The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE NATIONAL GALLERY, TRAFALGAR SQUARE.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held only on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 20 and must not exceed the age of 35 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Until further order preference will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The Trustees of the National Gallery will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

6. Candidates should be familiar with the history and practice of the Fine Arts, and it is desirable that they should have a knowledge of modern foreign languages.

7. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Keeper of the National Gallery, Trafalgar Square, and shall be made on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached the authorities of the Department shall scrutinise all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them

qualified for the duties of the posts in question. They shall then forward to the Civil Service Commissioners all the application forms received, who may then, if dissatisfied with the candidates presenting themselves, take such steps in consultation with the authorities of the Gallery as they may think fit to obtain other candidates. The list of qualified candidates shall then be settled by agreement between the Civil Service Commissioners and the authorities of the National Gallery.

8. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in their opinion fits them for the post. The Commissioners may, if in doubt, submit any or all of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test such education, or any part of it.

9. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

Until further order, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates who are debarred from active employment by a physical impairment due to the War and not of a nature to interfere with the discharge of ordinary administrative duties.

10. Candidates who are recommended by the authorities of the Department and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and if practicable one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by any candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

11. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

12. If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate subjected thereto will be required to pay a fee of £3. A Selected Candidate will be required to pay a fee of £8, towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of a certificate of qualification for appointment.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 1ST AUGUST, 1930.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Order.

1. The provisions of Part II (*Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area*) of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) as applied to the Area described in the Schedule to the Order of the Minister No. 4814, dated the 19th May, 1930, shall not apply to the movement of sheep of the Kerry Hill Breed to or from the special Sale specified in the Schedule to this Order, provided that the following conditions are complied with.

Special Conditions applicable to Sheep Moved to the Sale referred to in this Order.

2. All sheep exposed at the special Sale specified in the Schedule to this Order shall comply with the following conditions:—

(a) The sheep shall be accompanied by a certificate of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district from which the sheep are moved to the effect:—

(i) that the sheep have within 56 days before the movement been double-dipped

under the supervision of an Inspector of the Local Authority; and

(ii) that the sheep, since the second dipping, have been kept isolated from sheep which have not been so dipped, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground or saleyard.

(b) Such Certificate shall on the arrival of the sheep at the said special Sale, be delivered up to the Inspector of the Ministry.

(c) The sheep may be moved from the said special Sale only if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry authorising movement of the sheep to any destination in Great Britain and subject to such conditions, if any, as may be specified in the licence.

(d) All sheep exposed at the said special Sale shall be kept separate from all other sheep during movement to and from the Sale and whilst being exposed thereat.

Interpretation.

3. The expression "double-dipped" in this Order has the same meaning as in the principal Order.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this first day of August, nineteen hundred and thirty.

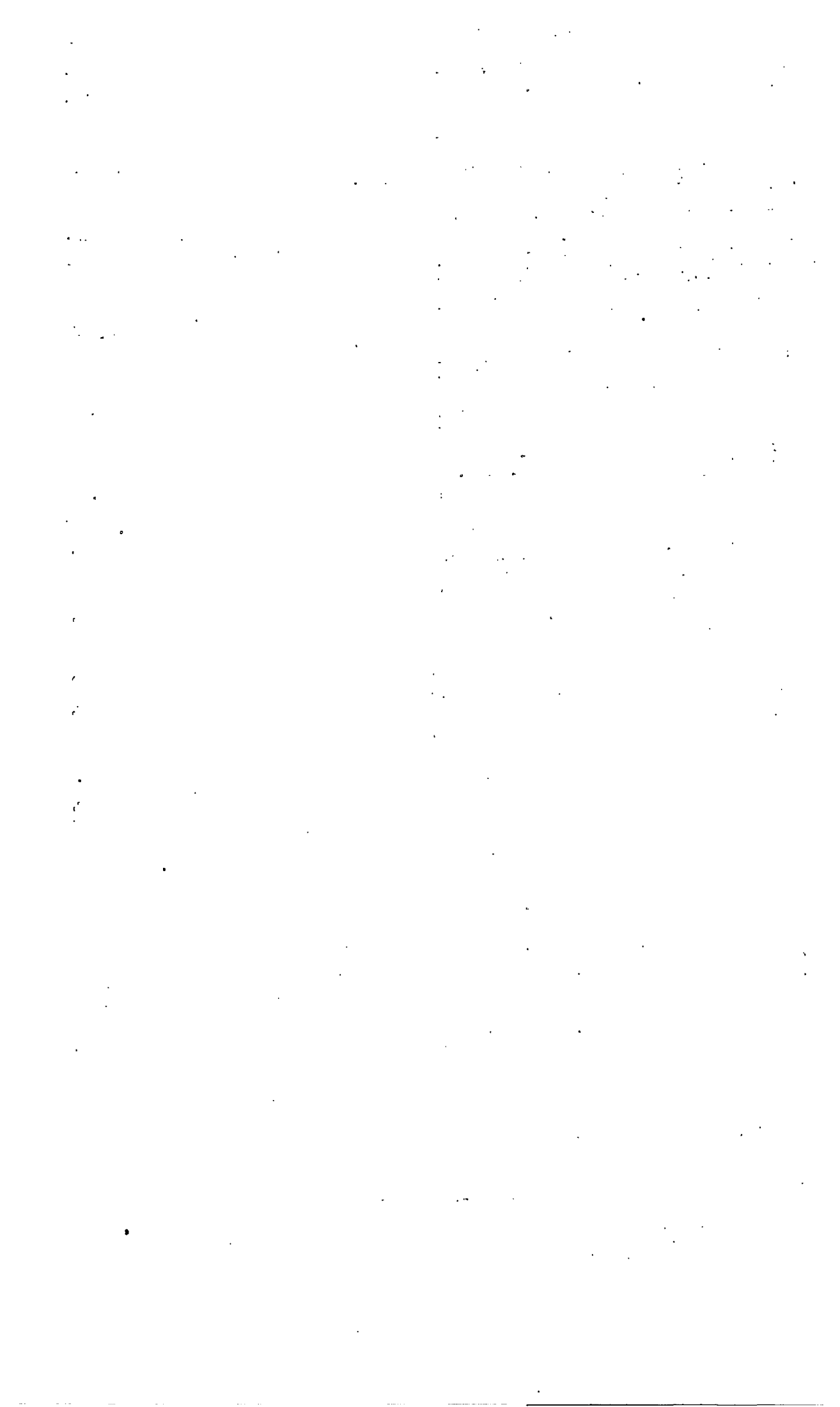
