GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

Greeting!

Whereas Her late Majesty Queen Victoria being desirous of distinguishing by some mark of Her Royal Favour the many heroic acts performed by Mariners and others who endanger their own lives in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from shipwrecks and other perils of the sea; and the many heroic acts performed on land by those who endanger their own lives in saving or endeavouring to save the lives of others from accidents in mines, on railways and at fires, or other peril within Her Dominions, other than perils of the sea, did, by Warrants under the Royal Sign Manual bearing date respectively the 7th March, 1866, the 12th April, 1867, and the 30th April, 187, for Herself, Her Heirs and Successors institute and create as a mark of Royal Approbation of such heroic acts, new Decorations styled respectively "The Albert Medal of the which may have been so forfeited when such 65-33651

First Class," and "The Albert Medal of the Second Class," which Decorations Her Majesty was desirous should be highly prized and eagerly sought after:

And whereas all the Warrants relating to these Decorations were consolidated by a Warrant under the Sign Manual bearing date the 5th June, 1905:

And whereas by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual bearing date the 28th August, 1917, the style of the said Decorations was amended and the Rules and Ordinances for the government of the Decorations were further consolidated:

And whereas We are desirous of amending the seventh clause of the said Royal Warrant of the 28th August, 1917:

Now know ye that We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors abrogate the seventh clause of the said Royal Warrant of the twenty-eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and in lieu thereof We ordain that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors by an Order under Our Sign Manual and on a recommendation to that effect by or through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State to cancel and annul the award to any person of either of the above Decorations and that thereupon his name in the Register shall be erased. vided that it shall be competent for Us, Our heirs and Successors to restore any Decoration

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED IN RECOMMENDING HIS MAJESTY TO GRANT THE KING'S POLICE MEDAL.

I, the Right Honourable John Robert Clynes, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby make the following Regulation amending the Regulations made on the 7th July, 1909:

1. To Regulation 6 (b) of the said Regulations there shall be added the words "or other police service of conspicuous merit."

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

Greeting!

Whereas We, having taken into Our Royal consideration the faithful and devoted service rendered by members of the Special Constabulary during the War, and being desirous of distinguishing such service by some mark of Our Royal Favour, and also of providing a means of recognizing continued and efficient service which may be rendered in the future by members of any Special Constabulary Reserve hereafter constituted, did by Warrant under Our Sign Manual dated the 30th August, 1919, institute and create a new Medal to be awarded for such service as aforesaid;

And whereas We did by Warrants under Our Sign Manual dated the 31st January, 1920, and the 15th August, 1929, establish revised Rules for the governance of the said Decoration:

And whereas We are desirous of further amending the said Rules, We are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following Rules for the governance of the said Decoration:—

I. It is ordained that the Medal shall be designated and styled "The Special Constabulary Long Service Medal."

II. It is ordained that the Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of Bronze with Our Effigy on the obverse and on the reverse an appropriate design or inscription, and shall bear on the rim the name of the person to whom the Medal is awarded.

III. It is ordained that the Medal shall only be awarded to those of Our faithful subjects who, being or having been members of the Special Constabulary during the War or of any Special Constabulary Reserve, shall satisfy the following conditions, namely:—

- (1) Shall have served as a Special Constable without pay during the War for not less than three years, and shall during that period have performed not less than 150 police duties; or
- (2) Shall have served in a Special Constabulary Reserve for not less than nine years, and shall be recommended by the Chief Officer of Police as willing and competent to discharge the duties of a Special Constable and as having performed without pay such duty as a Special Constable as has been required from him by the Chief Officer of Police during that period.

Provided that in the case of a man who has served both in the Special Constabulary during the War and in a Special Constabulary Reserve, each period of service during the War amounting to one year or upwards in the course of which he completed not less than 50 police duties shall be reckoned as equivalent to three years' efficient service in the Reserve, and other periods in the same proportion.

IV. It is ordained that the Medal shall be awarded by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department or by Our Principal Secretary of State for Scotland, and that the names of the persons eligible for such Medal shall be submitted to Our said Secretaries of State respectively by the Chief Officer of Police under whom such persons have served.

V. It is ordained that the Medal shall be worn on the left breast suspended from a riband of an inch and three-eighths in width, of which the central part (one-third of the whole) shall be red, while the remaining parts shall each have three longitudinal stripes of equal width, the central stripe being black and the other two white; and further, that in the case of those to whom the Medal is awarded for service during the War a bar or clasp shall be attached to the riband, bearing the words "The Great War, 1914-1918."

VI. It is ordained that an additional bar or clasp which shall be attached to the riband and shall bear upon it the words "Long Service" may be awarded to those to whom the Medal has been awarded upon the same recommendation by the Chief Officer of Police as is required for the award of the Medal upon the completion of each ten years of service after the award of the Medal, or, where such award was made under Rule III (1),

after 19th July, 1919.

VII. It is ordained that on a recommendation to that effect by or through one of Our said Secretaries of State it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors to direct the cancellation and annulment of the award to any person of the Medal or Bars, and thereupon the name of such person shall be erased from the record of those to whom the Medal shall have been awarded, and every person whose Medal shall be so forfeited shall on being required so to do by either of Our said Secretaries of State deliver up his Medal to such person as either of Our said Secretaries of State may direct. Provided that it shall be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors to direct the restoration of any Medal or Bars which may have been so forfeited when such recommendation has been withdrawn.

VIII. All previous Warrants issued in this behalf are hereby revoked except in so far as they are already revoked.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. - 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

DRIFT NETS MENDING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Trade Board established in Great Britain for the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Drift Nets Mending Trade, Great Britain) (Constitution and Proceedings) Regulations, 1925, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the minimum rates of wages for female workers set out in their Notice E. (8) dated 24th January, 1930, by providing that the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Column I of Paragraph 1 (and the Overtime Rates based thereon), and the General Minimum Piece Rates set out in Column I of Paragraph 3, of the Notice E. (8) shall operate for a period of 18 months from 27th January, 1930, instead of as at present provided for a period of 12 months from such date, and that the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Column II of Paragraph 1 (and the Overtime Rates based thereon), and the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Column II of Paragraph 3, of the Notice E (8) shall operate only as from 27th July, 1931, instead of as from 27th January, 1931, as at present provided.

This Notice is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

Pursuant to Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 10th October, 1930, the date on which Notice of the Proposal was given in the London Gazette and The Edinburgh Gazette.
