The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 4th day of November, 1930, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

### UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, 4TH NOVEMBER, 1930.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend cl. 5 of Sectio II of Titulus II of the Statutes of the University of Oxford concerning the admission of Forest Service Students and others to matriculation to conform with an amendment of the Statute concerning Forest Service Students which was approved by Convocation on the sixteenth day of February, 1926, Now THE SAID UNIVERSITY, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, ENACTS, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, AS FOLLOWS.

In Statt. Tit. II. Sect. II. cl. 5 (Statuta, ed. 1930, p. 4) the word "Indian" shall be struck out and the word "Imperial" shall be substituted.

THE SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES (EXEMPTION)
No. 3 ORDER, 1930, DATED 13TH NOVEMBER,
1930, MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 10
OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5,
c. 22).

Whereas it is provided by sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, c. 22) that the Treasury may by Order exempt from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921 (11 & 12 Geo. 5, c. 47) as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for such period as may be specified in the Order, any article in respect of which the Board of Trade are satisfied on a representation made by a consumer of that article that the article is not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of the article for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that the article will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities.

And whereas, by the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 3 Order, 1929 (S.R. & O. 1929, No. 643), the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 4 Order, 1929 (S.R. &

O. 1929, No. 1024), the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 1 Order, 1930 (S.R. & O. 1930, No. 205), made by the Treasury the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order were *inter alia*, exempted from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for a period ending on the 31st December, 1930.

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied on representations by consumers of the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order that these articles are not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of these articles for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that these articles will, within a reasonable period, be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities.

Now therefore we, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the powers conferred on us by the said Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, and of all other powers enabling us in that Behalf, hereby order as follows:—

1. The articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order shall continue to be exempt from the duty imposed by Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, from the expiration of the period prescribed by the three above mentioned Orders until the 31st day of December, 1931, inclusive.

2. This Order may be cited as the Safeguarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 3

Order, 1930.

#### APPOINTMENT.

AT PEMBRIDGE SQUARE, (SOUTH SIDE) BAYSWATER.

Four Hackney Carriages:

On the North side of roadway, commencing at a point in line with the passage between Nos. 4 and 5, Pembridge Square and extending Eastward, by kerb of garden enclosure, as far as necessary for four carriages.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.
