FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE ORDER OF 1930.

Provision for treatment with serum in certain circumstances.

The Minister may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, treat with serum as often as may be, in his opinion, necessary any animals which have been in contact with animals affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease or which have, in his opinion, been exposed to the danger of infection of that disease.

Amendment of Article 14 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order of 1928.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 14 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Order of 1928 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) no animal seized under the provisions thereof shall be moved for any purpose whatsoever from the place at which it is seized except by direction of the Minister or of an Inspector of the Ministry.

Expenses.

3. The Minister may recover summarily as a civil debt the expenses of the execution by him or by an Inspector of the Ministry of any of the provisions of the principal Order as amended by this Order from the owner of any animal seized or detained, or from the consignor or consignee thereof, who may recover the same from the owner by proceedings in any court of competent jurisdiction.

4. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE ORDER OF 1930 and shall be read as one with the principal Order.
