At Chittagong, Bengal, on the night of the 18th/19th April, 1930, raids were simultaneously made on the armouries and the telephone exchange, the object being to seize all available arms and ammunition, destroy communications and terrorize the population.

Whilst the raiders were engaged in burning the magazine at the police armoury, Sergeant Barraclough, of the Assam-Bengal Railway Battalion, who is an electrical engineer at the Pahartali Power House, was called out, took a Lewis Gun and ammunition and accompanied the Superintendent of Police in order to try and get in contact with the raiders. Sergeant Barraclough brought the Lewis Gun into action from a distance of about 200 yards, and although heavily fired on continued to work the gun and eventually dispersed the raiders who fled into the jungle.

THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (FEES) AMENDMENT ORDER, 1930, DATED NOVEMBER 24, 1930, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1894 (57 & 58 VICT. c. 60), AS AMENDED BY THE FEES (INCREASE) ACT, 1923 (13 & 14 GEO. 5. c. 4).

1. In pursuance of the powers conferred on the Board of Trade by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60) as amended by the Fees (Increase) Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5. c. 4), and the Economy (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 9), and of any other power in that behalf, the Board hereby direct that the reduction of 16½ per cent. allowed under the Merchant Shipping (Fees) Amendment Order, 1929, (a) on the fees therein specified shall be cancelled.

2. The Merchant Shipping (Fees) Amendment Order, 1929, is accordingly hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Fees) Amendment Order, 1930, and shall take effect as from the 1st day of December, 1930.

COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

THE SCOTTISH DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930, DATED NOVEMBER 24, 1930, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SUB-SECTION (3) OF SECTION 1 OF THE COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

In accordance with the requirements of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of Sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the Act, hereby make the following Scheme.

Designation.

1. This Scheme may be cited as the SCOTTISH DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930, and is hereinafter throughout referred to as "The Scheme," which expression shall include any amendment of the Scheme for the time being in force.

Meaning of Terms.

2. In the construction of the Scheme the following words and expressions shall have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them unless there be something in the context inconsistent therewith:—

"The Act" means the Coal Mines Act, 1930;

"The Central Scheme" means the Central (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, including any amendment thereof for the time being in force;

"The Central Council" means the Council constituted under the Central Scheme;

"The Board" means the Executive Board nominated to administer the Scheme;

"The Secretary" means the Secretary to the Board;

"The Lanarkshire Area" includes Lanarkshire, Stirlingshire, Linlithgowshire, Dumbartonshire and Renfrewshire;

"The Fife Area" includes Fife, Clackmannan and Sutherlandshire;

"The Lothians Area" includes Mid and East Lothian and Peeblesshire, and

"The Ayrshire Area" includes Ayrshire, Dumfriesshire and Argyllshire;

The words "Class" in relation to coal, "Coal," "Disposal," "District," "Functions," "Output," "District Allocation," have the meanings respectively assigned to them by the Act, and they are hereby incorporated as applicable to the Scheme with particular reference to the District of Scotland;

"Coal Mine" means any mine or open working in Scotland where the getting of coal is the principal object of the mining or quarrying operations;

"District Fund" means the District Fund constituted by and established under the Scheme;

"Owner" means the Owner, as defined in the Coal Mines Act, 1911, of any coal mine;

"Trustees" means the persons for the time being appointed under the provisions of the Scheme to be Trustees for the Board;

"Undertaking" means in the case of a colliery undertaking any undertaking comprising two or more coal mines belonging to the same Owner.

Object and Scope of the Scheme.

3. The Scheme is constituted for the purpose of regulating the production, supply and sale of coal by the Owners, and the production of coal and the supply and sale of coal by them shall be regulated by the provisions of the Scheme.

Commencement and Duration of the Scheme.

4. The Scheme shall come into force on the 24th day of November, 1930, and shall remain in force until the expiration of Part I. of the Act, unless in the meantime,

(a) A new Scheme shall be substituted in manner hereafter provided by the Scheme, or

(b) The Board of Trade shall direct in pursuance of Sub-section (7) of Section 5 of the Act that the Scheme shall cease to have effect.

