

persons who have been so employed, shall not be less in value than the price so determined;

(b) To form Central and Sectional Sale Committees for the purpose of the determination of classes of coal and of minimum prices for each such class;

(c) To elect Representatives from the Sectional Sale Committees (in the manner hereinafter set forth) to serve upon the Central Sale Committee hereinafter provided for and upon any other Central Sale Committee which may hereafter be set up by the Executive Board in pursuance of the objects of these Regulations;

(d) Generally to give effect to the provisions of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, relative to the classification of coal and the determination of minimum prices of coal.

2. MANAGEMENT.

Management of affairs under these Regulations.

These Regulations shall be administered by the Executive Board constituted under the Scheme of which this Schedule forms part.

3. SECTIONAL SALE COMMITTEES.

Appointment of Sectional Sale Committees.

(a) The Coalowners in each Section shall constitute a Committee (hereinafter referred to as "the Sectional Sale Committee") consisting of one Representative appointed by each Coalowner in such Section. Any Coalowner who is an individual may appoint himself as the representative for the purposes of this Clause. Each Coalowner appointing a Representative shall notify in writing to the Secretary of the Section the name and address and description of such Representative. Each Coalowner shall also be entitled to appoint a Substitute Representative who may attend any meeting of the Sectional Sale Committee in the absence of the appointed Representative without notice; but the name and address and description of such Substitute Representative shall be notified in writing to the Secretary of the Section. The place of any representative or substitute representative withdrawn or retiring from the Committee or dying shall be filled by the Coalowner who appointed him;

(b) Each Sectional Sale Committee shall (subject to the approval of the Executive Board) be authorised to appoint from their own number such Sub-Committees as they deem necessary to carry out the duties and functions referred to in Clause 4 of these Regulations.

4. FUNCTIONS OF SECTIONAL SALE COMMITTEES.

The functions of each Sectional Sale Committee shall be:—

(a) To appoint Representatives upon the Central Sale Committee as hereinafter provided;

(b) To recommend to the Central Sale Committee the class to which any coal produced in the Section shall belong for any purpose;

(c) To recommend to the Central Sale Committee the price below which every class of coal produced in the Section may not be sold or supplied by Owners of coal mines in the Section; and

(d) To confer with the Central Sale Committee and the other Sectional Sale Committees for the purpose of co-ordinating the duties and functions set out in this Clause in respect of the determination of classes of coal and minimum prices therefor.

5. VOTING.

(a) Voting at Meetings of Sectional Sale Committees shall be by show of hands and the Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote as a Member of the Committee. A declaration by the Chairman that a Resolution has been carried or lost shall be conclusive evidence of the fact.

Election of Chairman.

(b) Each Sectional Sale Committee shall elect a Chairman from their own number who shall remain in office until the 30th day of April, 1931. Thereafter a Chairman shall be elected annually and a retiring Chairman shall be eligible for re-election.

(c) The Secretary of the Section appointed under Clause 8 of the Scheme shall act as Secretary of the Sectional Sale Committee in that Section, and shall keep a minute book of the proceedings at meetings of the Sectional Sale Committee.

6. CENTRAL SALE COMMITTEE.

Appointment of Central Sale Committee.

(a) There shall be formed by appointment from each Sectional Sale Committee (in the manner in this Clause provided) a Committee to be known as the Central Sale Committee.

(b) The Central Sale Committee shall consist of Representatives appointed by each Sectional Sale Committee in the following manner that is to say:—

One Representative from each Sectional Sale Committee and one additional Representative in respect of every five million tons of the total output of the Coalowners of the Section in the twelve months ended on the 31st day of March, 1928. Where there shall be a balance of output in excess of such five million tons or a multiple thereof one further additional Representative shall be appointed in respect of such excess:

Provided that each Sectional Sale Committee shall be entitled to not less than two Representatives.

(c) Each Sectional Sale Committee when appointing Representatives upon the Central Sale Committee shall also appoint for each Representative a Substitute Representative to attend meetings of the Central Sale Committee in the absence of any such Representative and the appointment of such Substitute Representatives shall be made in the manner and upon the basis in this Clause defined for the appointment of Representatives.

(d) On the appointment of Representatives and Substitute Representatives on the Central Sale Committee after the first and subsequent retirements the appointment shall take place in the following manner that is to say:—

One Representative and Substitute Representative from each Sectional Sale Committee and one additional Representative and Substitute Representative in respect of each five million tons of annual standard tonnage of coal as fixed for the time being under Clause
