

within such portion so to be separated from Hound and annexed to Hamble le Rice.

"3. That the inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Hamble le Rice but shall cease to be entitled to any right of accommodation in the Parish Church of Hound excepting nevertheless any such inhabitants or inhabitant (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Hound who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"4. That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the said Parish Church of Hamble le Rice as but for the said separation they might have had in the Parish Church of Hound.

"5. That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion so to be separated from the Parish of Hound and annexed to Hamble le Rice shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Hamble le Rice who shall have all such rights and remedies for enforcing payment of the same as are now or would in the future but for the said separation be exercisable by the Incumbent of the Benefice of Hound.

"6. That no alteration shall be made in respect of the Tithe rent charges or other endowments of the said Benefices or either of them.

"7. That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.
