SCHEDULE.

COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE FOREST OF DEAN DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

1. This Scheme may be cited as the Forest of Dean District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, and is hereinafter throughout referred to as "the Scheme" which expression shall include any amendment of the Scheme for the time being in force.

2. In the Scheme, unless the contrary inten-

"The Act" means the Coal Mines Act, 1930;
"The Central Scheme" means the Central
(Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, including any
amendment thereof for the time being in force,
and "The Central Council" means the
Council for the time being constituted thereunder;

"Class" means, in relation to coal, a class determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, or according to whether it be supplied for use in Great Britain or for export to any other country;

"Coal" includes bituminous coal, cannel

coal and anthracite;

"Coal mine" means any mine or open working in the District where the getting of coal is the principal object of the mining or quarrying operations;

"Disposal" in relation to a coal mine means the tonnage of saleable coal raised and weighed at the pit head at that coal mine, after deducting all coal to be used for the purpose of working the mine and all coal to be supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed;

"The District" means the Forest of Dean District subject to the provisions of any Order of the Board of Trade under paragraph 2 of Part II of the Schedule to the Act, directing that a coal mine situate in the District shall be treated as situate in an adjoining district;

"District allocation" means the maximum permissible output for the District for any period as determined under the provisions of the Central Scheme;

"The District Fund" means the District Fund constituted by and established under the

Schemé ;

"Functions" includes powers and duties;

"Majority owners" means the owners of coal mines joining in submission of the Scheme to the Board of Trade and "Minority Owners" means the owners of coal mines other than majority owners;

"Output" means the tonnage in coal raised and weighed at the pithead of a coal mine;

"Owner" means the owner (as defined in the Coal Mines Act, 1911) of any coal mine, and where an owner is for the purposes of the Scheme represented by a duly authorised

representative includes such representative; "The Secretary" means the Secretary to the Executive Board constituted under the

provisions of the Scheme;
"The Trustees" means the persons for the time being appointed under the provisions of the Scheme to be Trustees for the Executive Board;

"Undertaking" means any undertaking comprising two or more coal mines belonging

to the same owner.

Duration and Scope of the Scheme.

- 3.—(1) The Scheme shall come into force on such date as may be appointed by the Board of Trade under the provisions of the Act, and shall remain in force until the expiration of Part I. of the Act, unless in the meantime:
 - (i) A new scheme shall be substituted in manner hereafter provided by the Scheme, or
 - (ii) The Board of Trade shall direct in pursuance of sub-section (7) of Section 5 of the Act that the Scheme shall cease to have
- (2) The production of coal and the supply and sale of such coal by all owners shall be regulated by the provisions of the Scheme.

Administration of the Scheme.

4. There shall be constituted and elected annually in manner hereafter in the Scheme provided an Executive Board (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the Board") who shall be responsible for the general administration of the Scheme and it shall be the duty of the Board, subject to the provisions of the Scheme and within the limits thereof, to take from time to time such steps as may appear to them desirable for the purposes of regulating to the best advantage the production of coal and the supply and sale of such coal in the District.

5.—(1) The Board shall consist of fifteen owners or their representatives, and shall be elected annually at a general meeting of all the owners:

Provided that the Board as first elected shall consist of thirteen persons representative of the Majority owners and two persons representative of the Minority owners who shall respectively be nominated and elected by Majority owners only and by Minority owners only.

- (2) At every election of members of the Board there shall be elected with each member a person to act in case of need as a substitute for such member; and, in the event of any member of the Board being unavoidably prevented from attending any meeting of the Board, his substitute so elected may attend and take part in the meeting in the place of such member.
- (3) The method of voting at the election of members of the first and every succeeding Board, including such substitutes as aforesaid, shall be that prescribed in Clause 29 of the
- 6. The Board shall hold office for twelve months, at the end of which period all members of the Board shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.
- 7. The Board may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit.
- 8. The Secretary shall upon receipt of any requisition for a meeting of the Board signed by any member of the Board or by any owner, summon a meeting of the Board by giving not less than three days' notice in writing of such meeting to every member of the Board:

Provided that the purpose for which the meeting is required shall be specified in every such requisition and notice as aforesaid.

- 9. The Board shall appoint a Chairman to preside at the meetings thereof and a Deputy Chairman to preside in his absence. If at any meeting of the Board neither the Chairman nor the Deputy Chairman is present, the members of the Board present shall choose one of their number to act as Chairman of that meeting.
- 10. Seven members of the Board present at a meeting shall form a quorum.
- 11. Any casual vacancy occurring on the Board may be filled by the members of the Board, but any person so appointed a member of the Board shall retire with the elected memhers at the end of their term of office, when he shall be eligible for re-election:

Provided that in filling any casual vacancy on the Board as first elected, regard shall be had to whether the member whose place is being filled was appointed by the Majority or the Minority Owners.

12. The Board may appoint Sub-Committees from time to time from among their own members or otherwise for such purposes as they shall think fit:

Provided that any decision of a Sub-Committee shall be subject to the approval of the

13. The Board shall appoint a Secretary to the Board and such other officers as are required to give effect to the functions of the Board and they shall fix the terms and duration of each appointment.

14. Voting at all meetings of the Board and at meetings of any Sub-Committee appointed by the Board shall be by show of hands, each member having one vote, but in the event of an equality of votes the Chairman of the Meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

15. Subject to the provisions of the Scheme the meetings of the Board and of any Sub-Committees appointed by the Board shall be held and conducted in accordance with such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the Board, including provision for the taking and keeping of minutes, which shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which they are approved and such signature shall be sufficient evidence of their accuracy.

16. The expenses of the Board and of any Sub-Committees appointed by the Board and the salaries of any officers of the Board, including such remuneration (if any) of the Chairman of the Board as may be determined by vote of a general meeting of owners, shall be payable out of the District Fund.

General Meetings.

17. Mr. Thomas Harold Fisher of St. Annals, Cinderford, shall call or cause to be called a general meeting of all the owners not later than seven days after the date on which the Scheme comes into force, for the purpose of electing the first Board and for any other business that may be necessary under the Scheme.

18. A general meeting of owners shall be held in each succeeding year at intervals of

approximately 12 months:

Provided that such annual general meeting shall be held not less than seven days before the retirement of the Board for the time being is due to take place, and that the business of such annual general meeting shall include the election of the Board for the twelve months following upon such retirement.

19. The election of representatives of the District to the Central Council, together with any substitutes therefor, shall take place at a general meeting:

Provided that such representatives and substitutes shall be elected from among

- (a) those persons who have been elected or appointed to membership of the Executive Board and are still serving in that capacity, and
- (b) the Secretary of other officer of the Board.
- 20. Save as otherwise provided in the Scheme, the date, time and place of all general meetings shall be determined by the Board.
- 21. The Board may whenever they think fit, and shall upon requisition made in writing by Owners representing not less than 10 per cent. of the aggregate of the Standard Tonnages of all coal mines or undertakings in the District for the time being in force convene a general meeting. Such requisition shall expressly state the object of the meeting that it is proposed to call and shall be addressed to the Secretary.
- 22. Upon receipt of such requisition the Board shall proceed forthwith to call a general

meeting, and, if they neglect to do so for seven days from the date of the serving of the requisition on the Secretary, the signatories of the requisition may themselves convene the meeting.

23. At least seven days' notice in writing of every general meeting stating the time, the date and the place of the meeting shall be sent by the Secretary or other person convening the meeting to each owner and such notice shall also state the general nature of the business to be transacted at the meeting, but the non-receipt of the notice by any owner shall not invalidate the proceedings at a general meeting.

24. The expenses of all general meetings, including the expenses of the meeting summoned under Clause 17 of the Scheme, shall be regarded as expenses of the Board and shall

be paid out of the District Fund.

25.—(1) At the first and each subsequent annual general meeting, the owners present shall appoint a Chairman and Deputy Chairman of general meetings who shall hold office until the next following annual general meeting when they shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.

(2) Such Chairman, or in his absence, the Deputy Chairman, shall preside at all general meetings, and in the absence of the Chairman and Deputy Chairman, the owners present at the meeting may appoint a Chairman for that meeting from those present thereat.

meeting from those present thereat.

26. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum of nine owners or their representatives are personally

present:

Provided that if at any meeting a quorum is not present within half-an-hour after the time appointed for holding the meeting, the Chairman of the meeting may adjourn the same until such reasonable time as he may decide, being not less than seven days later, and at the adjourned meeting the owners or their representatives actually present shall form a quorum.

27. Each owner shall by notice in writing to the Secretary nominate a representative to attend general meetings and (if an individual) may nominate himself. Each owner may further in like manner nominate a substitute to attend any meeting when the first nominated representative is unable to attend.

28. At any general meeting-

(1) Any matter put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided by show of hands unless a poll is demanded at the meeting and on such show of hands each representative or substitute present shall have one vote;

(2) In the event of equality of votes the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second

or casting vote;

(3) Unless a poll is demanded, the declaration by the Chairman of the meeting that a Resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried or lost and an entry to the effect in the minutes of the meeting shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded for or against the Resolution;

(4) The decision of the Chairman of the meeting as to the result of the voting on any

Resolution shall be final.

29. On a poll, which shall be taken at the meeting, every owner present or who has

appointed a proxy for the meeting shall have one vote and one further vote for each complete ten thousand tons of the annual standard tonnage of his coal mine or mines; in respect of any excess over a multiple of ten thousand tons a quantity of five thousand tons or upwards shall carry an additional vote:

Provided that at any general meeting held during the first year of operation of the scheme before standard tonnages have been determined, every owner present or who has appointed a proxy for the meeting shall have one vote and one further vote for each complete ten thousand tons of the output of his coal mine or mines in the period of twelve months ended 31st December, 1929; in respect of any recess over a multiple of ten thousand tons a quantity of five thousand tons or upwards shall carry an additional vote.

- 30. Votes on a poll at any general meeting may be given either personally or by proxy, and in the latter event the instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing and shall be sent to the Secretary not less than two days before the meeting takes place.
- 31.—(1) A minute book of the proceedings at general meetings shall be kept by the Secretary and all Resolutions and the result of voting thereon shall be entered therein.
- (2) The minutes of each meeting shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which they are approved and such signature shall be sufficient evidence of their accuracy.

Notice of Decisions of the Board and other Notices.

32. The Board shall, through the Secretary, give notice in writing of their decisions, and of the decisions of any of their Sub-Committees, to all owners immediately after the decisions have been reached. Such notices and any other notices to be given by the Board to any owners individually under the provisions of the Scheme shall be addressed either to the registered office of the owner, to his principal place of business, or to such address as he may furnish to the Secretary as appropriate for the service of such notices, and they may be served either personally or by prepaid post, and if posted shall be deemed to have been received by the owner within 24 hours of the posting thereof.

Amendment of Scheme.

33. The owners may, by Resolution in general meeting from time to time, authorise the Board to submit to the Board of Trade any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme or a new scheme in substitution therefor and the Board shall thereupon submit such alteration or new scheme in writing to the Board of Trade:

Provided that

(a) The method of voting on the Resolution authorising any such submission shall be that prescribed in Clause 29 of the Scheme;

(b) The Resolution in order to have effect must be supported by at least 51 per cent. of the total number of votes that could be recorded under that Clause by all the owners;

- (c) In the event of the Board failing to submit the alteration or new scheme in writing to the Board of Trade within seven days of the passing of an effective Resolution hereunder, any owner may so submit the same;
- (d) The alteration or new scheme (as the case may be) shall not come into force unless

and until approved by the Board of Trade and shall then be operative from such date as may be prescribed by them.

Classification of Coal.

34. For the purpose of determining the various classes to which the coal produced in the District belongs the Board shall, as soon as possible after their first election, and subsequently from time to time as they may think fit, require returns to be made to them within a specified time by every owner, in a form to be prescribed and issued by the Board.

35. The Board shall allocate the coal produced at each coal mine into classes, such classification being made at the discretion of the Board according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, or according to whether the coal be supplied for use in Great Britain or for export to any other country.

36. Any classification made by the Board under the scheme shall immediately be communicated to all the owners.

37. If any owner is dissatisfied with any classification made by the Board in respect of his coal mine or mines, he may give notice of objection to the Board at any time within fourteen days after such classification being communicated to him as aforesaid, and the Board shall thereupon reconsider the matter and deliver their decision thereon without delay.

Determination of Standard Tonnage.

38. The Board shall determine at such times as they may think fit an annual standard tonnage for each coal mine or undertaking and may, if they think fit, further distribute the standard tonnage fixed for any such mine or undertaking among the various classes of coal produced therefrom, provided that such distribution of the standard tonnages among classes of coal shall be effected for all coal mines or undertakings producing those classes of coal or any of them.

39. In the determination of such standard tonnages the Board shall have regard to the special circumstances of every coal mine (including the efficiency and economy of the working of the coal mine, the extent to which it has been developed or is being developed for economic working, and the extent to which its output has been increasing or decreasing).

40.—(1) For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of standard tonnages, every owner shall furnish to the Board, upon notice given to him by the Board, a statement, in writing, giving any information which the Board may require for the purpose of fixing standard tonnages and in particular specifying the name and situation of every coal mine or undertaking owned by him within the district and the output of such mine or undertaking during the year ended 31st December, 1929, which, in the absence of any special circumstances calling in the opinion of the Board for special treatment, shall be the standard tonnage of the mine or undertaking.

(2) Every owner may also include in the aforesaid statement particulars of any seasonal fluctuations in trade and the respective quantities of each class of coal comprised in the output for the period and it may be accom-

panied by particulars in writing of any claim (together with the evidence necessary to substantiate the same) for special consideration to be given to his mine or undertaking in view of the special circumstances pertaining thereto, and upon such an application being submitted the Board shall consider the same and fix the standard tonnage having regard to such application.

- 41. In any case where the standard tonnage cannot be ascertained by means of the above provisions, the Board shall decide the basis of the standard tonnage, and shall fix the same, having regard to the special circumstances of the mine.
- 42. Notice of the standard tonnages so determined by the Board (including any special conditions attaching thereto and any provisions relating to the distribution of the standard tonnage for the year in unequal monthly quantities or the distribution of the tonnage among the classes of coal produced) and of the results of any such revision thereof as is hereafter mentioned in Clause 44 of the Scheme, shall immediately be given by the Board to all the owners.
- 43. If any owner is dissatisfied with any standard tonnage so determined and communicated to him as aforesaid, or with any special condition attaching thereto, or with the omission of any special condition desired by the owner, he may give notice of objection to the Board at any time within fourteen days of such communication and the Board shall thereupon reconsider the matter and deliver their decision thereon without delay.
- 44. Subject to the provisions of Clause 45 of the Scheme the standard tonnages determined by the Board shall, save in so far as the Board's determination may be varied by the Arbitrator, remain unchanged unless and until a general revision of all the standard tonnages for the District shall be required by a Resolution of a general meeting of the owners:

Provided that in any case where the Board considers that, because a mine or undertaking is developing or its output is diminishing, that the standard tonnage for such mine or undertaking should not be fixed on an annual basis, it shall be proper for them to provide that the standard tonnage of such mine or undertaking shall be revised at stated intervals, and for the Board to reconsider, and if they think fit revise the standard tonnage of such mine or undertaking at those intervals, having regard to the special circumstances of the mine or undertaking.

45. Where after the commencement of the Scheme an owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine or undertaking the standard tonnage of the coal mine or undertaking so acquired, added to the standard tonnage of any other coal mine or undertaking belonging to such owner, shall if the owner so desires constitute the standard tonnage of the combined undertaking and on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages, such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnage so constituted were the standard tonnage of the combined undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages for the District:

Provided that where an owner purchases or taking shall be otherwise acquires part only of an undertaking to the penalties in respect of which a standard tonnage has of the Scheme.

been determined under the Scheme, the proportion of that standard tonnage to be added to the standard tonnage of any other coal mine or undertaking belonging to such owner shall be determined by the Board, and that amount shall be deducted from the standard tonnage of the undertaking of which part has been so acquired.

Determination of Quotas.

