ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport, after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the power conferred upon him by Part II of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, to make Regulations relating to Third Party Insurance in respect of Motor Vehicles.

3rd November	Extending the period of quarantine of a dog, the property of Mrs. R. C. Arbery.
3rd November	Extending the period of quarantine of two dogs, the property of Major F. C. Sampson.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD NOVEMBER, 1930.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Authorisation of Landing of Animals for
Exceptional Purposes.*

1. The landing of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto, which are intended

for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animals described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animals as aforesaid shall be landed except with the licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animals have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

*Regulations applicable to the Animals on
Landing.*

4.—(1) The animals on being landed, shall forthwith be moved under the supervision of an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animals shall be kept separate from all other animals, and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

(2) The animals shall not be removed from the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than under the authority of the licence from an Inspector of the Ministry required under Article 3 (1) (*Fifth*) of the foreign Animals (Quarantine) Order of 1896.

(3) A copy of every licence authorising the movement of any animal described in the First Schedule hereto shall be forwarded to the Ministry by the Inspector who grants the licence.

Revocation of certain Order.

5. The Order of the Minister (No. 4844) dated the 28th October, 1930, relating to the landing of certain animals at the port of Liverpool is hereby revoked.

Six antelopes, four deer, and two gazelles, the property of Mr. H. E. Rogers, brought from Calcutta, and to be landed in the Port of Liverpool from the steamship "Craftsmen" on or before the twenty-second day of November, nineteen hundred and thirty.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Stable (No. 1) in the enclosed yard and in the occupation of Mr. H. E. Rogers, at "Rosemont," Mossley Hill, in the city and county borough of Liverpool.
