The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 8th day of October, 1930 (C.W. 8220/30), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council of the 9th November, 1920, to provide for the payment of Command Money to Lieutenant-Colonels or Majors of the Royal Marines who are placed in independent command of Royal Marine Battalions detached from their Divisions and Depot:

"And whereas certain other appointments for Officers of those ranks arise, from time

to time, in which the responsibilities are equivalent to those entailed by the independent command of a Royal Marine Battalion and for which we consider there is equal justification for the payment of Command Money:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize, with effect from the 8th June, 1930, the payment of Command Money, at the rates approved from time to time for Lieutenant Colonels and Majors R.M. commanding R.M. Battalions, to Officers of those ranks when placed in command of other independent units, which, though not organized in the form of a Battalion, approach the strength of a Battalion and entail responsibilities analogous to those involved in the command of a Battalion.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have indicated their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Act, 1921, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and various Orders amending the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order, as amended, should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following paragraph shall be added to Article 1 of the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921 (as amended):—

“(xxx) It shall be lawful for the Clearing Office or the Administrator to deduct from any sum payable by the Clearing Office or Administrator to a creditor, or any other person, such commission not exceeding 2½ per cent. of the total amount paid or payable, as may be fixed by the Clearing Office or Administrator.”

2. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) (Amendment) Order, 1930, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1924, and this Order may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1930.

WHEREAS by section six of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that His Majesty may by

Order in Council make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to any of His Majesty's Dominions other than the Irish Free State as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of the establishment of the Irish Free State:

And whereas by Section 25, sub-section (1) of the Copyright Act, 1911, it is enacted that the said Act, except such of the provisions thereof as are expressly restricted to the United Kingdom, shall extend throughout His Majesty's Dominions: Provided that it shall not extend to a self-governing dominion unless declared by the Legislature of that dominion to be in force therein either without any modifications or additions or with such modifications and additions relating exclusively to procedure and remedies, or necessary to adapt the said Act to the circumstances of the dominion as may be enacted by such Legislature:

And whereas by Section 35 sub-section (1) of the said Act it is also enacted that “Self-governing dominion” means the Dominion of Canada, the Commonwealth of Australia, the Dominion of New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, and Newfoundland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The Irish Free State shall be deemed to be a self-governing dominion for the purposes of the Copyright Act, 1911, as though in Section 35 thereof the Irish Free State were included between the Union of South Africa and Newfoundland.

WHEREAS by Section 26, subsection (3) of the Copyright Act, 1911, it is provided that if His Majesty in Council is satisfied that the law of a self-governing Dominion to which the said Act does not extend provides adequate protection within the Dominion for the works (whether published or unpublished) of authors who at the time of the making of the work were British subjects resident elsewhere than in that Dominion, His Majesty in Council may, for the purpose of giving reciprocal protection, direct that the said Act, except such parts (if any) thereof as may be specified in the Order and subject to any conditions contained therein, shall, within the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends, apply to works the authors whereof were, at the time of the making of the work, resident within the first-mentioned Dominion, and to works first published in that Dominion:

And whereas by Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 27th day of *October*, 1930, it is provided that the Irish Free State is to be

deemed to be a self-governing Dominion for the purposes of the Copyright Act, 1911:

And whereas His Majesty in Council is satisfied that the law of the Irish Free State (that is to say, the Industrial and Commercial Property (Protection) Act, 1927, Number 16 of 1927, the Industrial and Commercial Property (Protection) (Amendment) Act, 1929, Number 13 of 1929, and an Order of the Governor General in Council thereunder entitled the Copyright (United Kingdom and British Dominions) Order, 1930) provides adequate protection for the works (whether published or unpublished) of authors who at the time of the making of the works were British subjects resident in the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which this Order applies:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) The Copyright Act, 1911, including the provisions as to existing works, shall subject to the provisions of the said Act and of this Order apply—

(a) to works first published in the Irish Free State in like manner as if they were first published within the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends.