- 46.—(1) The Board shall, as soon as the first District Allocation has been settled and thereafter from time to time, determine the proportion (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the quota") of the standard tonnage that may be produced from each coal mine or undertaking, having regard among other matters to the estimated demand for the coal of the District during the period covered by the quota and to the output permissible under the District Allocation.
- (2) If separate standard tonnages have been determined by the Board for any class or classes of coal, the Board may, if they think fit, determine a separate quota for any or all of such classes of coal.
- (3) Any quota so determined shall cover a period not exceeding three months and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not less than fourteen days before the commencement of the period to which such quota relates.
- (4) Any quota so determined as respects coal or any class of coal shall be the same proportion of the standard tonnage of coal, or of the class of coal, as the case may be, for all coal mines or undertakings.
- (5) All quotas shall be so calculated that, during any period for which the District Allocation has been fixed that Allocation shall not be exceeded.
- (6) The Board may at any time during the course of the period for which any quota has been determined increase the quota applicable to coal or to any class of coal and such increase shall apply for any unexpired remainder of the period for which the quota was determined, or for such part thereof as the Board may prescribe. The notice required under sub-clause (3) of this Clause shall not apply to such increase, but the increase shall be notified to all the owners in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.
- 47. The total output of each coal mine or undertaking shall be ascertained at the end of each period for which a quota is determined, and for that purpose every owner shall forward to the Secretary within fourteen days after the end of each such period a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe, giving full particulars of the output of his coal mine or undertaking during the period in question together with such other particulars as may be necessary for ascertaining any excess of output over the quota during the period. If in any case the output has exceeded the tonnage permitted by the quota (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under Clause 48 of the Scheme and any transfer of quota effected under Clause 49 of the Scheme), the owner of the coal mine or undertaking shall be liable in respect of such excess to the penalties prescribed in Clauses 76 and 77

48. No owner shall be entitled, in the event of the output of his coal mine or undertaking in any period for which a quota is determined falling short of the tonnage permitted by the quota for that period, to carry forward the amount of the shortage or any portion thereof as an addition to the tonnage permissible under the quota during the next or any succeeding period:

Provided that if the quota is fixed for a period of one month only, an owner shall be entitled, in the event of the output of his coal mine or undertaking falling short of the tonnage permitted by the quota for the month to carry forward not more than 50 per cent. of the amount of the shortage (being the difference between the tonnage permitted by the quota for the month, including any transfers of quota effected under Clause 49 of the Scheme, and the actual output of the mine or undertaking during that month) as an addition to the tonnage permissible under the quota during the next succeeding month.

49. Any owner may exceed the quota for any period by arranging with any other owner, for such consideration (if any) as may be agreed between them, that the output of the coal mine or undertaking of that other owner permissible under the quota for the same period shall be reduced by an agreed number of tons, to which number any such excess shall be limited:

Provided that if the excess is in respect of any particular class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined the reduction in the output of such other owner must be in respect of a quota determined for the same class of coal and that any failure of such other owner to reduce his permissible output by the agreed number of tons shall render him liable in respect of such failure to the penalities prescribed in Clauses 76 and 77 of the Scheme.

50. Notice in writing of any arrangement to exceed and reduce quotas under the last preceding clause must be given to the Secretary by the parties within twenty-four hours of the making of the arrangement.

Determination of Prices.

51. The Board shall, as soon as possible after the first election of the Board, call for returns from each owner in such form as the Board may prescribe, setting forth the prices actually. obtained by him during the preceding twelve months for the various classes of coal sold or supplied by him, together with such further information as the Board may deem necessary, and thereupon the Board shall proceed to fix a minimum price per ton of twenty hundredweights for each class of coal produced in the District below which price coal of that class (exclusive of coal supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about any coal mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed) shall not be sold or supplied

52. The minimum prices fixed shall in the case of coal sold or destined for shipment be f.o.b. at the customary place or places of shipment, and in all other cases shall be as fixed by the Board having regard to all the circumstances of the case:

Provided that there shall be only one minimum price for each class of coal as defined in the Scheme.

53. The minimum prices fixed in the first instance shall remain in force for such period as the Board may deem desirable, but the Board may revise the minimum prices from time to time and shall alter the same when alteration appears to the Board to be necessary, and in particular, on the application of any owner for the revision of the price so fixed for any particular class of coal produced by him, the Board shall forthwith consider such application and make such alteration of price (if any) as is in their opinion necessary.

54. The minimum price fixed from time to time for each class of coal shall forthwith be communicated to all the owners.

55. If any owner is dissatisfied with any price fixed for the time being under the Scheme in respect of any coal or class of coal produced by him, he may give notice of objection to the Board at any time within fourteen days after such communication of the price as aforesaid, and the Board shall thereupon reconsider the matter and deliver its decision thereon without delay.

56.—(1) As from the date when a minimum price is fixed by the Board for any class of coal under the provisions of the Scheme, no owner producing coal of that class shall, either directly or indirectly—

(i) sell or supply the coal at a price below the price so fixed for the time being,

(ii) sell or supply the coal in any manner whereby the actual consideration obtained is less in value than the price so fixed, or

(iii) allow or give, or agree to allow or give, save as may expressly be permitted by the Scheme, any discount, commission, rebate, extended credit or allowance in respect of the price, quantity or weight of the coal or otherwise,

and any owner who contravenes in any particular the provisions of this Clause shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Clause 78 of the Scheme.

(2) The Board may prescribe conditions of sale for securing that the actual consideration obtained by the sale or supply of any class of coal shall not be less in value than the minimum price for the time being fixed for that class of coal, and every owner shall comply with such conditions of sale as may be so prescribed.

57. In the event of any owner, in consequence of complaint by a customer in regard to short weight or quality of coal in any consignment, being required to furnish additional quantities or make a reduction or allowance in price for that particular consignment in order to meet such complaint, the owner concerned shall be entitled to supply such additional quantity or make such adjustment in his account as may be necessary, subject to making a report thereof in writing to the Board within ten days after the expiration of each calendar month during which any such concession is made; and any such concession which is not approved by the Board shall be deemed to be a breach of the provisions of the Scheme relating to the determination of prices and shall render the owner liable to the

penalties prescribed in Clause 78 of the Scheme.

58. If any owner ships or causes to be shipped any cargo or consignment of coal otherwise than in pursuance of a bona fide contract for the sale thereof, the actual consideration obtained by the sale or supply of the coal so shipped, being the amount remaining after deduction of the shipping and other charges incurred subsequent to shipment from the price ultimately obtained for the coal, shall not be less in value than the minimum f.o.b. price for coal of the same class ruling under the Scheme at the date of shipment, and any contravention of the provisions of this Clause shall render the owner who shipped, or caused to be shipped, the coal in respect of which the contravention occurs, liable to the penalties prescribed in Clause 78 of the Scheme.

59. In rendering to the Board such returns as the Board may prescribe of sales and deliveries with a view to ascertaining whether or not any coal has been sold below the minimum price therefor fixed for the time being under the Scheme, any owner who claims to have sold or delivered in accordance with the custom of the trade or otherwise any coal at a price other than on the basis fixed under Clause 52 shall furnish to the Board full details of the costs and charges actually incurred or to be incurred which fall to be added to or deducted from the price received in order to arrive at the basis fixed under Clause 52 for the purposes of comparison with the appropriate minimum price under the Scheme.

Trustees.

60. At the General meeting called in pursuance of Clause 17 of the Scheme the Owners shall appoint three persons to be the Trustees for the Board under the Scheme, in whom shall be vested the District Fund and all other property of the Board.

61. Any Trustee for the time being may retire, or may be removed from the office of Trustee by a Resolution of a general meeting, and any vacancy in the office of Trustee shall be filled by the owners at a general meeting:

Provided that the method of voting on a Resolution for removing a Trustee shall be that prescribed in Clause 29 of the Scheme, and that the Resolution in order to be effective must be supported by at least 75 per cent. of the total number of votes that could be recorded under that Clause by all the owners.

- 62. The Trustees shall not be liable to make good any deficiency in the District Fund, but shall be liable only for moneys which shall be actually received by them.
- 63. The Owners shall save harmless and keep indemnified the Trustees and each of them against all actions, claims, demands, costs and expenses which they or he may incur or sustain by reason of or incidental to any matter which may be done in execution of the provisions of the Scheme.

64. The Trustees may sue and be sued for and on behalf and in the name of the Board and shall pay into the District Fund any moneys recovered by them in any proceedings taken on behalf of the Board and the Trustees shall be entitled to reimburse themselves out of the District Fund for any costs and expenses

incurred by them in their capacity as Trustees under the Scheme:

Provided that the Trustees shall not commence any action or proceeding unless and until they are required so to do by the Board.

Levies.

65. Every owner shall pay to the Board, for the purposes of meeting the expenses of the Board in administering the Scheme, including any payments required under the Central Scheme, such levies as may be decided upon by the Board from time to time and notified to the owners.

66. Any levy made by the Board shall be calculated in proportion to the several owners' outputs or disposals of coal during such period as the Board may determine, so, however, that the same period shall be taken for all owners.

District Fund.

67. All contributions, levies, penalties and other moneys received by the Board, or any person on behalf of the Board, in connection with the administration of the Scheme, shall together form a fund to be called the District Fund, and shall be paid into a bank in the names of the Trustees.

68. There shall be paid out of the District Fund such expenses as the Board or any other persons on behalf of the Board may properly incur in the exercise or performance of their functions under the Scheme.

69. The Trustees shall have discretion to invest any moneys standing to the credit of the District Fund which are in excess of the immediate requirements of the Board in any investments authorised by law for the investment of trust moneys and may from time to time change such investments for any other investment of the like nature or realise the same in order to meet expenses duly approved by the Board.

70. Auditors of the District Fund shall be appointed by the owners at the general meeting called in pursuance of Clause 17 of the Scheme and the audited accounts of the District Fund shall be presented at each annual general meeting, when the auditors shall be re-appointed or other auditors appointed in their place.

Returns.

71. Every owner shall furnish to the Board, or any person authorised by the Board in that behalf, in such manner as the Board may prescribe, such returns, accounts, and other information, certified by the owner, his manager or accounting officer, or a person authorised to act on his behalf, as the Board may think fit to require for the purposes of their functions under the Scheme.

72. In order that the Board may be able to verify any return, account or other information furnished to them by any owner, or for the purpose of enabling the Board to secure any information that they consider necessary for the exercise or performance of any of their functions under the Scheme, any owner shall, on demand from the Board, produce the books and accounts relating to his coal mine or undertaking for the inspection of an accountant authorised by the Board, who shall report to the Board on the results of his inspection.

73. The Board shall furnish to the Board of Trade such accounts, returns and other oinformation with respect to the operation of the Scheme as the Board of Trade may from time to time require.

74. The Board shall supply to the Central Council such returns, accounts and other information as the Central Council may require for the purposes of the Central Scheme.

75. The Board shall furnish to the Committee of Investigation for the District, constituted under Section 5 of the Act, such returns, accounts and other information relating to the operation of the Scheme as that Committee may consider to be relevant to any complaint that it is investigating.

Penalties.

76. Any owner who raises or allows to be raised from his coal mine or undertaking, during any period for which a quota is operative, an output of coal or of any class of coal more than that permitted by the quota for the coal or for that class of coal (after allowing for any shortage carried forward under Clause 48 and any transfer of quota effected under Clause 49 of the Scheme) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty at the rate of 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per ton in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess.

77. In addition to any monetary penalty payable under the last preceding Clause, where coal or any class of coal is produced in excess of the quota for any period, the quota for the coal mine or undertaking of the owner so penalised may be reduced at the discretion of the Board by the amount of the excess during such succeeding period as the Board may determine.

78. Any owner who sells or disposes of any coal or class of coal at a price below the minimum price fixed for the time being under the Scheme for such coal, or sells or disposes of any coal or class of coal in such a manner that the actual consideration obtained by him is less in value than the minimum price so fixed, or ships or causes to be shipped any coal in contravention of Clause 58 of the Scheme, or allows any such sale, disposal, or shipment of any part of the output of his coal mine or undertaking to take place, shall pay on demand to the Board a penalty at the rate of 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per ton in respect of each ton or part of a ton so sold, disposed of or shipped.

- 79.—(1) Any owner who omits to render to the Board any return, account or information required or prescribed by the Board under the provisions of the Scheme, and after notice in writing from the Secretary, fails to furnish such return, account or information within the seven days next following the date of such notice, shall pay to the Board the following genalties:—
 - (i) In respect of the first seven days of such default a sum not exceeding \(\frac{1}{2}\)d. (one farthing) per ton per day on his quarter's output as last ascertained or, if such output is not known, on a fourth of his standard tonnage on an annual basis;
 - (ii) In the event of such default continuing beyond the first seven days, for each day

- of such continued default a sum not exceeding twice the sum contributable in respect of each of the first seven days.
- (2) For the purpose of calculating the amount of any penalty payable under the provisions of this Clause the default shall be regarded as commencing on the first day after the expiration of the said seven days next following the date of the notice as aforesaid from the Secretary.
- 80. Any owner who neglects to afford or refuses or allows to be refused the inspection of his books by an accountant duly authorised on behalf of the Board:—
 - (i) for the purpose of verifying any return, account or other information required by the Board, or
 - (ii) for the purpose of supplying any other information to the Board that they may require in connection with their functions under the Scheme,

shall pay to the Board a penalty not exceeding £20 (twenty pounds) for each day of such neglect or refusal.

81. All penalties imposed by the Board under Clauses 76, 78, 79 or 80 of the Scheme shall be recoverable by the Board through the Trustees and shall be paid, as and when received, into the District Fund:

Provided that no proceedings in default of payment of any such penalty shall be commenced until a period of ten days shall have elapsed from the date of notice of the penalty being given under the provisions of Clause 83 of the Scheme and, in the event of an application being made within that period by the owner upon whom the penalty is imposed, that the matter be referred to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the scheme, no such proceedings as aforesaid shall be commenced unless and until the arbitrator shall have made his award as to the amount of penalty (if any) payable by such owner, or the owner shall have abandoned his appeal, whichever shall first occur.

82. In the event of any objection by an owner under the provisions of Clauses 37, 43 or 55 of the Scheme to any determination or decision of the Board the determination or other decision of the Board to which objection is made shall be operative and shall, unless in any case the Board otherwise determine, continue to have full force until the same shall be varied (if at all) by the ruling of the Board on the objection, and no such objection or ruling shall be deemed to exempt the appellant from liability for any contravention of or non-compliance with the Scheme in respect of such determination or other decision at any time when the same shall be or have been operative.

83. Notice in the form of a certificate in writing signed by the Secretary or other person authorised by the Board for the purpose specifying the contravention of or non-compliance with the Scheme in respect of which any monetary penalty is imposed by the Board and the amount of the penalty so imposed, shall be sent or delivered by the Secretary or such other persons as aforesaid to the owner upon whom the Board imposes the penalty,

and shall be deemed to be sufficient notice that such penalty is payable, and the sum specified in the certificate shall be paid by such owner within ten days of the date of such notice, unless he shall in the meantime have referred the matter to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme in that behalf.

Compensation.

84. The Board may in its discretion make periodical distributions of the whole or any part of the surplus funds accruing from penalties remaining in the District Fund amongst the owners as it may from time to time deem appropriate in proportion to the standard tonnages of the owners.

Arbitration.

85. The Independent Chairman of the Coal Mines Minimum Wages Board for the District or his nominee shall be the Arbitrator to whom any dispute arising in connection with the scheme in the District may be referred. Such nominee shall not be a person who is financially interested in the ownership or working of any coal mine or any concern comprising a coal mine situate in the District or any person who is acting in a secretarial or advisory capacity to any Association or other body for regulating the production supply or sale of coal and in any case a person who has at any time been professionally employed by or on behalf of an owner in respect of any coal mine shall not be eligible to act as Arbitrator in any reference to which such owner is a party. If in the case of any dispute the Arbitrator thus nominated is not acceptable to the owner concerned, the appointment of an Arbitrator for such particular dispute shall be referred to the County Court Judge for Gloucestershire and his decision in the matter of nominating such Arbitrator shall be final.

86. Any Owner who is aggrieved (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the Complainant") by any act or omission of the Board or of any other persons in respect of their functions under the Scheme shall be entitled to refer the matter for decision to an Arbitrator to be appointed pursuant to Clause 85 hereof.

87. The Complainant shall, as soon as the arbitrator has been appointed, furnish to the arbitrator a Statement of Complaint in writing setting forth the matter or matters which the Complainant wishes to be referred to arbitration and containing in numbered paragraphs particulars of the cause or causes of complaint, including the names, descriptions and addresses of any person or body of persons alleged to be responsible therefor, as well as particulars of any facts upon which the Complainant intends to rely and of the remedy or remedies which he proposes to claim in the arbitration, and the Complainant shall at the same time furnish a copy of such Statement of Complaint to every person or body of persons alleged to be responsible as aforesaid.

88. The arbitrator shall upon receipt of the Statement of Complaint give such directions for the Conduct of the arbitration as he may think fit and shall fix a day for the hearing of the matter referred to him, and the arbitrator shall give notice in writing of the day so fixed to the Complainant and to every person

or body of persons alleged to be responsible as aforesaid.

89. Pending the award of an arbitrator, on any reference to arbitration under the Scheme, the decision of the Board in the matter under dispute shall be operative subject to the provisions of Clause 81 of the Scheme.

90. Where any determination or other decision of the Board is a subject of reference hereunder, the award of the arbitrator shall, unless he otherwise directs, be operative in respect of such determination or other decision as from the date on which the determination or other decision was intended by the Board to be operative.

91. The expenses of the Board in connection with any arbitration under the Scheme, or under the Central Scheme, shall be payable out of the District Fund.

Dissolution.

