

west and upon the north east by the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, at the junction of Ellison Road and Kempshott Road, and extending thence south westward to and along the wall or fence forming the boundary between the houses and premises known as Numbers 52 and 54 Ellison Road, for a distance of $3\frac{3}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence reaches the fence forming the north eastern boundary of the Croydon and Balham Line of the Southern Railway, and continuing thence south westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 10 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said line of railway upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, from the said District of the Holy Redeemer, Streatham Vale.

"The Second Schedule.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint James, West Streatham, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, which is bounded upon the north west partly by the New Parish of Saint Alban, Streatham Park, in the said County and Diocese, and partly by the said New Parish of Saint James, West Streatham, upon the south west by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Mitcham, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south east by the said District of the Holy Redeemer, Streatham Vale, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said District of the Holy Redeemer, Streatham Vale, from the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, at the centre of the bridge which carries the South London, Peckham and Sutton Line of the Southern Railway across the Croydon and Balham Line of the same Railway, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the said Croydon and Balham Line of railway for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said new Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, of the Parish of Streatham, in the said County and Diocese, and of the said New Parish of Saint Alban, Streatham Park, all meet.

"The Third Schedule.

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, which is bounded upon the south east by the New Parish of All Saints, Norwood, in the said County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury, upon the south west by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the

north west and upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Lower Streatham, from the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, at the junction of the road called Braxted Park, with the road called Baldry Gardens, and extending thence along the middle of Baldry Gardens for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Copley Park opposite to the middle of a proposed new road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of such proposed new road and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 13 chains or thereabouts to the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the public path known as The Rookery, and extending thence north westward along such wall or fence for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of Streatham Common, and extending thence first north eastward and then south eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of $17\frac{1}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Emmanuel, Streatham, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Norwood."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have with the exception hereinafter mentioned respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas one of the Patrons of the Vicarage of the New Parish of Saint Peter, Streatham, has not signified his assent to the said Scheme or Representation:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since drafts of the said Scheme or Representation were transmitted to the said Patrons and Incumbents:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.
