ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 5TH DECEMBER, 1930.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of a Pedigree Bull from Canada.

1. The landing of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby allowed under the Importation of Pedigree Animals Act, 1925, and subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and Part VI (Animals intended to be landed at an Imported Animals Quarantine Station) of the Animals (Importation) Order of 1930 hereinafter referred to as the "Principal" Order, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as an Imported Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the animal under this Order.

Regulations Applicable to the Animal before and on Landing.

- 3.—(1) The animal shall not be landed in Great Britain unless and until there are delivered to a proper officer of Customs and Excise the certificates and declarations prescribed by this Article, namely:—
 - (a) a certificate signed by a duly authorised officer of the Dominion of Canada to the effect that at the time of the shipment of the animal both the bull and also the whole of the Dominion were free from foot-and-mouth disease, contagious pleuro-pneumonia and cattle-plague;
 - (b) a certificate signed by a duly qualified veterinary officer of the Dominion of Canada to the effect that the animal was, within one month prior to the date of shipment, tested with tuberculin, and did not react. This certificate shall be accompanied by the temperature chart in respect of the animal;
 - (c) a certificate signed by the Secretary of the Canadian Guernsey Breeders' Association or by some person authorised to act on his behalf, to the effect that the said animal was at the time of shipment from the Dominion duly registered as a pedigree bull in the Canadian Guernsey Herd Book; particulars of the number, name and identification marks of the animal as registered in the Canadian Guernsey Herd Book shall be inserted in the certificate;
