PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates (and the Overtime Rates based thereon) for certain Classes of Male Workers set out in the Schedule to their Notice R.M.
