PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of May, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘the said Benefice’) of Benhilton, in

the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark:

“Whereas by a Codicil, dated the 16th day of August, 1927, to the Will, dated the 24th day of December, 1924, of the late Edward Gerald Coles, of Gosden Cottage, Bramley, in the said County of Surrey, Esquire, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Benhilton was devised to the Bishop for the time being of the Diocese in which such Benefice was situate at the time of his death:

“And whereas the said Edward Gerald Coles died on the 1st day of May, 1929, and the said Benefice of Benhilton was at that time and still is situate in the same Diocese of Southwark:

“And whereas the Royal Exchange Assurance Corporation, in the City of London, is the Executor of the said Will in whom but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said Advowson would now be vested, and the said Corporation is desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Benhilton should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Southwark for the time being in the manner hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“And whereas the Right Reverend Cyril Forster, now Bishop of Southwark, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore
