At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 27th day of November, 1930.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of November, 1930 (C.W. 7745/30) in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas, in view of his exceptional qualifications and experience in certain specialist duties, we consider that it would be of the greatest value to Your Majesty's Naval service to secure the continuous employment in the Royal Navy of Paymaster Lieutenant-Commander Theodore Eric Nave, Royal Australian Navy:

"We beg leave to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction his transfer to

the list of Accountant Officers, R.N., on the following terms, with effect from the 30th August last:—

(a) The Officer to be included as a Paymaster Lieutenant-Commander with his existing seniority in the establishment of, and subject to the regulations affecting Accountant Officers, R.N.

(b) All claims by him to defered pay which may have accrued under R.A.N. Regulations to be relinquished and the amount thereof to be transferred to R.N. Funds as a contribution towards his R.N. retired pay, subject to which all previous service as an Officer, R.A.N., to count as though it had been service in the Royal Navy for purposes of retired pay, widow's pension, etc.

(c) To be allowed to proceed to Australia on transfer and on arrival there to be granted 91 days' leave. During passage to Australia and until the expiration of this leave to be granted full pay at R.N. rates.

"The Naval Board of the Commonwealth of Australia and the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

HEREAS on the 20th of January, 1914, WW an International Convention for the safety of Life at Sea, and for purposes incidental thereto, was duly entered into by His Majesty and the other Signatory Powers more especially referred to and set out in the said Convention:

And whereas a Statute 4 & 5 Geo. 5, c. 50, intituled "An Act to make such amendments of the law relating to Merchant Shipping as are necessary or expedient to give effect to an International Convention for the safety of Life at Sea" (being the Convention above referred to) was passed on the 10th day of August, 1914, the short title of which is "The Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914": And whereas by Section 29, Sub-section 5,

of the said Act it was provided as follows:-

"This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1915:

"Provided that His Majesty may, by Order in Council from time to time, postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order":

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 17th day of December, 1929. until the 1st day of January, 1931:

His Majesty whereas deems expedient that the provisions of the said Act should be further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the aboverecited provision and all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of January, 1932.

Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1930, amending the first-mentioned Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the firstmentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order should come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:-

- 1. The following amendments shall be made in Schedule V to the principal Order:-
 - (a) In paragraph 1. after the words "in respect of the capacity in which he is so acting" there shall be inserted the words "and in respect of the class or type of aircraft in which he is so acting";
 - (b) After paragraph 7. the following paragraph shall be inserted-
 - "7A. A member of the operative crew of a passenger or goods flying machine of any type, who is manœuvring the machine under the direct supervision of the pilot thereof, shall be deemed to be the holder of a licence in respect of the capacity in which he is so acting, if he holds a pilot's licence, granted or rendered valid under the provisions of this Order, to fly passenger or goods flying machines of that or some other type.
 - "In this paragraph the expression "passenger or goods flying machine' means a flying machine carrying passengers or goods for hire or reward or being flown for any industrial purpose";
 - paragraph 9, after the word "authority" there shall be inserted the words "in any part of His Majesty's dominions outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland or ";
 - (d) Paragraph 10 shall be omitted.
- 2. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 7 of Schedule VI to the principal Order:—
 - "7. The fee chargeable for the validation of a pilot's, navigator's or engineer's licence under paragraph 9 of Schedule V to this Order shall be 5s."
- 3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1930.
- (2) This Order shall come into operation provisionally as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 7th day of May, 1929, to refer the said Petition to a Committee of the Lords of His Privy Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 5th day of July, 1929, to approve the Report of the Committee to the effect that, the Statutory Notice that the Petition had been presented having expired, it rested with the Secretary of State to appoint a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme in accordance with the provisions of Section 30 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas on the 24th day of July, 1929, the Right Honourable John Robert Clynes, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of and for apportioning the Councillors among the Wards of the Borough of Maidstone:

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 10th day of October, 1930:—

"Scheme for Determining the Boundaries of the Wards of the Borough of Maidstone and apportioning the Councillors among the said Wards in pursuance of Orders in Council dated 7th May, 1929, and 5th July, 1929...

"I.—Boundaries of Wards.

" High Street Ward.

