CORPORATION OF RAWTENSTALL.

RAWTENSTALL CORPORATION ACT, 1924.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 6 of the Rawtenstall Corporation Act, 1924, it is provided that the Corporation of Rawtenstall (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") may with the consent of the Minister

of Transport and the local authority of the district run omnibuses along any route outside the Borough.

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of the said sub-section the Corporation have made application to the Minister of Transport for his consent to the running by them of omnibuses on the following route, that is to say:—In the area of the County Borough of Burnley commencing at the boundary of the Borough of Burnley in Burnley Road West, thence along Manchester Road to Grimshaw Street, thence along Grimshaw Street and Parker Lane to the Cattle Market, returning via Parker Lane, Grimshaw Street and Manchester Road.

And notice is hereby further given that objection to the giving of such consent may be sent in writing to the Assistant Secretary, Roads Department, Ministry of Transport, 7, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1, on or before the sixteenth day of October, 1930.