Management and Administration.

5.—(i) The Scheme shall be administered by an Executive Board composed of twenty persons nominated from time to time by the Board of Trade in accordance with the provisions of Sub-section (1) of Section 3 of the Act, and the Board of Trade, after consultation with the Associations of Coal Owners for the several areas in Scotland hereby nominate the following persons to be the members of the Board in the first instance, that is to say:—

Messrs. Matthew Brown, Robert W. Brown, Robert Forrester, Thomas G. Hardie, Simon P. Hodge, and Andrew K. McCosh, Sir Adam Nimmo, K.B.E., Messrs. Peter M. Ritchie and William H. Telfer, representing the Coal Owners in the Lanarkshire Area.

Mr. C. Augustus Carlow, Captain Michael Wemyss, Messrs. Robert Storie, William Dowie and James Morton, representing the Coal Owners in the Fife Area.

Messrs. John Clark, James C. Murray and Robert Ramsay, representing the Coal Owners in the Lothians Area.

Messrs. Robert L. Angus, Duncan MacGregor and William Dalrymple, representing the Coal Owners in the Ayrshire Area.

(ii) The Board of Trade hereby, after the like consultation, further nominate the following persons to act as substitute members for the respective Areas and the persons so nominated are hereby empowered to act temporarily in place of members of their Area who are unable to attend a meeting or who at any time are otherwise unable to perform their duties as members of the Board, that is to say:—

Messrs. George Affleck, John P. Heslin, Walter Hogg, William Jarvie, Edmund D. Logan, John Morton, John M. Mitchell, Andrew Telfer and Thomas H. Thorneycroft,

representing the Coal Owners in the Lan-
arkshire Area.

Messrs. Charles C. Reid, Richard Kirkby,
John Paul, Henry M. Brownlie and William
Smith, representing the Coal Owners in the
Fife Area.

Messrs. James Jack, James A. Philips and
Archibald Shearer Paul, representing the
Coal Owners in the Lothians Area.

Messrs. James W. Tweedie, Hugh Shaw
Dunn and William A. Waddell, representing
the Coal Owners in the Ayrshire Area.

(iii) Subject to the right of any member or
substitute member to resign his appointment
the Board (including the substitute members)
shall remain in office for a period of twelve
months, at the end of which period they shall
retire; but retiring members and substitute
members of the Board shall be eligible for re-
nomination.

6. Any casual vacancy occurring on the
Board may be filled by a person nominated by
the Board of Trade, after consultation with
the Association of Coal Owners concerned, in
such manner as shall maintain the proportion-
ate representation of Areas as aforesaid, and
the Board of Trade may from time to time
recall the nomination of any member or sub-
stitute member of the Board and nominate,
after consultation as aforesaid, another person
in his place.

7. Subject to the provisions of the Scheme,
the Board shall have power to do all things
necessary to discharge its functions under the
Scheme to the best advantage.

*Appointment of Central Council Repre-
sentatives.*

8. The Board shall from time to time and
for such period as they may determine appoint
representatives and substitute representatives
of the Owners on the Central Council, who
shall be members or officials of the Board, or
shall have been nominated as members of the
Board to serve for any part of the next ensu-
ing period of appointment which may run con-
currently with the period of office of repre-
sentatives of the Central Council for which
the appointments are made, and shall be
representative of each of the said four Areas
as hereinbefore defined. Provided that such
representation of Areas shall, after one repre-
sentative and substitute have been appointed
for each Area, be as nearly as may be
practicable proportionate to the representation
of the Areas on the Board as before mentioned.

Meetings of the Board.

9. The Board shall meet and regulate its
meetings as it may think fit, and the Secre-
tary shall convene a meeting whenever re-
quested to do so by the Chairman or by any
two Members of the Board. In the case of a
meeting called at the request of Members of
the Board, the same shall be held within ten
days of the receipt of the request, and the
notice convening the meeting shall state the
general nature of the business for which the
meeting has been convened.

10. Unless shorter notice shall be unavoid-
ably necessary, seven clear days' notice shall
be given specifying the place, date and hour
of a Meeting of the Board.

11. The Board shall appoint a Chairman
and Vice-Chairmen from its own number, and

a Secretary, Treasurer, Auditors and such
other officials at such remuneration as it may
see fit. In the absence of the Chairman and
Vice-Chairmen, the Board may appoint a
Chairman for the meeting from the members
present thereat.

12. Ten members of the Board shall be a
quorum. Each member on a Division shall
have one vote, and the Chairman of the meet-
ing shall, in the case of an equality of votes
have a casting vote as well as a deliberative
vote, provided that if at any meeting of the
Board a quorum is not present within half an
hour after the time appointed for holding the
meeting, the Chairman of the meeting may
adjourn the same until such reasonable time
as he may decide, being not less than three
days nor more than seven days later, and at
the adjourned meeting of which notice shall
be given the members of the Board actually
present shall form a quorum.

13. The Board may appoint Committees of
its own members or other persons, and may
delegate to such Committees such of its
powers as it may think fit. All decisions of
Committees shall be reported to and be subject
to review by the Board.

14. Minutes of proceedings at Meetings of
the Board and of Committees shall be kept in
regular form and the signature thereto of the
Chairman of the Meeting at which the Minutes
are approved shall be sufficient evidence of
their accuracy.

General Meetings of the Owners.

15. The Board may, if it so decide, act in
regard to any of its functions under the
Scheme in consultation with the Owners and
may take into account any recommendation
of the Owners duly authorised by a resolution
carried or adopted by the Owners in general
meeting in accordance with the provisions of
the Scheme. For this purpose the Board may
at any time, and shall upon a requisition
made in writing by any three of its members
or by any ten Owners, convene a General
Meeting of Owners.

16. Any requisition so made shall state the
object for which the Meeting is to be called,
and shall be addressed to and delivered to
the Secretary at the Offices of the Board.

17. Upon receipt of any such requisition as
aforesaid the Board shall forthwith convene
a General Meeting of the Owners, and if it
neglects to do so for seven days from the time
of the requisition being so delivered the
requisitionists may themselves convene a
Meeting.

18. Seven clear days' notice shall be given
of a General Meeting of the Owners, specifying
the place, date and hour of Meeting and the
nature of the business.

19. Twenty-five Owners shall form a quorum
for General Meetings.

20. At each General Meeting of Owners the
Owners present shall elect a Chairman who
shall preside at the meeting at which he is
elected.

21. No business other than the election of
Chairman shall be transacted at a General
Meeting of the Owners unless a quorum is
present. If a quorum is not present at any
meeting, the meeting may be adjourned by
the Chairman of the meeting until such time
as he may decide, being not less than three

clear days from the date of the meeting, of which fresh notice shall be given. At the adjourned meeting the Owners or their representatives who are present shall form a quorum.

22. Each Owner shall be entitled to appoint a representative to attend General Meetings and to nominate a substitute for such representative. Such appointment and nomination shall be made by notice in writing to the Secretary.

23. Minutes of Proceedings at General Meetings shall be kept in regular form and the signature thereto of the Chairman of the meeting at which the Minutes are approved shall be sufficient evidence of their accuracy.

Voting at General Meetings of the Owners.

24. At a General Meeting of the Owners votes may be given either personally by Owners or their duly authorised representatives or by a proxy in writing. A resolution put to the vote shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is demanded, and unless a poll is so demanded a declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried unanimously or by a particular majority, or lost, and an entry to that effect in the book of proceedings shall be conclusive evidence of the fact without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded in favour of or against that resolution. The decision of the Chairman of the Meeting as to the result of the voting on any resolution shall be final.

On a show of hands every Owner present or represented at the Meeting shall have one vote, and at a poll the votes shall, until standard tonnage is available, be reckoned by tonnage based on the Owner's output for the last calendar year as returnable on Form T.S. (Wages Agreement) Returns and thereafter on annual standard tonnage in each case at the following rate:—30,000 tons and under, one vote; above 30,000 tons and not exceeding 80,000 tons, two votes; above 80,000 tons and not exceeding 150,000 tons, three votes; above 150,000 tons and not exceeding 250,000 tons, four votes; and in addition, one vote for every 100,000 tons above 250,000 tons.

Amendment of the Scheme.

25.—(i) The Board may from time to time either of its own motion or upon the recommendation of the Owners as herein provided submit to the Board of Trade—

(a) representations that it is necessary or expedient that an Order should be made under the provisions of Section 3 (4) of the Act for enabling the Scheme to make provision for matters in addition to or in substitution for the matters mentioned in sub-sections (2) and (3) of the said Section 3, or

(b) any amendment of the provisions of the Scheme or a new Scheme in substitution therefor as provided in Section 1 (5) of the Act;

(ii) The Owners may by resolution adopted in General Meeting recommend to the Board—

(a) that representations should be made by the Board to the Board of Trade as aforesaid for the making of an Order under Section 3 (4) of the Act, or

(b) that any amendment of the Scheme or a new Scheme in substitution therefor

should be made under the provisions of Section 1 (5) of the Act:

Provided that—

(i) the method of voting on the resolution covering any such recommendation shall be that prescribed in Clause 24 of the Scheme for a tonnage vote, and that

(ii) the resolution in order to be effective must be supported by at least 51 per cent. of the total number of votes that could be recorded under Clause 24 by all the Owners,

(iii) any amendment of the Scheme or a new Scheme in substitution therefor shall, if approved by the Board of Trade, and in the case of an amendment under the provisions of sub-section (4) of Section 3 of the Act, if the same shall first have been sanctioned by an Order as therein provided, have effect accordingly from such date as the Board of Trade may appoint.

Notices to Owners.

26. Intimation of all decisions of the Board shall, as soon as practicable, be made to each Owner and to each Member of the Board at his principal place of business or the registered office of the Owner of the coal mine or undertaking, or to such address as he may intimate to the Secretary as suitable for the receipt of notices. Provided that intimation of all decisions relating to classification of coal, standard tonnages, quotas and minimum prices shall be made individually to the Owner or Owners primarily concerned. Provided also that complete lists of all classifications of coal, standard tonnages, quotas and minimum prices shall be kept in the Offices of the Board and shall be made available for inspection by any Owner or his representative authorised in writing. All notices may be delivered personally or posted, addressed as aforesaid, and if posted shall be held to have been received in the ordinary course of post, and in any event not later than 48 hours from the time of posting.

Classification of Coal.

27. The Board shall determine the class to which any coal produced in the District belongs for any purpose. Any schedule embodying such classification and a note of any variation made therein from time to time shall be sent to each Owner.

Every Owner shall be entitled to make representations in writing to the Board in regard to the determination of any class of coal produced from his mine or mines, and the Board shall take such representations into consideration and give a decision without delay.

Standard Tonnages.

28. In order to regulate the quantity of coal which may be produced from coal mines and undertakings the Board shall from time to time and for such periods as it thinks fit, fix standard tonnages of coal for each coal mine or undertaking. For this purpose each Owner shall submit to the Board the aggregate output of coal for each month from all of the coal mines owned by him during each of any twelve consecutive months falling within either of the periods from 1st March, 1927, to 29th February, 1928, or from 1st March, 1929, to 31st March, 1930 (which twelve consecutive months are hereinafter referred to as the "selected period.")

Subject as aftermentioned, the tonnage of coal produced by any coal mine or undertaking during each month of its selected period shall be fixed by the Board as the monthly standard tonnage of coal of that coal mine or undertaking for the corresponding month in any prescribed period as aftermentioned, and the total of the monthly standard tonnages of the selected period shall be fixed by the Board as the annual standard tonnage of coal of the coal mine or undertaking. The sums of the monthly and of the annual standard tonnages of all the coal mines and undertakings are hereinafter referred to respectively as the "Scottish Monthly Standard Tonnage" and the "Scottish Annual Standard Tonnage." Provided that if the Board decides that standard tonnages shall be determined for any class of coal, the provisions of the Scheme relating to standard tonnages of coal shall be applicable to the standard tonnages of such class of coal.

29. The Board may determine a period and allocate monthly standard tonnages for any coal mine or undertaking for which a selected period and standard tonnages cannot be fixed under the foregoing provisions, and in so doing the Board shall have regard to any special circumstances of which it may have information affecting the coal mine or the undertaking in question.

30. Each Owner shall in making his return to the Board for the purpose of fixing standard tonnages as aforesaid be asked, and shall have the right, to bring to the notice of the Board any special circumstances affecting his coal mine or undertaking (including the efficiency and economy of the working of the coal mine or coal mines of such Owner, the extent to which they have been developed or are being developed for economic working, the extent to which their output has been increasing or decreasing), and each Owner shall furnish all particulars the Board may require for fixing standard tonnages, and the Board shall take such special circumstances into consideration and shall have regard in the case of the first determination to the proportion which the output of the coal mine or coal mines of each Owner bore to the output of the District during the period of six months ending 31st December, 1929. The Board shall also be entitled to modify as it may deem equitable the standard tonnages of the coal mine or undertaking concerned.

31. The Board may increase the standard tonnages of any coal mine or undertaking in respect of an output with an expanding capacity, including the bringing into production of any new mine, and may reduce the standard tonnages of any coal mine or undertaking in respect of an output with a diminishing capacity.

The Board may, on the appeal of any Owner, or at its own instance after consideration of the circumstances, alter the standard tonnages of any coal mine or undertaking.

32. Should any Owner acquire a coal mine or undertaking, the standard tonnages applicable to that coal mine or undertaking shall be added to his standard tonnages.

Should any Owner sell or transfer a coal mine or undertaking the standard tonnages applicable to that coal mine or undertaking shall be deducted from his standard tonnages.

If a coal mine so acquired or sold or transferred forms part of an undertaking, the standard tonnages applicable thereto which fall to be added or deducted as aforesaid shall be determined by the Board.

Notification of every sale or transfer of a coal mine or undertaking or part thereof shall be made to the Board without delay by the Owner selling or transferring.

Quotas of Output.

33. The Board shall, as soon as the first District Allocation has been settled and thereafter from time to time, determine the total quantity of coal to be produced during any month or other period (hereinafter referred to as the "prescribed period") from all the coal mines in Scotland (which quantity is hereinafter referred to as the "Scottish quota of output"), and shall allocate to each Owner the proportion of such Scottish quota of output which may be produced from the coal mines owned by him during such month or other period. Such output shall be deemed to be the quota of the coal mines owned by him for the prescribed period. Provided that quotas of output shall be so calculated that during any period for which the district allocation has been fixed by the Central Council that allocation shall not be exceeded. The allocation of the Scottish quota of output among the Owners shall be in the proportion which the standard tonnage of each Owner bears to the Scottish standard tonnage, and shall be stated as a percentage on the Owner's standard tonnage. Quotas shall be notified to each Owner not less than 7 days before the commencement of the period to which such quotas relate. Provided that, if the Board decides that standard tonnages shall be determined for any class of coal, quotas may, if the Board so decides, be fixed as respects that class and the provisions of the Scheme relating to quotas shall also apply to quotas so decided to be fixed, for any such class of coal.

Subject to the provisions of the Scheme, the Board shall be entitled at any time to increase or reduce quotas of output of any Owner.

Subject to the provisions of Clause 34 hereof, any Owner who, in any prescribed period, exceeds his quota of output by more than 2 per cent. thereof shall be liable in penalties as prescribed by Clause 46 hereof.

Deficiencies.

34. Should the output of coal produced by any Owner in any prescribed period fall short of his quota of output as determined by the Board for that period, the amount of the deficiency shall be notified to the Board and 50 per cent. of this amount may be produced in addition to his quota of output in the immediately succeeding prescribed period.

Sale or Transfer of Quotas.

35. Any Owner may sell or transfer, to the Board or to any other Owner, the whole or any part of his quota of output for a prescribed period, and the transferrer's quota of output shall thereby be proportionately reduced and the transferee's quota of output shall be increased by the amount by which the transferrer's quota of output has been reduced.

Such sale or transfer shall be intimated to the Board within three days after being effected.

Minimum Prices.

36. The Board shall from time to time and for such periods as it may think fit, determine the price per ton of 20 cwts. below which any class of coal produced in the district, exclusive of coal supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about any coal mine, and the dependents of persons who have been so employed, shall not be sold or supplied by Owners, which price is hereinafter referred to as the "minimum price." The minimum prices so determined shall in the case of coal sold or destined for shipment be f.o.b. at the customary places of shipment, and in all cases regard shall be had in the determination of minimum prices to all the circumstances of the case, and in particular to the costs of delivery in the case of pit prices; provided that there shall be only one minimum price for each class of coal as defined in the Scheme.

As from the date when the minimum price is fixed by the Board for any class of coal under the provisions of the Scheme no Owner producing coal of that class shall either directly or indirectly—

- (i) sell or supply the coal at a price below the price so fixed for the time being;
- (ii) sell or supply the coal in any manner whereby the actual consideration obtained is less in value than the price so fixed; or
- (iii) allow or give, or agree to allow or give, save as may expressly be permitted by the Scheme, any discount, commission, rebate, extended credit or allowance in respect of the price, quantity or weight of the coal or otherwise;

and any owner who contravenes in any particular the provisions of this Clause shall be liable in penalty under Clause 46 hereof.

The Board may prescribe conditions of sale for securing that the actual consideration obtained by the sale or supply of any class of coal shall not be less in value than the minimum price for the time being fixed for that class of coal, and every Owner shall comply with such conditions of sale as may be so prescribed.

In the event of any Owner in consequence of complaint by a customer in regard to short weight or quality of coal in any consignment being required to furnish additional quantities or make a reduction or allowance in price for that particular consignment, in order to meet such complaint the Owner concerned shall be entitled to supply such additional quantity or make such adjustment in his account as may be necessary, subject to making a report thereof in writing to the Board within ten days after the expiration of each calendar month during which any such concession is made, and any such concession which is not approved by the Board shall be deemed to be a breach of the provisions of the Scheme relating to the determination of price and shall render the Owner liable in penalty under Clause 46 hereof.

District Levies and Penalties or Levies under the Central Scheme.

37. The Board shall collect from every Owner levies imposed on the several Owners, and the several Owners shall be bound to pay to the Board such levies in proportion to the output of the several Owners for the purpose of

defraying the expenses of the Board in its administration of the Scheme, and any penalties or levies payable by the Board under the provisions of the Central Scheme. Any levy made by the Board shall be calculated in proportion to the output of the several Owners during such period as the Board may determine, so, however, that the same period shall be taken for all Owners.

District Fund.

38. There shall be established a District Fund to be administered and controlled, subject to the provisions hereof by the Board through Trustees as aftermentioned, into which Fund there shall be paid any money received under the provisions of the Central Scheme or of this Scheme by the Board or by any other persons in respect of their functions under this Scheme, and there shall be paid out of the Fund the expenses of the Board and the penalties and levies specified in Clause 37 hereof.

If an Owner ceases to come within the operation of the Scheme by selling or transferring his coal mine or undertaking, such Owner's share of the Assets and Liabilities of the Board, ascertained in such manner as the Board may determine, shall be taken over by the Owner acquiring such coal mine or undertaking.

Appointment of Trustees.

39. The Board shall so soon as practicable after the commencement of the Scheme appoint Trustees for the Board in whom shall be vested the District Fund and all other property of the Board.

40. The Trustees shall be three in number, and they shall be appointed by the Board to hold office for such time as the Board may determine. The appointments may be recalled and casual vacancies in their number filled by the Board at any time. They shall be liable only for the funds and investments within their control, and shall otherwise be liable only for wilful default or breach of trust. They shall be indemnified by the Board against all claims and costs and expenses made or incurred in carrying out the trust to which they are appointed.

They shall administer the District Fund by operation of bank account and trustee investment of surplus funds available for investment at any time as the Board may direct. They may sue and be sued on behalf of and in the name of the Board, and shall sue for and recover all levies and penalties and institute proceedings by way of declarator interdict or otherwise, for the protection of the Board in the administration of the Scheme and against any Owner contravening or failing to implement his obligations under the Scheme, as may be required by the Board.

The Trustees shall control and apply the funds of the Scheme under the direction of the Board in the payment of the expenses of the administration of the Scheme by the Board including the expenses of general meetings called under Clause 15 of the Scheme and the expenses of the constitution and the administration of the Trust and in making payments to the Central Council for defraying expenses and paying penalties under the Central Scheme, as may from time to time be required.

The Trustees shall also, if so directed by the Board, distribute *pro rata* to standard tonnage or otherwise as the Board may determine funds (other than proceeds of any levy to meet expenses) available for distribution among the Owners, or may, as directed by the Board, invest available funds in trustee securities according to the law of Scotland.

Inspection of Books and Accounts.

41. For the purposes of the Scheme each Owner shall be obliged at such time and in such manner as the Board may direct to make production of or give every reasonable facility for inspection of books and accounts relating to his coal mines to an Accountant authorised by the Board.

42. The Board shall as and when it requires for the purposes of the Scheme appoint an Accountant for the purpose of making such inspections, and the Accountant so appointed shall submit to the Board a report of every inspection of an Owner's books and accounts.

All returns and information shall, subject to the provisions hereof and of the Act, be treated by the Board as strictly private and confidential.

Returns.

43. Every Owner shall furnish to the Board or any person authorised by the Board in that behalf in such manner as the Board may prescribe such returns, accounts and other information certified by the Owner, his Manager or Accounting Officer or a person authorised to act on his behalf as the Board may think fit to require for the purposes of its functions under the Scheme.

Inspection of Mines.

44. The Board shall be entitled for the purposes of the Scheme, as and when it may think fit, to make inspection of any coal mine by some person authorised by the Board, and every Owner shall, when so required, give all necessary facilities for such inspection.

Arbitration.

45. Any Owner who is aggrieved by any decision, act or omission of the Board or of any other persons in respect of their functions under the Scheme shall be at liberty to require the matter to be settled by arbitration. On the matter being referred to arbitration it shall be referred, if parties so agree, to an independent Arbitrator, and failing such agreement, to two independent Arbitrators, one to be appointed by the Owner and the other by the Board, and, in case the Arbitrators cannot agree, to an Oversman to be appointed by them, and, failing their agreement, to be appointed by the Dean of the Faculty of Advocates and the award of such Arbitrator or Arbitrators or Oversman shall be final. The Arbitrations shall be informal, and the manner in which the conference is to be heard and determined shall be in the discretion of the Arbitrator or Arbitrators or Oversman, who shall have power to appoint Assessors. The Arbitrator or Arbitrators or Oversman shall have power to award costs.

Monetary Penalties.

46. Any Owner who in any prescribed period produces coal in excess by more than 2 per cent. of his quota of output for that period shall, subject to the permissible percentage

margin as aforesaid, and subject to Clause 34 hereof, for each ton of coal produced in excess of his quota, or who sells or supplies or agrees to sell or supply coal of any class below the minimum price therefor or in breach of the conditions of sale prescribed by the Board, or otherwise in contravention of the provisions of Clause 36 hereof, shall, for each ton of coal so sold or supplied, or agreed to be sold or supplied, pay to the Board a penalty of 2s. 6d. per ton.

Any Owner who fails as and when he may be required by the Board to produce or to give facilities for inspection by an Accountant authorised by the Board of the books and accounts relating to his mines in Scotland, or who otherwise fails to render to the Board any Return, account or information required by the Board, or who fails as and when he may be required by the Board to give facilities for the inspection of his mine or mines, shall be liable to pay to the Board a penalty of £20 for each day during which such Owner is and continues to be in default as aforesaid.

In the event of any Owner otherwise contravening or failing to comply with the provisions of the Scheme the Board shall impose on him, and he shall be liable to pay to the Board a penalty of 2s. 6d. per ton of the tonnage of coal involved in the transaction in connection with which such Owner contravenes or fails to comply with the provisions of the Scheme.

Providing however that if the Board shall be of opinion that any contravention by the Owner including an excess of quota is not occasioned by a wilful act, neglect or default on his part or was solely occasioned by the performance of contracts within the provisions of sub-section (2) of Section 4 of the Act the Board may reduce or remit wholly or partly any of the sums which would otherwise have been payable by an Owner in consequence of such contravention or dispense with deduction from quota as provided for in Clause 47 hereof, but only if, having regard to the provisions of the Central Scheme, such reduction or remission of penalty or dispensing with deduction from quota can be made without substantial injury to the interests of the other Owners.

Provided that no proceedings in default of payment of any such penalty shall be commenced until a period of ten days shall have elapsed from the date of notice of the penalty being given in writing signed by the Secretary or other person authorised by the Board for the purpose specifying the contravention of or non-compliance with the Scheme. In the event of an application being made within that period by the Owner upon whom a penalty is imposed that the matter be referred to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme, no such proceedings as aforesaid shall be commenced unless and until the arbitrator shall have made his award as to the amount of penalty, if any, payable by such Owner, or the Owner shall have abandoned his reference to arbitration, whichever shall first occur. Penalties shall fall to be paid by the Owner on whom they are imposed within ten days of the notice as aforesaid unless the matter has in the meantime been referred to arbitra-

tion in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme.

In the event of any objection by an Owner to any determination or decision of the Board under the provisions of Clauses 27, 31 and 36 of the Scheme the determination or decision of the Board to which objection is made shall be operative and shall, unless in any case the Board otherwise determine, continue to have full force until the same shall be varied (if at all) by the ruling of the Board on the objection, and no such objection or ruling shall be deemed to exempt the Appellant from liability for any contravention of or non-compliance with the Scheme in respect of such determination or other decision at any time when the same shall be or have been operative.

Excesses of Quotas.

47. Subject to Clause 34 hereof, where an Owner has produced coal in excess of his quota during any prescribed period the amount of the excess produced, less 1 per cent. of his quota, may, if the Board so decide, be deducted from the quota which he is entitled to produce in a succeeding prescribed period to be determined by the Board, but without prejudice to any penalty that may have been incurred by reason of the excess.

Dissolution.

48. Upon the dissolution of the Scheme the Trustees for the Board shall realise the assets of the Board and, after discharging thereout all liabilities of the Board, shall distribute the surplus, if any, amongst the Owners *pro rata* to the total contributions made by each Owner under Clause 37 hereof. Any deficiency in the funds on dissolution shall be made up by contributions from the Owners to be calculated by the Trustees in accordance with the provisions of Clause 37, and the decisions of the Trustees in relation thereto shall be deemed to be decisions of the Board properly intimated prior to dissolution. The dissolution of the Scheme shall in no way prejudice or affect any rights or obligations, liabilities or penalties previously constituted or incurred under the Scheme, and any legal proceedings in relation thereto may be continued or instituted and rights enforced and obligations maintained as if the Scheme still operated.
