“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in

Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Stawley and the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Bathealton with Kittisford, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Stawley and Bathealton with Kittisford duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bath and Wells and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bath and Wells signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“And whereas the said Benefice of Bathealton with Kittisford is now full, the Reverend John Walker being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Stawley is at present vacant:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has

signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said John Walker (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Stawley and the said Benefice of Bathealton with Kittisford shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bathealton with Stawley and Kittisford,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said John Walker if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bathealton with Kittisford shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That at any time and from time to time after the Union has taken effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice if the Bishop shall so require such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of £75 in any one year.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bathealton with Kittisford shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stawley and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of five successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Stawley shall have the second turn and the alternate Patrons of the said Benefice of Bathealton with Kittisford shall have the first, the third, the fourth and the fifth turns in the same order as between themselves as they are now entitled in respect of presentation or nomination to the said Benefice of Bathealton with Kittisford.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

Bishop of Birmingham and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Birmingham signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Elmdon and Bickenhill are now full, the Reverend Canon Harrison Goodenough Hayter being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Elmdon and the Reverend George Hood being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bickenhill:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Elmdon and the said Benefice of Bickenhill shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bickenhill with Elmdon' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Elmdon only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Bickenhill and the then Incumbent of Elmdon shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Bickenhill only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Elmdon and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Elmdon if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Bickenhill shall have been instituted to Bickenhill subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Bickenhill before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Bickenhill following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Elmdon and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Elmdon shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bickenhill shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently

may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Elmdon and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"4. “ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Exeter, Saint Lawrence, and Exeter, Saint Stephen with Saint Martin, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Exeter, Saint Lawrence, and Exeter, Saint Stephen with Saint Martin, are now full being held in plurality by the Reverend Prebendary Edgar Hay Hay under the authority of a Dispensation:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Exeter, Saint Lawrence, and Exeter, Saint Stephen with Saint Martin, now belongs to one and the same Patron:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Edgar Hay Hay (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence, and the said Benefice of Exeter, Saint Stephen with Saint Martin, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Exeter, Saint Lawrence with Saint Stephen and Saint Martin,’ and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

“ 2. That the Church of the Parish of Exeter, Saint Lawrence, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the

Table of Fees for the said Parish of Exeter, Saint Lawrence, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

“ 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Edgar Hay Hay if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Exeter, Saint Lawrence, and Exeter, Saint Stephen with Saint Martin, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Exeter, Saint Lawrence, and Exeter, Saint Stephen with Saint Martin, shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

“ 4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Churches of Saint Stephen and Saint Martin, Exeter, respectively, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Newington next Hythe (hereinafter referred to as the said Benefice of Newington) and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Cheriton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury and for altering the boundaries of the Parishes of the said Benefice of Newington and of the Benefices of Hythe Saint Leonard, Lyminge with Paddlesworth, Saltwood, Lympne and Falconhurst otherwise Fawkenhurst or Hurst, all in the said County and Diocese:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the re-arrangement of the said Benefices of Newington, Cheriton, Hythe Saint Leonard, Lyminge with Paddlesworth and the Benefice of Sandgate, in the said County and Diocese duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of Canterbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Newington and Cheriton and the terms for effecting the union including the transfer of portions of the said Parish of Newington to the said Parishes of Hythe Saint Leonard, Lyminge with Paddlesworth, Falconhurst otherwise Fawkenhurst or Hurst and Lympne respectively and the transfer of a portion of the said Parish of Saltwood to the said Parish of Hythe Saint Leonard and the said Archbishop of Canterbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alterations of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Newington and Cheriton are now full, the Reverend Frederick John Pickard being the

present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newington and the Reverend Frederick Stanley Fischer being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Cheriton:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Newington and Cheriton now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Newington and the said Benefice of Cheriton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Cheriton with Newington ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices of Newington and Cheriton shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices of Newington and Cheriton shall, be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices of Newington and Cheriton shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices of Newington and Cheriton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices of Newington and Cheriton be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices of Newington and Cheriton if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices of Newington and Cheriton shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices of Newington and Cheriton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and that the stipend to be assigned to the Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £250 per annum as the Archbishop of Canterbury may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Archbishop of Canterbury shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Sub-section (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

