TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 16th May, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 19th May, 1930, to Saturday, the 24th May, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
