

and extending thence northward along the middle of Winch Street for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ridgway Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, High Town, Luton, from the said New Parish of Stopsley.

*"The Third Schedule.*

"The territory to be dis severed from the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, High Town, Luton, and to be restored to the said Parish of Luton, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, High Town, Luton, which is bounded upon the east and upon part of the south east by the said Parish of Luton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south east, upon the south west, upon the north west, and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Luton from the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, High Town, Luton, at the junction of Crawley Green Road with Hart Hill Lane, and extending thence first south westward and then north westward along the middle of Hart Hill Lane for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading to Hart Lane, and extending thence first north eastward and then eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance in all of 20 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hart Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, High Town, Luton, from the said Parish of Luton.

*"The Fourth Schedule.*

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Paul, Luton, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"I. All that portion of the said Parish of Luton which is bounded upon the north west by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Luton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south west, upon the south, upon the south east, and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Luton, from the said Parish of Luton, at the junction of Cutenhoe Road with London Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of London Road for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence forming the northern boundary of Kidney Wood, and extending thence first north eastward to and then first north eastward, then south eastward and then again north eastward along such fence and along the fence forming the north western boundary of Lower Kidney Wood for a distance in all of 46 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence meets the fence forming the north eastern boundary of the field marked 1 upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme or Representation, and extending thence first north westward along the last mentioned fence and then south westward along the fence forming the north western boundary of the same field for a distance in all of 16½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the occupation road leading to Cutenhoe Road, and extending

thence north westward along the middle of such occupation road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Cutenhoe Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Luton from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Luton.

"II. And also all that other portion of the said Parish of Luton which is bounded upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Luton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Luton, from the said Parish of Luton at the junction of London Road with the road leading past the northern end of Stockwood Park, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading past the eastern side of the house and premises known as Whitehill, and extending thence north eastward to and along such footpath and along the roadway in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 12½ chains or thereabouts to the junction of such roadway with Castle Street upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Luton from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Luton.

*"The Fifth Schedule.*

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Woodside, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said Parish of Luton, which is bounded upon the north west partly by the New Parish of Saint Saviour, Luton, and partly by the New Parish of Christ Church, Luton, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the south west partly by the Parish of Caddington, in the said County and Diocese, partly by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Woodside, and partly by the Parish of Flamstead, in the County of Hertford and in the said Diocese of Saint Albans, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the east and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Flamstead from the said Parish of Luton at the junction of London Road with the road leading to Pepperstock, and extending thence northward along the middle of London Road for a distance of 1 mile and 50 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading past the northern side of Stockwood Park, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Farley Hill upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Luton from the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Luton.

"The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Luton, being:—

"I. All that portion of the said Parish of Luton which is bounded upon the east partly by the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Luton, and partly by the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Luton, upon the north west by the said New Parish of Saint Saviour, Luton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of