92. In the event of the Scheme ceasing to have effect under Part I. of the Act whether owing to the expiration of that Part of the Act or to action of the Board of Trade under sub-section (7) of Section 5 of the Act, the Trustees shall collect all money due or belonging to the Board and convert into money any property of the Board (including any investments of the District Fund) and after discharging thereout all liabilities of the Board shall distribute the surplus, if any, amongst the owners in the proportion, as nearly as possible, to the total contributions made by each of those owners under Clauses 65 and 66 of the Scheme:

Provided that, if it is agreed to continue the Scheme as a voluntary arrangement it shall be lawful for the Trustees to transfer the property of the Board (including any moneys and investments of the District Fund) to the Trustees under such voluntary arrangement, subject, however, to the payment to those owners who do not enter into the said voluntary arrangement of such sums (if any) as would be payable to them if the scheme were finally wound up under the provisions of this Clause in lieu of being continued as a voluntary arrangement.

93. If upon cessation of the Scheme to have effect the assets of the Board are insufficient to discharge their liabilities, the owners shall pay to the Trustees such sum as may be necessary to make up the deficiency, and a levy calculated so as to provide such sum shall be deemed to have been notified under the provisions of Clauses 65 and 66 of the Scheme immediately prior to the Scheme ceasing to have effect and shall be payable by the owners to the Trustees upon demand, notwithstanding such cessation.

94. The cessation of the Scheme to have effect

(a) affect the previous operation thereof or of anything duly done or suffered thereunder; or

(b) affect any right, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred thereunder; or

(c) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any contravention of or non-compliance with the Scheme; or

(d) affect any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, obligation, liability or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if the Scheme had not ceased to have effect.

COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

Whereas under the provisions of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, a scheme for regulating the production supply and sale of coal by owners of coal mines situated in the District of South Staffordshire (exclusive of Cannock Chase) and Worcestershire has been submitted to the Board of Trade by a majority of the owners of coal mines in that District:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section hereby approve the scheme as printed in the Schedule hereto, and appoint 28th October, 1930, as the date on which the said scheme shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

STAFFORDSHIRE (EXCLUSIVE OF CANNOCK CHASE) AND WORCESTERSHIRE DIS-TRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

- 1. This Scheme may be cited as the South STAFFORDSHIRE (exclusive of Cannock Chase) AND WORCESTERSHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930, and is hereinafter throughout referred to as "the Scheme," which expression shall include any amendment of the Scheme for the time being in force.
- 2. In the Scheme, unless the contrary intention appears-

"The Act" means the Coal Mines Act,

"The Central Scheme" means the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, including any amendment thereof for the time being in force, and "The Central Council" means the Council for the time being constituted there-

"Class" means, in relation to coal, a class determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, or according to whether it be supplied for use in Great Britain or for, export to any other country;

'Coal" includes bituminous coal, cannel

coal and anthracite;

"Coal Mine" means any mine or open working in the District where the getting of coal is the principal object of the mining or

quarrying operations;
"Disposal" in relation to a coal mine means the tonnage of saleable coal raised and weighed at the pit head at that coal mine after deducting all coal to be used for the purpose of working the mine and all coal to be supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed;
"The District" means the South Stafford-

shire (exclusive of Cannock Chase) and Worcestershire District subject to the provisions of any Order of the Board of Trade under paragraph 2 of Part II of the Schedule to the Act, directing that a coal mine situate in the District shall be treated as situate in an adjoin-

ing district;
"District Allocation" means the maximum permissible output for the District for any period as determined under the provisions of the Central Scheme;

"The District Fund" means the District Fund constituted by and established under the

"Functions" include powers and duties;
"Majority Owners" means the owners of coal mines joining in submission of the Scheme to the Board of Trade, and "Minority Owners" means the owners of coal mines other

than majority owners;
"Output" means the tonnage in coal raised and weighed at the pithead of a coal mine;

"Owner" means the owner (as defined in the Coal Mines Act, 1911) of any coal mine, and where an owner is for the purposes of the Scheme represented by a duly authorised repre-

sentative includes such representative;
"The Secretary" means the Secretary to the Executive Board constituted under the pro-

visions of the Scheme;

"The Trustees" means the persons for the time being appointed under the provisions of the Scheme to be Trustees for the Executive Board;

"Undertaking" means any undertaking comprising two or more coal mines belonging

to the same owner.

Duration and Scope of the Scheme.

- 3.—(1) The Scheme shall come into force on such date as may be appointed by the Board of Trade under the provisions of the Act, and shall remain in force until the expiration of Part I of the Act, unless in the meantime-
 - (i) A new scheme shall be substituted in manner hereafter provided by the Scheme, or
 - (ii) The Board of Trade shall direct in pursuance of sub-section (7) of Section 5 of the Act that the Scheme shall cease to have
- (2) The production of coal and the supply and sale of such coal by all owners shall be regulated by the provisions of the Scheme.

Administration of the Scheme.

- 4. There shall be constituted and elected annually in manner hereafter in the Scheme provided an Executive Board (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the Board") who shall be responsible for the general administration of the Scheme and it shall be the duty of the Board, subject to the provisions of the Scheme and within the limits thereof, to take from time to time such steps as may appear to them desirable for the purposes of regulating to the best advantage the production of coal and the supply and sale of such coal in the District.
- 5—(1) The Board shall consist of nine owners or their representatives, and shall be elected annually at a general meeting of all the owners:

Provided that the Board as first elected shall consist of eight persons representative of the majority owners and one person representative of the minority owners who shall respectively be nominated and elected by majority owners only and by minority owners only.

- (2) At every election of members of the Board there shall be elected with each member a person to act in case of need as a substitute for such member; and, in the event of any member of the Board being unavoidably prevented from attending any meeting of the Board, his substitute so elected may attend and take part in the meeting in the place of such member.
- (3) The method of voting at the election of members of the first and every succeeding Board, including such substitutes as aforesaid, shall be that prescribed in Clause 29 of the Scheme.
- 6. The Board shall hold office for twelve months, at the end of which period all members of the Board shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.
- 7. The Board may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn and otherwise regulate their meetings as they may think fit.
- 8. The Secretary shall upon receipt of any requisition for a meeting of the Board signed by any three members of the Board or by any three owners, summon a meeting of the Board by giving not less than three days' notice in writing of such meeting to every member of the Board:

Provided that the purpose for which the meeting is required shall be specified in every such requisition and notice as aforesaid, and no other business shall be transacted at this meeting except by permission of the Chairman.

- 9. The Board shall appoint a Chairman to preside at the meetings thereof and a Deputy Chairman to preside in his absence. If at any meeting of the Board neither the Chairman nor the Deputy Chairman is present, the members of the Board present shall choose one of their number to act as Chairman of that meeting.
- 10. Four members of the Board present at a meeting shall form a quorum.
- 11. Any casual vacancy occurring on the Board may be filled by the members of the Board, but any person so appointed a member of the Board shall retire with the elected members at the end of their term of office when he shall be eligible for election:

Provided that in filling any casual vacancy on the Board as first elected, regard shall be had to whether the member whose place is being filled was appointed by the majority or the minority owners.

12. The Board may appoint Sub-Committees from time to time from among their own members or otherwise for such purposes as they shall think fit:

Provided that any decision of a Sub-Committee shall be subject to the approval of the Board.

- 13. The Board shall appoint a Secretary to the Board and such other officers as are required to give effect to the functions of the Board, and they shall fix the terms and duration of each appointment.
- 14. Voting at all meetings of the Board and at meetings of any Sub-Committee appointed by the Board shall be by show of hands, each member having one vote, but in the event of an equality of votes the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

15. Subject to the provisions of the Scheme the meetings of the Board and of any Sub-Committees appointed by the Board shall be

held and conducted in accordance with such rules and regulations as may be prescribed by the Board, including provision for the taking and keeping of minutes which shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which they are approved and such signature shall be sufficient evidence of their accuracy.

16. The expenses of the Board and of any Sub-Committees appointed by the Board and the salaries of any officers of the Board, including such remuneration (if any) of the Chairman of the Board as may be determined by vote of a general meeting of owners, shall be payable out of the District Fund.

General Meetings.

- 17. Mr. Thomas Clare, of 267, Castle Street, Dudley, shall call or cause to be called a general meeting of all the owners not later than seven days after the date on which the Scheme comes into force, for the purpose of electing the first Board and for any other business that may be necessary under the Scheme.
- 18. A general meeting of owners shall be held in each succeeding year at intervals of approximately twelve months:

Provided that such annual general meeting shall be held not less than seven days before the retirement of the Board for the time being is due to take place, and that the business of such annual general meeting shall include the election of the Board for the twelve months following upon such retirement.

19. The election of representatives of the District to the Central Council, together with any substitutes therefor, shall take place at a general meeting:

Provided that such representatives and substitutes shall be elected from among—

- (a) those persons who have been elected or appointed to membership of the Executive Board and are still serving in that capacity; and
- (b) the Secretary or other officers of the Board.
- 20. Save as otherwise provided in the Scheme, the date, time and place of all general meetings shall be determined by the Board.
- 21. The Board may whenever they shall think fit, and shall upon requisition made in writing by not less than six owners or owners representing a majority of the output of the District, convene a general meeting. Such requisition shall expressly state the object of the meeting that it is proposed to call and shall be addressed to the Secretary.
- 22. Upon receipt of such requisition the Board shall proceed forthwith to call a general meeting, and, if they neglect to do so for seven days from the date of the serving of the requisition on the Secretary, the signatories of the requisition may themselves convene the meeting.
- 23. At least seven days' notice in writing of every general meeting stating the time, the date and the place of the meeting shall be sent by the Secretary or other person convening the meeting to each owner and such notice shall also state the general nature of the business to be transacted at the meeting, but the non-receipt of the notice by any owner shall not invalidate the proceedings at a general meeting.

- 24. The expenses of all general meetings, including the expenses of the meeting summoned under Clause 17 of the Scheme, shall be regarded as expenses of the Board and shall be paid out of the District Fund.
- 25. (1) At the first and each subsequent annual general meeting, the owners present shall appoint a Chairman and Deputy Chairman of general meetings who shall hold office until the next following annual general meeting when they shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election.
- (2) Such Chairman, or in his absence, the Deputy Chairman, shall preside at all general meetings, and in the absence of the Chairman and Deputy Chairman, the owners present at the meeting may appoint a Chairman for that meeting from those present thereat.

26. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum of six owners or owners representing a majority of the output of the District or their representatives are personally present:

Provided that if at any meeting a quorum is not present within half-an-hour after the time appointed for holding the meeting, the Chairman of the meeting may adjourn the same until such reasonable time as he may decide, being not less than seven days later, and at the adjourned meeting the owners or their representatives actually present shall form a quorum.

- 27. Each owner shall by notice in writing to the Secretary nominate a representative to attend general meetings and (if an individual) may nominate himself. Each owner may further in like manner nominate a substitute to attend any meeting when the first nominated representative is unable to attend.
 - 28. At any general meeting-
- (1) Any matter put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided by show of hands unless a poll is demanded at the meeting and on such show of hands each representative or substitute present shall have one vote;
- (2) In the event of equality of votes the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote;
- (3) Unless a poll is demanded, the declaration by the Chairman of the meeting that a Resolution has, on a show of hands, been carried or lost and an entry to the effect in the minutes of the meeting shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded for or against the Resolution:
- against the Resolution;
 (4) The decision of the Chairman of the meeting as to the result of the voting on any Resolution shall be final.
- 29. On a poll, which shall be taken at the meeting, every owner present or who has appointed a proxy for the meeting shall have one vote and one further vote for each complete twenty thousand tons of the annual standard tonnage of his coal mine or mines:

Provided that at any general meeting held during the first year of operation of the scheme before standard tonnages have been determined, every owner present or who has appointed a proxy for the meeting shall have one vote and one further vote for each complete twenty thousand tons of the output of his coal mine or mines in the period of twelve months ended 31st December, 1929.

- 30. Votes on a poll at any general meeting may be given either personally or by proxy, and in the latter event the instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing and shall be sent to the Secretary not less than two days before the meeting takes place.
- 31.—(1) A minute book of the proceedings at general meetings shall be kept by the Secretary and all Resolutions and the result of voting thereon shall be entered therein.
- (2) The Minutes of each meeting shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which they are approved and such signature shall be sufficient evidence of their accuracy.

Notice of Decisions of the Board and other Notices.

32. The Board shall, through the Secretary, give notice in writing of their decisions, and of the decisions of any of their Sub-Committees, to all owners immediately after the decisions have been reached. Such notices and any other notices to be given by the Board to any owners individually under the provisions of the Scheme shall be addressed either to the registered office of the owner, to his principal place of business, or to such address as he may furnish to the Secretary as appropriate for the service of such notices, and they may be served either personally or by prepaid post, and if posted shall be deemed to have been received by the owner within twenty-four hours of the posting thereof.

Amendment of Scheme.

33. The owners may, by Resolution in general meeting from time to time, authorise the Board to submit to the Board of Trade any alteration in the provisions of the Scheme or a new scheme in substitution therefor and the Board shall thereupon submit such alteration or new scheme in writing to the Board of Trade:

Provided that:-

- (a) The method of voting on the Resolution authorising any such submission shall be that prescribed in Clause 29 of the Scheme;
- (b) The Resolution in order to have effect must be supported by at least 51 per cent. of the total number of votes that could be recorded under that Clause by all the owners:
- (c) In the event of the Board failing to submit the alteration or new scheme in writing to the Board of Trade within seven days of the passing of an effective Resolution hereunder, any owner may so submit the same; and
- (d) The alteration or new scheme (as the case may be) shall not come into force unless and until approved by the Board of Trade and shall then be operative from such date as may be prescribed by them.

Classification of Coal.

34. For the purpose of determining the various classes to which the coal produced in the District belongs the Board shall, as soon as possible after their first election, and subsequently from time to time as they may think fit, require returns to be made to them within a specified time by every owner, in a form to be prescribed and issued by the Board.

- 35. The Board shall allocate the coal produced at each coal mine into classes, such classification being made at the discretion of the Board according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied, or according to whether the coal be supplied for use in Great Britain or for export to any other country.
- 36. Any classification made by the Board under the scheme shall immediately be communicated to all the owners.
- 37. If any owner is dissatisfied with any classification made by the Board in respect of his coal mine or mines, he may give notice of objection to the Board at any time within fourteen days after such classification being communicated to him as aforesaid, and the Board shall thereupon reconsider the matter and deliver their decision thereon without delay.

Determination of Standard Tonnage.

38. The Board shall determine at such times as they may think fit an annual standard tonnage for each coal mine and may, if they think fit, further distribute the standard tonnage fixed for any such mine among the various classes of coal produced therefrom:

Provided that such distribution of the standard tonnages among classes of coal shall be effected for all coal mines producing those classes of coal or any of them.

- 39. In the determination of such standard tonnages the Board shall have regard to the special circumstances of every coal mine (including the efficiency and economy of the working of the coal mine, the extent to which it has been developed or is being developed for economic working, the extent to which its output has been increasing or decreasing, and, in the case of the first determination, the proportion which the output of the coal mine bore to the output of the district during the twelve months ended the 30th June, 1930).
- 40.—(1) For the purpose of assisting the Board in the determination of standard tonnages, every owner shall furnish to the Board, upon notice given to him by the Board, a statement, in writing, giving any information which the Board may require for the purposes of fixing standard tonnages, and in particular, specifying the name and situation of every coal mine owned by him within the district and the output of each mine during each of the months between the 31st day of December, 1926, and the 1st day of July, 1930. In this statement the owner may indicate either of the following, viz.:—
 - (a) His output in any period of 12 consecutive months between the 31st day of December, 1926, and the 1st day of July, 1930, or
 - (b) his output for the month of March, 1929, or March, 1930, divided by the figure 26 and multiplied by the figure 300,
- as the basis which he would wish in the absence of any special circumstances calling, in the opinion of the Board, for special treatment, to have adopted for fixing the standard tonnage of his coal mine.
- (2) Every owner may also include in the aforesaid statement particulars of any seasonal fluctuations in trade and the respective quanti-

- ties of each class of coal comprised in the output for the period that he may select, and it may be accompanied by particulars in writing of any claim (together with the evidence necessary to substantiate the same) for special consideration to be given to his mine in view of the special circumstances pertaining thereto and upon such an application being submitted the Board shall consider the same and fix the standard tonnage having regard to such application.
- (3) Any owner may elect for the determination of a single standard tonnage for any two or more coal mines comprising an undertaking as if they were one mine.
- (4) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions the Board shall in any of the following cases, if required, on any of the grounds hereinafter mentioned, fix the standard tonnage on the first determination at such figure (within the limits hereinafter prescribed) as the Board may decide:—
 - (a) In the case of any newly opened coal mine which may not, during the period selected under Clause 40 (1), have been fully developed, or, in the case of any coal mine at which alterations or developments, made before the 30th June, 1930, have altered materially the potential output as compared with the potential output in the aforesaid period, the standard tonnage of the coal mine may be increased by such an amount as will represent the normal estimated production of that coal mine for the period in which the standard tonnage is intended to operate.
 - (b) Where it is shown to the satisfaction of the Board that, in the case of any mine or undertaking the total output of the mine or undertaking for the selected period as aforesaid has been less than normally would have been the case, owing to some mechanical or engineering difficulty, accident or misfortune happening, at one or more of the coal mines comprised in such mine or undertaking, the standard tonnage of the mine or undertaking may be increased by such amount as, in the opinion of the Board, represents the loss of output thereby occasioned.
- 41. In any other case where the standard tonnage cannot be ascertained by means of the above provisions, the Board shall decide the basis of the standard tonnage, and shall fix the same, having regard to the special circumstances of the mine.
- 42. Notice of the standard tonnages so determined by the Board (including any special conditions attaching thereto and any provisions relating to the distribution of the standard tonnage for the year in unequal monthly quantities or the distribution of the tonnage among the classes of coal produced) and of the results of any such revision thereof as is hereafter mentioned in Clause 44 of the Scheme, shall immediately be given by the Board to all the owners.
- 43. If any owner is dissatisfied with any standard tonnage so determined and communicated to him as aforesaid, or with any special condition attaching thereto, or with the omission of any special condition desired by the owner, he may give notice of objection to the Board at any time within fourteen days of such communication and the Board shall thereupon reconsider the matter and deliver their decision thereon without delay.

