The Home Secretary gives notice that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts, of women of 18 and young persons of 16 years of age and over in connexion with the legging and footing of hose in the Full Fashioned Knitting Department at the works of Messrs. St. Albans Hosiery Mills, Hatfield Road, St. Albans, Hertfordshire, subject to the conditions that a worker shall not be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks and that suitable accommodation for clothing put off during working hours, messroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.