"A line commencing at a point on the Borough boundary where the said boundary intersects Sandling Road at the junction of Monckton's Lane and the said Sandling Road, thence in a westerly direction following the Borough boundary to the centre of the channel of the River Medway, thence in a southerly and south-easterly direction along the centre of the channel of the said River to a point immediately opposite to the centre of and in a straight line with the Horseway to the River between All Saints' Church and the Old College, thence eastwards in a straight line to the centre of the said Horseway and continuing along the centre of the said Horseway to its junction with College Road, thence southwards along the centre of College Road, Hayle Road and Postley Road to the junction of Postley Road with Sheals Crescent, thence south-eastwards and eastwards along the centre of Sheals Crescent to its junction with Loose Road, thence southwards along the centre of Loose Road to its junction with the southern boundary of the Loose Road Laundry, thence eastwards following the said boundary to the south eastern corner of the New Grammar School property, thence northwards following the eastern boundary of the said Grammar School property the eastern boundary of the Foster Clark Housing Estate and the western boundary of the Mote Cricket Ground and continuing in a straight line to the centre of the River Len, thence in a north-westerly direction along the centre of the channel of the said River to the point where it is crossed by the centre of Square Hill Road, thence southwestwards along the centre of Square Hill Road and westwards along the centre of Mote Road to the junction of Mote Road with Lower Stone Street, thence northwards along the centre of Lower Stone Street, Gabriel's Hill, Week Street and Sandling Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" North Ward.

"A line commencing at a point on the eastern boundary of High Street Ward as hereinbefore defined at the junction of Week Street, Sandling Road and County Road, thence south-eastwards and north-eastwards along the centre of County Road to its junction with Well Road, thence south-eastwards along the centre of Well Road, to its junction with Wheeler Street, thence north-eastwards along the centre of Wheeler Street and Park Avenue to the footpath leading to Penenden Heath, thence continuing along the centre of the said footpath to its junction with Boxley Road, thence along the centre of Boxley Road to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence northwards, westwards, southwards, south-westwards and southwards following the boundary of the Borough to its junction with the northern and eastern boundaries of High Street Ward, thence southwards following the eastern boundary of High Street Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"King Street Ward.

"A line commencing at the junction of the south-western boundary of North Ward with the eastern boundary of High Street Ward, thence north-eastwards following the south-eastern boundary of North Ward as herein-before defined to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence southwards following the Borough boundary to its junction with the eastern boundary of High Street Ward in the River Len, thence south-westwards, westwards and northwards following the boundary of High Street Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Stone Street Ward.

"A line commencing at the point of junction of the eastern boundary of High Street Ward with the boundary of the Borough in the River Len, thence in an easterly, southerly and generally westerly direction following the Borough boundary to its junction with the River Medway, thence in a north-easterly direction along the centre of the channel of the River Medway to its junction with the boundary of High Street Ward, thence eastwards, southwards, eastwards and northwards following the boundary of High Street Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Bridge Ward.

"A line commencing at a point on the Borough boundary in the centre of the channel of the River Medway at its junction with the northern boundary of High Street Ward, thence north-westwards and south-westwards following the Borough boundary to its junction with London Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of London Road to its junction with Queens Road, thence south-westwards along the centre of Queens

Road to its junction with Scrubbs Lane footpath, thence in an easterly direction along the centre of Scrubbs Lane footpath to its junction with Bower Mount Road, thence southwards along the centre of Bower Mount Road to its junction with Tonbridge Road, thence westwards along the centre of Tonbridge Road to its junction with St. Michael's Road, thence southwards along the centre of St. Michael's Road to its junction with Upper Fant Road, thence in a south-westerly direction along the centre of Upper Fant Road to its junction with Unicum's Lane, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Unicum's Lane and continuing in a straight line to the centre of the channel of the River Medway, thence in a north-easterly and northerly direction along the centre of the channel of the said River following the western boundaries of Stone Street Ward and High Street Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Heath Ward.

"A line commencing at the junction of the Borough boundary with the northern and western boundaries of Bridge Ward, thence in a north-westerly, southerly and easterly direction following the Borough boundary to its junction with the western boundary of Stone Street Ward, thence in a generally northerly direction following the western boundaries of Stone Street Ward and Bridge Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Plan Delineating Boundaries.

"The Boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto which forms part of the Scheme.

"In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

"II.-Apportionment of Councillors.

"The three Councillors in office for each Ward as existing at the date of this Scheme shall be the Councillors for the Ward of the same name as altered by this Scheme."

And whereas the said Scheme has been submitted to His Majesty in Council for approval:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth hereby approve of the said Scheme of the said Commissioner, and doth order the same to be published in the London Gazette accordingly.

WHEREAS by Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, provision has been made for the reciprocal enforcement of judgments in the United Kingdom and in other parts of His Majesty's dominions:

And whereas by the said Act it is, amongst other things, provided that where His Majesty

is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of His dominions of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council declare that the said part of that Act shall extend to that part of His dominions and that on any such Order being made the said part of that Act shall extend accordingly:

And whereas on the 6th day of December, 1922, the Irish Free State was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament shortly entitled the Irish Free State Constitution Act.

1922 (Session 2):

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislature of the part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter mentioned has made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within that part of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to Malta.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect the registration or enforcement in the Irish Free State of any judgment in pursuance of Part II of the said Act.

