of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 27th day of November, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of All Saints, Harton Colliery, and of the New Parish of All Saints, Cleadon, both in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 15th day of August, 1890, and published in the London Gazette on the 19th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of All Saints, Harton Colliery, situate in the Parish of Harton, in the said County and Diocese, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Harton Colliery':

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 10th day of November, 1911, and published in

the London Gazette on the 14th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of All Saints, Cleadon, situate in the Parish of Whitburn, in the said County and Diocese, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of All Saints, Cleadon':

"And whereas the said Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Harton Colliery, and the said District Chapelry of All Saints, Cleadon, have, under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of All Saints, Harton Colliery, and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Cleadon, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of All Saints, Harton Colliery, and of the said New Parish of All Saints, Cleadon, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the Parish of Boldon, in the said County and Diocese, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of All Saints, Harton Colliery, and (secondly) all that portion of the said Parish of Boldon which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of All Saints, Cleadon.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of All Saints, Harton Colliery, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, being:—

"All that isolated portion of the Parish of Boldon, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north by the said New Parish of

All Saints, Harton Colliery, upon the west by the New Parish of Hedworth, upon the south by the New Parish of Saint George, East Boldon, and upon the east by the New Parish of All Saints, Cleadon, all in the said County and Diocese.

"The Second Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of All Saints, Cleadon, being:—

"All that other isolated portion of the said Parish of Boldon which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north, upon the north east, and upon the south east by the said New Parish of All Saints, Cleadon, upon the south west and upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint George, East Boldon."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 6th day of November, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Egham, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Egham is a Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of

Egham which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £125 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas by Instruments published in the London Gazette on the 29th day of October, 1920, and the 29th day of October, 1929, respectively, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in consideration of the benefactions now represented by £560 London Midland and Scottish Railway £5 per centum Preference Stock, £500 £5 per centum War Stock and a capital sum of £1,400, did, in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111, grant to the Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Egham, yearly sums or stipends amounting to £110 10s. 0d., such yearly sums or stipends to be paid only upon the production of a certificate that an Assistant Curate has been employed within the said Parish of Egham, and to continue payable so long only as may appear to us to be expedient:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us to be expedient that such yearly sums or stipends amounting to £110 10s. 0d. payable

by us as aforesaid should cease to be so payable and that in lieu thereof we should grant a yearly sum of £110 10s. 0d. to the Minister of the said proposed District when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors, Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District or New Parish:

"And whereas the said benefactions represented by £560 London Midland and Scottish Railway £5 per centum Preference Stock, £500 £5 per centum War Stock and the capital sum of £1,400, now held by us are available for the further endowment of the said proposed separate District and we have agreed to pay to the Minister of the said proposed District, when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors, Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District or New Parish, the dividends to accrue due in respect of the said sums of stock and also a yearly sum of £63 by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year, so long as the said sums of stock and the said capital sum of £1,400 shall remain in our hands:

"And whereas the said grants of the said yearly sums of £125 and £110 10s. 0d. respectively will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the last mentioned Act:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Guildford as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of Guildford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Egham, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and

that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Paul, Egham Hythe'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said John, Bishop of Guildford, and his successors, Bishops of Guildford, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Paul, Egham Hythe, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Egham, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford, which is bounded upon the north by the Parish of Wyrardisbury, in the County of Buckingham and in the Diocese of Oxford, upon the north east by the Parish of Staines, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Staines, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London, upon the south by the Parish of Thorpe, in the said County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Guildford, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Thorpe from the said Parish of Egham diverges westward from following the middle of the stream known as Mead Lake Ditch, and extending thence first northward and then north eastward along the middle of Mead Lake Ditch for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 10 Century Road, and extending thence north eastward to and along such fence, for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of Century Road, and extending thence north-eastward across Century Road to and along the fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 11 Century Road for a distance in all of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence reaches the fence on the southern side of the Staines and Wokingham Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence first northward to and then westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance in all of 10 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 1038 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Egham published in the year 1914 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or

plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence first northward to and then north eastward along the said fence for a distance in all of 13 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the southern side of The Causeway, and extending thence first northward to and then westward along the middle of The Causeway for a distance in all of 5 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 1042 upon the said maps, and extending thence northward to and along such fence for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the north western corner of the last mentioned close, and extending thence in a straight line due north for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Egham from the said Parish of Wyardisbury."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Guildford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of January, 1930, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stillington and the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Marton with Moxby and Farlington, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most

Reverend William, Archbishop of York, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Stillington and Marton with Moxby and Farlington duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of York and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union including an alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of Marton with Moxby (being one of the Parishes of the said United Benefice of Marton with Moxby and Farlington) and the Parish of the Benefice of Sutton on the Forest, situate in the said County and Diocese, and the said Archbishop of York signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Stillington is now full, the Reverend Herbert William Smith being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Marton with Moxby and Farlington is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Herbert William Smith has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of Stillington and Marton with Moxby and Farlington now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Archbishop of York (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Stillington and the said Benefice of Marton with Moxby and Farlington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stillington and Marton with Moxby and Farlington' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Herbert William Smith if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stillington shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a lay reader or occasional clerical assistance and a portion of the income of the United Benefice that is to say a sum of £100 per annum shall be set aside as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a lay reader or for occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid which said fund of £100 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stillington shall become

and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Marton with Moxby and Farlington and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"5. That with the consent of the Right Honourable John, Baron Sankey of Moreton, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and as such, Patron on behalf of Your Majesty Your Heirs and Successors of the said Benefice of Sutton on the Forest (which consent is testified by his signing this Scheme), and with the consent of the Reverend John Llewellyn Davies, now Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sutton on the Forest (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect all that detached part of the said Parish of Marton with Moxby which is situate within the area of the Civil Parish of Sutton on the Forest shall be transferred for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Sutton on the Forest.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of York has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased

hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Vyvyan George Hooper Hicks and Henry George Francis Hicks (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and by way of confirmation of the hereinbefore recited devise by the Will of the said George Deans Dundas Watt, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Shipdham shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever."

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, late Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Otterden and Stalisfield duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of Canterbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of Canterbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Otterden and Stalisfield are now full, the Reverend Francis William May being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Otterden, and the Reverend Charles Preedy being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stalisfield:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Otterden and the said Benefice of Stalisfield shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stalisfield with Otterden,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect

upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stalisfield shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Otterden having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Stalisfield having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to alter such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of Canterbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be

united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Knighton, situate within the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John the Baptist, Knighton, in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Knighton, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of All Souls, Leicester, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint John the Baptist, Knighton, and of the said New Parish of All Souls, Leicester, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Knighton, situate as aforesaid:

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

(iv) All employment in excess of 50 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in winter.

Providing that Clause (a) (i) above shall not apply in the case of any workman who, under an agreement with his employer is entitled to two weeks' holiday in each year or to one week's holiday in each half year on full pay, or to payment of double pay for one week's work in each half year.

(b) *Female Workers.*

(i) All employment on a Sunday and on Christmas Day.

(ii) All employment in excess of 8 hours on any other day.

(iii) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment).

For the purpose of this Order, employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on 15th October and terminating on 14th February and em-

ployment in summer shall be deemed to be employment from 15th February until 14th October.
