TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF MALE SORTING CLERK AND TELEGRAPHIST IN BELFAST, EDINBURGH AND CERTAIN PROVINCIAL TOWNS IN GREAT BRITAIN IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE POSTMASTER GENERAL.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

- 1. The limits of age for this situation are 15 and 18. Candidates must be within the prescribed limits of age on the day of the examination.
- 2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of persons serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the

 Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

- 5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—
 - 1. English.
 - 2. History.
 - 3. Geography.
 - 4. Arithmetic.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Handwriting and in the Examination as a whole.

6. The Examination is open only to local candidates. A local candidate is regarded as one whose family home is situated where he

can travel to and from the office conveniently and without detriment to his health or the interests of the Department. It will be within the authority of the Postmaster-General to decline to employ a candidate successful in the Examination if he is not satisfied on enquiry that the candidate complies with this requirement.

7. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height, and no officer will be retained in the Service who does not attain the height of 5 feet 4 inches before completing his nineteenth year.

8. In view of the difficulty which left-handed operators are likely to experience in the use of instruments designed for right-handed operators, candidates who are markedly left-handed are ineligible for appointment.

9.—(i) Persons actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force are ineligible to compete, (ii) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

WOMBWELL GAS.

(Application for Special Order under Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 and 1929.)

District Council of Wombwell (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") whose address is the Town Hall, Wombwell, intend to apply to the Board of Trade for a Special Order under the above-named Acts for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Council to contract with any company, body or person producing coke oven gas within the limits within which the Council are for the time being authorised to supply gas (hereinafter referred to as "the limits of supply") with reference to the purchase and taking by the Council from such company, body or person of a supply of coke oven gas and also to empower the Council to supply such gas within the limits of supply

for any purpose except as may be provided by the Order.

2. In relation to the supply by the Council of coke oven gas, to exempt them from the provisions of the Acts and Orders relating to their gas undertaking with respect to the calorific value, purity, pressure, testing or price of the gas supplied, and to empower the Council to break up streets within the limits of supply for the purpose of laying pipes in connection with the purchase and supply of coke oven gas.

3. To prescribe the conditions under which coke oven gas may be supplied by the Council for lighting purposes, including any conditions or regulations which may be prescribed by any Government Department.

4. To empower the Council to contract with any local authority company body or person for the supply by the Council to them or for the supply to the Council by them of gas in bulk.

- 5. To confer general and incidental powers upon the Council in connection with their gas undertaking, including particularly:-Relieving the Council from the obligation of supplying gas in certain cases; as to construction and placing of pipes etc.; supply of gas where consumer has separate supply; notice to discontinue supply of gas; power to enter premises to which a supply of gas is laid on; removal of fittings where gas supply discontinued; as to mode of cutting off supplies; expenses of reconnecting discontinued supply; provision of valve where high-pressure air or other gas is used; charges for special readings of meters; dwellinghouses for employees, offices, showrooms, etc.; power to take licences for use of patents; power to Council to compel repairs of internal piping or appliances or fittings on consumers' premises in case of danger.
- 6. To empower the Council to borrow money for the purposes of or in connection with the proposed Special Order and the gas undertaking of the Council and for the provision of working capital and to make other financial provisions, including authority for the establishment of a reserve fund, provision for the

payment of receipts and expenses of the Council in connection with their gas undertaking into and out of the general rate and general rate fund, interest on sinking funds, separate accounts in respect of the undertaking, as to surpluses and deficiencies on revenue account, use of moneys forming part of sinking and reserve funds, interest on reserve funds and other matters.

- 7. To repeal certain provisions of the Wombwell Local Board Gas Act 1879, the Wombwell Order 1913, the Wombwell Order 1915, the Wombwell Gas (Charges) Order 1929 and any other Act or Order relating to the Council or their gas undertaking.
- 8. To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would interfere with the objects of the intended Order and to confer other rights and privileges.
- 9. To incorporate and apply with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1871, the Lands Clauses Acts, the Public Health Act 1875, the Local Loans Act 1875, the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 and 1929 and the Interpretation Act 1889, and all or any of the provisions of any Act or Order relating to the gas undertaking of the Council.

Any local or other public authority company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 31st day of December, 1930.

Any such objection must state (a) the specific grounds of objection and (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the Objection must be forwarded to the Council or to the undersigned Solicitors or Parliamentary Agents at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.