And the Right Honourable Lord Passfield, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 31st day of July, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Haselbury Bryan and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Stoke Wake, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Haselbury Bryan and Stoke Wake duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and

therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Salisbury embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices or Haselbury Bryan and Stoke Wake are now full, the Reverend John Lewis Rhys being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Haselbury Bryan and the Reverend Seth Morgan being the present Incumbent of the

said Benefice of Stoke Wake:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Haselbury Bryan and the said Benefice of Stoke Wake shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Haselbury Bryan with Stoke Wake,' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Archdeaconry of Sherborne and of the Rural Deanery of Cerne but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all

respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Stoke Wake only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Haselbury Bryan and the then Incumbent of Stoke Wake shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Haselbury Bryan only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Stoke Wake and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Stoke Wake if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Haselbury Bryan shall have been instituted to Haselbury Bryan subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Haselbury Bryan before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Haselbury Bryan following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Stoke Wake and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stoke Wake shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Haselbury Bryan shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Haselbury Bryan shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Stoke Wake shall have the second turn.

"5. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe rentcharges, Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Branksome, Saint Clement, in the said Diocese of Salisbury with a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £74; the same annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be as from the date of the said union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Branksome, Saint Clement, to the intentthat such Incumbent may therewith be enabled to provide or in part provide the stipend of an assistant Curate for the Parish of Branksome, Saint Clement, and the said annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said Benefice of Branksome, Saint Clement, or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharge the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Branksome, Saint Clement, and his successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said Benefice of Branksome, Saint Clement, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly rentcharge hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then such annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiasical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certainalterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme has proceeded with an appeal to His Majesty in Council against the said Scheme or any part thereof:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 6th day of November, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Cotleigh and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Monkton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Cotleigh and Monkton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended. in the said Report:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Chelmsford, partly out of the Parish of Writtle, all in the County of Essex, and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Chelmsford, the said Parish of Broomfield, and the said Parish of Writtle are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Chelmsford, of the said Parish of Broomfield, and of the said Parish of Writtle, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of All Saints, Sidley, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Kennedy Allen, Bishop of Chichester (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Bexhill which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of All Saints, Sidley, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Sidley'.

"And with the like consent of the said George Kennedy Allen, Bishop of Chichester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of All Saints, Sidley, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"And whereas the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, acting as such Bishop, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice of Keyston with part of the Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston, and (2) of the Benefice of Molesworth with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Huntingdon and in the Diocese of Ely:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leonard, Bishop of Ely, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefice of Keyston with part of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston, and (2) of the said Benefice of Molesworth with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Ely, and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Ely signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said

Report:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Keyston, Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston and Molesworth are now full, the said Benefices of Keyston and Molesworth being held in plurality by the Reverend Percival Llewellyn Green under the authority of a dispensation, and the Reverend John Goodchild being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston:

"And whereas there is a pension charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston in favour of the Reverend Charles Fenton Bolland, a former Incumbent thereof:

- "Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Leonard, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—
- "1. That the said Benefice of Keyston and a part of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston, namely all that part of the Parish of such Benefice which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Bythorn, but excluding the extreme northern portion (containing 25 acres or thereabouts) of such area (all which excluded portion is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and thereon coloured Pink) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Keyston and Bythorn.'
- "2. That the said Benefice of Molesworth and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston (including the extreme northern portion of the area of the Civil Parish of Bythorn referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Brington with Molesworth and Old Weston' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.
- "3. That the Church of the Parish of Keyston shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Keyston and Bythorn.
- "4. That with the consent of the said Percival Llewellyn Green (testified by his signing this Scheme), if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston shall be vacant then the said unions shall forthwith take effect, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston shall be full then the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston, and if at the date when the unions shall take effect in either of the events hereinbefore described the said Benefices of Keyston and Molesworth are held by separate Incumbents the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Keyston shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Keyston and Bythorn and the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Molesworth shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Brington with Molesworth and Old Weston, but if at the date when the said unions shall take effect as afòresaid the said Benefices of Keyston and Molesworth are held in plurality by one Incumbent such Incumbent shall become the first Incumbent either of the United Benefice of Keyston and Bythorn or of the United Benefice of Brington with Molesworth and Old Weston as he shall then by his own choice determine.
- "5. That upon the said unions taking effect (1) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Keyston shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent

- of the United Benefice of Keyston and Bythorn; (2) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Brington with Molesworth and Old Weston and (3) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Molesworth and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith, if not previously sold, shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the United Benefice of Brington with Molesworth and Old
- "6. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, (a) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Keyston and Bythorn after the unions, the Patron of the said Benefice of Keyston shall have the first and the third turns and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston shall have the second turn and (b) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Brington with Molesworth and Old Weston after the unions, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Molesworth shall have the second turn.
- "7. That upon the unions taking effect a part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston, that is to say all those Tithe Rent-Charges originally commuted at £20 arising within the area of the Civil Parish of Bythorn and now or formerly payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston together with all capital sums, stocks, securities and other property representing or being the produce of the redemption, sale or other conversion of any of such Tithe Rent-charges and also a sum of £8,151 1s. 3d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock being part of a larger sum of such Stock at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Keyston with Bythorn, and all other the endowments of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston (including Tithe Rent-charges originally commuted at £440 arising within the area of the Civil Parish of Old Weston and now or formerly payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston together with all capital sums stocks securities and other property being or representing the produce of the redemption, sale or other conversion of any of such Tithe Rent-

charges and also a sum of £4,764 8s. 7d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, being the residue of the larger sum of such Stock at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Brington with Bythorn and Old Weston) shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Brington with Molesworth and Old Weston.

"8. That with the consent of the said Charles Fenton Bolland (testified by his signing this Scheme) if upon the date of the unions taking effect the pension now payable to the said Charles Fenton Bolland as aforesaid shall still be payable, such pension shall be apportioned as follows, that is to say, a portion equal to two-thirds of such pension shall be charged upon the revenues of the United Benefice of Brington with Molesworth and Old Weston and the remaining portion of such pension shall be charged upon the revenues of the United Benefice of Keyston with Bythorn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

That the said Benefice of Hooke and the part of the said United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Toller Fratrum which consists of the said Benefice of Toller Porcorum shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Hooke' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Bridport, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

That upon the said unions taking effect (1) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Toller Fratrum shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Hooke (2) pending the provision of a new Parsonage House more suitably situated for the Incumbent of the United Benefice the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Compton Abbas West with Wynford Eagle shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Bene-ace of Compton Abbas West with Wynford Eagle and Toller Fratrum and (3) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hooke and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners,

at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient, and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us for the benefit of the United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Hooke.

"5. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefices from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, (a) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Hooke after the unions the Patron of the said United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Toller Fratrum shall have the first and the third turns, and the Patron of the said Benefice of Hooke shall have the second turn and (b) that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Compton Abbas West with Wynford Eagle and Toller Fratrum after the unions the Patron of the said Benefice of Compton Abbas West with Wynford Eagle shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Toller Fratrum shall have the second turn.

"6. That upon the unions taking effect the endowments of the said United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Toller Fratrum shall be divided as follows, that is to say, (1) all those Tithe Rent-charges commuted at £37 arising within the Parish of Toller Fratrum and now or formerly payable to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Toller Fratrum, together with all capital sums of money, stocks, securities and other property being or representing the proceeds of any sale, redemption or other conversion of all or any of such Tithe Rent-charges and (2) a sum of £592 14s. 1d. London County Council £3 10s. 0d. per cent. per annum Stock now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of the said United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Toller Fratrum, shall be transferred to the United Benefice of Compton Abbas West with Wynford Eagle and Toller Fratrum, and all other the endowments now belonging to the said United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Toller Fratrum shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Toller Porcorum with Hooke.

"The Warden and Scholars Clerks of St. Mary College of Winchester near Winchester are the Patrons of the said Benefices of Hound and Hamble le Rice the Reverend William Edgar Henty-Summers being the present Incumbent of Hound and the Reverend Percy Raymond Humphrys being the present In-

cumbent of Hamble le Rice.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands Tithe rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consent in writing of the Patrons of both of the said Benefices of Hound and Hamble le Rice and also the Consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council.'

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:-

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed:-

"1. That there be separated from the Ecclesiastical Parish of Hound and annexed to the Parish of Hamble le Rice a certain portion of the said Parish of Hound being that portion of the said Parish which adjoins said Parish of Hamble le Rice the boundaries of which portion are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon verged pink.

"2. That the Incumbent of Hamble le Rice shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such portion so to be separated from Hound and annexed to Hamble le Rice.

"3. That the inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Hamble le Rice but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Church of Hound excepting nevertheless any such inhabitants or inhabitant (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Hound who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"4. That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the said Parish Church of Hamble le Rice as but for the said separation they might have had in

the Parish Church of Hound.

"5. That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion so to be separated from the Parish of Hound and annexed to Hamble le Rice shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Hamble le Rice who shall have all such rights and remedies for enforcing payment of the same as are now or would in the future but for the said separation be exercisable by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Hound.

"6. That no alteration shall be made in respect of the Tithe rent charges or other endowments of the said Benefices or either of

them.

"7. That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

"Dated this twelfth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and thirty.
