

## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are now "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

1. *Inverness*.—An Area comprising the islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray*), in the county of Inverness.

2. *Ross and Cromarty*.—An Area comprising the islands of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.