44. Subject to the provisions of Clause 45 of the Scheme the standard tonnages determined by the Board shall, save in so far as the Board's determination may be varied by an arbitrator, remain unchanged unless and until a general revision of all the standard tonnages for the District shall be required by a Resolution of a general meeting of the owners:

Provided that the Board may, without any general revision, vary from time to time the standard tonnage allotted to any new or developing coal mine or any coal mine with a

diminishing output.

45. Where after the commencement of the Scheme an owner purchases or otherwise acquires any coal mine or undertaking the standard tonnage of the coal mine or undertaking so acquired, added to the standard tonnage of any other coal mine or undertaking belonging to such owner, shall if the owner so desires constitute the standard tonnage of the combined undertaking and on any subsequent determination of standard tonnages, such combined undertaking shall be treated in the same way as if the standard tonnage so constituted were the standard tonnage of the combined undertaking under the last previous determination of standard tonnages for the District:

Provided that where an owner purchases or otherwise acquires part only of an undertaking in respect of which a standard tonnage has been determined under the Scheme, the proportion of that standard tonnage to be added to the standard tonnage of any other coal mine or undertaking belonging to such owner shall be determined by the Board, and that amount shall be deducted from the standard tonnage of the undertaking of which part has been so acquired.

Determination of Quotas.

- 46.—(1) The Board shall, as soon as the first District Allocation has been settled and thereafter from time to time, determine the proportion (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the quota") of the standard tonnage that may be produced from each coal mine or undertaking, having regard among other matters to the estimated demand for the coal of the District during the period covered by the quota and to the output permissible under the District Allocation.
- (2) If separate standard tonnages have been determined by the Board for any class or classes of coal, the Board may, if they think fit, determine a separate quota for any or all of such classes of coal.
- (3) Any quota so determined shall cover a period as the Board may decide and shall be notified by the Board to all the owners not less than fourteen days before the commencement of the period to which such quota relates.
- (4) Any quota so determined as respects coal or any class of coal shall be the same proportion of the standard tonnage of coal, or of the class of coal, as the case may be, for all coal mines or undertakings.
- (5) All quotas shall be so calculated that, during any period for which the District Allocation has been fixed that Allocation shall not be exceeded.
- (6) The Board may at any time during the course of the period for which any quota has

been determined increase the quota applicable to coal or to any class of coal and such increase shall apply for any unexpired remainder of the period for which the quota was determined or for such part thereof as the Board may prescribe. The notice required under subclause (3) of this Clause shall not apply to such increase, but the increase shall be notified to all the owners in such manner as the Board may think suitable for informing them thereof without delay and shall come into operation forthwith or at such time as may be specified in the notice.

- 47. The total output of each coal mine or undertaking shall be ascertained at the end of each period for which a quota is determined, and for that purpose every owner shall for-ward to the Secretary within ten days after the end of each such period a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe, giving full particulars of the output of his coal mine or undertaking during the period in question together with such other particulars as may be necessary for ascertaining any excess of output over the quota during the period. If in any case the output has exceeded the tonnage permitted by the quota (after allowing for any transfer of quota effected under Clause 49 of the Scheme), the owner of the coal mine or undertaking shall be liable in respect of such excess to the penalties prescribed in Clauses 75 and 76 of the Scheme.
- 48. No owner shall be entitled, in the event of the output of his coal mine or undertaking in any period for which a quota is determined falling short of the tonnage permitted by the quota for that period, to carry forward the amount of the shortage or any portion thereof as an 'addition to the tonnage permissible under the quota during the next or any succeeding period.
- 49. Any owner may exceed the quota for any period by arranging with any other owner, for such consideration (if any) as may be agreed between them, that the output of the coal mine or undertaking of that other owner permissible under the quota for the same period shall be reduced by an agreed number of tons, to which number any such excess shall be limited:

Provided that if the excess is in respect of any particular class of coal for which a separate quota has been determined the reduction in the output of such other owner must be in respect of a quota determined for the same class of coal and that any failure of such other owner to reduce his permissible output by the agreed number of tons shall render him liable in respect of such failure to the penalties prescribed in Clauses 75 and 76 of the Scheme.

50. Notice in writing of any arrangement to exceed and reduce quotas under the last preceding clause must be given to the Secretary by the parties within twenty-four hours of the making of the arrangement.

Determination of Prices.

51. The Board shall, as soon as possible after the first election of the Board, call for returns from each owner in such form as the Board may prescribe, setting forth the prices actually obtained by him during the preceding twelve months for the various classes of coal sold or supplied by him, together with such further information as the Board may deem necessary, and thereupon the Board shall proceed to fix a minimum price per ton of twenty hundred-weights for each class of coal produced in the District below which price coal of that class (exclusive of coal supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about any coal mine and the dependants of persons who have been so employed) shall not be sold or supplied by owners.

52. The minimum prices fixed shall in the case of coal sold or destined for shipment be f.o.b. at the customary place of shipment, and in all other cases shall be as fixed by the Board having regard to all the circumstances of the case:

Provided that there shall be only one minimum price for each class of coal as defined in the Scheme.

- 53. The minimum prices fixed in the first instance shall remain in force for such period as the Board may deem desirable, but the Board may revise the minimum prices from time to time and shall alter the same when alteration appears to the Board to be necessary, and in particular, on the application of any owner for the revision of the price so fixed for any particular class of coal produced by him, the Board shall forthwith consider such application and make such alteration of price (if any) as is in their opinion necessary.
- 54. The minimum price fixed from time to time for each class of coal shall forthwith be communicated to all the owners.
- 55. If any owner is dissatisfied with any price fixed for the time being under the Scheme in respect of any coal or class of coal produced by him, he may give notice of objection to the Board at any time within fourteen days after such communication of the price as aforesaid, and the Board shall thereupon reconsider the matter and deliver their decision thereon without delay.
- 56.—(1) As from the date when a minimum price is fixed by the Board for any class of coal under the provisions of the Scheme, no owner producing coal of that class shall, either directly or indirectly—
 - (i) Sell or supply the coal at a price below the price so fixed for the time being;
 - (ii) Sell or supply the coal in any manner whereby the actual consideration obtained is less in value than the price so fixed, or
 - (iii) Allow or give, or agree to allow or give, save as may expressly be permitted by the Scheme, any discount, commission, rebate, extended credit or allowance in respect of the price, quantity or weight of the coal or otherwise,

and any owner who contravenes in any particular the provisions of this Clause shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in Clause 77 of the Scheme.

(2) The Executive Board may prescribe conditions of sale for securing that the actual consideration obtained by the sale or supply of any class of coal shall not be less in value than the minimum price for the time being

fixed for that class of coal, and every owner shall comply with such conditions of sale as may be so prescribed.

- 57.—(a) In the event of any owner, in consequence of complaint by a customer in regard to short weight or quality of coal in any consignment, being required to furnish additional quantities or make a reduction or allowance in price for that particular consignment in order to meet such complaint, the owner concerned shall be entitled to supply such additional quantity or make such adjustment in his account as may be necessary, subject to making a report thereof in writing to the Board within ten days after the expiration of each calendar month during which any such concession is made; and any such concession which is not approved by the Board shall be deemed to be a breach of the provisions of the Scheme relating to the determination of prices and shall render the owner liable to the penalties prescribed in Clause 77 of the Scheme.
- (b) If any owner ships or causes to be shipped any cargo or consignment of coal otherwise than in pursuance of a bona fide contract for the sale thereof, the actual consideration obtained by the sale or supply of the coal so shipped, being the amount remaining after deduction of the shipping and other charges incurred subsequent to shipment from the price ultimately obtained for the coal, shall not be less in value than the minimum f.o.b. price for coal of the same class ruling under the Scheme at the date of shipment, and any contravention of the provisions of this Clause shall render the owner, who shipped or caused to be shipped, the coal in respect of which the contravention occurs, liable to the penalties prescribed in Clause 77 of the Scheme.
- 58. In rendering to the Board such returns as the Board may prescribe of sales and deliveries with a view to ascertaining whether or not any coal has been sold below the minimum price therefor fixed for the time being under the Scheme, any owner who claims to have sold or delivered, in accordance with the custom of the trade or otherwise, any coal at a price other than on the basis fixed under Clause 52, shall furnish to the Board full details of the costs and charges actually incurred or to be incurred which fall to be added to or deducted from the price received in order to arrive at the basis fixed under that Clause for the purposes of comparison with the appropriate minimum price under the Scheme.

Trustees.

- 59. At the general meeting called in pursuance of Clause 17 of the Scheme the owners shall appoint three persons to be the Trustees for the Board under the Scheme, in whom shall be vested the District Fund and all other property of the Board.
- 60. Any Trustee for the time being may retire, or may be removed from the office of Trustee by a Resolution of a general meeting, and any vacancy in the office of Trustee shall be filled by the owners at a general meeting:

Provided that the method of voting on a Resolution for removing a Trustee shall be that prescribed in Clause 29 of the Scheme, and that the Resolution in order to be effective must be supported by at least 75 per cent. of the total number of votes that could be recorded under that Clause by all the owners,

- 61. The Trustees shall not be liable to make good any deficiency in the District Fund, but shall be liable only for moneys which shall be actually received by them.
- 62. The Owners shall save harmless and keep indemnified the Trustees and each of them against all actions, claims, demands, costs and expenses which they or he may incur or sustain by reason of or incidental to any matter which may be done in execution of the provisions of the Scheme.

63. The Trustees may sue and be sued for and on behalf and in the name of the Board and shall pay into the District Fund any moneys recovered by them in any proceedings taken on behalf of the Board and the Trustees shall be entitled to reimburse themselves out of the District Fund for any costs and expenses incurred by them in their capacity as Trustees under the Scheme:

Provided that the Trustees shall not commence any action or proceedings unless and until they are required so to do by the Board.

Levies.

- 64. Every owner shall pay to the Board, for the purposes of meeting the expenses of the Board in administering the Scheme, including any payments required under the Central Scheme, such levies as may be decided upon by the Board from time to time and notified to the
- 65. Any levy made by the Board shall be calculated in proportion to the several owners' outputs or disposals of coal during such period as the Board may determine, so, however, that the same period shall be taken for all owners.

District Fund.

- 66. All contributions, levies, penalties and other moneys received by the Board, or any person on behalf of the Board, in connection with the administration of the Scheme, shall, together form a fund to be called the District Fund, and shall be paid into a bank in the names of the Trustees.
- 67. There shall be paid out of the District Fund such expenses as the Board or any other persons on behalf of the Board may properly incur in the exercise or performance of their functions under the Scheme.
- The Trustees shall have discretion to invest any moneys standing to the credit of the District Fund which are in excess of the immediate requirements of the Board in any investments authorised by law for the investment of trust moneys, and may from time to time change such investments for any other investment of the like nature or realise the same in order to meet expenses duly approved by the Board.
- 69. Auditors of the District Fund shall be appointed by the owners at the general meeting called in pursuance of Clause 17 of the Scheme and the audited accounts of the District Fund shall be presented at each annual general meeting, when the auditors shall be remeeting, appointed or other auditors appointed in their place.

Returns.

70. Every owner shall furnish to the Board, or any person authorised by the Board in that behalf, in such manner as the Board may prescribe, such returns, accounts, and other in-

- formation, certified by the owner, his manager or accounting officer, or a person authorised to act on his behalf, as the Board may think fit to require for the purposes of their functions. under the Scheme.
- 71. In order that the Board may be able to . verify any return, account or other information furnished to them by any owner, or for the purpose of enabling the Board to secure any information that they consider necessary for the exercise or performance of any of their functions under the Scheme, any owner shall, on demand from the Board, produce the books and accounts relating to his coal mine or undertaking for the inspection of an accountant authorised by the Board, who shall report to the Board on the results of his inspection.
- 72. The Board shall furnish to the Board of Trade such accounts, returns and other information with respect to the operation of the Scheme as the Board of Trade may from time to time require.
- 73. The Board shall supply to the Central Council such returns, accounts and other information as the Central Council may require for the purposes of the Central Scheme.
- 74. The Board shall furnish to the Committee of Investigation for the District, constituted under Section 5 of the Act, such returns, accounts and other information relating to the operation of the Scheme as that Committee may consider to be relevant to any complaint that it is investigating.

$Penalties. \dagger$

75. Any owner who raises or allows to be raised from his coal mine or undertaking, during any period for which a quota is operative, an output of coal or of any class of coal

* Section 8 of the Act provides that no informa-tion with respect to any particular undertaking shall be included in any report published by the Board of Trade, the Central Council, an Executive Board of Trade, the Central Council, an Executive Board, or a Committee of Investigation unless the owner agrees thereto. Any person who obtains any information in the exercise or performance of any powers or duties conferred upon the Board by the Scheme or otherwise under Part I of the Act, shall be required by the Board to make a declaration of secrecy in the form prescribed by the Board of Trade (which will be published in the London Gazette).

Any person who discloses any information obtained by him shall be guilty of a misdemeanour and liable, on conviction or indictment, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years, or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds, or to both such imprisonment and fine, or on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds, or to both such imprisonment and fine.

It is provided, however, that nothing in Section

It is provided, however, that nothing in Section 8 of the Act shall apply to the publication or disclosure of any information in so far as it is required to be published or disclosed for the purposes of any legal proceedings (including arbitrations) under Part I of the Act or any scheme made thereunder, or for any report of such proceedings or in so far as it is required or authorised by Part I or any such scheme to be published or disclosed to the Board of Trade, the Central Council. or Committee of Investigation or to the Board.

† Under Section 4 (1) of the Act, a contract for the sale or supply of Coal, whether made before or after the passing of the Act shall not, unless the terms of the contract otherwise provide, be void or unenforceable as between the parties

be void or unenforceable as between the parties by reason that it cannot be parformed without contravening the provisions of the Scheme:

in excess of that permitted by the quota for the coal or for that class of coal (after allowing for any transfer of quota effected under Clause 49 of the Scheme) shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty at the rate of 2s. 6d. (two shillings and sixpence) per ton in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess.*

76. In addition to any monetary penalty payable under the last preceding Clause, where coal or any class of coal is produced in excess of the quota for any period, the quota for the coal mine or undertaking of the .owner so penalised may be reduced at the discretion of the Board by the amount of the excess during such succeeding period as the Board may determine.

77. Any owner who sells or disposes of any coal or class of coal at a price below the minimum price fixed for the time being under the Scheme for such coal, or sells or disposes of any coal or class of coal in such manner that the actual consideration obtained by him is less in value than the minimum price so fixed, or ships or causes to be shipped any coal in contravention of Clause 57 (b) of the Scheme, or allows any such sale, disposal, or shipment of any part of the output of his coal mine or undertaking to take place, shall pay on demand to the Board a penalty at the rate of 3s. (three shillings) per ton in respect of each ton or part of a ton so sold, disposed of, or shipped. †

78.—(1) Any owner who omits to render to the Board any return, account or information required or prescribed by the Board under the provisions of the Scheme, and after notice in writing from the Secretary fails to furnish such return, account or information within the seven days next following the date of such notice, shall pay to the Board the following penalties :-

- (i) In respect of the first seven days of such default a sum not exceeding 1d. (one farthing) per ton per day on his quarter's output as last ascertained or, if such output is not known, on a fourth of his standard tonnage on an annual basis;
- (ii) In the event of such default continuing beyond the first seven days, for each day of such continued default a sum not exceeding twice the sum contributable in respect of each of the first seven days.
- (2) For the purpose of calculating the amount of any penalty payable under the provisions of this Clause the default shall be regarded as commencing on the first day after the expiration of the said seven days next following the date of the notice as aforesaid from the Secretary.
- 79. Any owner who neglects to afford or refuses or allows to be refused the inspection of his books by an accountant duly authorised on behalf of the Board—
 - (i) For the purpose of verifying any return, account or other information required by the Board, or
 - (ii) For the purpose of supplying any other information to the Board that they may require in connection with their functions under the Scheme,

shall pay to the Board a penalty not exceeding £20 (twenty pounds) for each day of such neglect or refusal.

