Front of vehicles toward the South.</p>
<p>19th May, 1930.</p> <p>AT PARK LANE, W.</p>	<p>Four Hackney Carriages: On the West side of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the Second Tree in the Park, approximately sixteen yards North of Grosvenor Gate, and extending Northward, by kerb, as far as necessary for four carriages. Front of vehicles toward the South.</p>
