WHEREAS by the Representation of the People Acts power is conferred on His Majesty to make provision for various matters by Order in Council:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Order (S.R. & O. 1918 (No. 1813) II, p. 723) (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") His Majesty was pleased to make provision for various matters under these Acts:

And whereas by Section 40 (2) of the Representation of the People Act, 1918 (7-8 G. 5, c. 64), any Order in Council made thereunder may be revoked or varied as occasion requires by any subsequent Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Acts and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following paragraph shall be substituted for the second paragraph of Rule 3 of the Order:—

Duplicate entries.

"Where a person is qualified for registration either as a parliamentary elector for

any constituency or as a local government elector for any local government electoral area, or any parish, ward or division of any such area, as the case may be, in respect of more than one qualification, and any entry in respect of him has accordingly been removed as a duplicate, the registration officer shall not be required to include that entry in any subsequent electors lists if that person remains qualified for registration as such an elector in respect of the qualification for which he is so registered in the register in force."

2. In the Form of Notice under Heading VIII in Schedule I to the Order, the following shall be substituted for so much of the Form as follows after paragraph (a) thereof:—

"(b) As a local government elector in respect of more than one qualification in the*

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, it is (amongst other things) enacted as follows:—

"Where His Majesty is satisfied that the law in force in any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom makes due provision for the publication of banns or for the giving of notice in respect of marriages between British Subjects intended to be solemnised or contracted in the United Kingdom, and for the recognition of certificates for marriage issued by Superintendent Registrars in England and of certificates for marriage issued by Registrars, and certificates of proclamation of banns, in Scotland, and of certificates for marriage issued by Registrars in Ireland as sufficient notice in respect of marriages between British Subjects intended to be solemnised or contracted in that part of His Majesty's Dominions, His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that this Section shall apply to that part of His Dominions, and in such case:—

"(a) Where a marriage is intended to be solemnised or contracted in the United Kingdom between a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland and a British Subject resident in that part of His Majesty's Dominions, a certificate of the publication of banns or a certificate of notice of marriage issued in accordance with such law shall in England have the same effect as a certificate for marriage issued by a Superintendent Registrar and in Scotland and Ireland have the same effect as a certificate for marriage issued by a Registrar in Scotland and Ireland respectively; and

"(b) Where a marriage is intended to be solemnised or contracted in that part of His Majesty's Dominions between a British Subject resident in that part and a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, a certificate for marriage may be issued in England by a Superintendent

Registrar, or in Scotland or Ireland by a Registrar, in the like manner as if the marriage was to be solemnised or contracted under circumstances requiring the issue of such a certificate, and as if both such British Subjects were resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, as the case may be":

And whereas by Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Amendment Act, 1916, it is enacted as follows:—

"If His Majesty is satisfied that, for the purposes of a marriage to be solemnised or contracted in any part of His Dominions outside the United Kingdom between a British Subject resident in that part and a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, no notice of the marriage is, under the law in force in that part of His Dominions, required on the part of the person resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, shall apply to that part of His Dominions, notwithstanding that the law in force in that part does not make provision for the recognition of certificates for marriage issued in England, Scotland, and Ireland, and of certificates of proclamation of banns issued in Scotland, as sufficient notice in respect of such marriages as aforesaid, provided that the other conditions required by that Section are fulfilled":

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that for the purposes of a marriage to be solemnised or contracted in the part of His Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter mentioned between a British Subject resident therein and a British Subject resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, no notice of the marriage is under the law in force in that part of His Dominions required on the part of the person resident in England, Scotland, or Ireland, and that under the said law the other conditions required by the hereinbefore recited Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, are fulfilled:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Acts in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Section 1 of the Marriage of British Subjects (Facilities) Act, 1915, shall apply to the part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

The Island of Jersey.

And it is hereby further ordered that this Order in Council be registered and published in the Island of Jersey, not as being essential to its operation therein, but that His Majesty's subjects in the said Island may have notice of the making thereof, and that they are bound thereby.

And the Lieutenant-Governor or Commander-in-Chief for the time being, and also the Bailiff and Jurats of the Royal Court, of the Island of Jersey, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Sidney Sussex College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 5th day of May, 1930, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTES TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES OF THE COLLEGE OF THE LADY FRANCES SIDNEY SUSSEX COMMONLY CALLED SIDNEY SUSSEX COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE, WHICH AMENDING STATUTES HAVING BEEN DULY MADE AT A GENERAL MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE SAID COLLEGE SPECIALLY SUMMONED FOR THIS PURPOSE AND HELD ON THE 5TH DAY OF MAY 1930 (NOTICE OF THE PROPOSED AMENDING STATUTES HAVING BEEN GIVEN TO THE SAID UNIVERSITY) AND PASSED AT SUCH MEETING BY THE VOTES OF ALL PERSONS PRESENT AND VOTING ARE NOW SUBMITTED FOR THE APPROVAL OF HIS MAJESTY THE KING IN COUNCIL.

We, The Master, Fellows and Scholars of Sidney Sussex College in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College in manner following, that is to say:—

CHAPTER VI.

OF ELECTION TO, TENURE AND VACATION OF FELLOWSHIPS.

By deleting the word "vacant" where it occurs in Paragraph 2 of this Chapter.

By deleting from Paragraph 4 in this Chapter intituled, Research Fellowships; the words "at the Annual Meeting."

CHAPTER VII.

OF THE DEAN.

By repealing this Statute and substituting therefor the following amended Statute:—

1. The Dean shall be elected by the Governing Body at the Annual Meeting from among the Fellows of the College for a period of not more than three years in the first instance, and shall be eligible for re-election for successive periods of not more than five years each.

2. It shall be the duty of the Dean to maintain discipline and good order among such members of the College as are *in statu pupilari*.

3. The Dean shall reside in College during such portion of each term as is appointed for the residence of the Undergraduate Members of the College, unless prevented by some urgent cause to be approved by a College Meeting.

By adding after Chapter XII the following Chapter to form a new Chapter:—

CHAPTER XII (a).

OF THE CHAPLAIN.

1. The Chaplain shall be elected by the Governing Body of the College at the Annual Meeting, and shall be in Priest's Orders.

2. If he be a Fellow of the College, he shall be elected for a period of two years in the first instance, and shall be eligible for re-election for successive periods of three years each.

3. If he be not a Fellow of the College, he shall be elected for a period of two years in the first instance, under such conditions as the Governing Body may impose and shall be eligible for re-election for not more than two successive periods of three years each.

He shall obtain permission from the Governing Body before undertaking any duties other than those of his office.

4. He shall have charge of the College Chapel and shall be responsible for the due performance, in accordance with the provisions of Section 6 of the Universities Tests Act, 1871, of Morning and Evening Service therein daily during full term, and for the celebration of the Holy Communion at least once a term.

He shall also provide for the preaching of a sermon on at least two Sundays in every term.

He shall also be responsible for the provision of Chapel Services on Sundays during the period of residence in the Long Vacation.

He shall take such part in carrying out the provisions of Section 5 of the Universities Tests Act, 1871, as the Governing Body may from time to time determine.

5. The Chaplain shall reside in College during such portion of each term as is appointed for the residence of the Undergraduate Members of the College, unless prevented by some urgent cause to be approved by a College Meeting.

6. If the Master or a Tutor be elected Chaplain, the Governing Body shall have power to elect an Assistant Chaplain, The Assistant Chaplain shall be elected from year to year, and shall receive such portion of the stipend of the Chaplain as may be assigned to him by the Governing Body of the College.

CHAPTER XV.

OF THE REMOVAL OF OFFICERS AND APPOINTMENT OF DEPUTIES.

By inserting in Paragraph 1 after the words "College Lecturers" the words "the Chaplain."

CHAPTER XVI.

OF INTERIM VACANCIES IN OFFICE.

By inserting in Paragraph 1 the word "Chaplain" after the words "College Librarian."

CHAPTER XVIII.

OF STIPENDS, ALLOWANCES, AND ROOMS.

By inserting in the first section of Paragraph 1 after the words "the Bursar" the words "the Chaplain."

By adding to the second section of Paragraph 1 "The stipend of the Master shall be £500 a year" the following words "and such allowances as the Governing Body may from time to time determine to meet the expenses arising out of his office."

By inserting in the third section of Paragraph 1 after the words "the Bursar" the words "the Chaplain."

By deleting in the second section of Paragraph 2 the word "and" and by inserting after the word "Fellows" the words "and the Chaplain."

CHAPTER XXII.

OF RETIREMENT AND PENSION OF OFFICERS.

By deleting from Paragraph 1 the words "When any Fellow not holding nor having held any of the following College Offices, viz.: Master Tutor College Lecturer Bursar or Dean (hereinafter called "the Pensionable Offices")" and substituting therefor the following words "When any Fellow not holding nor having held any of the following College Offices, viz.: Master Tutor College Lecturer or Bursar (hereinafter called "the Pensionable Offices")."

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, Oxford, on the 4th day of June, 1930, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

Ex Parte the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE to amend Statute VII (*Pensions*) and Statute XII (*Supplementary and Temporary Provisions*) made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5. ch. 33) for the aforesaid College, duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting specially summoned for this purpose and holden on the second day of May, 1930, and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and ordered for sealing after the consent of the University had been given in Congregation on the twenty-seventh day of May, 1930 (*Oxford University Gazette*, LX, No. 1939, page 573) and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend Statutes VII and XII of the College Statutes in order to assure to certain Official Fellows of the College if they have completed twenty-five years of service an annual sum which when added to the pension benefits already assured to them shall amount to a total annuity of Five hundred pounds per annum at the age of sixty, and to enable the Master and Fellows to enhance the pension benefits to be enjoyed by any existing Official Fellow of the College coming within the provisions of Statute XII. 2 (a) who shall continue to serve the College after the age of sixty years, and to empower the Master and Fellows to meet any

charges thereby arising either out of Corporate Revenue or out of the income of the Pension Fund or out of both:

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to give the Master and Fellows liberty to apply any surplus revenue from the Pension Fund after meeting all charges laid upon it by Statute XII. 2 either to assure and enhance the pension benefits of any Master or Fellow or Officer for whom adequate provision could not be made otherwise or for the benefit of the dependents of any former Master or Fellow or Officer of the College who by reason of his death or disablement or for any other reason shall have been left without adequate provision:

Now, therefore, We, the Master and Fellows of the said College, in virtue of all and every the powers enabling us contained in Statute XIII. 1 of our Statutes and section 7 (2) of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5. ch. 33), do alter and amend the Statutes of the College in so far as they relate to Pensions and the Pension Fund by the following omissions, alterations, and additions:

In Statute VII. 1 we strike out the words from "solely" (inclusively) to the end of the clause, and we substitute the words "to the payment of premiums for Life Assurance under the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Universities or in accordance with the provisions of Statute VII. 5 and of any other payments and allowances authorized by this Statute and by Statute XII (but not in relief of any sums authorized to be deducted from stipends under Statute VII. 2, and VII 4) or after meeting all charges laid upon it by Statute XII. 2 to the making if need shall arise of compassionate grants to any former Master or Fellow or Officer of the College or to his dependents or to such other similar purposes as the Master and Fellows may approve. If at any time the income of the Pension Fund shall be insufficient to defray the payments of premiums for Life Assurance and other payments authorized by this Statute and by Statute XII, such payments in so far as they cannot be made from the income of the Pension Fund shall be a charge upon the General Corporate Revenue, provided always that any compassionate grant authorized by this clause of this Statute shall be paid only out of the income of the Pension Fund. The Master and Fellows shall have power to transfer to the General Corporate Revenue by resolution at a Stated General Meeting any part of the income of the Pension Fund which is not required for the aforesaid purposes".

In Stat. XII. 2 (b) we alter the order of the words beginning at line 6 so as to read "in addition, undertake with the sanction of the Visitor to pay to such person on his retirement after twenty-five years or more of service":

In Stat. XII. 2 (b) we add the following words at the end: "and provided further that if any Official Fellow shall continue to serve the College after the age of sixty nothing in this sub-clause shall prevent the Master and Fellows, on condition that the Fellow shall until he reach the age of sixty-five years but not longer continue to contribute 5 per cent. of his stipend for this purpose, from continuing to contribute a sum equal to 10 per cent. of his stipend towards the augmentation of

his benefit beyond the amount of £500 per annum, which may be assured to him under the foregoing part of this sub-clause."

Six Hackney Carriages:

First Portion.—One carriage on the East side of Holloway Road to stand, by kerb, at a point in line with No. 468.

Front of vehicle toward the South.

Note.—The First Portion of this standing will be available between the hours of 11 p.m. and 6 a.m. only.

Second Portion.—Five carriages on the North side of Tufnell Park Road, commencing at a point six yards West of the Western building line of Holloway Road and extending Westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for five carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

The first portion when in use to be fed exclusively by carriages from the second portion.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE NATIONAL GALLERY, MILLBANK (TATE GALLERY).

