## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 31st October, 1930, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from

Monday, the 3rd November, 1930, to Saturday, the 8th November, 1930, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The KING has been pleased, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm, bearing date the 20th instant, to nominate the Reverend Thomas Sherwood Jones, M.A., Rector of Middleton, Lancashire, and Honorary Canon of Manchester, to be Bishop Suffragan of Hulme in the Diocese of Manchester.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Archbold Hawthorn in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 12th May, 1930, a fall of roof estimated at about 20 tons occurred at the North Biddick Colliery, Washington, Co. Durham, and entombed Lawrence Taylor, a hewer, and Stewart Collins, a putter, who were working at a seam. The Deputy and several other men hurried to the scene and an attempt was made by the Deputy to make a way over or through the fall by pulling away loose timber and stones. In jumping back to avoid a large falling stone the Deputy fell and struck his head against a rail which rendered him semi-conscious.

Meanwhile Archbold Hawthorn, the Fore-Overman, who had been summoned, arrived on the scene. Having first satisfied himself that

the entombed men were unhurt, he began to scrape a hole through the top of the fall, and in a short time he succeeded in making a hole through the fall about 18 inches square and about 4 yards long. Hawthorn then crawled halfway through the tunnel and pulled both Collins and Taylor through the opening. Immediately after Taylor had been extricated, another extensive fall occurred and closed the tunnel completely.

Hawthorn displayed conspicuous gallantry in effecting single handed the rescue of these two men. He incurred great personal risk as he was working in an open cavity from which stones were falling the whole time and there was always the danger that another large fall might occur before the rescue operations were completed.

Front of vehicles toward the East. <i>Note:—</i>This Standing will be available between the hours of 9 a.m. and 10 p.m. only.</p>
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Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section hereby approve the scheme as printed in the Schedule hereto, and appoint 25th October, 1930, as the date on which the said scheme shall come into force.

**SCHEDULE.**

**COAL MINES ACT, 1930.**

**THE NORTH STAFFORDSHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.**

1. This Scheme may be cited as the NORTH STAFFORDSHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930, and is hereinafter throughout referred to as "the Scheme" which expression shall include any amendment of the Scheme for the time being in force.

2. In the Scheme, unless the contrary intention appears:—

"The Act" means the Coal Mines Act, 1930;

"The Central Scheme" means the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, including any amendment thereof for the time being in force, and "The Central Council" means the Council for the time being constituted thereunder;

"Class" means, in relation to coal, a class determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, or according to whether it be supplied for use in Great Britain or for export to any other country;

"Coal" includes bituminous coal, cannel coal and anthracite;

"Coal mine" means any mine or open working in the District where the getting of coal is the principal object of the mining or quarrying operations;

"Disposal" in relation to a coal mine means the tonnage of saleable coal raised and weighed at the pit head at that coal mine, after deducting all coal to be used for the purpose of working the mine and all coal to be supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed;

"The District" means the North Staffordshire District subject to the provisions of any Order of the Board of Trade under paragraph 2 of Part II of the Schedule to the Act, directing that a coal mine situate in the District shall be treated as situate in an adjoining district;

"District Allocation" means the maximum permissible output for the District for any period as determined under the provisions of the Central Scheme;

"The District Fund" means the District Fund constituted by and established under the Scheme;

"Functions" includes powers and duties;

"Majority Owners" means the owners of coal mines joining in submission of the Scheme to the Board of Trade and "Minority Owners" means the owners of coal mines other than majority owners;

"Output" means the tonnage in coal raised and weighed at the pithead of a coal mine;

"Owner" means the owner (as defined in the Coal Mines Act, 1911) of any coal mine, and where an owner is for the purposes of the Scheme represented by a duly authorised representative includes such representative;

"The Secretary" means the Secretary to the Executive Board constituted under the provisions of the Scheme;

"The Trustees" means the persons for the time being appointed under the provisions of the Scheme to be Trustees for the Executive Board;

"Undertaking" means any undertaking comprising two or more coal mines belonging to the same owner.

#### *Duration and Scope of the Scheme.*

3.—(1) The Scheme shall come into force on such date as may be appointed by the Board of Trade under the provisions of the Act, and

shall remain in force until the expiration of Part I of the Act, unless in the meantime:—

(i) A new scheme shall be substituted in manner hereafter provided by the Scheme, or

(ii) The Board of Trade shall direct in pursuance of sub-section (7) of Section 5 of the Act that the Scheme shall cease to have effect.

(2) The production of coal and the supply and sale of such coal by all owners shall be regulated by the provisions of the Scheme.

#### *Administration of the Scheme.*

4. There shall be constituted and elected annually in manner hereafter in the Scheme provided an Executive Board (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the Board") who shall be responsible for the general administration of the Scheme and it shall be the duty of the Board, subject to the provisions of the Scheme and within the limits thereof, to take from time to time such steps as may appear to them desirable for the purposes of regulating to the best advantage the production of coal in the district and the supply and sale of such coal.

5.—(1) The Board shall consist of 18 owners or their representatives, and shall be elected annually at a general meeting of all the owners:

Provided that not more than one representative of any owner shall be elected on the Board. And provided that the Board as first elected shall consist of 11 persons representative of the majority owners and of 7 persons representative of the minority owners who shall respectively be nominated and elected by majority owners only and by minority owners only.

(2) At every election of Members of the Board there shall be elected with each member a person to act in case of need as a substitute for such member, and in the event of any member of the Board being unavoidably prevented from attending any Meeting of the Board his substitute so elected may attend and take part in the meeting in place of such member.

(3) The method of voting at the election of members of the first and every succeeding Board including such substitutes as aforesaid shall be that prescribed in Clause 29 of the Scheme.

6. The Board shall hold office for twelve months, at the end of which period all members of the Board shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.

7. The Board may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit.

8. The Secretary shall upon receipt of any requisition for a meeting of the Board signed by any member of the Board or by any three owners, summon a meeting of the Board, by giving not less than three days' notice in writing of such meeting to every member of the Board:

Provided that the purpose for which the meeting is required shall be specified in every such requisition and notice as aforesaid.

9. The Board shall appoint a Chairman to preside at the meetings thereof and a Deputy Chairman to preside in his absence. If at any meeting of the Board neither the Chairman



nor the Deputy Chairman is present, the members of the Board present shall choose one of their number to act as Chairman of that meeting.

10. Seven members of the Board present at a meeting shall form a quorum.

11. Any casual vacancy occurring on the Board may be filled by the members of the Board, but any person so appointed a member of the Board shall retire with the elected members at the end of their term of office:

Provided that in filling any casual vacancy on the Board as first elected, regard shall be had to whether the member whose place is being filled was appointed by the Majority or the Minority Owners.

12. The Board may appoint Committees from time to time from among their own members or otherwise for such purposes as they shall think fit, provided that any decision of a Committee shall be subject to the approval of the Board.

13. The Board shall appoint a Secretary to the Board and such other officers as are required to give effect to the functions of the Board and they shall fix the terms and duration of each appointment.

14. Voting at all meetings of the Board and at meetings of any Committee appointed by the Board shall be by show of hands, each member having one vote, but in the event of an equality of votes the Chairman of the Meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

15. Subject to the provisions of the Scheme the meetings of the Board and of any Committees appointed by the Board shall be held and conducted in accordance with such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the Board, including provision for the taking and keeping of minutes, which shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which they are approved and such signature shall be sufficient evidence of their accuracy.

16. The expenses of the Board and of any Committees appointed by the Board and the salaries of any officers of the Board, including such remuneration (if any) of the Chairman of the Board as may be determined by vote of a general meeting of owners, shall be payable out of the District Fund.

#### *General Meetings.*

17. Mr. E. A. Wright, of The Coal Trade Office, Stoke-on-Trent, shall call or cause to be called a general meeting of all the owners not later than seven days after the date on which the Scheme comes into force, for the purpose of electing the first Board and for any other business that may be necessary under the Scheme.

18. A general meeting of owners shall be held in each succeeding year at intervals of approximately 12 months:

Provided that such annual general meeting shall be held not less than seven days before the retirement of the Board for the time being is due to take place, and that the business of such annual general meeting shall include the election of the Board for the twelve months following upon such retirement.

19. The election of representatives of the District to the Central Council together with any substitutes therefor shall take place at a general meeting, and the method of voting shall be that specified in Clause 29:

Provided that such representatives and substitutes shall be elected from—

(a) those persons who have been elected or appointed to Membership of the Board and are still serving in that capacity, and

(b) the Secretary or other officers of the Board.

20. Save as otherwise provided in the Scheme, the date, time and place of all general meetings shall be determined by the Board.

21. The Board may whenever they shall think fit, and shall upon requisition made in writing by not less than three owners, convene a general meeting. Such requisition shall expressly state the object of the meeting that it is proposed to call and shall be addressed to the Secretary.

22. Upon receipt of such requisition the Board shall proceed forthwith to call a general meeting, and, if they neglect to do so for seven days from the date of the serving of the requisition on the Secretary, the signatories of the requisition may themselves convene the meeting.

23. At least seven days' notice in writing of every general meeting stating the time, the date and the place of the meeting shall be sent by the Secretary or other person convening the meeting to each owner and such notice shall also state the general nature of the business to be transacted at the meeting, but the non-receipt of the notice by any owner shall not invalidate the proceedings at a general meeting.

24. The expenses of all general meetings, including the expenses of the meeting summoned under Clause 17 hereof, shall be regarded as expenses of the Board and shall be paid out of the District Fund.

25.—(1) At the first and each subsequent annual general meeting, the owners present shall appoint a Chairman and Deputy Chairman of general meetings who shall hold office until the next following annual general meeting when they shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.

(2) Such Chairman, or in his absence, the Deputy Chairman, shall preside at all general meetings, and in the absence of the Chairman and Deputy Chairman, the owners present at the meeting may appoint a Chairman for that meeting from those present thereat.

26. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum of seven owners or their representatives are personally present:

Provided that if at any meeting a quorum is not present within half-an-hour after the time appointed for holding the meeting, the Chairman of the meeting may adjourn the same until such reasonable time as he may decide; being not less than seven days later, and at the adjourned meeting the owners or their representatives actually present shall form a quorum.

27. Each owner shall by notice in writing to the Secretary nominate a representative to attend general meetings and (if an individual) may nominate himself. Each owner may further in like manner nominate a substitute to attend any meeting when the first nominated representative is unable to attend.

28. At any general meeting:—

(1) Any matter put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided by show of hands unless a poll is demanded at the meeting and on such show of hands each representative or substitute present shall have one vote;

(2) In the event of equality of votes the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote;

(3) Unless a poll is demanded, the declaration by the Chairman of the meeting that a Resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried or lost and an entry to the effect in the minutes of the meeting shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded for or against the Resolution;

(4) The decision of the Chairman of the meeting as to the result of the voting on any Resolution shall be final.

29. On a poll, which shall be taken at the meeting, every owner present or who has appointed a proxy for the meeting shall have one vote and one further vote for each complete 75,000 tons of the annual standard tonnage of his coal mine or mines:

Provided that at any general meeting held during the first year of operation of the scheme before standard tonnages have been determined, every owner present or who has appointed a proxy for the meeting shall have one vote and one further vote for each complete 75,000 tons of the output of his coal mine or mines in the period of twelve months ended 31st March, 1928.

30. Votes on a poll at any general meeting may be given either personally or by proxy, and in the latter event the instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing and shall be sent to the Secretary not less than two days before the meeting takes place.

31.—(1) A minute book of the proceedings at general meetings shall be kept by the Secretary and all Resolutions and the result of voting thereon shall be entered therein.

(2) The minutes of each meeting shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which they are approved and such signature shall be sufficient evidence of their accuracy.

#### *Notice of Decisions of the Board and other Notices.*

32. The Board shall, through the Secretary, give notice in writing of their decisions, and of the decisions of any of their Committees, to all owners immediately after the decisions have been reached. Such notices and any other notices to be given by the Board to any owners individually under the provisions of the Scheme shall be addressed either to the registered office of the owner, to his principal place of business, or to such address as he may furnish to the Secretary as appropriate for the service of such notices, and they may be served either personally or by prepaid post, and if posted shall be deemed to have been received by the owner within 24 hours of the posting thereof.

#### *Amendment of Scheme.*

33. The owners may, by Resolution in general meeting from time to time, authorise the Board to submit to the Board of Trade any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme or a new scheme in substitution therefor and the

Board shall thereupon submit such alteration or new scheme in writing to the Board of Trade:

Provided that—

(a) The method of voting on the Resolution authorising any such submission shall be that prescribed in Clause 29 of the Scheme;

(b) The Resolution in order to have effect must be supported by at least 51 per cent. of the total number of votes that could be recorded under that Clause by all the owners;

(c) In the event of the Board failing to submit the alteration or new scheme in writing to the Board of Trade within seven days of the passing of an effective Resolution hereunder, any owner may so submit the same; and

(d) The alteration or new scheme (as the case may be) shall not come into force unless and until approved by the Board of Trade and shall then be operative from such date as may be prescribed by them.

#### *Classification of Coal.*

34. For the purpose of determining the various classes to which the coal produced in the District belongs the Board shall, as soon as possible after the first election, and subsequently from time to time as they may think fit, require returns to be made to them within a specified time by every owner, in a form to be prescribed and issued by the Board.

35. The Board shall allocate the coal produced at each coal mine into classes, such classification being made at the discretion of the Board according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, or according to whether the coal be supplied for use in Great Britain or for export to any other country.

36. Any classification made by the Board under the scheme shall immediately be communicated to all the owners.

37. If any owner is dissatisfied with any classification made by the Board in respect of his coal mine or mines, he may give notice of objection to the Board at any time within fourteen days after such classification being communicated to him as aforesaid, and the Board shall thereupon reconsider the matter and deliver their decision thereon without delay.

#### *Determination of Standard Tonnage.*

38. Each owner shall furnish to the Board upon notice given to him by the Board a statement in writing specifying the name and situation of every coal mine owned by him within the District and the output of each mine during the following periods, namely:—

The year ended 31st March, 1924.

together with particulars of any seasonal fluctuation in trade and the respective quantities of each class of coal comprised in the output for each of the said periods, and such other information which the Board may require for the purpose of determining standard tonnages.

39. The aforesaid statement may be accompanied by particulars in writing of any claim (together with the evidence necessary to substantiate the same) which the owner may

desire to advance for special treatment in the determination of the standard tonnage of any coal mine to which his said statement relates on the ground of the special circumstances of the mine, including the efficiency and economy of the working of the mine, or the extent to which it has been developed, or is being developed for economic working, and the extent to which its output has been increasing or decreasing.

40. The Board shall determine an annual standard tonnage for each coal mine or undertaking and may, if they think fit, further distribute the standard tonnage fixed for any such mine or undertaking among the various classes of coal produced therefrom, provided that such distribution of the standard tonnages among classes of coal shall be effected for all coal mines or undertakings producing those classes of coal or any of them.

41.—(1) The method of determination of standard tonnages shall be as follows:—

The annual standard tonnage of each coal mine shall be the output of the coal mine during the year ended the 31st day of March, 1928, subject to such adjustment by the Board as shall have regard to the special circumstances of the coal mine (including the efficiency and economy of the working of the mine, the extent to which it has been developed or is being developed for economic working, and the extent to which its output has been increasing or decreasing).

(2) In any case where the standard tonnage cannot be ascertained by means of the above provisions, the Board may decide the basis of the standard tonnage and may determine the same on such basis having regard to the special circumstances of the mine as defined in the preceding sub-clause.

(3) After the determination of the Annual Standard Tonnages of each coal mine or undertaking every owner shall declare by notice in writing to the Secretary the monthly proportions in which he requires the Board to allocate the annual standard tonnage of his coal mine or undertaking for the twelve months of each year ending on the 30th day of April, or over such other period as the Board may prescribe, and if the Board shall be satisfied that such declared allocations are not prejudicial to the interests of other owners, they shall fix the allocated monthly tonnages as the Monthly Standard Tonnages of the coal mine or undertaking concerned. After the Board shall have fixed such Monthly Standard Tonnages the same shall not be altered by the owner concerned during the year in question, except with the written consent of the Board and in such manner as may be so sanctioned.

42. Notice of the standard tonnages so determined by the Board (including any special conditions attaching thereto and any provisions relating to the distribution of the standard tonnage for the year in unequal monthly quantities or the distribution of the tonnage among the classes of coal produced) and of the results of any such revision thereof as is hereafter mentioned in Clause 44 of the Scheme, shall immediately be given by the Board to all the owners.

43. If any owner is dissatisfied with any standard tonnage so determined and communicated to him as aforesaid, or with any special condition attaching thereto, or with the omission of any special condition desired by the owner, he may give notice of objection to the

Board at any time within fourteen days of such communication and the Board shall thereupon reconsider the matter and deliver their decision thereon without delay.

44. Subject to the provisions of Clause 45 of the Scheme, the Board may at any time review (whether upon an appeal by an owner or not) and if necessary revise and vary the standard tonnages or any of them and fix such revised standard tonnages as may seem to the Board fair and proper having regard to the special circumstances of each mine affected by the revision.

45. Where after the commencement of the Scheme an owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine or undertaking the standard tonnage of the coal mine or undertaking so acquired added to the standard tonnage of any other coal mine or undertaking belonging to such owner, shall if the owner so desires constitute the standard tonnage of the combined undertaking and on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages, such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnage so constituted were the standard tonnage of the combined undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages for the District:

Provided that where an owner purchases or otherwise acquires part only of an undertaking in respect of which a standard tonnage has been determined under the Scheme, the proportion of that standard tonnage to be added to the standard tonnage of any other coal mine or undertaking belonging to such owner shall be determined by the Board, and that amount shall be deducted from the standard tonnage of the undertaking of which part has been so acquired.

#### *Determination of Quotas.*

46.—(1) The Board shall, as soon as the first District Allocation has been settled and thereafter from time to time, determine the proportion (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the quota") of the standard tonnage for the period covered by the quota that may be produced from each coal mine or undertaking, having regard among other matters to the estimated demand for the coal of the District during the period covered by the quota and to the output permissible under the District Allocation.

(2) If separate standard tonnages have been determined by the Board for any class or classes of coal, the Board may, if they think fit, determine a separate quota for any or all of such classes of coal.

(3) Any quota so determined shall cover a period not exceeding three months and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not less than seven days before the commencement of the period to which such quota relates.

(4) Any quota so determined as respects coal or any class of coal shall be the same proportion of the standard tonnage for the period covered by the quota of coal, or of the class of coal, as the case may be, for all coal mines or undertakings.

(5) All quotas shall be so calculated that, during any period for which the District Allocation has been fixed that Allocation shall not be exceeded.

(6) The Board may at any time during the course of the period for which any quota has been determined increase the quota applicable to coal or to any class of coal and such increase

shall apply for any unexpired remainder of the period for which the quota was determined, or for such part thereof as the Board may prescribe. The notice required under sub-clause (3) of this Clause shall not apply to such increase, but the increase shall be notified to all the owners in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.

47. The total output of each coal mine or undertaking shall be ascertained at the end of each period for which a quota is determined, and for that purpose every owner shall forward to the Secretary within seven days after the end of such period a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe, giving full particulars of the output of his coal mine or undertaking during the period in question together with such other particulars as may be necessary for ascertaining any excess of output over the quota during the period. If in any case the output has exceeded the tonnage permitted by the quota (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under Clause 48 of the Scheme and any transfer of quota effected under Clause 49 of the Scheme), the owner of the coal mine or undertaking shall be liable in respect of such excess to the penalties prescribed in Clauses 77 and 78 of the Scheme.

48. No owner shall be entitled, in the event of the output of his coal mine or undertaking in any period for which a quota is determined falling short of the tonnage permitted by the quota for that period, to carry forward the amount of the shortage or any portion thereof as an addition to the tonnage permissible under the quota during the next or any succeeding period:

Provided that if the quota is fixed for a period of one month only, an owner shall be entitled, in the event of the output of his coal mine or undertaking falling short of the tonnage permitted by the quota for the month to carry forward the amount of the shortage (being the difference between the tonnage permitted by the quota for the month, including any transfers of quota effected under Clause 49 of the Scheme, and the actual output of the mine or undertaking during the month) as an addition to the tonnage permissible under the quota during the next succeeding month. All such shortages shall be cancelled at the end of each period for which a District Allocation has been made by the Central Council.

49. Any owner may exceed the quota for any period by arranging with any other owner, for such consideration (if any) as may be agreed between them that the output of the coal mine or undertaking of that other owner permissible under the quota for the same period shall be reduced by an agreed number of tons, to which number any such excess shall be limited:

Provided that if the excess is in respect of any particular class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined the reduction in the output of such other owner must be in respect of a quota determined for the same class of coal and that any failure of such owner to reduce his permissible output by the agreed number of tons shall render him liable in respect of such failure to the penalties prescribed in Clauses 77 and 78 of the scheme.

50. Notice in writing of any arrangement to exceed and reduce quotas under the last preceding clause must be given to the Secretary by the parties within 24 hours of the making of the arrangement.

#### *Determination of Prices.*

51. The Board shall, as soon as possible after the first election of the Board, call for returns from each owner in such form as the Board may prescribe, setting forth the prices actually obtained by him during the preceding twelve months for the various classes of coal sold or supplied by him, together with such further information as the Board may deem necessary, and thereupon the Board shall proceed to fix a minimum price per ton of 20 cwt. for each class of coal produced in the District below which price coal of that class (exclusive of coal supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about any coal mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed) shall not be sold or supplied by owners.

52. The minimum prices fixed shall in the case of coal sold or destined for shipment be f.o.b. at the customary place of shipment and in all other cases shall be as fixed by the Board having regard to all the circumstances of the case:

Provided that there shall be only one minimum price for each class of coal as defined in the Scheme.

53. The minimum prices fixed in the first instance shall remain in force for such period as the Board may deem desirable, but the Board may revise the minimum prices from time to time and shall alter the same when alteration appears to the Board to be necessary and in particular, on the application of any owner for the revision of the price so fixed for any particular class of coal produced by him, the Board shall forthwith consider such application and make such alteration of price (if any) as is in their opinion necessary.

54. The minimum price fixed from time to time for each class of coal shall forthwith be communicated to all the owners.

55. If any owner is dissatisfied with any price fixed for the time being under the Scheme in respect of any coal or class of coal produced by him, he may give notice of objection to the Board at any time within fourteen days after such communication of the price as aforesaid, and the Board shall thereupon reconsider the matter and deliver their decision thereon without delay.

56. As from the date when a minimum price is fixed by the Board for any class of coal under the provisions of the Scheme, no owner producing coal of that class shall, either directly or indirectly

(i) sell or supply the coal at a price below the price so fixed for the time being;

(ii) sell or supply the coal in any manner whereby the actual consideration obtained is less in value than the price so fixed; or

(iii) allow or give, or agree to allow or give, save as may expressly be permitted by the Scheme, any discount, commission, rebate, extended credit or allowance in respect of the price, quantity or weight of the coal or otherwise;

and any owner who contravenes in any particular the provisions of this Clause shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Clause 79 of the Scheme.

57. The Executive Board may prescribe conditions of sale for securing that the actual consideration obtained by the sale or supply of any class of coal shall not be less in value than the minimum price for the time being fixed for that class of coal, and every owner shall comply with such conditions of sale as may be so prescribed.

58. In the event of any owner, in consequence of complaint by a customer in regard to short weight or quality of coal in any consignment being required to furnish additional quantities or make a reduction or allowance in price for that particular consignment in order to meet such complaint, the owner concerned shall be entitled to supply such additional quantity or make such adjustment in his account as may be necessary, subject to making a report thereof in writing to the Board within ten days after the expiration of each calendar month during which any such concession is made; and any such concession which is not approved by the Board shall be deemed to be a breach of the provisions of the Scheme relating to the determination of prices and shall render the owner liable to the penalties prescribed in Clause 79 of the Scheme.

59. If any owner ships or causes to be shipped any cargo or consignment of coal otherwise than in pursuance of a *bona-fide* contract for the sale thereof, the actual consideration obtained by the sale or supply of the coal so shipped, being the amount remaining after deduction of the shipping and other charges incurred subsequent to shipment from the price ultimately obtained for the coal, shall not be less in value than the minimum *f.o.b.* price for coal of the same class ruling under the Scheme at the date of shipment, and any contravention of the provisions of this Clause shall render the owner, who shipped or caused to be shipped, the coal in respect of which the contravention occurs, liable to the penalties prescribed in Clause 79 of the Scheme.

60. In rendering to the Board such returns as the Board may prescribe of sales and deliveries with a view to ascertaining whether or not any coal has been sold below the minimum price therefor fixed for the time being under the Scheme, any owner who claims to have sold or delivered in accordance with the custom of the trade or otherwise, any coal at a price other than on the basis fixed under Clause 52, shall furnish to the Board full details of the costs and charges actually incurred or to be incurred which fall to be added to or deducted from the price received in order to arrive at the basis fixed under that Clause for the purposes of comparison with the appropriate minimum price under the Scheme.

#### Trustees.

61. At the General meeting called in pursuance of Clause 17 of the Scheme the owners shall appoint three persons to be the Trustees for the Board under the Scheme, in whom shall be vested the District Fund and all other property of the Board.

62. Any Trustee for the time being may retire, or may be removed from the office of Trustee by a Resolution of a general meeting, and any vacancy in the office of Trustee shall be filled by the owners at a general meeting:

Provided that the method of voting on a Resolution for removing a Trustee shall be

that prescribed in Clause 29 of the Scheme, and that the Resolution in order to be effective must be supported by at least 75 per cent. of the total number of votes that could be recorded under that Clause by all the owners.

63. The Trustees shall not be liable to make good any deficiency in the District Fund, but shall be liable only for moneys which shall be actually received by them.

64. The Owners shall save harmless and keep indemnified the Trustees and each of them against all actions, claims, demands, costs and expenses which they or he may incur or sustain by reason of or incidental to any matter which may be done in execution of the provisions of the Scheme.

65. The Trustees may sue and be sued for and on behalf and in the name of the Board and shall pay into the District Fund any moneys recovered by them in any proceedings taken on behalf of the Board and the Trustees shall be entitled to reimburse themselves out of the District Fund for any costs and expenses incurred by them in their capacity as Trustees under the Scheme:

Provided that the Trustees shall not commence any action or proceeding unless and until they are required so to do by the Board.

#### Levies.

66. Every owner shall pay to the Board, for the purposes of meeting the expenses of the Board in administering the Scheme, including any payments required under the Central Scheme, such levies as may be decided upon by the Board from time to time and notified to the owners.

67. Any levy made by the Board shall be calculated in proportion to the several owners' outputs or disposals of coal during such period as the Board may determine, so, however, that the same period shall be taken for all owners.

#### District Fund.

68. All contributions, levies, penalties and other moneys received by the Board, or any person on behalf of the Board, in connection with the administration of the Scheme, shall together form a fund to be called the District Fund, and shall be paid into a Bank in the names of the Trustees.

69. There shall be paid out of the District Fund such expenses as the Board or any other persons on behalf of the Board may properly incur in the exercise or performance of their functions under the Scheme.

70. The Trustees shall have discretion to invest any moneys standing to the credit of the District Fund which are in excess of the immediate requirements of the Board in any investments authorised by law for the investment of trust moneys and may from time to time change such investments for any other investment of the like nature or realise the same in order to meet expenses duly approved by the Board.

71. Auditors of the District Fund shall be appointed by the owners at the general meeting called in pursuance of Clause 17 of the Scheme and the audited accounts of the District Fund shall be presented at each annual general meeting, when the auditors shall be re-appointed or other auditors appointed in their place.

*Returns.*

72. Every owner shall furnish to the Board, or any person authorised by the Board in that behalf, in such manner as the Board may prescribe, such returns, accounts, and other information, certified by the owner, his manager or accounting officer, or a person authorised to act on his behalf, as the Board may think fit to require for the purposes of their functions under the Scheme.

73. In order that the Board may be able to verify any return, account or other information furnished to them by any owner, or for the purpose of enabling the Board to secure any information that they consider necessary for the exercise or performance of any of their functions under the scheme, any owner shall, on demand from the Board, produce the books and accounts relating to his coal mine or undertaking for the inspection of an accountant authorised by the Board, who shall report to the Board on the results of his inspection.

74. The Board shall furnish to the Board of Trade such accounts, returns and other information with respect to the operation of the Scheme as the Board of Trade may from time to time require.

75. The Board shall supply to the Central Council such returns, accounts and other information as the Central Council may require for the purposes of the Central Scheme.

76. The Board shall furnish to the Committee of Investigation for the District, constituted under Section 5 of the Act, such returns, accounts and other information relating to the operation of the Scheme as that Committee may consider to be relevant to any complaint that it is investigating.

*Penalties.*

77. Any owner who raises or allows to be raised from his coal mine or undertaking, during any period for which a quota is operative, an output of coal or of any class of coal in excess of that permitted by the quota for the coal or for that class of coal (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under Clause 48 and any transfer of quota effected under Clause 49 of the Scheme) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty not exceeding 3s. per ton in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess.

78. In addition to any monetary penalty payable under the last preceding Clause, where coal or any class of coal is produced in excess of the quota for any period, the quota for the coal mine or undertaking of the owner so penalised may be reduced at the discretion of the Board by the amount of the excess during such succeeding period as the Board may determine.

79. Any owner who sells or disposes of any coal or class of coal at a price below the minimum price fixed for the time being under the Scheme for such coal, or sells or disposes of any coal or class of coal in such a manner that the actual consideration obtained by him is less in value than the minimum price so fixed, or ships or causes to be shipped any coal in contravention of Clause 59 of the Scheme, or allows any such sale, disposal, or shipment of any part of the output of his coal mine or undertaking to take place, shall pay on demand to the Board a penalty not exceeding

3s. per ton in respect of each ton or part of a ton so sold, disposed of, or shipped.

80.—(1) Any owner who omits to render to the Board any return, account or information required or prescribed by the Board under the provisions of the Scheme, and after notice in writing from the Secretary fails to furnish such return, account or information within the seven days next following the date of such notice, shall pay to the Board the following penalties:—

(i) In respect of the first seven days of such default a sum not exceeding 1d. per ton per day on his quarter's output as last ascertained or, if such output is not known, on a fourth of his standard tonnage on an annual basis;

(ii) In the event of such default continuing beyond the first seven days, for each day of such continued default a sum not exceeding twice the sum contributable in respect of each of the first seven days.

(2) For the purpose of calculating the amount of any penalty payable under the provisions of this Clause the default shall be regarded as commencing on the first day after the expiration of the said seven days next following the date of the notice as aforesaid from the Secretary.

81. Any owner who neglects to afford or refuses or allows to be refused the inspection of his books by an accountant duly authorised on behalf of the Board—

(i) for the purpose of verifying any return, account or other information required by the Board, or

(ii) for the purpose of supplying any other information to the Board that they may require in connection with their functions under the Scheme,

shall pay to the Board a penalty not exceeding £20 for each day of such neglect or refusal.

82. All penalties imposed by the Board under Clauses 77, 79, 80 or 81 of the Scheme shall be recoverable by the Board through the Trustees and shall be paid, as and when received into the District Fund:

Provided that no proceedings in default of payment of any such penalty shall be commenced until a period of ten days shall have elapsed from the date of notice of the penalty being given under the provisions of Clause 84 of the Scheme and, in the event of an application being made within that period by the owner upon whom the penalty is imposed, that the matter be referred to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme, no such proceedings as aforesaid shall be commenced unless and until the arbitrator shall have made his award as to the amount of penalty (if any) payable by such owner, or the owner shall have abandoned his appeal, whichever shall first occur.

83. In the event of any objection by an owner under the provisions of Clauses 37, 43, or 55 of the Scheme to any determination or decision of the Board the determination or other decision of the Board to which objection is made shall be operative and shall, unless in any case the Board otherwise determine, continue to have full force until the same shall be varied (if at all) by the ruling of the Board on the objection, and no such objection



or ruling shall be deemed to exempt the appellant from liability for any contravention of, or non-compliance with the Scheme in respect of such determination or other decision at any time when the same shall be or have been operative.

84. Notice in the form of a certificate in writing signed by the Secretary or other person authorised by the Board for the purpose specifying the contravention of or non-compliance with the Scheme in respect of which any monetary penalty is imposed by the Board and the amount of the penalty so imposed, shall be sent or delivered by the Secretary or such other persons as aforesaid to the owner upon whom the Board imposes the penalty, and shall be deemed to be sufficient notice that such penalty is payable, and the sum specified in the certificate shall be paid by such owner within ten days of the date of such notice, unless he shall in the meantime have referred the matter to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme in that behalf.

#### *Surplus Funds.*

85. The whole or any part of the surplus from time to time remaining in the District Fund which has accrued from penalties and in the opinion of the Board, is not required for the effective management of the Scheme, may be distributed amongst the owners *pro rata* on the basis of the then prevailing standard tonnage or on such other equitable and proportionate basis as the Board may determine.

#### *Arbitration.*

86. The Board shall prepare and submit for approval to the President of the Birmingham Law Society, a panel of arbitrators for the District to one or more of whom any dispute arising in connection with the Scheme may be referred. Such panel shall not include any person who is financially interested in the ownership or working of any coal mine or any concern comprising coal mines situate in the District or any person who is acting in a secretarial or advisory capacity to any association or other body for regulating the production, supply or sale of coal; and in any case a person who has at any time been professionally employed by or on behalf of an owner in respect of any coal mine, shall not be eligible to act as arbitrator in any reference to which such owner is a party.

87. Any owner who is aggrieved (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the Complainant") by any act or omission of the Board or of any other persons in respect of their functions under the Scheme shall be entitled to refer the matter for decision to such one or more of the arbitrators constituting the panel of arbitrators for the District as he may select in agreement with the Board:

Provided that when the Complainant and the Board are unable to agree on the selection of an arbitrator from the panel the President of the Birmingham Law Society shall select the arbitrator.

88. The Complainant shall, as soon as the arbitrator has been appointed, furnish to the arbitrator a Statement of Complaint in writing setting forth the matter or matters which the Complainant wishes to be referred to arbitration and containing in numbered paragraphs particulars of the cause or causes of

complaint, including the names, descriptions and addresses of any person or body of persons alleged to be responsible therefor, as well as particulars of any facts upon which the Complainant intends to rely and of the remedy or remedies which he proposes to claim in the arbitration, and the Complainant shall at the same time furnish a copy of the Statement of Complaint to every person or body of persons alleged to be responsible as aforesaid.

89. The arbitrator shall upon receipt of the Statement of Complaint give such directions for the Conduct of the arbitration as he may think fit and shall fix a day for the hearing of the matter referred to him, and the arbitrator shall give notice in writing of the day so fixed to the Complainant and to every person or body of persons alleged to be responsible as aforesaid.

90. Pending the award of an arbitrator, on any reference to arbitration under the Scheme, the decision of the Board in the matter under dispute shall be operative subject to the provisions of Clause 82 of the Scheme.

91. Where any determination or other decision of the Board is a subject of reference hereunder, the award of the arbitrator shall, unless he otherwise directs, be operative in respect of such determination or other decision as from the date on which the determination or other decision was intended by the Board to be operative.

92. The expenses of the Board in connection with any arbitration under the Scheme, or under the Central Scheme, shall be payable out of the District Fund.

#### *Dissolution.*

93. In the event of the Scheme ceasing to have effect under Part I of the Act whether owing to the expiration of that Part of the Act or to action of the Board of Trade under sub-section (7) of Section 5 of the Act, the Trustees shall collect all money due or belonging to the Board and convert into money any property of the Board (including any investments of the District Fund) and after discharging thereout all liabilities of the Board shall distribute the surplus, if any, amongst the owners in the proportion, as nearly as possible, to the total contributions made by each of those owners under Clauses 66 and 67 of the Scheme:

Provided that, if it is agreed to continue the Scheme as a voluntary arrangement it shall be lawful for the Trustees to transfer the property of the Board (including any moneys and investments of the District Fund) to the Trustees under such voluntary arrangement, subject, however, to the payment to those owners who do not enter into the said voluntary arrangement of such sums (if any) as would be payable to them if the scheme were finally wound up under the provisions of this Clause in lieu of being continued as a voluntary arrangement.

94. If upon cessation of the Scheme to have effect the assets of the Board are insufficient to discharge their liabilities, the owners shall pay to the Trustees such sum as may be necessary to make up the deficiency, and a levy calculated so as to provide such sum shall be deemed to have been notified under the

provisions of Clauses 66 and 67 of the Scheme immediately prior to the Scheme ceasing to have effect and shall be payable by the owners to the Trustees upon demand, notwithstanding such cessation.

95. The cessation of the Scheme to have effect shall not:—

(a) affect the previous operation thereof or of anything duly done or suffered thereunder; or

(b) affect any right, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred thereunder; or

(c) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any contravention of or non-compliance with the Scheme; or

(d) affect any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, obligation, liability or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if the Scheme had not ceased to have effect.

#### COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

Whereas under the provisions of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, a scheme for regulating the production supply and sale of coal by owners of coal mines situated in Great Britain has been submitted to the Board of Trade by a majority of the owners of coal mines in Great Britain;

And whereas the Board of Trade have made such modifications in the scheme so submitted as appear to the Board to be necessary;

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section hereby approve the scheme as printed in the Schedule hereto, and appoint 25th October, 1930, as the date on which the said scheme shall come into force.

THE CENTRAL (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930, submitted to the Board of Trade by the representatives of the majority of the owners of coal mines situated in Great Britain under the provisions of the Coal Mines Act, 1930.

#### Title.

I. This Scheme may be cited as the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, and is hereinafter throughout referred to as "the Scheme" which expression shall include any amendment of the Scheme for the time being in force.

#### Definitions.

II. In the Scheme unless the context otherwise requires:—"The Act" means the Coal Mines Act, 1930; "District Scheme" means a scheme approved or made by the Board of Trade for any district under the provisions of Section 1 of the Act; "Quarter" means calendar quarter; The following words respectively have the same meaning in the Scheme as in the Act, namely:—"class," "coal," "coalmine," "disposal," "district," "functions," "output," "owner."

#### Central Council.

III. There shall be constituted not later than fourteen days after the Scheme comes into operation or within such further period as may be necessary a Central Council (hereinafter called "the Council") which shall have the powers provided for the Council in Section 2 of the Act and shall exercise such powers in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.

IV.—(1) The Council shall consist of one representative of the owners in each of the districts and one additional representative of the owners in each of the districts for each seven and a half million tons of annual output of the district.

Such representatives shall be appointed in accordance with the respective District Schemes and there may also be appointed by the owners in each district a substitute or substitutes for such representative or representatives, and in the absence of a representative (but not otherwise) one of the substitutes appointed by the owners in the district in respect of which the absent representative was appointed may attend and vote at meetings of the Council in the place of such absent representative:

Provided that in the case of districts which are only entitled to one representative such representative may be accompanied at meetings of the Council by a substitute who, however, shall on such occasions have no right to vote or to speak.

(2) The said representatives shall be members or officers of the district Executive Boards and, for the purposes of the Scheme, shall be deemed to be representatives of such Executive Boards.



(3) For the purposes of this Clause "annual output" shall mean the output allocated to the district under the scheme in respect of the last completed period of four quarters immediately preceding each meeting of the Council provided that in respect of any such period or any part of such period for which allocations of output shall not have been made under the Scheme the output actually produced in the district shall be substituted for the allocated output.

(4) The Executive Board of each district shall intimate to the Council from time to time the names and addresses of the representative or representatives and substitute or substitutes appointed under this Clause in respect of the district and any changes therein.

#### *First Meeting of Council.*

V. The first meeting of the Council shall be held as soon as conveniently possible after the date on which the Scheme shall have been approved by the Board of Trade for the purpose of electing officers and of any other business that may be necessary under the Scheme. Such first meeting shall be called by William Alexander Lee, C.B.E., of General Buildings, Aldwych, London, by seven days' notice in writing to the members of the Council and to the Secretaries of the respective Executive Boards.

#### *Powers of Council.*

VI.—(1) The Scheme shall be administered by the Council which shall have power to do all such things as are necessary for the discharge of the functions of the Council under the Scheme or as are incidental to or consequential on the provisions of the Scheme or necessary for giving effect thereto.

(2) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers the Council shall have power (a) to appoint officers, (b) save as to the provisions of Clause IX. to make and from time to time vary rules of procedure governing the calling of meetings of the Council and the conduct and quorum for the transaction of business thereat, (c) to appoint committees from among its members or otherwise from time to time for such purposes and with such delegation of its powers as it may think fit; provided that on the appointment of any Committee every district shall have the right to be represented thereon if it so desires; provided further that every decision of a Committee shall be subject to the approval of the Council.

#### *Officers.*

VII.—(1) The Council shall appoint a Secretary and such other officers as are required to give effect to the functions of the Council and they shall fix the terms and duration of each appointment.

(2) The Council may pay to any of its members who may be called upon to perform any special services including a Chairman or Deputy Chairman such remuneration as the Council may from time to time determine.

#### *Trustees and Central Fund.*

VIII.—(1) The Council shall appoint three Trustees for the Council at its first meeting or as soon thereafter as practicable and the Central Fund hereinafter mentioned and all other property of the Council shall be vested in such Trustees.

(2) There shall be established and vested in the Trustees a Central Fund into which shall be paid all monies received by them on behalf of the Council and out of which shall be paid all the expenses of the Council and any money payable by the Council under the Scheme. The Central Fund and all other property of the Council shall be held and dealt with by the Trustees subject to the directions of the Council from time to time.

(3) Any amounts for the time being standing to the credit of the Central Fund and in the opinion of the Council in excess of its requirements for the other purposes of the Scheme, whether representing contributions or penalties or partly the one and partly the other may be distributed among any or all of the Executive Boards in such proportions and manner as the Council may from time to time decide.

(4) The Council shall save harmless and keep indemnified the Trustees and each of them against all actions, claims, demands, costs and expenses which they or he may incur or sustain in the performance of their or his duties or by reason of or incidental to any matter which may be done in execution of the provisions of the Scheme.

(5) The Trustees may sue and be sued for and on behalf and in the name of the Council and shall pay to the Central Fund any monies recovered by them in any proceedings taken on behalf of the Council and the Trustees shall be entitled to reimburse themselves out of the Central Fund for any costs and expenses incurred by them in their capacity as Trustees under the Scheme; provided that the Trustees shall not commence any action or proceedings unless and until they are required to do so by the Council.

(6) Subject to any directions given by the Council from time to time the Trustees shall have discretion as regards any monies standing to the credit of the Central Fund which are in excess of the immediate requirements of the Council either to place the same on deposit with any banking company at interest or to invest the same in any investments authorised by law for the investment of trust monies and they may from time to time change such investments for any other investments of the like nature or realise the same in order to meet expenses duly approved by the Council.

(7) The Council may at any time remove any Trustee from office and shall as soon as practicable after the death, retirement or removal of any Trustee fill the vacancy thereby occasioned by appointing a new Trustee in his place, but so nevertheless that the Trustees for the time being may act notwithstanding any vacancy in their number.

#### *Voting.*

IX. The following rules shall apply to voting at meetings of the Council:—

(1) Voting shall in the first place be by show of hands.

(2) If any member demand a poll it shall be taken at the meeting and each Executive Board represented at the meeting shall be entitled to one vote for every ton of annual output of the district as defined in Clause IV. (3).

(3) Subject to the provisions of Clause XVI. all questions at any meeting of the Council shall be decided by the majority of the votes recorded, provided that if the representative

or representatives as the case may be of any Executive Board dissent at any meeting from a decision of that meeting and claim on behalf of such Executive Board that the matter be referred to arbitration the matter shall forthwith be referred to arbitration accordingly.

(4) The decision of the Chairman that a resolution whether on a show of hands or a poll is carried, or carried by a particular majority or lost shall be conclusive.

#### *District Allocations.*

X.—(1) The Council shall from time to time allocate to each district in accordance with the following provisions a maximum output for the district (herein called "the District allocation").

(2) The Council shall determine the district allocation at such times and for such periods as they think fit and any such period is herein-after referred to as a "period of allocation".

Provided that with a view to facilitating the making of contracts for the sale of coal the Council shall whenever the period of allocation is less than twelve months fix and intimate to each Executive Board with the district allocation a figure of output below which the district allocation in respect of the remainder of the period of twelve months from the beginning of such period of allocation shall not be fixed and which shall be substantially below the output necessary to meet the estimated demand during the remainder of the period aforesaid.

(3) Before the commencement of each period of allocation the Council shall request each Executive Board to submit its own estimate of the tonnage of coal which the owners in its district will be able to dispose of during the period and the output corresponding thereto. Such request shall be made so soon as it is reasonably practicable in the Council's opinion for the Executive Boards to estimate in respect of the period in question.

(4) The Council may also require from any Executive Board from time to time such further information as they may decide to be necessary to assist them in arriving at their determinations.

(5) Each Executive Board shall forward to the Council the estimates referred to in sub-clause (3) of this Clause within such time as may be determined by the Council and specified in the request mentioned in that sub-clause and the Council shall cause the estimates of each Executive Board to be forwarded to each of the other Executive Boards as soon as practicable after the receipt thereof.

(6) The Council shall meet at such reasonable interval after the making of the request mentioned in sub-clause (3) of this Clause as the Council may determine and in any event not less than five weeks before the expiration of each current period of allocation to consider the district allocation for the succeeding period of allocation.

(7) In determining the district allocation the Council shall on every occasion have regard to all relevant circumstances affecting the several districts not excluding the relative position of such districts prior to the war.

(8) If the representative or representatives of any Executive Board on the Council exercise the right conferred by Clause IX. (3) of

appealing to arbitration from a decision of the Council as to the allocation of any district the matter or matters in dispute shall forthwith be referred to arbitration accordingly.

(9) The district allocations made by the Council or by arbitration as the case may be shall be communicated by the Council to the Executive Boards as soon as practicable and in no case less than four weeks before the commencement of the period to which they relate.

(10) In any period of allocation any Executive Board may at any time apply to the Council to have its district allocation increased for the remainder of such period on the ground that such increase is necessary in order to meet an increased demand for coal or any class of coal. The Council shall meet within seven days of the receipt of any such application to consider the same and if satisfied that the increase applied for is necessary wholly or in part to meet such increased demand as aforesaid shall grant the same wholly or in part as the case may be and if not so satisfied shall refuse the same and unless the representative or representatives of any Executive Board exercise the right conferred by Clause IX. (3) of appealing to arbitration against the decision of the Council, shall at once communicate such decision to all of the Executive Boards. In the event of an appeal to arbitration under Clause IX. (3) the matter shall forthwith be referred to arbitration accordingly. The Council shall use its best endeavours to secure that the decision of the Council or of the arbitrators as the case may be shall be communicated to all Executive Boards as soon as practicable after the receipt of the application, but delay in the making or communication of the decision of the Council or the arbitrators as the case may be shall not entitle the applicant district to produce in excess of the output already allocated to it in accordance with the provisions of this Clause.

XI.—(1) Each Executive Board shall regulate the output of its district so as not to exceed the district allocation but if in any period of allocation the aggregate output of the district of any Executive Board exceeds the district allocation then such Executive Board shall pay to the Trustees the sum of 2s. 6d. per ton of such excess output which shall be paid within fourteen days after demand by the Council. All such penalties as and when received shall be paid into the Central Fund.

(2) No Executive Board shall have the right to transfer to any other district any part of the output allocated to it under the Scheme.

(3) If in any period any district fail to produce the whole tonnage of coal allocated to it in respect of that period such deficiency in production shall not entitle it to produce in excess of the district allocation in any subsequent period, and the output to be allocated to it in such subsequent periods shall continue to be fixed as provided in Clause X. hereof.

#### *Contributions.*

XII. Each of the Executive Boards shall pay to the Trustees periodically on the demand of the Council such contribution in the form of such uniform amount per ton of output raised in the district during such period as may be prescribed by the Council as shall be necessary

to meet the administrative expenses incurred by the Council for the purposes of their functions under the Scheme.

#### *Complaints.*

XIII.—(1) If at any time representations are made to the Council by an Executive Board that it is aggrieved by any act or omission of the Council or of any other Executive Board or of any other persons in respect of their functions under a scheme in force under the Act, the Council shall consider such representations and subject to the provisions of Clause IX. (3) of the Scheme shall make such recommendations, if any, in relation thereto as it may determine.

(2) If at any time after the Council has decided either to make or to refrain from making recommendations in relation to representations made to it in accordance with sub-clause (1) of this Clause any Executive Board represents to the Council that it is aggrieved by such decision or by the failure of the Council or of any other Executive Board or of any other persons in respect of their functions under a scheme in force under the Act to act in accordance with such recommendations and that it desires to refer the matter to arbitration notwithstanding anything in Clause IX. or Clause X. of the Scheme the same shall forthwith be referred to arbitration accordingly.

#### *Advising Executive Boards.*

XIV. The Council shall from time to time consider the operation of the district schemes and shall give to the Executive Boards for the several districts any advice which may as a result of such consideration appear to the Council desirable with a view to co-ordinating the operation of the district schemes.

#### *Returns by Executive Boards.*

XV. Each Executive Board shall on demand furnish to the Council or any person authorised by the Council such returns accounts and other information as the Council may consider necessary for the operation of the Scheme duly authenticated in such manner as the Council may from time to time determine.

#### *Amendments.*

XVI.—An Executive Board may at any time propose to the Council that the provisions of the Scheme other than those of this Clause may be varied, rescinded or added to and in the event of any such proposal being made the following provisions shall have effect:—

(1) The proposal shall be communicated by the Council to all of the other Executive Boards.

(2) It shall be considered at the next meeting of the Council after the expiration of fourteen days from the date of its communication to the Executive Boards.

(3) If a resolution in favour of the proposal with or without amendment is carried by votes amounting to not less than 85 per cent. of the voting power on a poll of all the members of the Council the proposal so carried shall be deemed to be adopted by the Council, provided that any dissentient Executive Board shall have the right to refer to arbitration the question whether it shall be adopted or not.

