ABERGAVENNY FAIRS.

ALTERATION OF DATES.

Whereas a representation has been duly made to me as Secretary of State for the Home Department by the Abergavenny Town Council that Fairs have been annually held in Abergavenny, in the County of Monmouth, on the second Tuesday in May and on the third Tuesday in September, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the Public that such Fairs should in future be held on the 14th day of May, and on the 25th day of September respectively:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I should take the same into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the Public that the said Fairs should in future be held on the 14th day of May and on the 25th day of September:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby order that the aforesaid Fairs annually held in Abergavenny shall in future be held on the 14th day of May and on the 25th day of September respectively.

BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND TO FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 21st April, 1927, the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY AND TO FIX Minimum Rates of Wages for certain classes of Workers.
