WEST USK ELECTRICITY.

SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY IN THE URBAN DISTRICT OF BLAENAVON, IN PARTS OF THE RURAL DISTRICTS OF ABERGAVENNY, PONTYPOOL AND MAGOR, ALL IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made by the South Wales Electrical Power Distribution Company whose Principal Office is situate at Number 27 Newport Road in the City of Cardiff (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") for a Special Order under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928, for all or some of the following, amongst other, objects and purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Company to generate, supply, transform, and distribute Electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928 within the Parishes of Llanwenarth Ultra, Llanfoist, Llanellen, Llanover (otherwise Llanover Higher and Lower) and Llanvair Kilgeddin and so much of the Parishes of Llanwenarth Citra, Llanvihangel-nigh-Usk and Llangattock-nigh-Usk as lies to the West, or South, of the River Usk, all in the Rural District of Abergavenny.

The Parishes of Goytre, Mamhilad, Monkswood, Glascoed (otherwise Glascoed Hamlet), Llanbadoc, Llandegveth, and Llanthewy Vach, and so much of the Parishes of Llangibby, Llanlloell, and Llantrissant as lies to the West of the said River Usk, all in the Rural District of Pontypool and The Parishes of Llanhennock and Llangattock (otherwise Llangattock juxta Caerleon) Township, and so much of the Parish of Tredunnoch as lies to the West of the said River Usk, all in the Rural District of Magor.

All as respectively constituted at the commencement of the proposed Special Order and the whole being in the County of Monmouth (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply") and to confer upon the Company all necessary and usual powers in that behalf.

2. To prescribe the maximum price or prices that may be demanded by the Company in respect of any supply of electricity in the area of supply.

3. To authorise the Company to break up in the area of supply streets and parts of streets which are not repairable by the local authority and Railways and Tramways and parts of Railways and Tramways respectively.

4. To confer on the Company all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928 and to incorporate with the Order

all or some of the provisions of the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899 subject to such variations extensions and exceptions as may be contained in the said intended Order. Any authority company body or person desirous of bringing before the Electricity Commissioners any objection to the intended application may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Electricity Commission, Savoy Court, Strand, London, W.C. 2, and despatched on or before the 24th day of November 1930, and a copy of such objection must on or before the same date be forwarded to the undermentioned Solicitors, or Parliamentary Agents.