“ 4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Cheriton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of

the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Newington and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"5. That with the consent of the Patron of the said Benefice of Saltwood namely the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, in right of his See (which consent is testified as aforesaid), with the consent of the Patron of the said Benefice of Falconhurst otherwise Fawkenhurst or Hurst namely Richard Harry Green, of The Warren, Willesborough, Ashford, in the said County of Kent, Esquire (which consent is testified by his signing this Scheme), and with the consent of the Patron of the said Benefice of Lympne namely the Venerable Edward Hoare Hardcastle, Archdeacon of Canterbury, in right of his Archdeaconry (which consent is testified by his signing this Scheme), and with the consents of the Incumbents of the Benefices affected namely the said Frederick John Pickard, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newington, the Reverend Charles William Chastel de Boinville, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hythe Saint Leonard, the Reverend Duncan Gordon Macpherson now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saltwood, the Right Reverend Bishop Arthur Mesac Knight, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lyminge with Paddlesworth, the Reverend Henry Davenport Rice, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Falconhurst otherwise Fawkenhurst or Hurst, and the Reverend George Herbert Green, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lympne (all which consents are testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme,

"(a) all that detached portion of the said Parish of Newington which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say upon the west by the said Parish of Hythe Saint Leonard, upon the north west by the said Parish of Saltwood, upon the east by the Parish of the said Benefice of Cheriton and upon the south by the sea, shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Hythe Saint Leonard;

That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Elm only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Buckland Dinham and the then Incumbent of Elm shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Buckland Dinham only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Elm and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Elm if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Buckland Dinham shall have been instituted to Buckland Dinham subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Buckland Dinham before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Buckland Dinham following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Elm and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Elm shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Buckland Dinham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Elm and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such

manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as to one moiety for the benefit of the Benefice of Godney and as to the other moiety for the benefit of the Benefice of Pill, both in the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Elm having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Buckland Dinham having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"5. That upon the union taking effect a part of the endowment and property of the United Benefice, that is to say, a sum of £1,333 6s. 8d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock (being part of a larger sum of such Stock now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the said Benefice of Elm) shall be excepted out of the union and shall be appropriated and applied by us for and towards the augmentation of the said Benefices of Godney and Pill respectively in equal shares.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bath and Wells has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions

of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Emmanuel, Streatham, partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Mitcham, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Barnabas, Mitcham, all in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark:

“Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Mitcham, and the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Mitcham, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the

particular portions of the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Mitcham, and of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Mitcham, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

“And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £5,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

“And whereas the said Capital sum of £5,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £5,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us John Henry Buxton, of Easneye, Ware, in the County of Hertford, Esquire, the Venerable Robert Charles Joynt, of Number 12, Kingswood Road, Norwood, in the said County of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders, Archdeacon of Kingston-upon-Thames, and a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, the Reverend Arthur Blackwell Goulburn Lillingston, of the College, Durham, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Durham, Sir Thomas Walker Hobart Inskip, of Number 3, Hare Court, Temple, in the City of London, Knight, C.B.E., one of Your Majesty's Counsel, the Reverend Theodore Charles Chapman, of Number 24, Canynge Square, Clifton, in the City of Bristol, Clerk in Holy Orders, Sir Samuel Roberts, of Queen's Tower, Sheffield, in the County of York, Baronet, a Member of the Commons House of Parliament, and the Reverend Herbert William Hinde, of the Vicarage, Islington, London, N., Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London (commonly known as the Patronage Trustees of the Church

Pastoral Aid Society) as the persons to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Mitcham, and of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Mitcham, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of the Holy Redeemer, Streatham Vale.'

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of the Holy Redeemer, Streatham Vale, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Emmanuel, Streatham, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Mitcham, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Barnabas, Mitcham, all in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark, which, taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the centre

Matthew, Croydon, of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Croydon, and of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, South End, Croydon, and of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Croydon, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the Parish of Croydon, in the said County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Canterbury; (secondly) all that portion of the said Parish of Croydon which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Croydon; (thirdly) all that portion of the said Parish of Croydon which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured blue shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Croydon;

(fourthly) all that portion of the said Parish of Croydon, which is described in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured brown shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Broad Green, Croydon; (fifthly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, which is described in the Fifth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured yellow shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon; and (sixthly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, and of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Croydon, in the said County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Canterbury, which are described in the Sixth Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parish and Consolidated Chapelry respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be restored to the Parish of Croydon, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury, being:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish of Saint Peter, South End, Croydon, in the said County and Diocese, which forms part of the Haling Park Estate and which has been acquired by the Whitgift Foundation as a site and grounds for the proposed new Whitgift Grammar School.

"II. "All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, which is bounded upon the south and upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, at the junction of Cherry Orchard Road with Cedar Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Cedar Road for a distance of 21 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lebanon Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Lebanon Road for a distance of 11½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Addiscombe Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, from the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon.

