The KING has been pleased to grant unto Francis Cameron Macpherson, of the Manor House in the Parish of Shanklin, in the Isle of Wight and County of Southampton, Gentleman, His Royal Licence and Authority that he may take and henceforth use the surname of Popham in addition to and before that of Macpherson and that he may bear the Arms of Popham quartered with his own Arms and that such surname and Arms may in like manner be taken and borne and used by his issue, the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in the Collège of Arms, otherwise the said Royal Licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

The KING has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that John Bonyngé Coventry, Helena Blanche Ryder, wife of Dudley Ryder (commonly called Viscount Sandon), Major Territorial Army Reserve, late Royal Field Artillery, and Peggy Virginia Hoare, wife of Eustace Benyon Hoare, late

Lieutenant the Grenadier Guards, shall henceforth have hold and enjoy the same rank title place pre-eminence and precedence as the younger son and daughters of an Earl, as would have been due to them if their father, George William Coventry (commonly called Viscount Deerhurst), sometime Lieutenant-Colonel Territorial Force Reserve, formerly 2nd Volunteer Battalion the Worcestershire Regiment, had survived his father, George William Coventry late Earl of Coventry, and had thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Earl of Coventry.