80. All penalties imposed by the Board under Clauses 75, 77, 78 or 79 of the Scheme shall be recoverable by the Board through the Trustees and shall be paid, as and when received, into the District Fund:

Provided that no proceedings in default of payment of any such penalty shall be commenced until a period of ten days shall have elapsed from the date of notice of the penalty being given under the provisions of Clause 82 of the Scheme and, in the event of an application being made within that period by the owner upon whom the penalty is imposed, that the matter be referred to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the scheme, no such proceedings as aforesaid shall be commenced unless and until the arbitrator shallhave made his award as to the amount of penalty (if any) payable by such owner, or the owner shall have abandoned his Appeal whichever shall first occur.

81. In the event of any objection by an owner under the provisions of Clauses 37, 43, or 55 of the Scheme to any determination or decision of the Board the determination or other decision of the Board to which objection is made shall be operative and shall, unless in any case the Board otherwise determine, continue to have full force until the same shall be varied (if at all) by the ruling of the Board on the objection, and no such objection or ruling shall be deemed to exempt the appelant from liability for any contravention of or non-compliance with the Scheme in respect of such determination or other decision

^{*}Under Section 4 (2) of the Act, where the output of a coal mine or undertaking exceeds during any period the quota of that mine or undertaking for that period, the owner shall not be liable to any penalty, nor shall any deduction be made from the quota of the mine or undertaking for any subsequent period, in respect of the excess, if it is adjudged by the Board, or in the event of an arbitration, by the arbitrator:

⁽a) that the excess was solely occasioned by the performance of contracts made before the 11th December, 1929;

⁽b) that the excess was reasonably necessary for the performance of those contracts; and

⁽c) that, having regard to the provisions of the Central Scheme, the imposition of the penalty or the making of the deduction, as the case may be, can without substantial injury to the interests of other owners be dispensed with with.

[†] Under Section 4 (3) of the Act an owner shall not be liable to a penalty under the Scheme by reason of the fact that he has, in pursuance of any contract, sold or supplied coal at a price below the minimum price determined in respect of that coal under the Scheme at the time of the sale or supply, unless the price at which the coal was contracted to be sold or supplied was lower than the minimum price at the time when coal was contracted to be sold or supplied was lower than the minimum price at the time when the contract was made, or, where no minimum price had then been determined in respect of the coal unless it is adjudged by the Board or, in the event of arbitration, by the arbitrator, that the quantity of coal contracted to be sold or supplied is greater, or the period over which the coal was contracted to be sold or supplied is longer than it would have been if no party to the contract had anticipated that the price would be regulated under the scheme.

at any time when the same shall be or have been operative.*

82. Notice in the form of a certificate in writing signed by the Secretary or other person authorised by the Board for the purpose specifying the contravention of or non-compliance with the Scheme in respect of which any monetary penalty is imposed by the Board and the amount of the penalty so imposed, shall be sent or delivered by the Secretary or such other persons as aforesaid to the owner upon whom the Board imposes the penalty, and shall be deemed to be sufficient notice that such penalty is payable, and the sum specified in the certificate shall be paid by such owner within ten days of the date of such notice, unless he shall in the meantime have referred the matter to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme in that behalf.

Compensation.

83. The whole or any part of the surplus remaining from time to time in the District Fund which has accrued from penalties and which in the opinion of the Board is not required for the effective management of the Scheme may be distributed among the members pro rata on the basis of Standard Tonnages as last determined.

Arbitration.

84. The Board shall prepare and submit for approval to the President of the Birmingham Law Society a panel of arbitrators for the District to one or more of whom any dispute arising in connection with the Scheme may be referred. Such panel shall not include any person who is financially interested in the ownership or working of any coal mine or any concern comprising coal mines situate in the District or any person who is acting in a secretarial or advisory capacity to any association or other body for regulating the production, supply or sale of coal; and in any case a person who has within the last three years been professionally employed by or on behalf of an owner in respect of any coal mine, shall not be eligible to act as arbitrator in any reference to which such owner is a party.

85. Any owner who is aggrieved (hereafter in the Scheme referred to as "the Complainant") by any act or omission of the Board or of any other persons in respect of their functions under the Scheme shall be entitled to refer the matter for decision to such one or more of the arbitrators constituting the panel of arbitrators for the district as he may select in agreement with the Board:

Provided that when the Complainant and the Board are unable to agree on the selection of an arbitrator from the panel the President of the Birmingham Law Society shall select the arbitrator.

86. The Complainant shall, as soon as the arbitrator has been appointed, furnish to the arbitrator a Statement of Complaint in writing setting forth the matter or matters which the Complainant wishes to be referred to arbitration and containing in numbered paragraphs particulars of the cause or causes of complaint, including the names, descriptions and addresses of any person or body of persons alleged to be responsible therefor, as well as particulars of any facts upon which the Complainant intends to rely and of the remedy or remedies which he proposed to claim in the arbitration, and the Complainant shall at the same time furnish a copy of such Statement of Complaint to every person or body of persons alleged to be responsible as aforesaid.

87. The arbitrator shall upon receipt of the Statement of Complaint give such directions for the conduct of the arbitration as he may think fit and shall fix a day for the hearing of the matter referred to him, and the arbitrator shall give notice in writing of the day so fixed to the Complainant and to every person or body of persons alleged to be responsible as aforesaid.*

88. Pending the award of an arbitrator, on any reference to arbitration under the Scheme, the decision of the Board in the matter under dispute shall be operative subject to the pro-

visions of Clause 80 of the Scheme.

89. Where any determination or other decision of the Board is a subject of reference hereunder, the award of the arbitrator shall, unless he otherwise directs, be operative in respect of such determination or other decision as from the date on which the determination or other decision was intended by the Board to be operative.

90. The expenses of the Board in connection with any arbitration under the Scheme, or under the Central Scheme, shall be payable out of the District Fund.

Dissolution.

91. In the event of the Scheme ceasing to have effect under Part I of the Act whether owing to the expiration of that Part of the Act or to action of the Board of Trade under sub-section. (7) of Section 5 of the Act, the Trustees shall collect all money due or belonging to the Board and convert into money any property of the Board (including any investments of the District Fund) and after discharging thereout all liabilities of the Board shall distribute the surplus, if any, amongst the owners pro rata on the basis of Standard Tonnages as last determined or in such other way as may be deemed by the Board to be appropriate and equitable:

Provided that, if it be agreed to continue the Scheme as a voluntary arrangement it shall

^{*} Under Section 9 of the Act it is provided that if any person contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of the Scheme and no penalty for the contravention or failure is expressly provided by the Scheme, he shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £100 and to a further fine not exceeding £20 for every day on which the contravention or failure occurs or continues. Where an offence under Part I of the Act or the Scheme, committed by a corporation, is proved to have been committed with the consent or connivance of, or to have been facilitated by any neglect on the part of, any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the corporation, he, as well as the corporation, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

^{*}Under the provisions of Section 16 (2) of the Act, the Arbitration Act, 1889, shall apply to any arbitration under a Scheme made under Part I of the Act, except in so far as the Arbitration Act, 1889, is inconsistent with Part I of the Act, provided that when on any such arbitration an award is stated in the form of a special case for the opinion of the court under paragraph (6) of Section 7 of the Arbitration Act, 1889, the decision of the High Court thereon shall be final.

be lawful for the Trustees to transfer the property of the Board (including any moneys and investments of the District Fund) to the Trustees under such voluntary arrangement, subject, however, to the payment to those owners who do not enter into the said voluntary arrangement of such sums (if any) as would be payable to them if the Scheme were finally wound up under the provisions of this Clause in lieu of being continued as a voluntary arrangement.

92. If upon cessation of the Scheme to have effect, the assets of the Board are insufficient to discharge their liabilities, the owners shall pay to the Trustees such sum as may be necessary to make up the deficiency, and a levy calculated so as to provide such sum shall be deemed to have been notified under the provisions of Clauses 64 and 65 of the Scheme immediately prior to the Scheme ceasing to have effect and shall be payable by the owners to the Trustees upon demand, notwithstanding such cessation.

93. The cessation of the Scheme to have effect shall not-

(a) affect the previous operation thereof or of anything duly done or suffered there-

(b) affect any right, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred thereunder;

(c) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any contravention of or non-complance with the Scheme; or

(d) affect any legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any right, obligation, liability or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if the Scheme had not ceased to have effect.

COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

Whereas under the provisions of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, a scheme for regulating the production, supply, and sale of coal by owners of coal mines situated in the District of South Wales (including Monmouthshire) has been submitted to the Board of Trade by the South Wales Coal Marketing Association, a voluntary Association representing a majority of owners of coal mines in the said District, after consultation with representatives of owners of coal mines in the District who are not members of the Association; and with the approval of a general meeting of all the owners in the said District:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section hereby approve the scheme set out in the Schedule hereto, and appoint Tuesday, the 28th day of October, 1930, as the date on which the said scheme shall come into

SCHEDULE.

COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE SOUTH WALES DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

The South Wales District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, submitted to the Board of Trade by The South Wales Coal Marketing Association, a voluntary Association representing a majority of owners of coal mines in the said District, after consultation with representatives of owners of coal mines in the District who are not members of the Association; and with the approval of a general meeting of all the owners in the said District.

- 1. This Scheme may be cited for all purposes as the "South Wales District (Coal Mines) SCHEME, 1930," and shall come into operation on such date as may be appointed by the Board of Trade under the provisions of the Act, and shall remain in force until the expiration of Part I of the Act, unless in the meantime
 - (i) A new Scheme shall be substituted in manner hereafter provided, or
 - (ii) The Board of Trade shall direct in pursuance of sub-section (7) of Section 5 of the Act that the Scheme shall cease to have
- 2. The production of coal and the supply and sale of such coal by all owners in the district shall be regulated by the provisions of the Scheme.
- 3. In this Scheme (unless the context otherwise requires) the following expressions shall have the following meanings, that is to say:—.
 - (a) "The Scheme" means the Scheme hereby constituted, and includes any amend-ment for the time being in force;
 - (b) "The Act" means the Coal Mines Act,
 - 1930;
 (c) "The Association" means the South Wales Coal Marketing Association consti-

tuted by deed of 31st October, 1929;
(d) "The Executive Board" or Board" means the Executive Board constituted under or by virtue of the Scheme;

- (e) "Quarter" (except where the context otherwise requires or where otherwise defined by the Executive Board) means a period of three calendar months ending on the 31st day of March, 30th day of June, 30th day of September, and the 31st day of December in each year;
- (f) Words importing the singular include the plural and words importing the masculine gender include the feminine and words appropriate to natural persons include corporations;
- (g) The term "sale" or "sell" or "dispose of" includes an agreement to sell or dispose of, provided that the provisions of the Scheme shall not apply to a contract or sale entered into before the date hereof except to the extent mentioned in Section 4 of the Act;
- (h) "The Central Scheme" means the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme 1930 including any amendment thereof for the time being in force; and "the Central Council" means the Council for the time being constituted thereunder;

- (i) "Class" means in relation to coal a class determined according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry or other category of consumer supplied or according to whether it is supplied for use in Great Britain or for export to any other country;
- (j) "Coal" includes bituminous coal, cannel coal and anthracite;
- (k) "Coal Mine" means any mine or open working in the district where the getting of coal is the principal object of the mining or quarrying operations;
- (l) "Disposal" in relation to a coal mine means the tonnage in saleable coal raised and weighed at the pit head at that coal mine after deducting all coal to be used for the purpose of working the mine and all coal to be supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependents of persons who have been so employed;
- (m) "The District" means the South Wales District subject to any adjustment thereof under the provisions of Part II of the Schedule to the Act;
- (n) "The District Fund" means the District Fund constituted by and established under the Scheme;
 - (o) "Month" means calendar month;
- (p) "Output" means the tonnage in coal raised and weighed at the pit head of a coal mine or undertaking;
- (q) "Owner" means the owner (as defined in the Coal Mines Act 1911) of any coal mine;
- mine;
 (r) "The Trustees" means the persons for the time being appointed under the provisions of the Scheme to be the trustees for the Executive Board;
- (s) "Undertaking" means any undertaking comprising one or more coal mines in the same ownership;
- (t) "Functions" includes powers and duties.

REPRESENTATIVES AND ASSOCIATES:

- 4. (i) Each owner shall appoint one "representative" and one "associate" for the purposes of the Scheme.
- (ii) Any owner may from time to time or at any time remove his representative or associate and appoint a new representative or associate in his place or in the place of a deceased representative or associate.
- (iii) Every such appointment or removal shall be in writing under the hand of the owner concerned or in the case of an owner being a corporation under the hand of one or more of its officers duly authorised in that behalf. Written notice of every such appointment or removal shall be given to the Executive Board.
- (iv) A sole owner not being a corporation may (subject to giving notice in writing to the Executive Board that he intends to do so) act as his own representative and references herein or in the Schedules hereto to representatives shall be deemed to include a sole owner so acting.
- (v) The representatives and associates appointed under this clause are in the Scheme referred to as "representatives" and "associates."

GENERAL MEETINGS OF OWNERS.

5. The provisions set forth in the Second Schedule herete as to the holding of and procedure and voting at general meetings of the owners and otherwise in relation to such general meetings shall have effect.

THE EXECUTIVE BOARD.

6.—(i) The Scheme shall be administered by an Executive Board constituted as provided in the First Schedule to the Scheme.

- (ii) There shall be constituted and elected as hereinafter provided an Executive Board who shall be responsible for the general administration of the Scheme and it shall be the duty of the Executive Board, subject to the provisions of the Scheme and within the limits thereof, to take from time to time such steps as may appear to them desirable for the purposes of regulation to the best advantage of the production of coal, and the supply and sale of coal produced in the district, and the Executive Board further and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers shall have the following powers:—
 - (a) The appointment of officers, servants and staff for the purpose of carrying out any functions under the Scheme.
 - (b) The appointment of committees of the Executive Board, so however that these shall be constituted of representatives or associates (as defined in the Scheme) of owners of coal mines within the district. The Executive Board may delegate any of their powers to any committee so appointed whereof half its number are members of the Executive Board; provided that the decision of any committee shall be subject to approval of or ratification by the Executive Board.
 - (c) For the making of rules and regulations for carrying out any matter under the Scheme or incidental to any purpose of the Scheme.
 - (d) For any other purpose for carrying out the provisions of the Scheme.
- (iii) The provisions contained in the First Schedule hereto with respect to the constitution, election, meetings and proceedings of and otherwise in relation to the Executive Board shall have effect.

TONNAGE STATEMENTS.

- 7.—(i) Every owner shall within seven days after the Scheme comes into force send to the secretary of the Association for transmission to the Executive Board when constituted a statement in writing (hereinafter called "the tonnage statement") containing the following particulars:—
 - (a) The full name and address (and if a company the registered office) of such owner, or in the case of a coal mine or undertaking owned by several persons jointly or by a partnership firm the name and address of each such person or of each of the partners in the firm, and also in the case of a firm the name and address of the firm.

(b) The name and situation of each coal

mine owned by him in the district.

(c) The period selected by such owner from

amongst the following periods as the period by reference to which his standard tonnage is to be determined, that is to say, either (1) any one of the six quarters commencing on 1st January 1927 and ending on 30th June 1928; or (2) the month of March 1929; and

- (d) The output of each of such owner's coal mines (with the quantities of the coal of each class comprised in such output) for
 - (1) all the periods before mentioned; and (2) the six months ending 31st December 1929.
- (ii) Each tonnage statement shall within 21 days after the Scheme comes into force be supplemented by particulars in writing of any claim (together with the evidence necessary to substantiate the same) which the owner concerned may desire to advance for special treatment in the determination of the standard tonnage of any of his coal mines on the ground of the special circumstances of the mine, including the efficiency and economy of the working of the mine, the extent to which it has been or is being developed for economic working and the extent to which its output has been increasing or decreasing.

(iii) After the constitution of the Executive Board any owner who has not previously complied with the foregoing provisions of this clause shall furnish to the Executive Board on demand such tonnage statement and such claim (if any) as aforesaid.

DETERMINATION OF CLASSES.

8. For the purpose of determining the various classes to which any coal produced in the district belongs, the Board shall as soon as possible after their first election, and subsequently from time to time as they may think fit allocate the coal produced at each mine into classes, such classification being at the discretion of the Board according to the nature of the coal or of the trade, industry, or other category of consumer supplied or according to whether it be supplied for use in Great Britain or for export to any other country; and the Board may adopt a different basis of classification in the determination of classes for the purpose of fixation of standard tonnages quotas and quarterly allocations from those for the purpose of fixation of minimum prices and may from time to time or at any time alter or add to any such classification. The Board may make rules or regulations providing for the method of determination of classes and shall communicate to each owner any classification adopted.

DETERMINATION OF STANDARD TONNAGES.

