TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 4th July, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £35,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 7th July, 1930, to Saturday, the 12th July, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

(1927) Ltd., Ermyn Way, Leatherhead, Surrey, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, mess-room accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided; that additional daily thermometer readings shall be taken and recorded if atmospheric humidity is artificially produced; and that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupiers to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship.

AMENDMENT, DATED MAY 30, 1930, OF THE RULES OF PROCEDURE OF THE ANGLO-GERMAN MIXED ARBITRAL TRIBUNAL (STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS, 1920, No. 2062) CONSTITUTED UNDER ARTICLE 304 OF THE TREATY OF VERSAILLES AS AMENDED BY STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS, 1925, No. 176.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

MERCHANDISE MARKS (IMPORTED GOODS)
EXEMPTION DIRECTION (No. 3), 1930.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 3, sub-Section (2) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that they have, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, given a Direction in the following terms:—

Whereas by Section 3 sub-Section (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, c. 53), it is provided that if, where an Order

in Council has been made under that Act with respect to any goods, it is shown to the satisfaction of the appropriate Department by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order or of some of those provisions to any particular class or description of those goods has caused or is likely to cause injury or hardship to the said persons or any of them, the Department may direct that the Order or any particular provisions of the Order shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the Direction is in force, have effect subject thereto;

And whereas it is provided by Article 15 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 5 Order, 1929,* that it shall not be lawful to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom any imported knitted hose, knitted gloves and other knitted articles of apparel and knitted fabrics made of cotton, wool, silk, artificial silk or mixtures thereof unless they bear an indication of origin;

And whereas it is provided by Article 16 of the same Order that the indication of origin shall be applied as follows:—

(i) Hose.—To be stamped or printed on, or applied by transfer to, one of each pair in a contrasting colour.

(ii) Gloves.—As therein provided.

(iii) Other articles of apparel.—(a) To be stamped or printed on each article or applied thereto by transfer in a contrasting colour; or (b) Woven into, or stamped or printed on, or applied by transfer to, a tab of woven material securely sewn to each article.

(iv) Fabrics.—As therein provided.

And whereas by Article 20 of the same Order, it is provided that Part III of the Order (which includes the above recited articles) shall come into force on the 1st August, 1930;

And whereas the Board of Trade, being the appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the said provisions of the Order to the particular classes or descriptions of the goods hereinafter specified is likely to cause hardship to the said persons;

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3 hereby direct as follows:—

1. Article 16 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 5 Order, 1929, shall not apply to knitted hose or other knitted articles of apparel (other than knitted gloves) which were imported before the 17th day of December, 1929, and are sold or exposed for sale before the 31st January, 1931, and which bear an indication of origin applied by means of a label securely attached by wire or by a metal clip in the following manner:—

(a) Hose.—To one of each pair.

(b) Other articles of apparel (other than gloves).—To each article.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction No. 3, 1930.
