Road for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Great Stone Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Great Stone Road for a distance of 2½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Numbers 126 and 124, Great Stone Road, and extending thence south westward to and along such fence and along the fence forming the western boundary of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Ryebank Road, for a distance in all of 10 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Stretford, from the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Chorlton cum Hardy.

## "The Fourth Schedule.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Stretford, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Hilda, Old Trafford, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Stretford, which is bounded upon the north west and upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Hilda, Old Trafford, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point in the middle of the bridge which carries Ayres Road across the said Manchester South District Line of railway where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Hilda, Old Trafford, of the said New Parish of Saint John, Old Trafford, and of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Stretford, all meet, and extending thence westward along the middle of Ayres Road for a distance of 161 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Elsinore Road, and extending thence westward in a straight line for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of the said Manchester South Junction and Altrincham Line of railway where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Stretford, of the said New Parish of Saint Hilda, Old Trafford, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Stretford, all meet."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 6th day of November, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of All Saints, Sidley, situate in the Parish of Bexhill, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of All Saints, Sidley, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George Kennedy Allen, Bishop of Chichester (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Bexhill which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of All Saints, Sidley, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Sidley'.

"And with the like consent of the said George Kennedy Allen, Bishop of Chichester (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of All Saints, Sidley, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.
