WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of March, 1930, (G.H.), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 30 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted that the Admiralty with the approval of Your Majesty in Council, may, from time to time, make free grants of land, part of the lands vested in them by virtue of this Act; for the erection of buildings, and providing conveniences for places of worship, residence of Ministers, education of children or other public purposes (so that any such grant of land does not include any right to the minerals under the land granted, or comprise more than two acres in any one parish):

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the free grant to the Norham and Islandshires Rural District Council of a piece of land measuring 3,650 square yards or thereabouts at present vested in the Admiralty by virtue of the aforesaid Act, for the purpose of widening the Scremerston Station Road, Scremerston, Berwick-on-Tweed."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with 65-33606

the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that the Admiralty shall, from time to time, continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks, and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council dated the 4th November, 1925, a pension at the rate of £138 5s. 5d. a year was granted from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. J. Wakeford, a former Master in the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich:

'And whereas this pension requires a slight

amendment:

"And whereas Mrs. F. M. Crome, a former Established Typist in the Greenwich Hospital Estate Office, Greenwich, retired from the service of Greenwich Hospital on marriage on

the 8th June, 1929:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment of the following pension and marriage gratuity from the funds of Greenwich Hospital:-

(1) to Mr. J. Wakeford, a further pension at the rate of £4 12s. (Four pounds and twelve shillings) per annum as from 1st March, 1929.

(2) to Mrs. F. M. Crome, the payment of a marriage gratuity of £71 4s. 2d. (Seventy-one pounds, four shillings and two pence)".

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we deem it expedient that Non-Commissioned Officers, R.M., qualified and employed as Royal Marine Signalling Instructors afloat, should receive extra duty

pay:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of extra duty pay at the rate of 6d. a day to all Royal Marine Signalling Instructors allowed in complements affoat, such payment only to be made for actual days of employment on instructional duty.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by Section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, power is given to His Majesty by Order in Council to make Regulations as to the manner in which Government ships may be registered as British ships under the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by the said Section, it is provided that those Acts shall, subject to any exceptions or modifications which may be made by Order in Council, either generally, or, as respects any special class of Government ships, apply to Government ships registered in accordance with such Regulations as if they were registered in manner provided by those Acts:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been

complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act, or otherwise, in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following Regulations shall have effect as regards any Government ships in the service of the Government of Northern Ireland:-

- 1. An application for registry of a Government ship in the service of the Government of Northern Ireland shall be made in writing under the hand of the Secretary or one of the Assistant Secretaries of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as the Ministry). Such application shall contain the following particulars:-
 - (i) A statement of the name and description of the ship.
 - (ii) A statement of the time when, and place where, the ship was built; or, if the ship was foreign built and the time and place of building are unknown, a statement to that effect, and of her foreign name.
 - (iii) A statement of the nature of the title to the said ship, whether by original construction by or for the Government of Northern Ireland, or by purchase or otherwise, and a list of the documents of title, if any, in case she was not originally constructed by or for the Government of Northern Ireland.
 - (iv) A statement of the name of the Master.
- 2. The Registrar, on receiving such application in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Government of Northern
- (i) enter the ship in the Register Book as belonging to the Government of Northern Ireland and shall also enter therein

- (ii) the name of the port to which she belongs;
- (iii) the particulars stated in the application for registration;
- (iv) the details comprised in the Surveyor's Certificate.
- 3. On the registry of a Government ship in the service of the Government of Northern Ireland, the Registrar shall retain in his possession the Surveyor's Certificate, the application for registry, and any documents of title mentioned in such application.
- 4. Upon the transfer of a registered Government ship in the service of the Government of Northern Ireland by Bill of Sale, the Ministry shall be the transferors and the Bill of Sale shall be in Form A. in the proper form prescribed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, hereinafter called the Principal Act, omitting the covenant therein contained. Any such Bill of Sale shall be signed by the Secretary or by one of the Assistant Secretaries of the Ministry on behalf of the Government of Northern Ireland.
- 5. The application for a Certificate of Sale referred to in Sections 39 to 42 and Sections 44 to 46 of the Principal Act may be made in respect of a Government ship in the service of the Government of Northern Ireland by the Ministry.
- 6. The person to whom the management of any Government ship in the service of the Government of Northern Ireland is entrusted by the Government of Northern Ireland shall be registered as provided by Section 59 (2) of the Principal Act.
- 7. Where any section of the Merchant Shipping Acts which, by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order in Council, is applicable to Government ships in the service of the Government of Northern Ireland imposes any duty or liability or confers any right or power upon or contemplates any act being performed by the owner of a ship, such duty, liability, right or power shall, subject always to the other provisions of this Order in Council, be carried out, borne or exercised by the Government of Northern Ireland on behalf of His Majesty.
- 8. In this Order in Council the term Merchant Shipping Acts shall mean and include any of the Merchant Shipping Acts any provision of which is by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order, applicable to Government ships.
- 9. Section 1 and Sections 8 to 12 of the Principal Act shall not apply to Government ships in the service of the Government of Northern Ireland registered in pursuance of the provisions of this Order in Council.

