“Whereas by the twentieth section of an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Her late Majesty's reign, Chapter 89, entitled ‘The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865,’ it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Admiralty shall, from time to time, continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

“And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 14th July, 1921, it was directed that the scale of salary attached to the appointment of Director of Greenwich Hospital should be at the rate of £1,200 a year as from the 15th July, 1921:

“And whereas the present holder of the post, Mr. Arthur William Smallwood, C.B.E., has been called upon to undertake greatly increased responsibilities in connection with the building of the new Greenwich Hospital

School and the arrangements for the transfer of the present School:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize the payment to the present Director of Greenwich Hospital of an increased salary at the rate of £1,500 a year as from the 1st April, 1930, this increase to be personal to the present holder.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following proviso shall be inserted at the end of paragraph 1 of Schedule VI to the principal Order:—

"Provided that, where the aircraft has been previously registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Secretary of State is satisfied—

(a) that the certificate of registration last issued in respect of the aircraft lapsed by

reason of the sale of the aircraft by the registered owner; and

(b) that the registered owner of the aircraft immediately before the sale was the constructor thereof or a dealer in aircraft; and

(c) that the aircraft has not been flown since a certificate of registration was last issued in respect thereof, except for the purpose of—

(i) an experiment or test carried out in the ordinary course of construction or in order to obtain a certificate of airworthiness; or

(ii) a demonstration to a prospective purchaser; or

(iii) delivering the aircraft to a purchaser;

the fee chargeable for the issue of the certificate shall be five shillings."

2. The following paragraphs shall be substituted for paragraph 6 of Schedule VI to the principal Order:—

"6. Subject to the provisions of this paragraph and paragraph 6s of this Schedule, the fees chargeable in respect of the grant of licences for personnel shall be in accordance with the following table—

(a) where an applicant for a licence of any description has previously been medically examined for a licence of any other description for which a similar standard of medical fitness is prescribed, the fee chargeable for official medical examination (if required) shall be 10s. 6d.;

(b) where an applicant for a pilot's licence in respect of flying machines under paragraph 4 of Schedule V to this Order

is qualified as a Royal Air Force Pilot and is granted exemption from flying test under paragraph 5 of that Schedule conditionally upon the satisfactory completion of a special flying test, the fee chargeable for official flying test shall be £1 1s. 0d.

6A. Subject to the provisions of the next following paragraph, the fees chargeable in respect of the renewal of licences for personnel shall be in accordance with the following table:—

Where an applicant for the grant or renewal of any licence referred to in paragraph 6 of this Schedule is not required to pass any particular part of the appropriate technical examination or official flying test by reason of his having passed that part on some previous application or for any other reason, the fee chargeable for the technical examination or official flying test, as the case may be, may be reduced by such amount as the Secretary of State may think proper in the circumstances of the case.

6c. The fee chargeable in respect of the issue or renewal of a licence for a competent person under paragraph 11 of Schedule II to this Order shall be 5s. for technical examination and 5s. for the licence.

6d. The fee chargeable for the issue of a master pilot's certificate shall be 10s."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 27th March, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Paul, Gloucester, partly out of the Parish of Hempsted and partly out of the Parish of Matson, all situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, the said Parish of Hempsted and the said Parish of Matson are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, of the said Parish of Hempsted, and of the said Parish of Matson, which are mentioned and described in the Schedule to

this Scheme and are delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of June, 1927, and published in the London Gazette on the 5th day of the following month provision has been made for the union into one Benefice of the Benefice of Saint Aldate, Gloucester, the Benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Gloucester, the Benefice of Saint Mary de Crypt with All Saints, and Saint Owen, Gloucester, and the Benefice of Saint Michael with Saint Mary de Grace, Gloucester, all in the said County and Diocese, and it was by the same Order provided, amongst other things, that out of the annual stipend payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Gloucester, a sum of £100 per annum shall upon such union taking effect be applied to the endowment of a proposed ecclesiastical district at Tuffley to be constituted wholly or partly out of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted is the District for which such endowment will be applied as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act grants of £180 per annum and of £120 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grants of the said yearly sum of £180 and of the said yearly sum of £120 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by Instruments to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas it is provided by the said Order in Council dated the 27th day of June, 1927, that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District shall be vested in the Bishop of Gloucester for the time being:

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, of the said Parish of Hempsted, and of the said Parish of Matson, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your

Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Barnabas, Tuffley,' and that the said District shall ultimately be endowed in the manner which is contemplated by the said Order in Council dated the 27th day of June, 1927.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said lastly mentioned Order in Council, be vested in and exercised by the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Barnabas, Tuffley, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Paul, Gloucester, of the Parish of Hempsted, and of the Parish of Matson, all in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Bowly Road and Linden Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Linden Road for a distance of 20½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Calton Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Calton Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Tweenbrook Avenue, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Tweenbrook Avenue for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stroud Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Stroud Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Clevedon Road, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of such footpath (thereby passing under the Bristol and Birmingham Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway) for a distance in all of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading to Northfield Road, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the middle of the last mentioned footpath (thereby crossing the Gloucester Branch Line of the Great Western Railway) for a distance of 24 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the north western side of Northfield Road, and extending thence first south eastward to and then south westward along the middle of Northfield Road for a distance in all of 6½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Selwyn Road, and extending thence first south eastward and then southward along the middle of Selwyn Road for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Reservoir Road, where the

boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, of a detached portion of the Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester, in the said County and Diocese and of a detached portion of the said Parish of Matson, all meet, and extending thence southward along the boundary which divides the said detached portion of the Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester, from the said detached portion of the Parish of Matson for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the boundary which divides the said detached portion of the Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, and extending thence first eastward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary and also along the boundaries which divide a detached portion of the said Parish of Hempsted, the said Parish of Matson, and the Parish of Whaddon, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester (thereby crossing Stroud Road, the Gloucester Branch Line of the Great Western Railway and the Bristol and Birmingham Branch Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway, and following in part the middle of Tuffley Lane) for a distance in all of 2 miles and 6 chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of Tuffley Lane where the boundaries of the said Parish of Whaddon, of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, and of the said Parish of Hempsted all meet, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Tuffley Lane (thereby following in one part the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hempsted from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, and in another part the boundary which divides a detached portion of the Parish of Quedgeley, in the said County and Diocese, from the said Parish of Hempsted) for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Podsmead Road, and extending thence northward to and along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 43½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the New Docks Branch Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway across such footpath, upon the boundary which divides the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke the Less, Gloucester (of which the Church is now known as the Church of Saint Stephen) in the said County and Diocese from the said Parish of Hempsted, and extending thence north eastward along the last mentioned boundary and along the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke the Less, Gloucester, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, for a distance in all of 22½ chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary diverges north westward along the middle of the road called Tuffley Avenue, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Tuffley Avenue for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bowly Road and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Bowly Road for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Linden Road, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the

secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of Murston save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz. :—

MURSTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Murston Old Parish Churchyard, in the said Parish, and in the part of the Old Church now in existence.

Provided that in the earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard in which the remains of Thomas de la Prise are interred, the burial may be allowed at her decease of the body of Emilie de la Prise, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, 6TH MAY, 1930.

WHEREAS it is expedient to assign to the Congregation of the University certain duties and functions at present performed by Convocation under the Statutes of the University of Oxford: NOW THE SAID UNIVERSITY, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, AS FOLLOWS.

The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal to present The Rev. Charles Gough Littlehales, M.A., to the Vicarage of St. Andrew, Allensmore, in the County of Hereford and Diocese of Hereford, void by the death of the last Incumbent and in His Majesty's Gift in full right.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London on the 11th March and concluded on the 7th May, 1930, the following Verdicts of the Pyx Jury were delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz. :—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the Eleventh day of March One thousand nine hundred and Thirty, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January One thousand nine hundred and Twenty-nine to the 31st day of December One thousand nine hundred and Twenty-nine, both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of silver coins, making altogether 2 crowns, 82 half-crowns, 68 florins, 70 shillings, 76 sixpences, 4 fourpences, 3 threepences, 4 twopences and 3 pennies. We then weighed each one pound troy weight (at its standard weight) of the coins so taken out and ascertained that the said coins so bulked were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We then took

for assay one pound troy (at its standard weight) of the coins so weighed comprising 1 crown, 10 half-crowns, 10 florins, 10 shillings, 10 sixpences, 1 fourpence, 1 threepence, 2 twopences and 1 penny, and we ascertained that the amount of variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920 was, for such pound so taken for assay plus three thousandths (+.003) of an ounce on the whole, and that, therefore, such pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was on the whole within the variation from standard weight so allowed. We then assayed separately the coins in the pound troy so taken for assay, comparing them with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said coins was on the whole within the remedy as to fineness prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus two ten thousandths (—0002) on the whole of the coins in such pound, and that, therefore, the said pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was, on the whole, within the variation from fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the said packets of silver coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the remedy as to weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, being Five hundred and seventy-five thousandths of an ounce (—575) below the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts.

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PRETORIA BRANCH MINT.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the Eleventh day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the city of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Pretoria in the Union of South Africa, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the First day of January One thousand nine hundred and Twenty-nine to the Thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, both days inclusive. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us and that such number corresponded with the number which the officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we

took out one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to 121 sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed separately each of the said coins so taken out, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight so prescribed was plus one thousandth of an ounce (+·001 oz) on the whole of such coins. We then melted all the said gold coins so taken out and separately weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Trial Plate of gold produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said ingot was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus three hundred thousandths (or -·00003), and that therefore the said metal was within the remedy as to fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the said coins remaining in the said packets of gold coins, and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920, being eighteen thousandths (-·018) of an ounce below the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts. We then took from such residue five sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 123·286 grains, the second 123·283 grains, the third 123·227 grains, the fourth 123·222 grains, the fifth 123·140 grains, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively the first twelve thousandths of a grain above (+·012), the second nine thousandths of a grain above (+·009), the third forty seven thousandths of a grain below (-·047), the fourth fifty two thousandths of a grain below (-·052), the fifth one hundred and thirty four thousandths of a grain below (-·134), the standard weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920.

We then assayed the said five sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916·72, the second 916·53, the third 916·63, the fourth 916·76, the fifth 916·57, and that therefore the said sovereigns were respectively,—the first six hundred-thousandths above (+·00006), the second thirteen hundred-thousandths below (-·00013), the third three hundred thousandths below (-·00003), the fourth ten hundred thousandths above (+·00010), the fifth nine hundred-thousandths below (-·00009), the standard fineness prescribed as aforesaid.

VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the Eleventh day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the city of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Perth in the State of Western Australia, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the First day of January One thousand nine hundred and Twenty-nine to the Thirty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, both days inclusive. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us and that such number corresponded with the number which the officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took out two coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to 36 sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and we weighed separately each of the said coins so taken out, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight so prescribed was nil of an ounce (nil oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted all the said gold coins so taken out and separately weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Trial Plate of gold produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said ingot was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus twelve hundred-thousandths (or -·00012), and that therefore the said metal was within the remedy as to fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1920.
