PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of June, 1930 (N. 1607/30), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we deem it expedient that two non-substantive ratings to be known as 'Seaman Deep Diver' and 'Artificer Deep Diver' should be introduced for Divers required to descend to abnormal depths:

"And whereas we deem it expedient that

the following rates of non-substantive pay should be granted, viz.:—

Seaman Deep Diver—9d. a day;

Artificer Deep Diver—1s. 2d. a day;

any other substantive or non-substantive rate of pay apart from pay as 'Diver' or 'Artificer Diver' being retained:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the rates of extra diving pay for Divers, Artificer Divers and Diving Instructors laid down by various Orders in Council should be amended as in the Schedule appended hereto; that the gratuity authorised by the Order in Council of the 13th May, 1887, be increased to a sum not exceeding £10 where the depth reached by the diver exceeds 40 fathoms; that time spent in a decompression chamber be included in the time for which the rates of extra pay are payable; and that the attendant accommodated in the decompression chamber be paid the rates of extra pay applicable to the depth to which the chamber is submerged:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the foregoing.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

SCHEDULE.

All that area of land comprising portions of the counties of Norfolk and Suffolk lying within a line drawn as follows, including, where any road is named as a boundary, the said road:—

On the North, from the point near to Diss where the London and North-Eastern Railway crosses the road from Diss to Scole eastwards along the road through Scole and Brockdish and thence north-eastwards along the road through Harleston to Bungay; thence eastwards along the road through Mettingham and Shipmeadow to Beccles; thence along the road from Beccles through Worlingham to North Cove; thence southwards along the road from North Cove to Hulver Bridge; thence eastwards along the Hundred River to the coast:

On the East, from the mouth of the Hundred River southwards along the coast through

Southwold, Dunwich and Aldeburgh to the mouth of the River Deben:

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 14th July, 1930, to Saturday, the 19th July, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the

amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
