable the Company to alter from time to time such calorific values and to prescribe the minimum pressure or pressures at which the Company shall supply gas.

30. To provide that certain of the provisions of the Gas Regulation Act 1920 shall apply as if the intended provisions as to price were an Order made under Section 1 of that Act and that other provisions of the said Act shall cease to apply to the Company or their undertaking.

31. To define or fix a basic price or basic prices for the gas to be supplied by the Company within their limits of supply or any part or parts thereof with liberty (if thought fit) to charge different prices in different parts of the said limits and to make provision as to the revision of such basic price or prices.

32. To repeal all or any of the provisions of the Acts and Orders of the Company prescribing a maximum price or prices for gas supplied by them and a maximum rate of dividend on the ordinary capital of the Company.

33. To provide that the Company shall continue to charge for gas supplied by them according to the number of heat units contained therein and to enact provisions as to the method of ascertainment for the purposes

of the Order of the number of heat units supplied.

34. To prescribe a basic rate or basic rates of dividend on the ordinary capital of the Company and to provide for the application of the whole or part of the profits in excess of those required for payment of dividends at such basic rate or rates in reduction of the price of gas to consumers and in increasing dividends of the ordinary capital beyond the said basic rate or rates and in forming or increasing a reserve fund and for the benefit of all or some of the employees of the Company, or in any one or more of those ways and to provide (if thought fit) that in determining the rate or rates at which dividends may be paid on the ordinary capital of the Company the prices charged to certain consumers or for certain supplies or in certain parts of their limits of supply shall not be taken into account; and to make provision for determining from time to time the amount of the profits to be applied as aforesaid.

35. To repeal Section 23 of the Order of 1929 and to make new provisions with respect to the payment of interim dividends by the directors without the sanction or direction of a general meeting and as to the preparation of the Company's Accounts.

36. To empower the Company or the directors thereof to establish a Reserve Fund a Special Purposes Fund and a Renewal Fund to provide for the application of those funds respectively and to make provision with respect to the appropriation of the existing reserved fund and renewal fund of the Company and the Suspense Renewals Fund of the Vendors.

37. To authorise the Company or the directors to establish superannuation schemes and to grant superannuation and other allowances, gratuities, pensions and to make other payments to officers and employees and the widows, families and dependants of such persons and to any superannuation fund established for the benefit of officers and employees and to the widows, families and dependants of such persons, to enter into and carry into effect agreements with insurance companies or others for securing such gratuities, pensions and other payments and to apply the funds and revenues of the Company for all or any of those purposes.

38. To empower the Company to purchase or acquire and hold or dispose of shares, stock, mortgages, debentures, debenture stock or other securities of other companies, authorities or bodies.

39. To make new provisions with respect to the holding and use of patent rights by the Company and with respect to the grant of patents to the Company jointly with other persons and the rights and remedies of the joint grantees.

40. To amend in their application to the Company and their undertaking all or some of the provisions of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, with regard to the definition and testing of the calorific value of gas supplied by the Company in cases where the whole or part of the moisture contained in such gas has been extracted by any process.

41. To make new or further provisions as to the prevention of the improper use of gas.

42. The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with its purposes and confer other rights and privileges.

43. To repeal alter or amend all or any of the provisions of the Dudley Gas Act 1853 the Dudley Gas Act 1881 the Town of Dudley Gas (Charges) Order 1923, the Order of 1929 and any other Act or Order relating to the Company or their undertaking.

44. To incorporate with the Order, with or without modification, or to render inapplicable all, or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871, the Lands Clauses Acts and the Companies Clauses Acts, 1845, 1863 and 1869.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 5th day of May, 1930.

Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) The specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) The omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must at the same time be forwarded to the undermentioned Solicitors or Parliamentary Agents.

A copy of the draft Special Order, an Ordnance Map showing the situation of the existing and proposed works of the Company and the boundaries of the existing area of supply and of the added area and an Ordnance Map showing the land to be used for the manufacture and storage of gas and the manufacture and conversion of residual products have been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Stafford at his office at the County Buildings, Stafford with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Worcester at his office at the Shire Hall, Worcester and at the offices of the Company at Spring Gardens, Dudley.

COLCHESTER CORPORATION.

(TRAMWAYS ABANDONMENT.)

Order by the Minister of Transport.

WHEREAS by Section 18 of the Colchester Corporation Act, 1927 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1927") the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Colchester (therein and hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") were authorised to provide and maintain and run omnibuses on the routes therein mentioned.

And whereas it is enacted in Section 16 of the Act of 1927, *inter alia*, as follows:—

"(1) At any time after the passing of this Act the Minister of Transport may by order authorise or require the Corporation to abandon or discontinue temporarily or permanently any of the Corporation's tramways (for the time being) along the route of which the Corporation have provided and equipped or are about to provide and equip trolley vehicles or have provided omnibuses under the provisions of this Act or any Provisional Order made thereunder.

(3) Any order made under the provisions of this section may as from such date as may be specified therein provide for the cesser of all or any of the powers, liabilities, duties or obligations, conferred or imposed upon the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to any tramway to be abandoned or discontinued in pursuance of such order and may provide for the removal of the rails of such tramway from the surface of the road and for the portion of the road upon which such rails were laid to be left in good repair and condition so as to comply with the requirements of Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870."

And whereas in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Section 18 of the Act of 1927 the Corporation have provided omnibuses along the routes of the tramways hereinafter described, authorised by the Colchester Corporation Tramways Orders 1901 and 1905, confirmed respectively by the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1901, and the Tramways Orders Confirmation (No. 2) Act, 1905:— that is to say:—

Tramways authorised by The Colchester Corporation Tramways Order 1901.

Tramway No. 1 (Part of) commencing in High Street at its junction with North Hill

thence passing along High Street and terminating in High Street at a point 20 yards or thereabouts north of the north-east corner of All Saints Church.

Tramway No. 2 commencing in High Street by a junction with Tramway No. 1 at its termination above described passing thence along High Street, Queen Street, St. Botolph Street, Magdalen Street, Barrack Street, Hythe Hill, and terminating at the eastern end of Hythe Hill at a point 20 feet or thereabouts from the nearest rail of the Hythe Quay siding.

Tramway authorised by The Colchester Corporation Tramways Order 1905.

The tramway commencing in Magdalen Street by a junction with the existing tramway in such street at a point 40 yards or thereabouts eastward of the north-eastern corner of Portland Road passing along Military Road and part of Old Heath Road and terminating in Old Heath Road at a point 73 yards or thereabouts south-eastward of the south-east corner of Wimpole Road.

And whereas the Corporation have applied to the Minister of Transport (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") for an Order to authorise the permanent discontinuance and abandonment by them of the tramways hereinbefore described.

Now therefore the Minister in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 16 of the Act of 1927 and of any and every other power thereunto him enabling hereby orders as follows:—

(1) The Corporation may and shall forthwith abandon and discontinue the tramways hereinbefore described and shall with all reasonable despatch remove the rails of the said tramways from the surface of the road and leave the portion of the road upon which such rails are laid in good repair and condition so as to comply with the requirements of Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870.

(2) As from the date of this Order the powers and obligations of the Corporation to run services of cars on the said tramways under the Colchester Corporation Tramways Orders 1901 and 1905 shall cease and as from the date on which the removal of the rails of the said tramways and the restoration of the road upon which the same are laid shall be duly completed all other powers and liabilities duties or obligations conferred or imposed on the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to the said tramways shall cease.

(3) This Order may be cited as the Colchester Corporation (Tramways Abandonment) Order, 1930.