Provided always that no provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which, according to a reasonable construction, would not apply in the case of Government ships in the service of the Government of Northern Ireland shall be deemed to apply to such ships by reason only that its application is not hereby expressly excluded.

10. Anything required or authorised by this Order in Council to be done by the Government of Northern Ireland may be done by the Secretary or by one of the Assistant Secretaries of the Ministry.

WHEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (which is a Section in Part XI of that Act), it is (among other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities, on account of the services of lighthouses, buoys and beacons, or the annual or other sums to be paid out of the Mercantile Marine Fund in respect of those establishments:

And whereas by Section 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is (among other things) enacted that where His Majesty has power under that Act or any Act thereafter to be passed amending the same, to make an Order in Council, His Majesty may from time to time make that Order in Council and by Order in Council revoke alter or add to any Order so made:

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (among other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas by Order in Council made on the 12th day of March, 1923, the establishment to be maintained by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses being one of the general lighthouse authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the salaries to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund in respect of that establishment were duly fixed:

And whereas by Order in Council made on the 12th day of August, 1924, certain annual or other sums to be paid to the holders at that time of the posts of Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent over and above the sums payable to them under the said Order in Council dated the 12th day of March, 1923, were duly fixed:

And whereas the holder of the post of Superintendent at the date of the last recited Order in Council has since retired and the holder at that time of the post of Assistant Superintendent has been promoted in his stead:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order in Council dated the 12th day of August, 1924, should be revoked and that such additional annual sums payable to the present holder of the post of Superintendent as are hereinafter provided should be fixed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the said Order in Council dated the 12th day of March, 1923, Mr. John Vass at present the holder of the post of Superintendent mentioned in the Second Schedule to the said Order may be paid as from the 17th October, 1929, an annual allowance of £100 over and above the scale of salary specified for that post in the said schedule, such annual allowance to carry cost of living bonus on the usual scale but not to count for the purpose of calculating the superannuation allowance or compensation to which he may be entitled on discharge or retirement. This annual allowance is authorised in view of the undesirability of revising the Superintendent's scale of salary at the present time and in view of the important nature of the duties now performed by Mr. Vass.

2. The sums payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General

Lighthouse Fund.

3. The Order in Council made on the 12th day of August, 1924, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as the Northern Lighthouse Board (Establishment) Order, 1930.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of February, 1930, in the words and figures

following, that is to say:-

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Chignal Smealy and the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Chignal, Saint James and Saint Mary, with Mashbury, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Chignal Smealy and Chignal, Saint James and Saint Mary, with Mashbury, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chelmsford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chelmsford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended

in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Chignal Smealy and Chignal, Saint James and Saint Mary, with Mashbury, are now full, the Reverend Alexander William Oliphant Murray being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Chignal Smealy and the Reverend Lester Charles Blower being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Chignal, Saint James and Saint Mary, with Mashbury:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford (in

testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Chignal Smealy and the said Benefice of Chignal, Saint James and Saint Mary, with Mashbury, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of The Chignals with Mashbury' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Chignal Smealy shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Chignal, Saint James and Saint Mary, with Mashbury, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Chignal, Saint James and Saint Mary, with Mashbury, shall have the first and the third turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Chignal Smealy shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England,

or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said

Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections, have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Chelmsford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chelmsford.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 20th day of February, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Alton Pancras and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Piddletrenthide, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices

Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Alton Pancras and Piddletrenthide duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the said Benefice of Piddletrenthide and the Parish of the Benefice of Piddlehinton situate in the said County and Diocese, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Alton Pancras and Piddletrenthide are now full, the Reverend Percy Temple Phillipps Knott being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Alton Pancras and the Reverend Richard Lawrance Boyer being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Piddletrenthide:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Alton Pancras and the said Benefice of Piddletrenthide shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Piddletrenthide with Alton Pancras' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Bere Regis, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue

distinct in all respects. "2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, The union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Alton Pancras only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Piddletrenthide and the then Incumbent of Alton Pancras shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Piddletrenthide only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Alton Pancras and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Alton Pancras if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Piddletrenthide shall have been instituted to Piddletrenthide subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted

to the said Benefice of Piddletrenthide before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Piddletrenthide following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Alton Pancras and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Alton Pancras shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Piddletrenthide shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, and the first turn of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union shall belong to the Patrons of that one of the said two Benefices of Alton Pancras and Piddletrenthide an Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

"5. That with the consent of the Provost and Fellows of the College Royal of the Blessed Mary at Eton near unto Windsor, as Patrons of the said Benefice of Piddlehinton (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Collegiate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend William George Newman, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Piddlehinton (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect all that southern part of the said Parish of Piddletrenthide including the area or locality known as White Lackington (all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured pink) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Piddlehinton, but no alteration in the Patronage or endowments of either of the Benefices thereby affected shall be made by reason of such transfer of territory.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical

Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:
