The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge, on the 3rd day of June, 1930, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTES TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES IN RELATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE MADE UNDER "THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923" (13 & 14 GEORGE V., CHAPTER 33).

WE, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE D.

THE UNIVERSITY OFFICERS.

CHAPTER XII.

THE UNIVERSITY TEACHING OFFICERS.

By repealing Section 2 of Chapter XII and substituting therefor the following amended Section:—

"2. Every University teaching officer, unless he is exempted under any provision of these Statutes from the operation of this rule, shall join in the Federated Superannuation System for Universities, which shall be applicable in respect of his pensionable salary determined in accordance with the provisions of these Statutes or, in the absence of any provisions in that behalf, by the University."

CHAPTER XIII.

THE PROFESSORS.

By repealing Section 5 of Chapter XIII and substituting therefor the following amended Section:—

"5. A Professor, unless he is exempted under any provision of these Statutes from the operation of this rule, shall vacate his office at the end of the academical year in which he attains the age of sixty-five years."

By inserting between Chapter XIV and Chapter XV the following additional Chapter:—

"CHAPTER XIV A.

"THE SLADE PROFESSORSHIP OF FINE ART.

"1. Any person may be elected to the Slade Professorship of Fine Art for a period not

exceeding three years notwithstanding that he has attained the age of sixty-five years, provided that he has not previously held that Professorship: but no one shall be re-eligible to the Professorship after attaining the age of sixty-two years.

"2. A Slade Professor of Fine Art elected for a period not exceeding three years shall not be required to join in the Federated Superannuation System for Universities, or to vacate his office at the end of the academical year in which he attains the age of sixty-five years."

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 20th June, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 23rd June, 1930, to Saturday, the 28th June, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