- 9.—(i) Upon receipt of the tonnage statements and such claims (if any) as aforesaid the Executive Board shall proceed to fix a standard tonnage on a quarterly basis for each coal mine or undertaking in the district in accordance with the following provisions:—
 - (a) In the absence of any special circumstances calling in the opinion of the Executive Board for special treatment the standard tonnage for any coal mine or undertaking shall be fixed at an amount equal to 90 per cent. of its output for the selected period unless the selected period be the month of March, 1929, in which case such standard tonnage shall be fixed at an amount equal to such output for that month divided by the figure 26 and multiplied by the figure 75.

(b) In fixing the standard tonnages the Executive Board shall have regard to the special circumstances of every coal mine or undertaking, including the matters set out

- in paragraph (c) of sub-section 3 (2) of the Act, and shall have regard to the proportion which the output of the coal mine or undertaking bore to the output of the district during the three months ending 31st March, 1927.
- (c) Where a coal mine or undertaking had no output during any of the periods available for selection or where the owner concerned fails to furnish a tonnage statement or in any case not otherwise provided for the Executive Board may fix the standard tonnage at such amount as, having regard to the provisions of paragraph (c) of subsection 3 (2) of the Act, they shall think proper.
- (ii) The standard tonnages so fixed by the Executive Board and results of any such revision thereof as is hereinafter mentioned shall immediately be notified in writing to the respective owners concerned. If any owner is dissatisfied with the standard tonnage or revision thereof so notified to him as aforesaid he may within two days after such notification give notice of objection to the Executive Board and the Executive Board shall hear the objection and give their decision thereon with Provided that there all convenient speed. shall be no right of objection to the Executive Board against the standard tonnage as originally fixed unless either (a) the appellant's tonnage statement was supplemented by such claim as is mentioned in sub-clause (ii) of clause 7 of the Scheme or (b) such standard tonnage was fixed at an amount less than that mentioned in sub-clause (i) (a) of this clause.
- 10.—(i) The Executive Board may if they think fit so to do fix separate standard tonnages for such classes of coal as they may determine and for that purpose may distribute the standard tonnage of any coal mine or undertaking producing different classes of coal amongst the various classes of coal produced thereby, but so that such distribution of standard tonnages amongst any class of coal shall be effected for all coal mines or undertakings producing that class of coal.
- (ii) Until otherwise determined by the Executive Board separate standard tonnages shall be capable of being fixed in respect of the following classes of coal only, that is to say:—
 - (a) Anthracite,
 - (b) Swansea Steam, and
 - (c) Steam and Bituminous and all other
- 11. The standard tonnage of each owner once fixed shall (except as herein provided) remain unchanged for the period of two years or until the Executive Board shall determine to alter the basis of the standard tonnage for all the owners and shall carry out any modification of the Scheme.
- 12.—(i) In case of an owner owning any newly opened coal mine which may not during the selected period have been fully developed or in the case of an owner owning any coal mine at which alterations or developments not made or not fully effective until after the selected period have altered materially the potential output of such coal mine as compared with its potential output in the selected period the standard tonnage of such owner upon his application to the Executive Board

for the purpose may be increased by such an amount as will represent the resulting increase in the normal estimated production of that coal mine for the quarter in which the standard tonnage is intended to operate.

- (ii) Where an owner's coal mine which was not working in any of the periods available for selection restarts work after the first fixation of standard tonnages under the Scheme the standard tonnage of such owner upon his application to the Executive Board for the purpose may be increased by such an amount as will represent the normal estimated production of that coal mine for the next ensuing quarter, provided that in the case of a coal mine forming part of an undertaking the last preceding quarterly allocation of all owners has amounted to at least the total standard tonnage on which the first quarterly allocation to be fixed hereunder is based.
- (iii) Applications under the foregoing provisions of this clause must be made to the Executive Board in writing at least 42 days before the commencement of the quarter to which the increase is intended to apply and any increase granted shall cease to have effect at the expiration of such quarter or other period for which they were granted unless continued for the next or any subsequent quarter or period upon a like application made for the purpose at least 42 days before the commencement of that quarter.

Review of Standard Tonnage.

13. At the end of the period of two years or such other time as the Executive Board may determine the Board shall if they think fit review the operation of the Scheme in the light of the experience of working and of the fairness of determination of the standard tonnages herein before prescribed, and if at the end of the period of two years or such other period as may be determined it is found that there are a substantial number of owners who for more than a period of one quarter have failed to produce the proportion of standard tonnage which the total output of the whole district bears to the total standard tonnage of all owners of the district then the Executive Board shall consider a modification of the Scheme and shall if the modification is approved submit to the Board of Trade a revised basis for the purpose of determining a standard tonnage for each owner in order to bring the basis into line with actual experience and working.

- 14. Where an owner ceases to own a coal mine in respect of which a standard tonnage has been assigned or where he sells the whole or any portion of his coal mines or except as herein provided where he permanently closes down all his coal mines the standard tonnage applicable to the owner in respect of those coal mines or portion of those coal mines shall cease. Provided that:—
 - (i) In case of any one or more coal mines being purchased the Executive Board shall assign to the purchaser the standard tonnage applicable to the coal mine at the time of the previous ownership, subject however to any variations thereof made under the provisions of the Scheme.

- (ii) In cases where:--
 - (a) an owner who permanently closes down all his coal mines has prior to the coming into operation of the Scheme entered into an arrangement with another owner for the control of his undertaking or the control of his output therein for a period which continues for not less than two years from the commencement of the Scheme and who proposes to take a transfer of quarterly allocations from him; or
 - (b) the undertaking of such owner permanently closing down all his coal mines is, as to not less than two-thirds thereof owned or controlled by another owner who proposes to take a transfer of quarterly allocations from him,

the standard tonnage of the coal mines permanently closed down may remain; subject however to the owners taking advantage of these exceptions and provisos being under the same obligations as to transfers of quarterly allocation as are mentioned in Clause 22 of the Scheme.

15. A list of the standard tonnages and of any variations thereof made from time to time shall be kept available at the offices of the Executive Board for inspection during ordinary business hours by any owner or his agent duly authorised in writing.

REGULATION OF OUTPUT.

Quotas and Allocations.

16. The Executive Board shall so far as practicable meet at least 90 days before the beginning of each year and at least 28 days before the beginning of each quarter or other period; provided that if it be intended to provide for the first fixation of output under the provisions of the Scheme for the remainder of the year 1930 they shall meet not later than 14 days after being constituted. Provided that the Board shall meet as often as occasion shall require during the quarter for the purpose of revising any estimates hereinafter provided or for the purpose of allocating the revised quantities so fixed among the owners in manner hereinafter set out. They shall so meet for the purpose of estimating in the case of every year the amount of the minimum demand for coal likely to be produced from the district for the forthcoming year (herein called "the estimated annual quota") and in the case of each quarter for the purpose of estimating or revising the estimate of the reasonable amount of coal (herein called "the estimated quarterly allocation") likely to be produced from the district for the ensuing quarter. In so doing they shall have regard to the respective estimated quantities likely to be produced for disposal for export and for inland consumption and the corresponding amount of output at the pithead necessary therefor. They shall also have regard to the quantities of each class of coal likely to be produced in accordance with Section 3 (2) (d) of the Act. These estimates shall be submitted to the Central Council together with such information as the Central Council may require, and the amounts approved by them are referred to as "the approved annual quota" and "the approved quarterly allocation" respectively.

- 17. Upon receipt of the approved annual quota or the approved quarterly allocation or any revision thereof the Executive Board shall consider the same and shall proceed to fix the total annual quota or the total quarterly allocation as the case may be at such approved quantity, or any less amount to be divided among the owners as may be decided by the Executive Such total annual quota and total quarterly allocation shall be disposed of among the owners in manner hereinafter appearing. Provided that in the case of the fixation of output for the remainder of the year 1930 which may be unexpired at the time of the commencement of the Scheme the Board shall not be under any obligation to fix the allocation for that period upon a quarterly basis or upon the basis of an annual quota but shall divide the quantity (if any) among the owners in the same proportions as the total annual quota is to be divided under the provisions hereinafter contained.
- 18. (i) The Board may divide the total annual quota among the different classes of coals produced by the owners and the following provisions of this Scheme shall then be construed and applied accordingly.
- (ii) The total annual quota or the proportion applicable to any class of coal produced by the owners shall be divided by the Board amongst the owners and for this purpose the Board shall fix the output for each owner in respect of that year hereinafter called "the annual quota" which shall bear the same proportion to the standard tonnage of such owner as the total annual quota bears to the total standard tonnage of all the owners. vided that in any distribution of the total annual quota by classes of coal the annual quota for each owner in respect of such classes shall be so apportioned that the distribution shall be in the same proportion for all such Provided that an owner becoming or ceasing to be such during the currency of any year shall be entitled only to a rateable proportion of his annual quota for that year. Provided also that an owner's annual quota may be varied during any year to conform with the alteration of his standard tonnage but so that the alteration of the owner's annual quota shall only be operative for the same period as his standard tonnage.
- 19. Each owner shall be entitled to raise during each quarter such proportionate part of his annual quota (as is hereinafter mentioned) together with such further quantity as may be fixed for such owner under the provisions hereinafter contained. The Executive Board shall so far as practicable fix proportionate parts to apply for each quarter having regard to the number of working days in each quarter of the year respectively, but shall, subject to this and to any other circumstances which may appear to them to be material, endeavour to fix the proportion as near as possible at one equal fourth part of such owner's annual quota.
- 20. (i) The total quarterly allocation shall be divided among the owners by the Executive Board in manner following, that is to say:
 - (ii) After making allowance for:
 - (a) the quarterly proportion of the total annual quota already referred to;

- (b) amounts necessary to provide for any increase in the owners' annual quota due to increase of their standard tonnages;
- (c) deficiencies estimated or liable to be brought forward from the preceding quarter under the provisions hereinafter contained;
- (d) any amounts additional to the quantities allocated to owners under the provisions of the Scheme which may be necessary to comply with contracts entered into under the provisions of Section 4 of the Act and subject to the provisions therein contained the Board shall decide what further quantity (if any) of the difference between the approved quarterly allocation fixed by the Central Council, and the total of the said allowances shall be raised during the quarter and the Board may in its discretion during such quarter increase the quantity so fixed, but not in excess of the approved quarterly allocation without first receiving the approval of the Central Council.
- (iii) The further quantities so determined from time to time shall be allocated among owners generally or if the Board so decide among owners producing any particular class or classes of coal in such shares that the quantity allocated to each owner shall bear the same proportion to the total further quantity as the owner's standard tonnage or the proportion thereof applicable to the particular class of coal as the case may be bears to the total standard tonnage of all the owners or of the proportions thereof applicable to such particular class of coal.
- (iv) The amount so allocated to any owner is hereinafter referred to as the owner's "period quota," and the owner's period quota, together with the quarterly proportion of the annual quota is hereinafter referred to as the owner's "quarterly allocation"; and the total of the owner's four quarterly allocations is hereinafter referred to as the owner's "total allocation."
- 21.—(i) No owner shall produce more than his quarterly allocation in any quarter except:
 - (a) for the purpose of producing deficiencies carried forward from one quarter to another in the same year to the extent hereinafter permitted, or
 - (b) in the case of an owner claiming the protection of Section 4 of the Act in respect of any contract and then only upon satisfying the Executive Board upon the matters required and to the extent permitted by them or under the provisions of the said Section, or
 - (c) otherwise under the provisions for transfer hereinafter contained; and any owner acting in contravention hereof shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in clause 43 of the Scheme.
- (ii) Each owner intending to claim to carry forward any deficiency from one quarter to another shall at least 28 days before the end of the quarter in which the deficiency arises, notify the Board of his intention so to do and of his estimate of such deficiency. The claim for such deficiency (hereinafter called the "quota deficiency") shall be the lesser of the following amounts, namely:
 - (a) the actual amount by which the quarterly proportion of his annual quota exceeds his output for the quarter after deducting

any tonnage allowed under this clause to be carried forward from the preceding quarter,

- (b) the estimate of such amount before mentioned.
- (iii) If the total of the quota deficiencies of all owners claiming together with other allowances mentioned in sub-clause (ii) of clause No. 20 hereof amount to not more than the total quarterly allocation in the quarter next following that in which the deficiencies arise then the Board shall allow the claim of each owner for a quota deficiency at the lesser of the amounts mentioned in the last sub-clause (ii) hereof.
- (iv) If the total of the said quota deficiencies of all ewners so claiming together with the allowances as aforesaid amount to more than the total quarterly allocation in the quarter next following as aforesaid then the total of the quota deficiencies shall be diminished by the amount of the excess and each owner's quota deficiency shall in like manner abate protanto and such abated amount shall be his quota deficiency.

Transfers of Quarterly Allocations.

- 22. Subject to the following provisions an owner may agree with any other owner to produce less than his quarterly allocation for not more than one quarter at a time, and so that the benefit of any deficiency so agreed to shall be transferred to the other owner who shall not in respect of the amount so transferred be deemed to have exceeded his quarterly allocation and the transfer shall be taken as though the quarterly allocation of the transferring owner were diminished and as though the quarterly allocation of the transferee owner were increased for the period by the amount of the transfer. Such transfers shall only be made:
 - (a) by one owner to another in respect of the same class of coal for which any separate standard tonnage, quota, or allocation may for the period for which the transfer is made be in force; and
 - (b) if notified to the Executive Board within 24 hours of the arrangement for the said transfer, and not later than the end of the quarter or other period for which it is made.

Calculation of Output.

- 23. The output of each owner shall be ascertained at the end of each quarter by the Board and each owner whose output shall be in excess of his quarterly allocation for the time being shall pay to the Board such penalty as may be prescribed by clause 43 of the Scheme upon each ton in excess of his quarterly allocation.
- 24. For the purpose of calculating any excess or deficiency in quarterly proportion of the annual quota, quarterly allocation or total allocation, over or below the output of any coal mine or undertaking or of any owner in respect thereof adjustments shall be made as provided in the several clauses of the Scheme, whether in respect of quantities transferred to or from any owner or in respect of excess quantities produced in one quarter falling to be deducted from a following in respect of deficiencies Or allowed to be carried forward under the Scheme or as the case may be.

25. Where in any period a separate standard tonnage, annual quota, or quarterly allocation has been fixed in respect of any class of coal then the references herein to total output, quarterly allocation, annual quota, excess, or deficiencies shall be deemed to mean the total output, quarterly allocation, annual quota, excess, or deficiencies respectively of such owner in respect of such class.

PROVISIONS RELATING TO MINIMUM PRICES.

- 26. The Board shall fix minimum prices per ton of 20 cwts. for the classes of coal in the district below which prices coal of each class shall not be sold or disposed of, other than such coal as is allowed to be disposed of free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine and the dependents of persons who have been so employed.
- 27. For the purpose of fixing minimum prices the coal mines and coals of the ewners shall be divided into groups according to the classes of coals produced from such coal mines respectively.
- 28. The Executive Board shall allocate the owners' coal mines into the respective groups and classes to which the coals of such coal mines for the purpose of disposal in the market are, in the opinion of the Executive Board, appropriate; Provided always that before making finally such allocation the Executive Board shall invite such owners to submit applications for any class of coal to be placed in a particular group or class and shall consider such applications on their merits.
- 29. There shall be a committee for each group, which committee shall have consultative powers only and shall be composed of one representative of each owner of a coal mine producing any class of coal in the group. The owner or the representative may appoint a substitute to attend in his stead.
- 30: The Executive Board shall then so soon as practicable determine the respective minimum prices below which coals in each class may not be sold or disposed of, and the minimum price for each class of coal shall be fixed from time to time by the Executive Board, which shall meet as often as occasion shall require and shall so far as practicable endeavour to fix the same at as nearly as possible the same time as the quarterly allocations, but may nevertheless if they think fit from time to time and at any time fix or alter any minimum prices whether at the time of the fixing of quarterly allocations or not.
- 31. The minimum price fixed for any class of coal shall be an f.o.b. price for shipment coal, whether sold f.o.b. or c.i.f., and a pithead price for coal other than coal for shipment.
- 32. The classification adopted and minimum price fixed from time to time for any class of coal as well as any variation or new fixation thereof as hereinafter provided shall be communicated to all owners concerned as soon as possible and a complete list of the classification and of the minimum prices for the time being in force shall be kept available at the office of the Executive Board for inspection at all reasonable times by any owner or his agent duly authorised in writing.
- 33. If any owner is dissatisfied with any classification adopted or of the minimum price

fixed in respect of any coal or class of coal produced by him he may within two days after notification of such classification or minimum price give notice of objection to the Executive Board who shall thereupon reconsider the matter and deliver their decision with all convenient speed.