(b) to unpublished works of authors who were at the time of the making of the works resident within the Irish Free State.

Provided that in the case of any literary or dramatic works in the Irish language, the right after the expiration of ten years from the date of first publication of the work or of the last instalment of the work to prevent the production, reproduction or publication of any translation in the English language of the work shall be conditional upon the publication before the expiration of the above mentioned period and within the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which this Order applies of an authorised translation of the work in the English language.

(2) This Order shall apply to all the parts of His Majesty's Dominions, including any territories under His Majesty's protection, to which the Copyright Act, 1911, extends, except to self-governing Dominions.

(3) This Order shall be construed as if it formed part of the Copyright Act, 1911.

(4) This Order may be cited as the Copyright (Irish Free State) Order, 1930.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Harold Ernest, Lord Bishop of Newcastle, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, in the following terms:—

"We, the Right Reverend Harold Ernest by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Newcastle, do in pursuance of an Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her late

Majesty Queen Victoria, Cap. 106, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the County of Northumberland and Diocese of Newcastle the Rectory of Bothal the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 3,575.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Bothal is at present £1,200.

"The Patronage of the said Rectory is vested in His Grace The Duke of Portland and the Reverend Thomas Pears Gordon Forman, M.A., is the present Rector thereof.

"2. There is in the same County and Diocese the perpetual curacy and titular Vicarage of Longhirst the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 427.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Longhirst is at present £300.

"The Patronage of the said perpetual curacy and titular Vicarage is vested in Colonel The Honourable Hugh Edward Joicey and the Reverend Stanley Claude Bryson, B.A., is the present vicar thereof.

"3. It appears to us that under the provisions of the said Act 1 and 2 Victoria Chapter 106 and of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign Chapter 49 the following alterations in the contents and boundaries of the above mentioned Parishes may advantageously be made.

"The separation of certain portions of the Parish of Bothal hereinafter described and the annexation of the same to the Parish of Longhirst.

"4. Pursuant to the directions contained in the said 26th section of the first mentioned Act of Parliament, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing such portions above referred to and the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereupon in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Tithe Rentcharges and other ecclesiastical dues and payments and in respect of Patronage may be made with justice to all parties interested.

"And we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith we request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents aforesaid by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate those portions of the Parish of Bothal in the County of Northumberland and Diocese of Newcastle which comprise the Townships of Causey Park, Earsdon Forest, Earsdon, Tritlington, Fenrother, Cockle Park and Hebburn all of which form the Chapelry of St. Cuthbert, Hebburn; together with the Township of Old Moor, and more particularly described in the First Schedule hereto, and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Longhirst in the same County and Diocese.

"From and after the passing of any Order in Council carrying this Scheme into effect the Incumbent of the said Parish of Longhirst

shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said townships now part of the Parish of Bothal and proposed to be annexed to the Parish of Longhirst, and the fees for marriages, churchings and burials and other ecclesiastical dues, offerings and emoluments arising from the said townships shall thenceforth belong to the Incumbent of the said Parish of Longhirst.

"That the Patronage or right of nomination of a minister to serve the enlarged Parish of Longhirst shall remain vested in the present Patron of Longhirst.

"That the curate's house at Priestbridge situate in the said Township of Tritlington do remain as part of the property of the said Benefice of Bothal.

"That the endowment particulars of which are entered in the second Schedule hereto shall from and after the date of the Scheme taking effect be separated from the endowment of the said Parish of Bothal and shall belong to and become part of the endowment for the Minister of the said proposed enlarged Parish of Longhirst.

"That no alteration shall be made as to the Patronage of the said Parish of Bothal.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE above referred to.

"All those portions of the Parish of Bothal in the County of Northumberland and Diocese of Newcastle, comprised within the Townships or Civil Parishes of Causey Park, Earsdon Forest, Earsdon, Tritlington, Fenrother, Cockle Park and Hebburn, which form the Chapelry of St. Cuthbert, Hebburn, together with the Township or Civil Parish of Old Moor, the boundaries of which townships and Chapelry are well known and defined.

CORONERS (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1926.

ORDER FOR THE ALTERATION OF CORONERS' DISTRICTS.

Whereas by an Order made by His Majesty the King in Council on the fourteenth day of May, 1912, under the provisions of the Local Government Act, 1888, and in manner provided by law, that is to say, in accordance with the provisions of the Coroners Act, 1844, the County of London was divided for the purposes of the last-mentioned Act into seven districts namely, the Eastern Coroner's District, the North-Eastern Coroner's District, the Central Coroner's District, the Western Coroner's District, the Southern Coroner's District, the South-Western Coroner's District and the South-Eastern Coroner's District:

And whereas it is provided by Section 4 of the Coroner's (Amendment) Act, 1926, that the right of any person having power to appoint a Franchise Coroner shall cease on the next vacancy in the Office which occurs after the passing of the Act and that for all purposes relating to Coroners the area in which the Franchise Coroner had jurisdiction shall thereupon, if and so far as it is not situated in a Borough the Council of which have power to appoint a Borough Coroner, be merged in the County:

And whereas on the first day of November, 1930, vacancies occurred in the Offices of Franchise Coroner for the Duchy of Lancaster Liberty (Clapham portion), of Franchise Coroner for the Duchy of Lancaster (Savoy portion) and of Franchise Coroner for Westminster City and Liberty:

And whereas the London County Council has pursuant to section 12 of the Act of 1926 above recited, and to the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, submitted to the Secretary of State a draft Order providing for

the alteration of the existing division of the County of London, into coroners' districts so as to reduce the number of such districts to six:

Now, therefore, I, the undersigned, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, in pursuance of the power vested in me by section 12 of the Act of 1926 above recited, do hereby order that the existing division of the County of London into coroners' districts shall be altered and that the said districts shall be named and constituted as set out in the Schedule hereto and substituted for the existing districts.

This Order shall come into operation forthwith.

(TRAMWAYS ABANDONMENT.)

ORDER BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

WHEREAS by Section 83 of the Accrington Corporation Act, 1928 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1928") the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Accrington acting by the Council (therein and hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") were authorised to provide and maintain and run omnibuses within the Borough and on other routes therein mentioned.

And whereas it is enacted in Section 80 of the Act of 1928 *inter alia* as follows:—

"(1) At any time after the passing of this Act the Minister of Transport may by order authorise or require the Corporation to abandon or discontinue temporarily or permanently any of the Corporation tramways along the route of which the Corporation have provided and equipped or are about to provide and equip trolley vehicles or have provided omnibuses under the provisions of this Act or any Provisional Order made thereunder.

"(3) Any order made under the provisions of this section may as from such date as may be specified therein provide for the cesser of all or any of the powers liabilities duties or obligations conferred or imposed upon the Corporation by any Act or Order relating to any tramway to be abandoned or discontinued in pursuance of such order."

And whereas in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Section 83 the Corporation have provided omnibuses along the routes of the tramways hereinafter described, authorised by the Accrington Corporation Tramways Act, 1882, and the Accrington Corporation Act, 1905; that is to say:—

Tramway No. 1 (part of) from the junction of Manchester Road with the boundary of the borough of Haslingden along Manchester Road and Abbey Street to the junction of Abbey Street and Peel Street;

Tramway No. 6 (part of) from Abbey Street near to the junction of Blackburn Road with Abbey Street along Blackburn Road to the junction of Blackburn Road and Church Street.

And whereas the Corporation have applied to the Minister of Transport (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") for an Order to authorise the permanent discontinuance and abandonment by them of the tramways hereinbefore described.

Now therefore the Minister in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 80 of the Act of 1928 and of any and every other power thereunto him enabling hereby orders as follows:—
