WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of April, 1930 (C.W. 11341/29), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council dated 12th August, 1924, to sanction, inter alia, a revised scale of retired pay for Quartermasters, Royal Marines, and the application of such scale to Directors of Music, Royal Marines, and the Musical Director, Royal Naval School of Music subject to the special conditions regarding length of service prescribed by Order in Council dated 10th June, 1921:

"And whereas it is considered necessary to define more fully the conditions under which Directors of Music and the Musical Director, Royal Naval School of Music, shall be eligible for retired pay on the Quartermasters' scale:

"And whereas we are of opinion that provision should be made for the award of retired pay to Directors of Music and the Musical Director, Royal Naval School of Music, if invalided after less than 15 years' service:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

"1. Directors of Music and the Musical Director of the Royal Naval School of Music to be eligible for Retired Pay on the scale laid down for Quartermasters, Royal Marines, subject to the following conditions:—

(a) In the case of Officers promoted from the ranks or with previous Marine, Army or Royal Air Force service, 15 years' total service to be required before they are permitted to enter the Quartermasters' scale, but all who had 15 years' total service in the ranks and with commissions, to enter the scale at the rate appropriate to their rank and length of commissioned service: the counting of previous service to be subject to such service being allowed to reckon for pension purposes under the Regulations applicable to the Force in which it was rendered.

(b) In the case of Officers entered from civil life on and after the date of this Order, 15 years' service to be required before they enter the Quartermasters' scale; on attaining 15 years' service such Officers to enter at the minimum rate, to receive increments of £6 per annum in respect of each year of service from the 16th to the 22nd inclusive, an increment of £8 for the 23rd year of service and thereafter increments of £10 for each subsequent year of service, subject, however, to the provisos-

(i) that no Officer of the rank of Lieutenant should receive retired pay in excess

of £300 a year,

(ii) that no Officer of the rank of Captain should receive retired pay in

excess of £350 a year, and

(iii) that increments beyond £350 should not begin to accrue until promotion to the rank of Major for which the maximum should be £400 a year.

(c) Officers with previous Army or Royal Air Force service, entered on or after the date of this Order, if granted a pension from Army or Royal Air Force Funds, to relinquish such pensions as from the date of appointment to the Royal Marines, and to count their previous Army or Royal Air Force service for Naval retired pay purposes as in clause (a) above, if the rate of pension is thereby increased; if not, payment of Army or Royal Air Force pension to be resumed on final retirement from the Royal Marines.

The counting of previous service to be subject to such service being allowed to reckon for pension purposes under the Regulations applicable to the Force in which it was rendered.

- "2. Directors of Music and the Musical Director of the Royal Naval School of Music to be eligible for retired pay under the follow-ing regulations if invalided before completing the service requisite to qualify them for retired pay under the provisions of Clause 1:
 - "I. Officers promoted from the ranks and Officers with previous service in the Army or Royal Air Force, which is allowed to reckon under Rule 1 (a) or (c).
 - (a) If invalided for a non-attributable cause to receive retired pay on the following scale:

- (a) If invalided for a non-attributable cause before completing 5 years' service to be ineligible for retired pay.
- (b) If invalided for a non-attributable cause after completing 5, but before completing 15 years' service to be eligible for retired pay at the rate of £15 for each complete year of service.
- (c) If invalided for a cause attributable to the conditions of service before completing 5 years' service to be granted disability retired pay on the following scale:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Francis Reginald James (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Presteigne with Discoyd, now vested in him, the said Francis Reginald James, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and his successors in the said Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Martin Linton, Bishop of Hereford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters afore-Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late | said, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 2nd May, 1930, he made an Order under Section 7 of the Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1916, for securing the welfare of the workers employed in all factories and workshops, or parts thereof, in which are carried on the processes of liming and tanning of raw hides and skins (including the re-tanning of tanned or partly tanned hides and skins) and processes incidental thereto.

A draft of this Order was issued in August last, and certain objections lodged against the draft were referred, in pursuance of the statutory procedure, to Sir Harold Morris, K.C., as Referee, for settlement. The Report of the Referee has now been received and the Order as finally made by the Secretary of State is based on that Report.

This Order, which may be cited as the Tanning Welfare Order, 1930, will come into force on 1st July, 1930, from which date the Order made by the Secretary of State on the 22nd March, 1918, for factories or parts of factories in which bichromate of potassium or sodium is used in tanning by the "two bath" process, will be revoked in so far as it affects factories or parts of factories to which the new Order applies.

DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS, 1877 to 1927.

IMPORTATION OF RAW CHERRIES ORDER OF 1930.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the above Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit the landing in England or Wales after the 5th June of Italian cherries except those grown in the Region of Emilia. After the 16th June the importation of cherries grown in any part of Italy is entirely prohibited. Consignments imported between the 6th and 16th June must be accompanied by certificates issued by the Italian Phytopathological Service.

After the 3rd June the landing in England or Wales of cherries grown in the southern part of France is prohibited, and after the 9th June of those grown in the central area. After the 6th July the importation of cherries grown in France is prohibited except of those grown within a small district in the North. These areas are defined in the Schedule to the Order. Consignments imported after the 4th June must be accompanied by certificates issued by the French Phytopathological Service.

French Phytopathological Service.

Cherries imported from other European countries after the 5th June must be accompanied by certificates of origin.

The certificates prescribed in the Order must be delivered to the Officer of Customs and Excise with the entry relating to the consignment.

Cherries landed without the certificates prescribed in the Order must be destroyed at the expense of the importer unless they are reexported or are disposed of in accordance with the terms of a licence issued by an Inspector of the Ministry.

An Inspector may enter any premises and open, examine and take samples of any cherries shipped or believed to have been shipped from any European country; any person wilfully obstructing or impeding an Inspector in the exercise of these powers, or failing to comply with the provisions relating to destruction or re-exportation, or with the terms of a licence, is liable to a penalty of £10, or in respect of

a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty of