- 34. After the first preparation by the Executive Board of a classification of coals and a schedule of minimum prices for each class of coals, any new fixation of minimum prices applicable to any coal or class thereof, or any variation of the said classification or schedule of minimum prices or of any duly effected modification thereof, shall be carried out in the following manner:—
 - (i) Any proposed new fixation or variation shall in the first instance (other than one applicable in like manner to all the owners or one not affecting the relative prices of the classes of coal or in the case of urgency) be considered by the appropriate group committee or committees, and the Executive Board shall only exercise the powers of variation of the classification or of the minimum prices hereinbefore referred to (other than those above excepted) after such discussion by the group committee, whether the variations are approved by the group committee or not.
 - (ii) A question of a matter being urgent shalf be decided by a two-thirds majority of the members present at the meeting of the Executive Board.
- 35. With a view to ascertaining whether any coal has been sold below the minimum price for the time being in force, any owner who claims to have sold or delivered any coal at a price other than an f.o.b. price for shipment coal or a pithead price for coal other than coal for shipment, shall furnish to the Board through the accountants or other officer full details of the costs and charges actually incurred which fall to be deducted from the price in order to arrive at the f.o.b. or the pithead price, as the case may be, for the purpose of comparison with the appropriate minimum prices, and where coal is sold at a price including wagon hire, the amount of the wagon hire shall be calculated by taking the amount which would have been charged therefor had the coal been carried in wagons owned by the Railway Company.
- 36. From and after the application of a minimum price to any coal or class of coal, no owner producing coal of that class shall either directly or indirectly (except in respect of coal supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the coal mine and the dependents of persons who have been so employed):
 - (i) Agree to sell or supply coal at a price below the price fixed for the time being for that class of coal, or agree to sell or supply the same in any manner whereby the actual consideration obtained by him is less in value than the price so fixed; or
 - (ii) Sell or deliver coal at any time at a price below the minimum price in operation at the time of the contract of sale; or where-

by the actual consideration obtained by him is less in value than the price so fixed; or

(iii) Allow or give or agree to allow or

- give, save as may be expressly permitted by the Scheme, any discount, rebate, extended credit or allowance in respect of the price, quantity, or weight of the coal or otherwise; and any owner who contravenes in any particular the provisions of this clause shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in clause 43
- of the Scheme.

 37. No owner shall ship or cause to be shipped any cargo of coal otherwise than in pursuance of a bona fide contract for the sale thereof at a priced fixed before the time of shipment not being a price lower than the minimum price for the time being in force for the class or classes of coal contained in such cargo for shipment and any owner committing a breach of this clause shall pay to the Board two shillings and sixpence per ton upon the number of tons of coal so shipped.

RETURNS.

- 38. The Executive Board may require the owners to send to the Board or to any person nominated by them such returns, accounts and information as the Board may consider necessary for the operation of the Scheme.
- 39. Each owner shall also afford to the Board through the accountants authorised by the Board on demand, production and inspection of his books and documents relating to any coal mine of the owner, and such accountants shall report to the Board the result of such inspection.
- 40. Any owner desiring to claim pretection under Section 4 of the Act shall give to the Board through the accountants or other proper officer all information necessary as to any contract for the sale of coal for which any protection may be claimed.
 - 4h. Each owner shall:
 - (i) within 10 days after the expiration of each calendar month forward to the Board a statement in writing in such form as the Board shall prescribe and duly certified by the owner or his agent, manager or accounting officer, giving such particulars as may be required of all sales or deliveries of coal made by him during such month, and
 - (ii) within 10 days after the end of each quarter forward to the Board a statement in writing in such form as the Board may prescribe, and duly certified by the owner or his agent, manager, or accounting officer, giving full particulars of his output of coal in the quarter together with any further particulars necessary for ascertaining any excess or deficiency in output.
- 42. The Board may, in case any owner fails to supply information required under the Scheme, itself estimate as near as possible the information which should have been supplied by the owner, and in particular the Board may exercise such powers of making estimates for the purpose of fixing standard tonnage, annual quota, quarterly allocation, or for the purpose of estimating the output in any period or for the purpose of levying contributions upon the owner or for any other matter for which this power ought reasonably to be exercised. These powers may be exercised

without prejudice to the penalties incurred by the owner for breach or breaches of any clause of the Scheme.

PENALTIES.

- 43.—(i) Any owner whose output during the quarter or other period for which the quarterly allocation is operative exceeds the amount of the quarterly allocation, shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty of 2s. 6d. per ton in respect of each ton or part of a ton of such excess, and if so decided by the Executive Board shall also have deducted the amount of the excess from his following quarterly allocation or allocations.
- (ii) Any owner who shall hereafter sell or dispose of any coal or class of coal produced in the district at a price below the minimum price fixed for the time being in respect of such coal or shall sell or dispose of any coal or class of coal in such a manner that the actual consideration obtained by him is less than the minimum price so fixed, or who ships or causes to be shipped any coal in contravention of Clause 37 of the Scheme or allows such sale, disposal or shipment shall pay on demand to the Board a penalty at the rate of 2s. 6d. per ton in respect of each ton so sold, disposed of, or shipped.
- 44.—(i) Any owner who omits to render to the Executive Board any return or information required by, or prescribed by the Board under the provisions of the Scheme, or who omits to render or supply information relative to any contract under Section 4 of the Act which may be required by the Executive Board and after notice in writing from the Secretary fails to furnish such returns or information within the three days next following the date of such notice shall pay to the Executive Board on demand the following penalties:—
 - (a) In respect of the first seven days of such default a sum of \(\frac{1}{4}\)d. per ton per day on his quarterly output as last ascertained, or \(\frac{1}{3}\)f such output is not known then on his standard tonnage.
 - (b) In the event of such default continuing beyond the first seven days of such continued default, an amount equal to twice the sum contributable by him in respect of each of the first seven days.
- (ii) for the purpose of calculating the amount of any penalty payable under the provisions of this clause, the default shall be regarded as commencing on the first day after the expiration of the said three days next following the date of such notice as aforesaid.

Provided that if in the opinion of the Executive Board the owner shows sufficient cause why the said return or information has not been sent within the aforesaid time the Executive Board may remit all or any of the penalties provided in this clause.

- 45. Any owner who neglects to afford or refuses or allows to be refused the inspection of his books by an accountant duly authorised on behalf of the Executive Board.
 - (i) For the purpose of verifying any return account or other information required by the Executive Board; or
 - (ii) For the purpose of supplying any other information (except that referred to in clause 44 hereof) to the Executive Board that they may require in connection with

their functions under the Scheme, shall pay to the Executive Board on demand, a penalty of £25 for each day of such neglect or refusal.

46. Penalties shall be paid within seven days of the delivery of notification from the Executive Board, and five per cent. interest per annum shall be paid upon any amount not paid within ten days after receipt of the said notification. Provided that this present provision for the payment of penalties shall not in any way prejudice or affect any remedy by way of injunction or otherwise which the Board or the Trustees might have against any such owner.

Provided also that no proceedings in default of payment of any such penalty shall be commenced until a period of seven days shall have elapsed from the date of notice of the penalty being given, and in the event of an application being made within that period by the owner upon whom the penalty is imposed, that the matter be referred to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme, no such proceedings as aforesaid shall be commenced unless and until the arbitrator shall have made his award, or until the owner shall have withdrawn his claim or reference, or within the times prescribed by the Scheme or the Executive Board hereunder have failed to prosecute his claim or proceed with the reference.

47. All penalties imposed by the Board shall be recoverable by the Board through the Trustees and shall be paid as and when received into the District Fund.

CONTRIBUTIONS.

- 48. (i) Every owner shall pay to the Board, for the purposes of meeting the expenses of the Board in administering the Scheme, including any payments required under the Central Scheme, such levies as may be decided upon by the Board from time to time and notified to the owners.
- (ii) Any levy made by the Board shall be calculated in proportion to the several owners' outputs or disposals of coal during such period as the Board may determine, so, however, that the same period shall be taken for all owners; provided that in the case of any undertaking having no output or disposal in the period so taken, the levy shall be calculated in proportion to the output or disposal thereof during the latest period of equal duration in which such undertaking had an output or disposal.

THE DISTRICT FUND.

49. All contributions, levies, penalties and other moneys received by the Executive Board, or any person on behalf of the Board, in connection with the administration of the Scheme, shall together form a fund to be called the District Fund and shall be paid into a bank in the names of the Trustees. Provided that such reasonable sums as the Board may decide may be left outstanding in the hands of any officer of the Board, and provided further that if the sum exceeds £100 it shall stand in the name of the Chairman of the Board for the time being as well as the officer concerned.

50. There shall be paid out of the District Fund such expenses as the Board or any other persons on behalf of the Board may properly incur in the exercise or performance of their functions under the Scheme, and also there shall be paid out of the District Fund such amounts necessary to defray any penalties imposed on the District under the provisions of the Central Scheme and also such amounts as shall be necessary to provide for compensation to members whose output is less than their total allocation in manner provided in this clause and in Clause 54 of the Scheme.

Provided that any moneys derived from the payment of penalties shall be accounted for under a distinct and separate heading in the accounts of the District Fund and such moneys shall be primarily liable for the payment of any penalties imposed on the District under the Central Scheme and subject to payment of or provision for such penalties as shall have been actually imposed on the District or in the opinion of the Executive Board may have been incurred by the District down to the end of any year the balance or the requisite part thereof shall be distributed in the proper pro-portions amongst the owners entitled to compensation for that year under the provisions of the Scheme in or towards satisfaction of the compensation to which they are so entitled, and the ultimate balance (if any) remaining after such distribution as aforesaid shall (together with any balance carried forward from any preceding year or years and remaining unapplied) be carried forward and added to the moneys derived from payment of penalties in the year next following.

Provided further that the total amount distributable by way of compensation for any year shall not exceed the amount of the balance available for distribution under the last preceding proviso.

- 51. For the purpose of meeting any expenses duly approved by the Executive Board the Trustees or any persons duly authorised by them may draw cheques on the District Fund.
- 52. The Trustees shall have discretion to invest any moneys standing to the credit of the District Fund which are in excess of the immediate requirements of the Board in any investments authorised by law for the investment of trust moneys and may from time to time change such investments for any other investment of the like nature or realise the same in order to meet expenses duly approved by the Board.
- 53. Auditors of the District Fund shall be appointed by the owners at the general meeting called in pursuance of Clause 1 of the Second Schedule to the Scheme and the audited accounts of the District Fund shall be presented at each annual general meeting, when the auditors shall be reappointed or other auditors appointed in their place.

COMPENSATION.

54.—(i) The total amount of compensation shall be allocated by the Executive Board out of the District Fund under the provisions contained in the Scheme, and the compensation payable to owners shall be distributed so that the amount paid to any owner bears the same proportion to the total amount paid by way of compensation as such owner's compensateable deficiency (as hereinafter defined) bears to the total of the compensateable deficiencies of all

the owners, but so that no owner shall in any case receive more than 2s. for every ton of his compensateable deficiency.

- (ii) An owner's compensateable deficiency shall be calculated as follows:—From the amount by which such owner's output is short of his total allocation there shall be deducted the output (estimated as hereinafter provided and called "lost output") lost owing to strikes, accidents, or breakages of machinery, and the resulting amount or ten per cent. of the total allocation (whichever shall be the less) shall be and is herein referred to as his compensateable deficiency.
- (iii) If the coal mine affected by any of the causes specified in sub-clause (ii) hereof has not worked on any day in the quarter by reason of any such causes, there shall be no compensateable deficiency for such quarter so far as regards that coal mine.
- (iv) If the coal mine has worked on any day during the quarter, the lost output of any owner estimated by reference to each quarter shall be as follows: The output for the quarter of each coal mine affected by any of the causes specified in sub-clause (ii) hereof shall be divided by the number of days actually worked by that coal mine during that quarter and the daily output so ascertained shall be multiplied by the number of days on which the coal mine was idle owing to any of the said causes and the result shall represent the lost output for that coal mine.

TRUSTEES. .

- 55. The owners shall, at the first General Meeting called in pursuance of Clause 1 of the Second Schedule to the Scheme, appoint three persons to be the Trustees for the Board under the Scheme. The District Fund and all other property of the Board shall be vested in the Trustees.
- 56.—(i) Any Trustee for the time being hereof may retire or by resolution of a general meeting be removed from the office of Trustee, and the power of appointing new or additional Trustees hereof shall be exercisable by the owners in general meeting.

Provided that if the number of Trustees be reduced at any time to less than two the Executive Board may themselves appoint a new Trustee to act with the remaining Trustee until the next annual general meeting of owners.

- (ii) The Trustees shall not be liable to make good any deficiency which may arise or happen in the District Fund or property of the Board, but shall be liable only for moneys which shall be actually received by them on account of the Board.
- (iii) The owners shall save harmless and keep indemnified the Trustees and each of them from all actions, claims, demands, costs and expenses which they or he may incur, sustain, or be put to by reason of or incidental to any matter which may be done in execution of the provisions of the Scheme.
- 57. The Trustees may sue and be sued for and on behalf and in the name of the Board, and shall pay into the District Fund any moneys recovered by them in any proceedings taken on behalf of the Board, and the Trustees

shall be entitled to reimburse themselves out of the District Fund for any costs and expenses incurred by them in their capacity as Trustees under the Scheme. Provided that the Trustees shall not be bound to commence any action or proceeding unless required to do so by the Board and then only upon having proper provision made for their costs. For the purpose of any proceedings the accountants of the Executive Board and any other officer are hereby authorised to furnish to the Trustees and to the Board all such information as may be required.

AMENDMENTS.

- 58. The Board may if they think fit at any time submit to the Board of Trade any alterations or amendments in or additions to the provisions of the Scheme or may also if they think fit make a new Scheme in substitution therefor and submit the same to the Board of Trade. Provided that the resolution of the Board authorising such amendment or new Scheme shall be carried by at least two-thirds of the members present at the meeting.
- 59. The owners may also by resolution in general meeting from time to time resolve upon any alterations or amendments in or additions to the provisions of the Scheme or upon the adoption of a new Scheme in substitution therefor and the Board shall consider the resolution at a meeting to be held not less than 10 days thereafter, and unless the Board submit the alterations or new provisions as the case may be within 20 days of the passing of the said resolution of the owners, any owner may submit the same to the Board of Trade. Provided that the resolution of the owners in general meeting shall be carried by at least two-thirds of the voting power of those present according to tonnage.
- 60. The alteration or new Scheme as the case may be shall not come into force unless and until approved by the Board of Trade and shall then be operative from such date as shall be prescribed by the Board of Trade.

ARBITRATION.

- 61.—(i) Any owner who is aggrieved by any act or omission of the Board or of any other persons in respect of their functions under the Scheme may, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained refer the matter to such arbitrator as may be appointed under the Scheme.
- (ii) No owner shall be entitled to refer any matter to arbitration unless he shall have given notice to the Executive Board and to the other party within the time limited by the Scheme in relation to such matter, such time to be computed from the service on him of the notice of the matter complained of, or in the absence of such notice then from the date on which he first became aware of such matter.
- (iii) The time limited for reference to arbitration shall be as follows:—
 - (a) In respect of a reference under a Class 1 arbitration, two days; and
 - (b) in respect of a reference under a Class
- 2 arbitration, seven days, unless for good cause the Arbitrator shall in any case grant an extension of such time.

- (iv) The Executive Board may from time to time determine and vary the determination of classes of arbitrations to fall within those numbered 1 and 2 hereinbefore referred to and until and failing such determination the following provisions shall apply:—
 - (a) An arbitration in Class 1 means an arbitration in the matter of the fixation or variation of standard tonnage, or of the fixation or variation of the classification of any coal or of a minimum price for any coal or class of coal.
 - (b) An arbitration in Class 2 shall consist of and means such other arbitrations arising out of any other matters under the Scheme in which an owner may have a right of reference to arbitration.
- (v) In exercising any such power of determination, the Executive Board shall, in deciding that any particular class of arbitration shall fall within Class 1, have regard to whether arbitrations in that class are of a nature which ought to be immediately or promptly determined.
- 62.—(i) The Executive Board shall every twelve months or other period determined by them from time to time prepare:
 - (a) a panel containing the names of independent persons suitable in their opinion to be appointed arbitrators under the Scheme,
 - (b) a panel of independent persons suitable in their opinion to act as technical or trade assessors in cases hereinafter mentioned for the purposes of an arbitration under the Scheme.
- (ii) (a) The panel of arbitrators shall be submitted for approval to the President of the Law Society for the time being.
- (b) The panel of assessors shall be submitted for approval to the President of the Institution of Mining Engineers for the time being, and to the President of the Cardiff Incorporated Chamber of Commerce for the time being.
- (iii) Except as otherwise provided in the Scheme and except where otherwise agreed between the parties to the arbitration, only such arbitrators and assessors shall act as such respectively under the Scheme as are named on the panel and who have been approved as aforesaid.
- (iv) The Executive Board may from time to time add names to such panels provided that any additional names shall be subject to the like approval as those on the panel in the first instance.
- (v) The panels aforesaid shall consist, so far as may be practicable of persons who are not financially interested in the ownership or working of any coal mine or concern comprising coal mines in the District, and shall not include any person who is acting in a secretarial or advisory capacity to the Executive Board, and any person who is interested financially or by way of retainer or in like manner in any coal mine or undertaking in respect of which a reference is made to arbitration shall be disqualified from acting as arbitrator or assessor in such reference.