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held only on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 20 and must not exceed the age of 35 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Until further order preference will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The Trustees of the National Gallery, Millbank, will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire

to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

6. Candidates should be familiar with the history and practice of the Fine Arts, and it is desirable that they should have a knowledge of modern foreign languages.

7. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Director of the National Gallery, Millbank, and shall be made on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached the authorities of the Department shall scrutinise all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them qualified for the duties of the posts in question. They shall then forward to the Civil Service Commissioners all the application forms received, who may then, if dissatisfied with the candidates presenting themselves, take such steps in consultation with the authorities of the Gallery as they may think fit to obtain other candidates. The list of qualified candidates shall then be settled by agreement between the Civil Service Commissioners and the authorities of the National Gallery, Millbank.

8. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in their opinion fits them for the post. The Commissioners may, if in doubt, submit any or all of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test such education, or any part of it.

9. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

Until further order, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from active employment by a physical impairment due to the War and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of ordinary administrative duties.

10. Candidates who are recommended by the authorities of the Department and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and if practicable one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by any candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

11. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment.

The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

12. If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate subjected thereto will be required to pay a fee of £3. A Selected Candidate will be required to pay a fee of £8, towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH MAY, 1930.)

CONTROL OF DOGS ORDER OF 1930.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Wearing of Collars by Dogs.

1. Every dog while in a highway or in a place of public resort shall wear a collar with the name and address of the owner inscribed on the collar or on a plate or badge attached thereto: Provided that this requirement shall not apply to any pack of hounds, or to any dog while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep.

Power of Local Authority to make Regulations for the control of Dogs between Sunset and Sunrise.

2.—(1) A Local Authority may, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle, make Regulations for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise be kept under control in the manner prescribed by the Regulations.

The expression "cattle" herein includes horses, mules, asses, sheep, goats and swine.

(2) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District of the Local Authority and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

(3) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries (hereinafter referred to as the Minister) for confirmation and been confirmed by him. Drafts of the proposed Regulations shall be submitted to the Minister before the Regulations are made by the Local Authority. For the purpose of confirmation the Regulations as made by the Local Authority, or two certified copies thereof, shall be sent to the Minister.

Continuance of Certain Existing Regulations of Local Authority.

3. Regulations for the control of dogs during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise made by any Local Authority under the powers conferred by any Order referred to in the Schedule hereto and in force immediately before the commencement of this Order, shall be deemed to have been made under this Order, and shall continue in force until altered or revoked by the Local Authority or revoked by the Minister.

Power to seize Dogs.

4. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against this Order or any Regulation made or deemed to have been made thereunder may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

5. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):—

- Section forty-three (powers of police);
- Section forty-four (powers of inspectors);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Offences.

6. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of any breach of the provisions of this Order, or of any Regulations made or deemed to have been made thereunder shall be liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

7. The provisions of this Order shall, except where it is otherwise expressly provided, be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Revocation of Orders and Certain Regulations of Local Authority.

8. The Orders referred to in the Schedule hereto, and Regulations relating to the wearing of collars by dogs made by any Local Authority under the powers conferred by the Dogs Order of 1906, are hereby revoked.

Extent.

9. This Order extends to England, Wales and Scotland.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty.

Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the CONTROL OF DOGS ORDER OF 1930.

The word "Premises" shall mean any station, shelter, waiting room or other place or premises used in connection with the Motor Omnibus Undertaking of the Corporation.

The words "Interior of an Omnibus" shall not include the upper deck of a double deck omnibus.

The word "Driver" means any officer or servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive an omnibus.

The word "Conductor" means any officer or servant of the Corporation having charge of or helping in the charge of an omnibus.

Extent of Bye-Laws.

2. The Bye-Laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to every omnibus of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-Laws.

Entering and Leaving Cars.

3. Every passenger shall enter or depart from an omnibus by the step of the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise, provided that in the case of single deck omnibuses persons may enter or leave from either end of the near side of the omnibus unless directed by the conductor or other authorised officer to enter or leave from one particular end, when every person shall enter or leave the omnibus at that particular end.

4. When an omnibus stops no person except with the permission of the conductor shall board the omnibus until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

5. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave any omnibus in motion.

6. When any omnibus contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such omnibus after being warned by the conductor not to do so.

7. No male person shall, unless duly authorised by the Corporation mount or attempt to mount upon any omnibus which is run and reserved by the Corporation for female persons only, and on which a notice to that effect is conspicuously exhibited. In any case in which

an omnibus is run and reserved for any special purpose, which shall be indicated by a notice conspicuously exhibited upon such omnibus, no person other than the person or persons for whose conveyance the same omnibus is reserved shall mount or attempt to mount upon such omnibus.

8. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board an omnibus or attempt to do so, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of an omnibus.

Smoking.

9. No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar, cheroot or cigarette in or upon any omnibus, except in a compartment or on seats especially set apart for that purpose.

Musical Instruments, etc.

10. No passenger or other person shall play or perform upon any musical instrument, or distribute any advertisement or tract of any kind or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell any article in or upon any omnibus or premises.

Depositing Litter, etc.

11. No passenger or other person shall deposit or throw down any remnants of any food or fruit, or paper or other litter in or upon any omnibus or premises.

Intoxicated Persons.

12. A person in a state of intoxication shall not enter, mount or travel or attempt to enter, mount or travel in or upon any omnibus or enter or attempt to enter any premises, and if found in or upon any omnibus or premises shall leave the omnibus or premises immediately on being requested to do so by a duly authorised officer or servant of the Corporation.

Offensive Language, etc.

13. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any omnibus or premises, or commit any nuisance in, upon, from or against any omnibus or premises or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

Spitting.

14. No person shall spit in, on, from or against any omnibus or in, on, or against any premises.

Damaging Omnibuses.

15. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil or damage any cushion, seat, curtain, or lining, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice or any advertisement in or on any omnibus or premises or mark, break or scratch any window, or place his feet upon or lie upon the seat of or otherwise wilfully damage any omnibus or premises. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-Law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-Laws in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Objectionable Persons.

16. No person who has any contagious or infectious disease shall board, enter or travel on any omnibus, or enter or remain on any

premises, or attempt so to do, and no conductor or other authorised officer or servant of the corporation shall suffer or permit any such person so to do. No clothing or other article likely to spread any contagious or infectious disease shall be brought into or placed by any person on any omnibus or premises, and any such person, clothing or article found in or upon any omnibus or premises shall be removed from the omnibus or premises by or under the direction of the conductor or other duly authorised officer or servant of the Corporation.

“Contagious or infectious diseases” means any of the following diseases:—

Small Pox, Cholera, Diphtheria, Membranous Croup, Erysipelas, Scabies, the disease known as Scarlatina or Scarlet Fever, and Measles; also the fevers known by any of the following names:—Typhus, Typhoid, Enteric, Relapsing, Continued.

Persons Prohibited from Travelling, etc.

17. Any person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of the omnibus, soil, injure or damage the seats, linings curtains or cushions of any omnibus, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or any person who, in the opinion of a duly authorised officer or servant of the Corporation, might for any reason be offensive to any passenger or to any person lawfully using any premises shall not be entitled to enter, mount or remain in or upon any omnibus, or to enter or remain in or on any premises, and may be prevented from entering, mounting or remaining in or upon any omnibus or from entering or remaining in or on any premises, and shall not enter mount or remain in or upon any omnibus, or enter or remain in or on any premises after having been requested not to do so by any such officer or servant, and if found in or upon any omnibus or in or on any such premises shall, on the request of any such officer or servant, leave the omnibus or premises upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned, provided that on omnibuses specially run for artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers, no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on an omnibus under the provisions of this Bye-Law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Payment of Fares, and Tickets.

18. Each passenger shall upon demand pay to the conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for the journey and accept a ticket therefor, and in any case whether demanded or not shall pay such fare before leaving the omnibus.

19. A ticket issued to a passenger shall not be transferable and (except as expressly provided for by these Bye-Laws) shall be available only for the journey and on the omnibus or omnibuses, where more than one, for and on which the same is issued. Any person leaving an omnibus shall be deemed to have completed his journey unless he leaves such omnibus for the purpose of joining another omnibus of the Corporation in order to complete the journey for which the ticket held by him is available provided that upon any change of vehicle as

aforesaid the journey must be completed upon the first available omnibus.

20. A passenger travelling beyond the stage or journey to which the ticket issued is available shall pay to the conductor the fare legally payable for the distance travelled by the passenger beyond the stage or journey to which the fare had been paid.

21. No child under five years of age who is sitting on the lap of a passenger shall be liable to pay a fare, provided that this provision shall apply only to one such child accompanying any one passenger; any additional child, irrespective of age, accompanying such passenger shall pay the full ordinary fare.

22. Each passenger shall show his ticket when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

23. No passenger shall wilfully alter or deface any ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible or knowingly or wilfully use or attempt to use any ticket which shall have been in any respect materially altered or defaced.

24. No passenger shall use or attempt to use a ticket on any omnibus or on any day for which such ticket is not available or use a ticket which has already been used on a previous journey, or otherwise than in accordance with the conditions upon which it is issued.

Workmen's Tickets.

25. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic or daily labourer within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Corporation or to Omnibuses, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics or daily labourers.

Dogs, Etc.

26. No dog shall be allowed in the interior of any omnibus nor without the previous permission of the conductor upon the upper deck of a double deck omnibus nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog is or in the opinion of the conductor is likely to be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. Every person who takes any dog in or on any omnibus shall securely hold such dog in leash and keep it under control so as to prevent it from causing any injury or damage. No person shall take a dog into or on any omnibus after having been requested not to do so by the conductor and no person shall take into or on any omnibus any animal other than a dog. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any omnibus in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the omnibus immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

27. The person in charge of any dog lawfully taken upon an omnibus shall upon demand pay to the conductor the fare legally demandable in respect of such dog for the journey, and Bye-Laws Nos. 18, 19, 20, 22, 23 and 24, shall apply in respect of such dog accordingly.

Luggage.

28. Subject to the provisions of Section 39 (2) of the Chester Corporation Act, 1929, no luggage or parcels of any description shall be conveyed upon any omnibus except such personal luggage as is allowed by Section 43 of the Chester Corporation Act, 1901, and is carried in manner prescribed by that Section.

Dangerous or Offensive Articles, Etc.

29. No person shall travel in or on any omnibus with any fire-arm or any explosive substance or with any article, instrument, tool or implement or any material or substance which may in the opinion of the conductor or other authorised officer of the Corporation be dangerous or offensive to the passengers provided that nothing contained in this Bye-Law shall apply to persons in the Naval, Military, Reserve or Auxiliary Forces carrying unloaded fire-arms.

Interference with Officers, Signals, Etc.

30. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any omnibus and no person other than the conductor or driver or other officer or servant of the Corporation shall change or remove any route indicator or destination board or touch handle or interfere with the steering gear, brakes, lights, ventilators, signalling apparatus or any machine or appliance in, under, upon or about any omnibus.

Disabled Omnibuses.

31. If at any time an omnibus becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon request of the conductor, leave the same and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available omnibus, the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the conductor, enter a disabled or damaged omnibus.

Shelters and Waiting Rooms.

32. No persons other than intending passengers and servants of the Corporation shall enter any shelter or waiting-room provided for the accommodation of intending passengers and servants of the Corporation.

Stopping Places.

33. The conductor shall not be bound to cause an omnibus to be stopped for the purpose of enabling passengers to enter or leave the omnibus except at such places along any route as may be indicated from time to time by the Corporation.

Travelling on Steps, Etc.

34. No passenger or other person, not being an officer or servant of the Corporation acting in performance of his duty, shall travel on the steps or platforms of any omnibus, or stand on the upper deck or sit or stand on the roof, or sit on the outside rails of any omnibus, or except by the express permission of the conductor first obtained, stand on the lower deck of any omnibus.

Omnibuses Proceeding to Garage.

35. No person other than the conductor or driver shall travel upon an omnibus upon or along any siding or approach to an omnibus garage or upon or along any omnibus within an omnibus garage.

Power to Remove Offenders.

36. Any person who shall commit whilst in or on any omnibus any breach of these Bye-Laws shall, if the offence is continued, be liable in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the omnibus by or under the direction of the conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

Any person who shall commit any breach of these Bye-Laws in relation to any premises shall, if the offence is continued be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from such premises by or under the direction of any officer or servant of the Corporation.

Enforcement of Bye-Laws.

37. Every conductor and driver shall to the best of his ability enforce these Bye-Laws and prevent the breach thereof, and if any such conductor or driver fails to enforce the same as aforesaid he shall be deemed to have committed a breach thereof.

Penalty.

38. Any person infringing any of the foregoing Bye-Laws shall be liable to a penalty

of not exceeding Forty Shillings, and in case of a continuing offence to a penalty of not exceeding Ten Shillings, in addition to the first-mentioned penalty, for every day during which such offence continues.

Exhibition of Bye-Laws.

39. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each omnibus in use and premises a printed copy of these Bye-Laws.

Date of Commencement.

40. These Bye-Laws shall come into force on the eighteenth day of August, 1930.
