### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 5th September, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills-Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th September, 1930, to Saturday, the 13th September, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the

Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London

Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief

Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

(John Park Mathie.)

Whereas John Park Mathie, L.R.C.P., R.C.S.Ed., L.R.F.P.S.Glas., of Kelvin L.R.C.S.Ed., L.R.F.P.S.Glas., of Kelvin House, Church Street, Bilston, Staffordshire, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said John Park Mathie cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said John Park Mathie, the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said John Park Mathie to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation)

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF DISTRICT OFFICERS UNDER THE FORESTRY COMMISSIONERS.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies.

- 1. Age.—Candidates must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 30 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part; provided that in reckoning age for this purpose a candidate who served in the Army, Navy or Air Force between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, may deduct from his actual age any period of service between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st December, 1919.
- 2. Nationality.—Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—
  - (a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.