- 63.—(i) In case of any arbitration under Class 1 the arbitrator shall be such of the arbitrators before mentioned as the Board shall select.
- (ii) In case of any arbitration under Class 2 the arbitrator shall be such of the arbitrators before mentioned as may be agreed between the Executive Board and the other party to the reference, or in default of agreement as may be appointed by the President of the Law Society for the time being.
- (iii) For the purpose of arbitrations in Class 1 the Board may—
 - (a) select particular arbitrators to undertake arbitrations arising out of the particular matters defined as coming within Class 1, and so far as practicable all arbitrations on such particular matters shall be taken before the particular arbitrator appointed, and
 - (b) appoint one or more deputies to the particular arbitrator to act in cases where he in unavailable, unwilling or incapacitated from acting, or where in the opinion of the Executive Board owing to the number of or time taken by such arbitrations they could not otherwise be immediately or promptly determined.
- 64. The person referring the matter to arbitration shall within the time hereby specified furnish to the arbitrator and to the Executive Board and the other party to the arbitration a full statement setting out his grounds of complaint, the matters on which he intends to rely and any remedy proposed, that is to say:—
 - .(i) In a reference under Class 1 the time prescribed shall be the said two days after giving notice of reference;
 - (ii) In an arbitration under Class 2 the prescribed time shall be seven days after giving notice of reference;

unless for good cause the arbitrator shall in any case grant an extension of such time.

- 65. The arbitrator shall upon receipt of the statement of complaint give such directions for the conduct of the arbitration as he may think fit and shall fix a day for the hearing of the matter referred to him, and the arbitrator shall give notice in writing of the day so fixed to the complainant and to every other person or body of persons alleged to be responsible as aforesaid.
- 66. Any arbitrator may, if he thinks fit, and shall if any party so desires, sit with a competent technical or trade assessor approved of by the Executive Board from the panel herein mentioned, but any such assessor shall sit in an advisory capacity only.
- 67. An arbitration in Class 1 shall, so far as possible, take place within seven days and an arbitration in Class 2 within fourteen days of the submission of any claim, and the award of the arbitrator shall also, so far as practicable, be sent to the Board and to the parties to the arbitration within, in the case of an arbitration in Class 1, two days, and in the case of an arbitration in Class 2, ten days, of the hearing.
- 68. Pending the award of an arbitrator, on any reference to arbitration under the Scheme, the decision of the Executive Board in the

matter under dispute shall be operative subject to the provisions of clause 46 of the Scheme.

- 69. Where any determination or other decision of the Executive Board is a subject of reference hereunder, the award of the arbitrator shall, unless he otherwise directs, be operative in respect of such determination or other decision as from the date on which the determination or other decision was intended by the Executive Board to be operative.
- 70. The expenses of the Executive Board in connection with any arbitration under the Scheme or under the Central Scheme or of anyone acting on behalf of the Board in respect of whose functions a complaint is made shall be payable out of the District Fund.

DISSOLUTION.

71. In the event of the Scheme ceasing to have effect under Part 1 of the Act, whether owing to the expiration of that part of the Act or to action of the Board of Trade under sub-section (7) of Section 5 of the Act, the Trustees shall collect all moneys due or belonging to the Board and convert into money any property of the Board (including any investments of the District Fund), and after discharging thereout all liabilities of the Board shall distribute the surplus, if any, amongst the owners in the proportion, as nearly as possible, to the total contributions made by each of those owners under clause 48 of the Scheme.

Provided that, if it be agreed to continue the Scheme as a voluntary arrangement it shall be lawful for the Trustees to transfer the property of the Board (including any moneys and investments of the District Fund) to the Trustees under such voluntary arrangement, subject, however, to the payment to those owners who do not enter into the said voluntary arrangement of such sums (if any) as would be payable to them if the Scheme were finally wound up under the provisions of this clause in lieu of being continued as a voluntary arrangement.

- 72. If upon cessation of the Scheme the assets of the Board are insufficient to discharge their liabilities, the owners shall pay to the Trustees such sum as may be necessary to make up the deficiency and a levy calculated so as to provide such sum shall be deemed to have been notified to the owners immediately prior to the Scheme ceasing to have effect, and shall be payable by the owners to the Trustees upon demand, notwithstanding such cessation.
 - 73. The cessation of the Scheme shall not
 - (i) affect the previous operation thereof or of anything duly done or suffered thereunder; or
 - (ii) affect any right, obligation or liability acquired, accrued or incurred thereunder;
 or
 - (iii) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any contravention of or non-compliance with the Scheme; or
 - (iv) affect any legal proceedings or remedy in respect of any such right, obligation, liability or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such legal proceedings or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if the Scheme had not ceased to have effect.

GENERAL.

- 74. All notices required to be given under the Scheme may be served upon an owner at his registered office or principal place of business either personally or by posting the same be prepaid post and if posted shall be deemed to have been received by the owner on the morning of the day following the posting thereof
- 75. All costs, charges and expenses of and in connection with the preparation, submission and approval of the Scheme which are in any way incurred or paid by the persons submitting the same or on their behalf shall be regarded as expenses of the Board and shall be paid out of the District Fund.
- 76.—(i) Subject to the provisions of this clause and except in cases referred to hereunder any owner may if he is dissatisfied with a decision of the Executive Board and within two days of the time limited for reference to arbitration under the Scheme, give notice that he requires a general meeting of owners to consider the matter, and such general meeting shall be convened and a decision given thereon with all convenient speed.
- (ii) The provisions of sub-clause (i) hereof shall not apply in the following cases:
 - (a) Where an owner refers the matter to arbitration.
 - (b) Where, under the provisions of the Scheme or of any rules or regulations to be made hereunder he gives notice of objection to and requires reconsideration of the matter by the Executive Board.
- (iii) Notice of, or if held, proceedings of the general meeting upon the matter in question shall be null and void as against the owner concerned in case he shall refer the matter to arbitration.
- (iv) Pending such general meeting the decision of the Executive Board shall unless otherwise decided by the Board be operative until the general meeting has been held, and the decision given thereon, which decision shall have effect.

THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

The Executive Board.

- 1. Save as may be provided by any rules made by the Executive Board under Clause 3 of this Schedule the Executive Board shall be elected annually from among representatives or associates by the owners in General Meeting, and shall consist of 36 representatives or associates. Provided that the first Board shall consist of 30 persons elected by the owners who are members of the Association and six persons elected by the owners who are not members of the Association. The Board as first elected shall meet if possible immediately after their constitution and at that meeting and for ten days thereafter may transact business notwithstanding any vacancy in their number or that no notice or agenda for the Meeting was or could have been given.
- 2. All members for the time being of the Executive Board shall retire at the Annual General Meeting to be held in the year 1931 and at the Annual General Meeting in each subsequent year, but shall be eligible for re-

- election. The members of the Executive Board so retiring at any Annual General Meeting shall be deemed to continue in office until the close of the Meeting at which they so retire.
- 3. The Executive Board may from time to time make and vary such rules as they shall think fit for the annual election of members of the Executive Board by the owners whether at the Annual General Meeting or otherwise as may be provided by such rules, and also if they think fit whether at the Annual General Meeting or otherwise in such manner as to secure the constitution of an Executive Board representing in fair proportions the various sections of the coal mining industry in the District. Provided that any such rules shall give the owners the same voting rights as on a poll (as set forth in the Second Schedule hereto) and Provided further that any such rules whenever made shall operate only as from the date of the next succeeding Annual General Meeting.
- 4. The Executive Board shall meet together for the dispatch of business, adjourn, and regulate their proceedings as they think fit.
- 5. Ten Members of the Executive Board present at a Meeting thereof shall form a quorum.
- 6. The Executive Board may act notwithstanding any vacancy in their number, but if at any time their number is reduced to less than 15 they may act for the purpose of filling up vacancies in their number or summoning a General Meeting of the Owners but for no other purpose.
- 7. The Executive Board shall from time to time appoint a Chairman to preside at meetings thereof and a Deputy-Chairman to preside in his absence.

The Chairman may be paid such remuneration (if any) out of the District Fund as the Executive Board shall from time to time determine.

- If neither the Chairman nor the Deputy-Chairman are present at a Meeting the members of the Executive Board present shall choose one of their number to act as Chairman of that meeting.
- 8. Voting shall be by show of hands and each member of the Board present shall have one vote, and in case of equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.
- 9. All resolutions passed and acts done by the Executive Board in good faith shall be valid and effective for all purposes notwith-standing that some defect or irregularity may afterwards be found in the constitution of the Executive Board (by reason of the disqualification of any member thereof or otherwise) or in the convening or conduct of or otherwise in relation to any meeting thereof.
- 10. The Executive Board shall cause a Minute Book to be kept in which proper minutes shall be entered of their proceedings and of all resolutions passed at the said meetings. An entry in the Minute Book of any resolution when signed by the Chairman or Deputy-Chairman or other member of the Executive Board who presided at the meeting confirming the minutes shall be conclusive

evidence of the terms of such resolution and that the same was duly passed by the majority stated in such entry.

- 1d. Any member of the Executive Board shall vacate office:—
 - (i) If he is found lunatic or becomes of unsound mind;
 - (ii) If he is adjudged bankrupt or enters into any composition or arrangement with his creditors:
 - (iii) If he ceases for any reason to be a representative or associate;
 - (iv) If he is requested to retire from office by a notice in writing signed by not less than four-fifths of the other members of the Board:

Provided that sub-clause (iii) of this clause shall not apply to a member of the Executive Board as first elected who is not at the time of his election a representative or associate, and Provided further that any casual vacancy arising from the operation of the sub-clause (iv) hereof shall be filled by the owners in general meeting.

- 12. Any casual vacancy occurring on the Board other than one arising under sub-clause (iv) of the last preceding Clause No. 11, may be filled by members of the Board, but any person so appointed shall retire with the elected members at the end of their term of office. Provided that in filling any casual vacancy on the Board as first elected regard shall be had to whether the member whose place is being filled was appointed by the Association or by the owners who are not members of the Association.
- 13. The expenses of the Board and any committees and the salaries of any officers of the Board, including such remuneration (if any) of the Chairman of the Board, shall be payable out of the District Fund.

THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

General Meetings.

- 1. A General Meeting of all the owners in the district shall be convened by Evan Williams of Glyndwr Pontardulais in the County of Glamorgan Esquire, William North Lewis of Lisvane in the County of Glamorgan Esquire, Thomas Evans of Craig-y-Parc Pentyrch in the County of Glamorgan Esquire, and Sir David Richard Llewellyn of the Court St. Fagans in the County of Glamorgan Baronet, or any two of them not later than ten days after the date on which the Scheme comes into force for the purpose of transacting any business that may be necessary under the Scheme.
- 2. A meeting of all the owners who may not be members of the Association shall also be convened within the aforesaid time by Sir Clifford J. Cory of Llantarnam Abbey near Newport Baronet, Thomas Evans of Craig-y-Parc Pentyrch in the County of Glamorgan Esquire, and William North Lewis of Lisvane in the County of Glamorgan Esquire, which meeting shall if practicable he held upon the same day as and prior to the General Meeting first before prescribed. The meeting shall be

- held for the purpose of electing six members to represent such owners upon the first Executive Board. The decision of the conveners of the meeting or of a majority of them as to the election of any person or as to the votes given in his favour or upon any matter shall be final and conclusive.
- 3. A General Meeting of the owners shall be held in the year 1931 and in each subsequent year at intervals of approximately twelve months which in addition to any other business to be transacted shall (unless rules are made by the Executive Board for some other method of election as mentioned in the First Schedule) elect the Executive Board to replace that retiring at the meeting.
- 4. General Meetings may if the Executive Board think fit and shall if the Board is required in writing to do so by not less than seven owners be convened for any necessary or desirable purpose, and General Meetings shall also be convened when required under the Scheme.
- If the Board fail within 14 days to convene a meeting when required to do so, then any signatories to the requisition or any owner, if it be the case of fulfilling any statutory obligation under the Scheme, may themselves convene a meeting.
- 5. The election of representatives of all the owners of coal mines in the district to serve upon the Central Council and of any substitutes for such representatives shall be made at a general meeting. Provided that the general meeting shall only elect:
 - (i) such persons as are already members of the Executive Board or have been elected as members of the Executive Board to serve for any part of the next ensuing year which may run concurrently with the period of office of representatives of the Central Council for which the election is held, and
 - (ii) if thought fit such officer of the Executive Board as may be decided.
- 6. At least four days' notice in writing of every General Meeting stating the time, the date and the place of the meeting shall be sent by the Secretary or other person convening the meeting to each owner and such notice shall also state the general nature of the business to be transacted at the meeting, but the accidental omission to give notice to or the non-receipt of the notice by any owner shall not invalidate the proceedings at a General Meeting.
- 7. The expenses of all General Meetings shall be regarded as expenses of the Board and shall be paid out of the District Fund.
- 8. The owners shall at the first and each subsequent General Meeting elect a Chairman and Deputy-Chairman who shall hold office until the next following Annual General Meeting when they shall retire but shall be eligible for re-election. The Chairman and in his absence the Deputy-Chairman shall preside at all General Meetings of the owners and in the event of an equality of votes shall have a second or casting vote on a show of hands. In the absence of the Chairman and Deputy-Chairman, the owners present may appoint a.

Chairman for that meeting who shall preside thereat and have a second or casting vote.

- 9. The attendance and voting of owners at General Meetings shall be effected through their representatives or associates, and no person not being either a representative or an associate shall be entitled to attend or vote at any General Meeting. Provided that no associate shall be entitled to attend or vote at any meeting at which the same owner's representative is present. Provided also that for the first general meeting one person authorised by an owner may attend and vote thereat on his behalf notwithstanding that he may not be a formally appointed representative or associate.
- 10. Twenty owners present by their representatives or associates shall form a quorum at any meeting, except where otherwise provided in the Scheme.
- 11.—(i) On a show of hands every owner present shall have one vote.
- (ii) On a poll every owner shall have one vote for the first 1,000 tons of his standard tonnage for the quarter immediately preceding that in which the meeting is held and one further vote for each 1,000 tons over and above the first 1,000 tons: Provided that any owner whose standard tonnage aforesaid was less than 1,000 tons shall have one vote and Provided further that for the purpose of the first General Meeting each owner's output for the six months ending 31st December 1929 shall be taken.
- (iii) Votes at General Meetings may be given personally or by special proxy.
- 12.—(i) Voting shall in the first instance be by show of hands; but
- (ii) Any owner present may chafflenge the result of such voting, in which case a poll by tonnage vote shall be taken as herein provided.
- (iii) A resolution shall, unless otherwise provided in the Scheme, be duly passed if carried by a simple majority of the owners present at the meeting on a show of hands or if a poll is demanded on a poll.
- 13. If a poll is required or demanded upon the election of a Chairman or upon a question of adjournment or upon any matter required to be passed by tonnage vote it shall be taken forthwith. A poll demanded upon any other question shall be taken at such time and in such manner as the Chairman of the meeting directs. The result of the poll shall be deemed to be the resolution of the meeting at which the poll was demanded.
- 14. The decision of the Chairman as to the result of the voting on any resolution shall be final.
- 15. If a quorum is not present at any meeting within half an hour after the time appointed for holding the same the meeting shall stand adjourned until such reasonable time as the Chairman may decide and (except for the purposes of a special majority required under the provisions of the Scheme) the owners actually present at such adjourned meeting shall form a quorum.

16. A proper minute book of proceedings at General Meetings shall be kept by the Secretary of the Executive Board and all resolutions shall be entered therein. The minutes of each meeting shall be signed by the Chairman of the meeting at which they are confirmed and such signature shall be sufficient evidence of their accuracy.

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in consideration of the Benefaction which has been duly secured for the permanent spiritual benefit of each of the Parishes and Benefices whereof the names and the names of the Counties and Dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto which Benefaction is described in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, and in respect of which Benefaction we have undertaken to pay out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent of the Benefice the yearly sum stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice subject to the conditions hereinafter stated in respect to our Grant hereinafter made, do hereby, in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and eleven, section five, Grant subject as hereinafter mentioned, out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, one yearly sum or stipend

of the amount stated in the sixth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, such yearly sum or stipend to be calculated as from the date stated in the seventh column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, and to be payable in four equal portions on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in each and every year. Provided always that such yearly sum or stipend or any quarterly portion thereof shall be payable only upon the production to us on or after each of the said last mentioned quarterly days of payment of a certificate (in such form as may be required by us) under the hand of the Bishop of the Diocese in which the Benefice is situate certifying that during the quarter then ended, there has been employed within the Parish of the Benefice and duly licensed by such Bishop such number of Assistant Curates as is stated in the eighth column of the said Schedule, and that the last in order of such number of Assistant Curates has been in receipt of a stipend after a rate of not less than one hundred and twenty pounds per annum.

Provided also that the yearly sum or stipend so granted shall continue payable as aforesaid so long only as may to us appear to be expedient under the circumstances from time to time affecting the Parish and Benefice in favour of which it is granted. Provided further that such yearly sum or stipend is granted upon and is payable only subject to satisfaction of the further conditions (if any) stated with reference thereto at the foot of the

said Schedule. Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall only operate as one single Grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.
