"And whereas we consider it expedient that Royal Marines transferred to the Sick Berth branch of Your Majesty's Navy should now be subject to the normal conditions of that branch during the probationary period, and subsequently:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction that the Order in Council of the 8th February, 1890, be abrogated, and that Royal Marines who, in future, transfer to the Sick Berth branch, shall receive the pay appropriate to their Sick Berth rating at the time of transfer.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in

these proposals."

conditions of service:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Clause 9 of Schedule III to Your Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of October, 1923, to empower us to reduce or withhold, at our discretion, any grant which might otherwise have been made to an Officer invalided on account of a disability certified to be directly attributable to the conditions of service on or after the 1st October, 1921, if the disability be due to any cause within his control:

"And whereas we consider that we should have further powers of the like nature in respect of Officers invalided both for attribut-

able and non-attributable causes:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to provide that if in our opinion the unfitness for which an Officer is invalided, or the degree of his disability at any time thereafter when surveyed for the review of an award be due wholly or in part to his own negligence, misconduct or any cause within his control, any retired pay or gratuity which might otherwise have been granted to him may be reduced or withheld at our discretion.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in

this proposal."

"The power of His Majesty to apply the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, to British Possessions shall include a power to apply the said Act to any territories, being either territories under His Majesty's protection or territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty, to which it cannot be applied by virtue of the provisions of the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, and the said Act shall accordingly have effect as if references therein to British possessions included references to such territories as aforesaid":

And whereas on the sixth day of December, 1922, the Irish Free State was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament shortly entitled "The Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922 (Session 2)":

And whereas the State of Johore is a territory under His Majesty's Protection to which the said Colonial Probates Act, 1892, cannot be applied by virtue of the provisions of the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913:

And whereas His Majesty the King is satisfied that the Legislature of the State of Johore has made adequate provision for the recognition in that territory of probates and letters of administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above recited Acts in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall

apply to the State of Johore.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the sealing in the Irish Free State of any probate or letters of administration in pursuance of the said Act.

before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 19th day of June, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Luke, York, situate within the Parish of Saint Olave with Saint Giles, York, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Saint Olave with Saint Giles, York, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Philip and Saint James, Clifton, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parish and New Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Saint Olave with Saint Giles, York, and of the said New Parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Clifton, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Luke, York, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Archbishop of York, as Bishop of the Diocese and also as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Saint Olave with Saint Giles, York, with the consents of Donald Sween Mackay, of Hob Moor House, Tadcaster Road, York, Solicitor, of Henry Venn Scott, of Number 14, Saint Peter's Grove, Clifton, York, Solicitor, of Charles Ernest Elmhirst, of Number 8, Lendal, York, Solicitor, and of Henry Charles Shann of The Priory Gate, Sudbury, in the County of Suffolk, Doctor of Medicine, the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Clifton (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Saint Olave with Saint Giles, York, and of the said New Parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Clifton, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Luke, York, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, York.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, York, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Saint Olave with Saint Giles, York, in the County of York and in the Diocese of York, which is bounded upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Thomas, York, upon the north and upon the west by the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Philip and Saint James, Clifton, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Clifton, from the said Parish of St. Olave with Saint Giles, York, at the junction of Burton Stone Lane with Asylum Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Asylum Lane for a distance of 151 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Scarborough Terrace, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Scarborough Terrace for a distance of 10 yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footbridge leading across the York and Scarborough Line of the London and North Eastern Railway, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of the said footbridge for a distance of 13 yards or thereabouts to its centre upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Olave with Saint Giles, York, from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, York.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Clifton, which is bounded upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, York, upon the south by the above described portion of the Parish of Saint Olave with Saint Giles, York, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Olave with Saint Giles, York, from the said New Parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Clifton, at the junction of Burton Stone Lane with the road called Field View and extending thence northward along the middle of Burton Stone Lane for a distance of 441 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Wigginton Road near Bootham Stray Gates, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of Wigginton Road, and extending thence first eastward to and then south eastward along the middle of Wigginton Road for a distance in all of 3 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the said York and Scarborough Line of the London and North Eastern Railway across Wigginton Road, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Philip and Saint James, Clifton, from the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, York."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby

to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of May, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Westonsub-Edge and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Aston-sub-Edge, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to hold an Inquiry concerning the said two Benefices of Weston-sub-Edge and Aston-sub-Edge and also the Benefice of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne, situate partly in the said County of Gloucester and partly in the County of Worcester and wholly in the said Diocese of Gloucester duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Gloucester, and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Weston-sub-Edge and Astonsub-Edge and the terms for effecting the union, including certain alterations of boundaries affecting the Parishes of the said Benefices of Weston-sub-Edge and Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne and the Parish of the Benefice of Mickleton situate in the said County of Gloucester and in the said Diocese of Gloucester, and the said Bishop of Gloucester signified in writing his approval of the said

'And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said Union and alteration of boundaries based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Weston-sub-Edge and Aston-sub-Edge are now full, the Reverend Rowan Ernest Grice-Hutchinson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Weston-sub-Edge and the Reverend George Edward Hitchcock being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Aston-sub-Edge:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Weston-sub-Edge and the said Benefice of Aston-sub-Edge shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Weston-sub-Edge with Aston-sub-Edge,' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Weston-sub-Edge shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Weston-sub-Edge shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Aston-sub-Edge only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Weston-sub-Edge and the then Incumbent of Aston-sub-Edge shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Weston-sub-Edge only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Aston-sub-Edge and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Aston-sub-Edge if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Weston-sub-Edge shall have been instituted to Weston-sub-Edge subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Weston-sub-Edge before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Weston-sub-Edge following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Astonsub-Edge and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Aston-sub-Edge shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Aston-sub-Edge shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Weston-sub-Edge shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the second turn shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Aston-sub-Edge and the first, the third and the fourth turns shall belong to the Patron of the said Benefice of Weston-sub-Edge.

"7. That with the consent (testified by his signing this Scheme) of the Right Honourable John, Baron Sankey, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, as Patron on behalf of Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors of the said Benefice of Mickleton, and with the consents (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) of the Reverend Claude Sebastian Henry Sandwith now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne, and of the Reverend Frederick George Lacey, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Mickleton, upon the union taking effect: (a) All that part of the said Parish of Weston-sub-Edge which lies to the north west of the middle of the Cheltenham and Honeybourne Branch Line of the Great Western Railway, shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne; (b) All that part of the said Parish of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne which lies to the south east of the middle of the said Cheltenham and Honeybourne Branch Line of Railway shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Weston-sub-Edge; and (c) All that part of the said Parish of Weston-sub-Edge (being part of a detachment of such Parish) which lies to the north east of the middle of the Oxford, Worcester and Wolverhampton Branch Line of the Great Western Railway shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Mickleton.

"8. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe rentcharges, glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the said two Benefices of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne and Mickleton, with the annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned that is to say (1) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne and (2) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £100 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Mickleton; the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne and Mickleton respectively, and the said annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of either of the said Benefices of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne and Mickleton or his representatives on the one hand and his

successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges in each case the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne and Mickleton and their successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said Benefices of Church Honeybourne with Cow Honeybourne and Mickleton or either of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Gloucester for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for both or either of the said yearly rentcharges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then in every case in which such equivalent provision shall have been made the corresponding annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the said Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make an alteration in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Gloucester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

DRAFT DEFINITION OF THE CATERING TRADE.

The Catering trade (that is to say):—

- 1. All work performed in or in connection with a catering establishment.
- 2. For the purposes of this Appendix the expression "catering establishment" means an undertaking, or branch or department of an undertaking, wholly or mainly engaged in the preparation, supply, or serving of good or drink for consumption at premises or places where such food or drink is served by persons in the employment of the undertaking, or branch or department.

Authorisation of Landing of Animals for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed sub-

ject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulations applicable to the Animals on Landing.

- 4.—(1) The animals on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.
- (2) The animals shall not be removed from the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than under the authority of the licence from an Inspector of the Ministry required under Article 3 (1) (Fifth) of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896.
- (3) A copy of every licence authorising the movement of any animal described in the First Schedule hereto shall be forwarded to the Ministry by the Inspector who grants the licence.
