The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 11th day of March, 1930, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, 11 MARCH, 1930.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend § 23 of Titulus XIX of the Statutes of the University of Oxford as a consequence of the report of the Accountants after the first triennial inspection: NOW THE SAID UNIVERSITY, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY IN COUNCIL, AS FOLLOWS.

1. In Statt. Tit. XIX. § 23. cl. 1 (ii) (*Statuta*, ed. 1929, p. 369), the words "the number of meals supplied by and the amounts credited" shall be struck out and the following words shall be substituted: "and consumed, and the amounts credited in respect thereof."

2. Ibid., cl. 1 (iii), the word "three" shall be struck out and the word "five" shall be substituted:

3. Ibid., cl. 2, the words from "Hall, and other Society" to "and also" shall be struck out and the following words shall be substituted: "and New Foundation, St. Edmund Hall, and"; and at the end of the clause the following words shall be added:—

"When a meeting of the Committee is summoned to deal with the quinquennial inspection aforesaid or business connected with it, only representatives of the Colleges and Societies which are required by this Statute to undergo inspection shall be summoned."

4. Ibid., after cl. 2 the following new clause shall be inserted:—

"3. The Domestic Bursars Committee shall have power to appoint an Advisory Committee consisting of five of its own members, and to give to the Advisory Committee such executive powers in regard to the performance of the duties of the Domestic Bursars' Committee as it may deem expedient."

5. Ibid., cl. 3 (i) and cl. 4, after the word "Colleges" the words "and Residential Societies for Women Students" shall be inserted.

6. Ibid., cl. 3 (ii), the word "third" shall be struck out and the word "fifth" shall be substituted, and the word "three" shall be struck out and the word "five" substituted.

And at the end of the sub-clause the following words shall be added:—

"They shall also inspect and report upon the accounts and catering arrangements of each of the Residential Societies for Women Students, and each of these Societies shall communicate the report of the said Accountants to the Domestic Bursars' Committee and to the Curators of the University Chest."

7. Ibid., cl. 3 (iii) (p. 370), the word "three" shall be struck out and the word "five" shall be substituted.

8. Ibid., cl. 6, after the word "College" the words "and Residential Society for Women Students" shall be inserted, and after the words "These costs" the words "where there is a separate Kitchen department" shall be inserted.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Thursday, the 17th April, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 22nd April, 1930, to Saturday, the 26th April, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

On November 7th, 1929, an explosion accompanied by fire took place in a press house of

the Royal Naval Cordite Factory at Holton Heath. Turner, on hearing the explosion, immediately went towards the press house and as only one worker came out of the building he knew that there would be others left inside. With complete disregard for his own safety he made his way into the Press House which he knew to contain quantities of explosives and was then on fire and found one of the workers unconscious on the floor beneath an accumulation of burning debris. Despite the grave risk of further explosions he pulled the injured man free, extinguished so far as possible his burning clothing and managed to drag him clear of the building. Unfortunately the injuries sustained by the rescued man subsequently proved fatal.

2. This Order may be cited as the Companies (Forms) No. 2 Order, 1929 (Amendment) Order, 1930.

Under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the Administrator by Article 1 (xiv) of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders 1921 to 1923, a rule was made on the 7th day of March, 1923, duly approved by the President of the Board of Trade, prescribing the 30th day of June, 1923, as the final date by which proofs by British nationals of debts due to them by Hungarian nationals or of pecuniary obligations of the

Hungarian Government under Article 231 of the Treaty of Trianon, must be made upon the prescribed forms and lodged with the Department for the Administration of Hungarian Property in order to participate in the distribution of the funds in the hands of the Administrator arising out of the liquidation of the property, rights and interests of nationals of the former Kingdom of Hungary transferred to or vested in him under the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders 1921 to 1923, or any Orders of the Board of Trade made thereunder or received by him from the Hungarian Clearing Office in pursuance of the Convention dated 20th December, 1921, and the Agreement dated 17th October, 1925, between His Majesty's Government and the Hungarian Government respecting the settlement of Enemy debts referred to in Section III of Part X of the above mentioned Treaty, or arising out of any other available property, and it was by the said Rule provided that in any case where it is proved to the satisfaction of the Administrator that the Claimant should have become aware only at a date subsequent to the 1st June, 1923, of the existence or amount of a claim the Administrator might extend the period for lodging the Proof of Claim with the Department until two calendar months after the Claimant should have become aware of the existence and amount of the claim in question.