"The Sixth Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, being:—

"I. All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, which is bounded upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south east and upon the south west, by an imaginary line commencing at the centre of the bridge which carries Addiscombe Road across the said Woodside and South Croydon line of the Southern Railway where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, the District of Saint Mildred, Addiscombe, in the said County and Diocese, and the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, all meet, and extending thence south westward along the middle of such line of railway for a distance

of 32½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the middle of the road called Park Hill Rise, and extending thence first north westward and then northward along the middle of Park Hill Rise for a distance of 33½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Addiscombe Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe.

"II. And also all that portion of the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Croydon, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the south east and upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, upon the north west by the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Croydon, at the junction of Cherry Orchard Road with Lower Addiscombe Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Lower Addiscombe Road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Leslie Park Road upon the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Croydon, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe.

"III. And also all that other portion of the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Croydon, which is bounded upon the south east and upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north west and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Croydon, at a point in the middle of Lower Addiscombe Road opposite to the wall dividing the property known as Kendal House from the property known as No. 73, Lower Addiscombe Road, and extending thence north eastward to and along such wall, and along the wall forming the south eastern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the south eastern side of Morland Road (which in part forms the north western boundary of the houses and premises situate on the north western side of Warren Road) for a distance in all of 19 chains or thereabouts to the fence forming the south western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 13, Amberley Grove, and extending thence first south eastward along such last mentioned fence and then north eastward along the fence forming the south eastern boundary of the same house and premises for a distance in all of 3 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence dividing such house and premises from the house and premises known as Number 14, Amberley Grove, and extending thence in a straight line due south east for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Mid Kent Line of the Southern Railway upon the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Croydon, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of All Souls College, in the University of Oxford, on the 17th day of May, 1930, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

ALL SOULS COLLEGE, OXFORD.

AMENDMENT TO STATUTES.

WHEREAS the University of Oxford Commissioners under and by virtue of all and every the powers in that behalf enabling them contained in the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, did, by an Instrument under their Seal, dated the 4th day of February, 1925, approve certain Statutes thereunto annexed for your Petitioners who are therein described as "The College of the Souls of All Faithful People deceased in the University of Oxford."

And whereas such Statutes were approved by His Majesty King George the Fifth in Council on the 25th day of June, 1925.

And whereas at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for that purpose, and held on the 1st day of March, 1930, it was unanimously resolved, by those present and voting at the Meeting, that the alterations in and additions to the said Statutes hereinafter specified should be made (that is to say):—

That Clauses 9 and 10 of Statute III be repealed and that there be substituted therefor a new Clause 9 to be in the words and figures following, namely:—

"The Warden and Fellows may from time to time elect to Research Fellowships of Class A persons who have done valuable

work in letters or science or who have attained special distinction in some branch of knowledge and to Research Fellowships of Class B persons who are well qualified to engage in original research.

"Election to both these classes shall be subject to the condition that Research Fellows shall undertake to perform some definite literary or scientific work in the College or in the University or with the permission of the College elsewhere, which work shall be specified in the Resolution by which they are elected.

"Such Fellows shall be elected for a period of seven years. Research Fellows of Class A and (in exceptional circumstances) Research Fellows of Class B may be re-elected for further periods of seven years. No Research Fellow shall hold his Fellowship after the age of sixty-five years unless the Warden and Fellows shall resolve by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting to extend the tenure of his Fellowship for a further period of not more than five years.

"Research Fellows of Class A shall receive a fixed annual emolument of £1,000 inclusive of allowances (except the table allowance hereinafter mentioned) and Research Fellows of Class B shall receive a fixed annual emolument of £500 inclusive as aforesaid.

"In making any such Election, the Warden and Fellows may impose any conditions, limiting or directory, as to teaching or other work to be undertaken by the Fellow."

That in Clause 23 of the said Statute there shall be inserted immediately after the words "for the time being" the following words: "or if any Research Fellow shall fail to comply bona fide with the conditions of his election"

That Clauses 11 to 23 of the said Statute (both inclusive) shall be re-numbered as Clauses 10 to 22.

That in Statute IV, Clause 1, the provision in regard to the Drummond Professor of Political Economy shall be repealed and the following provision substituted therefor:

"In respect of the Drummond Professor of Political Economy such a sum as together with what he shall receive from Mr. Drummond's Foundation shall amount to £1,200"

That in the same Clause the provision with regard to the Gladstone Professor of Political Theory and Institutions shall be repealed and the following provision shall be substituted therefor:

"In respect of the Gladstone Professor of Political Theory and Institutions such a sum as together with what he shall receive from the Gladstone National Memorial Trust's Endowment shall amount to £1,200"

That at the end of the said Clause there shall be added the following words:

"In respect of the Chichele Chair of Economic History £1,200"

That in Clause 2 of the same Statute for the words "of which one member at least

shall be a member nominated by the Warden and Fellows" there shall be substituted the words:

"which shall include (1) the Warden of All Souls College or if he is unable or unwilling to act a person appointed by the Warden and Fellows on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an Elector on that occasion and (2) a person appointed by the Warden and Fellows".