(4) If the proposal, with or without amendment, is supported by less than the number of votes aforesaid no further action shall be taken upon it by the Council.

(5) If a proposal adopted in accordance with paragraph (3) of this Clause involves the provision for any matters in addition to or in substitution for the matters mentioned in sub-sections (2) and (3) of Section 2 of the Act the Council shall make representations to the Board of Trade that it is necessary or expedient that such provision should be made.

(6) Subject to the approval of the Board of Trade in accordance with Section 1 (5) of the Act and to the making of any necessary Order by the Board of Trade under sub-section (4) of Section 2 of the Act the Council shall amend the Scheme in accordance with any proposal adopted under this Clause.

#### *Dissolution.*

XVII. In the event of the Scheme ceasing to have effect the Trustees shall collect all monies due or belonging to the Council and convert into money any property of the Council (including any monies and investments of the Central Fund) and after discharging thereout all liabilities of the Council shall distribute the surplus, if any, amongst the Executive Boards in proportion as nearly as possible to the total contributions made by each under Clause XII. of the Scheme.

XVIII. If, upon the Scheme ceasing to have effect the assets of the Council are insufficient to discharge their liabilities the Executive Boards shall notwithstanding such cessation pay to the Trustees on the demand of the Council such contributions calculated in accordance with Clause XII. as may be necessary to make up the deficiency.

#### *Arbitration.*

XIX.—(1) All references to arbitration under the Scheme shall unless the parties to the reference otherwise agree be to three arbitrators.

(2) The provisions set forth in the Schedule hereto as to the appointment of arbitrators for the purposes of the Scheme, the selection of arbitrators for the purposes of each reference, the manner of hearing and determining references and the procedure in relation thereto shall have effect as part of the Scheme.

(3) Upon any reference to arbitration the decision of the arbitrators acting therein or a majority of them, or where the reference is by agreement to a sole arbitrator, the decision of such arbitrator, shall be final and binding on all parties subject always to the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1889, except in so far as such provisions are inconsistent with Part I. of the Act or are modified by Section 16 (2) of the Act.

#### *General.*

XX. In the determination of all questions arising under the Scheme the Council and the arbitrators shall endeavour to secure that the foregoing provisions thereof shall operate fairly and equitably as between all districts and all branches of the coal mining industry affected thereby from time to time.

## SCHEDULE.

## ARBITRATION.

*Rules of Procedure.*

1. The Council shall forthwith proceed to appoint a panel of arbitrators (with their successors in Office hereinafter called "the Panel") for the purpose of the settling of disputes that may at any time or from time to time be referred to arbitration under the Scheme.

2. The Panel shall consist of not less than 7 in number and none of the Panel shall be actively engaged in the coal mining industry.

3. In each case of dispute which falls to be settled by arbitration the names of all the Panel shall be written on pieces of paper and placed in a box or other vessel and the three whose names are first drawn out by the Secretary of the Council or other Officer appointed by the Council and authorised in that behalf shall be the arbitrators to act in the matter.

4. At the same time the remainder of the names shall be similarly drawn to be used in the order in which they are drawn in case any one of those previously drawn shall owing to illness or other unavoidable cause be unable to act in the matter or having entered upon the reference be unable to proceed but every member of the Panel becoming an arbitrator by virtue of this clause shall have the powers hereby conferred on the arbitrators originally drawn.

5. By agreement between the Council and the complaining Executive Board or Boards (hereinafter called the "Complainants") any matter in dispute instead of being referred to arbitrators selected from the Panel in manner hereinbefore provided may be referred to a sole arbitrator or to three arbitrators whether selected from the Panel or not as may be agreed and in such an event the same rules shall apply as if the reference had been made to three arbitrators selected from the Panel as hereinbefore provided.

6. So soon as the arbitrators or sole arbitrator for the purposes of any reference shall have been selected or agreed as aforesaid the complainants shall forthwith send to the Secretary of the Council for transmission to the Arbitrators (which expression herein includes any such sole arbitrator as aforesaid) a statement in writing of the question or questions to be decided and the arbitrators shall as soon as possible thereafter proceed to hear and determine the matter or matters in dispute.

7. The arbitrators shall give such directions as they think fit as to the conduct and hearing of the reference and the procedure in relation thereto.

8. The arbitrators shall be supplied by the Council and by the complainants with all such information as the arbitrators may consider necessary to enable them to arrive at a decision on the question or questions which they have to decide.

9. The arbitrators shall (except in the cases next provided for) within 10 days after the hearing is completed give their decision or the decision of any two of them in writing and deliver the same to the Secretary of the Council. The Secretary shall forthwith send

a copy of the award to all the Executive Boards and the original award shall be retained at the office of the Council for inspection by any Executive Board.

10. In the case of disputes under Clause X. (8) and Clause X. (10) the arbitrators shall hear and determine the question and deliver their decision to the Secretary within five days in the case of Clause X. (8) and in the case of Clause X. (10) within three days from the day of the meeting of the Council at which the reference of the matter to arbitration has been demanded:

Provided that Sunday shall not be counted as a day in either case and that the arbitrators shall have power in any proper case to extend the time so limited:

11. All arbitrations shall be held in London unless otherwise decided by the Council.

12. If at any time a vacancy shall occur in the Panel the Council may forthwith fill the vacancy or vacancies so occurring and shall do so if by the occurrence of such vacancy or vacancies the number of the panel is reduced below 7.

# AGRICULTURAL WAGES (REGULATION) ACT, 1924.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Cambridge and Isle of Ely have in pursuance of the above Act, duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board in pursuance of the said Act, and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee, hereby order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from the 1st November, 1930.

## SCHEDULE.

1. The wages payable for employment of male workers wholly or mainly as Horsemen, Cowmen or Shepherds (other than workers employed solely as Stockmen or Yardmen) shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates for the hours necessary for the performance of the customary duties of workers so employed.

3. Where a whole-time worker is employed by the week or any longer period and the hours of work agreed between the worker and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) are less than the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker in respect of that week, the rate of wages applicable to that worker shall be such as to secure to the worker the wages which would have been payable if the agreed hours had been the full hours mentioned above in the case of that worker in respect of that week.

4. For the purpose of the above rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be all

employment during the period commencing on 1st March and terminating on 31st October following, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be all employment during the period commencing on 1st November and terminating on 28th February following.

5. The wages payable for employment of female workers shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates:—

6. For the purpose of all the above rates, the hours of work shall not include meal times but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a worker who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

9. For the purpose of the application of the above differential rates of wages for overtime employment, the Cambridgeshire and Isle of Ely Agricultural Wages Committee have by Order dated 15th October, 1928, defined the following employment as the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment:—

1. In the case of male workers (other than workers employed wholly or mainly as horsemen, cowmen or shepherds, but including

workers employed solely as stockmen or yardmen):—

(a) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday, Christmas Day or Good Friday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday.

(c) All employment in excess of 40 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day (unless it be a Sunday) falls.

(d) All employment in excess of 42 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in the week in which Good Friday falls.

(e) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in winter, except as provided in Clause (c) above.

(f) All employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in summer, except as provided in Clause (d) above.

2. In the case of female workers:—

(a) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday, Christmas Day or Good Friday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday.

(c) All employment in excess of 8 hours on any other day.
