

APPOINTMENT OF A STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

*By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."*

I, the undersigned, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby APPOINT a Standing for Hackney Carriages at the following place, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the Boundaries for the same, viz. :—

AT HAMMERSMITH ROAD,

Five Hackney Carriages :

On the North side of roadway, commencing at the lamp standard immediately West of the main entrance to Empire Hall (Olympia) and extending Westward, by kerb, as far as necessary for five carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the East.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

VARIATION AND FIXING OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES IN THE BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE IN GREAT BRITAIN.

The Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain) have issued Notices M (46) and M (47) dated 31st October, 1930, setting out respectively Minimum Time-Rates of Wages as varied and Minimum Piece-Rates of Wages as fixed and varied by them and confirmed by Order of the Minister of Labour to take effect as from 3rd November, 1930.