That in Clause 3 of the same Statute there shall be inserted immediately after the word "no" the words "payment shall be made from the revenues of the College to the Curators of the University Chest in respect of any" and the words "shall be entitled to receive any payment from the revenues of the College" shall be omitted from the said Clause.

That in Statute VII, Clause 1, sub-clauses (ii), (iii), (iv) and (vi) be repealed and that the numbers (ii), (iii), (iv) and (vi) be omitted from the concluding paragraph of the said Clause.

That in Clause 2, sub-clause (i) of the same Statute for the words "Charges (i), (ii), (iii) and (iv)" shall be substituted the words "Charge (i)" and the number "(vi)" shall be omitted from the said sub-clause.

That in sub-clause (ii) of the same Clause the number (vi) shall be omitted.

That in the concluding paragraph of the said Clause the words "Charge (vii)" shall be substituted for the words "Charges (iv), (vi) and (vii)"; the words "the Professor or Reader" shall be substituted for the words "each of the several Professors or Readers"; and the words "which shall include (1) the Warden of All Souls College or if he is unable or unwilling to act a person appointed by the Warden and Fellows on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an Elector on that occasion and (2) a person appointed by the Warden and Fellows" shall be substituted for the words "of which two members at least shall be persons elected by the Warden and Fellows".

That in Clause 3 of the said Statute the words "the Professor or Reader" shall be substituted for the words "every Professor and to the Reader".

Now WE, the said Warden and College, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby submit the aforesaid alterations and additions made by us in the Statutes governing our said College to The King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council, and humbly pray that the same may be approved and confirmed.

YORKSHIRE (EAST RIDING) SWINE
FEVER INFECTED AREA ORDER OF
1930.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Area to which this Order applies.

1. This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, referred to in this Order as "the Infected Area."

Restriction of Movement of Swine into, out of, or within the Infected Area.

2.—(1) The movement of swine into or out of the Infected Area, or along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Infected Area, is prohibited except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority in accordance with this Order. Provided that this Order shall not affect or prevent the movement of swine through the Infected Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

(2) No swine shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Infected Area.

Markets etc., of Swine in Infected Area to be restricted to Fat Swine only.

3. No market, sale or exhibition of swine shall be held in any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in the Infected Area, unless it is restricted to fat swine intended for immediate slaughter, and then only in accordance with the following conditions, namely:—

(a) A licence shall be obtained from the Local Authority authorising the holding of the market, sale or exhibition.

(b) All swine exposed at such market, sale or exhibition shall be removed therefrom direct to a slaughterhouse, and shall be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority specifying the slaughterhouse to which the swine are to be moved.

Licences for Movement of Swine into Infected Area.

4. Where the movement required is governed by the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, the licence necessary under that Order shall be sufficient authority for the movement of swine into the Infected Area. Where the movement is not affected by the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, a licence for the movement of swine into the Infected Area may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the swine are to be moved. The licence, which

may be granted for movement for any purposes, shall be in the Form C with the necessary adaptation. No declaration is required to be produced to obtain the licence.

Licences for Movement of Swine within or out of the Infected Area.

5.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority for the following movements of swine from premises within the Infected Area to premises in or outside the Infected Area, viz.:—

From premises in the Infected Area (other than a market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition).

(a) to a licensed market, sale or exhibition in the Infected Area (licence Form C); or

(b) to a slaughterhouse in or outside the Infected Area (licence Form C); or

(c) to private premises in or outside the Infected Area (licence Form A, or, if for breeding purposes, Form C); or

(d) to a vessel direct for shipment or to any premises for detention until shipment (licence Form C).

From a licensed Market, sale or exhibition in the Infected Area.

to a slaughterhouse either within or outside the Infected Area (licence Form C).

(2) Before a licence (Form A) or (Form C) is granted under paragraphs (c) and (d) of this Article the owner of the swine, or his authorised agent, shall sign and produce or send to the Inspector a declaration in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order. The Inspector shall retain the declaration, and before granting the licence shall satisfy himself as far as practicable as to the correctness of the statements contained therein. No declaration is required before granting a licence for movement of swine to a licensed market, sale or exhibition, or to a slaughterhouse.