Now by way of variation of the proviso to the above mentioned Rule and in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Clearing Office and the Administrator as aforesaid I hereby prescribe the 20th day of May, 1930, as the final date in the case of British nationals, whose claims come within the exception contained in the above mentioned proviso, by which proofs of debts due to them by Hungarian nationals or of pecuniary obligations of the Hungarian Government under Article 231 of the Treaty of Trianon must be made upon the prescribed forms and lodged with the Department for the Administration of Hungarian Property in order to participate in the distribution of the funds in my hands arising out of the liquidation of the property, rights and interests of nationals of the former Kingdom of Hungary or otherwise as in the said Rule of the 7th day of March, 1923, particularly mentioned.

“Any worker employed in agriculture in any county on piece work for which no minimum piece rate has been fixed or any person authorised by such a worker may complain to the agricultural wages committee for the county that the piece rate of wages paid to the worker for that work is such a rate as would yield in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker a less amount of wages than the minimum rate for time work applicable in the case of that worker and the committee may, on any such complaint, after giving the employer an opportunity of making such representations as he thinks desirable, direct that the employer shall pay to the worker such additional sum by way of wages for any piece work done by him at that piece rate at any time within fourteen days before the date of complaint or at any time after the date of complaint and before the decision of the committee thereon as in their opinion represents the difference between the amount which would have been paid if the work had been done by an ordinary worker at the minimum rate for time work and the amount actually received by the worker by whom or on whose behalf the complaint is made, and any sum so directed to be paid may be recovered by or on behalf of the worker from the employer summarily as a civil debt.”

(iii) All employment in any week in excess of 60 hours (excluding hours of overtime employment).

In the Southern area:—

(i) All employment after 12 noon on a Saturday.

(ii) All employment (other than time necessarily spent in the immediate care of and attention to horses or stock) on Christmas Day and Good Friday.

(iii) All employment in any week in excess of—

(a) 52½ hours (excluding hours of overtime employment) in the case of workers of 16 years of age or over employed wholly or mainly as stockmen or teamsmen.

(b) 50 hours (excluding hours of overtime employment) in the case of other workers.

For the purpose of this Order the Northern, Eastern and Southern areas are defined as follows:—

Northern Area.—The county boroughs of Blackpool and Preston, the boroughs of Lancaster, Lytham St. Annes and Morecambe and Heysham, the petty sessional divisions of Amounderness, Garstang, Hornby, Kirkham and South Lonsdale, and such parts of the petty sessional divisions of Blackburn and Clitheroe as lie north and west respectively of the river Ribble.

Eastern Area.—The county boroughs of Blackburn, Bolton, Burnley, Bury, Oldham and Rochdale, the boroughs of Accrington, Ashton-under-Lyne, Chorley, Clitheroe, Colne, Darwen, Heywood, Middleton, Mossley and Nelson, the petty sessional divisions of Ashton-under-Lyne, Bolton, Burnley, Bury, Church, Colne, Darwen, Middleton, Oldham, Rossendale and Walton-le-Dale, such parts of the petty sessional

divisions of Blackburn and Clitheroe as lie south and east respectively of the river Ribble, the urban districts of Adlington, Failsworth and Withnell, and the parishes of Anderton, Brindle, Clayton-le-Woods, Cuerden, Duxbury, Heapey, Heath Charnock, Hoghton, Wheelton and Whittle-le-Woods.