*Conditions of Movement.**Detention and Isolation at Destination for 27 days of Swine moved with Licence (Form A).**Marking of Swine moved to a Slaughterhouse.*

6.—(1) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) shall not, for a period of 27 days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved therefrom except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only if the swine are marked before the movement commences in the manner described in the next following paragraph of this Article, and are accompanied by a licence (Form C). Swine while detained during the said period of 27 days shall be kept separate from all other swine. This Article does not prohibit the movement of the carcase of a pig slaughtered on the premises during the said period of 27 days.

(2) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse, they shall, before the movement to a slaughterhouse commences, be marked by and at the expense of the owner, by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line

down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long, and on arrival at the slaughterhouse the swine shall be detained there until slaughtered.

(3) Swine while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other swine.

Provisions as to Licences.

7.—(a) Licences may be granted under this Order only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences;

(b) A movement licence shall not be granted by an Inspector if, in his opinion, it is undesirable to grant it, or for any movement of swine, which is prohibited by the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922;

(c) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(d) Licences must be delivered up at, or sent by post to the nearest Police Station or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences (other than licences—Form C—specifically marked “for Breeding purposes”), shall only be available for eight days including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement. Licences (Form C) specifically marked “for Breeding purposes” shall be available for 28 days, inclusive of the date thereof. If required for the purpose of service, the swine referred to therein may be moved under the authority of the licence to the same premises either on one or two occasions within the said period of 28 days and back to the original premises from which it was moved. The swine shall, on return to the original premises, be detained thereon for a period of 28 days from the date of return; provided that where movement on two occasions takes place under the licence the said period of 28 days detention shall commence on the date of return after the second movement;

(f) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the swine moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or Constable, and such person shall if required by such Officer give his name and address.

Special Provisions Applicable to the Great Yorkshire Agricultural Society's Show at Hull, July 16th to 18th.

8.—(1) Nothing in this Order shall apply to the exhibition of Swine at the Show held by the Great Yorkshire Agricultural Society in the City of Hull on the 16th to 18th July, 1930, nor to the movement of Swine to or from the said Show, but such movement shall be subject to the special provisions of this Article.

(2) No swine shall be moved to the said Show from any premises situated in the Infected Area described in the First Schedule hereto.

(3) Swine may be moved to the said Show from premises outside the Infected Area if accompanied by a licence (Form C) granted either under Article 7 of the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, or this Order by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City of Hull or by some person specially authorised by the said Local Authority to grant such licences. Such licences may be granted without the production of a declaration (Form B).

(4) Swine may be moved from the said Show to premises either in the Infected Area described in the First Schedule hereto, or to premises outside such area if accompanied by a licence (Form C) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority for the City of Hull, or by some person specially authorised by the said Local Authority to grant such licences.

Forms.

9. The Licences (Forms A and C) required for use under this Order shall be in the forms set forth in the Second Schedule to the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, with the necessary adaptations. The declaration (Form B) shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Terms.

POST OFFICE TELEPHONES.

In pursuance of the Telephone Regulations, 1924, His Majesty's Postmaster General hereby gives notice that the charges for telephonic communication between Great Britain (excluding the Isle of Man) on the one hand and the Island of Java in the Dutch East Indies on the other are £5 2s. 0d. for a call of not more than 3 minutes' duration, and £1 14s. 0d. for each additional minute or fraction of a minute in excess of 3 minutes.

NOTE.—Communication is at present limited in Java to calls to certain selected call offices in the following places:—

Bandoeng, Buitenzorg, Cheribon, Djokjakarta, Kediri, Malang, Semarang, Soekaboemi, Soerabaja, Solo (Soerakarta), Tjepoe, Weltevreden.

The hours during which calls may be made vary according to the season, but at present calls may be made only between the hours of 1.40 p.m. and 5.10 p.m. (British Summer Time). The service is not open on Sundays or public holidays or on the anniversaries of the birthdays of the Dutch Royal Family (the 19th and 30th April and the 2nd and 31st of August).

Calls may be booked only for a specified person, and as subscribers in Java have to be called to a special public call office in order to receive calls from this country, subscribers in this country, when booking a call to Java, should give the usual postal address of the person required, in addition to his name and telephone number.

If the person required (or an acceptable substitute) is not available or does not wish to speak or if he fails to arrive at the call office at the appointed time a "Report Charge" of £1 6s. 0d. is payable.

Any variations in the foregoing particulars of the service will be advertised in the public press and exact information may be obtained at any time by enquiry of the London Trunk Exchange ("Radio Telephone Service Enquiries").
