- (a) in pursuance of an agreement for arbitration to which the protocol set out in the Schedule to the Arbitration Clauses (Protocol) Act, 1924, applies; and
- (b) between persons of whom one is subject to the jurisdiction of some one of such Powers as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be parties to the said Convention, and of whom the other is subject to the jurisdiction of some other of the Powers aforesaid; and

(c) in one of such territories as His Majesty, being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made, may by Order in Council declare to be territories to which the said Convention applies:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made as aforesaid by the Powers set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order and as respects the territories set out in the second column of that Schedule:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared as follows:—

- 1. The Powers set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order are parties to the said Convention.
- 2. The territories set out in the second column of the said Schedule are territories to which the said Convention applies.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Arbitration (Foreign Awards) No. 2 Order, 1930, and shall come into force on the 27th day of December, 1930.

HEREAS the Right Reverend James, Lord Bishop of Wakefield, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, in the following terms:

"I, The Right Reverend James, Lord Bishop of Wakefield, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd Victoria Chapter 106 hereby represent to your Grace that there are in the County of York and my Diocese of Wakefield certain isolated portions of the Parish of Sandal which have become entirely separated therefrom by other parishes which have from time to time been formed between them and such portions are coloured pink on the plan attached hereto.

"That there are also in the County of York and my Diocese of Wakefield certain isolated portions of the Parish of Silkstone which have also become entirely separated from the ancient parish of Silkstone by other parishes which have from time to time been formed between them and such portions are coloured blue on the plan attached hereto.

"That the said portions of Sandal and Silkstone form together one Township known as the

Township of West Bretton.
"That the said portions of the said parish of Sandal coloured pink as aforesaid are five miles distant from the Parish Church of Sandal and have a population of one hundred and twenty people. There is a Private Chapel within the said township of West Bretton which the public are allowed to attend.

"That the said portions of the parish of Silkstone coloured blue on the said plan are six miles distant from the Parish Church of Silkstone and have a population of eighty people. There is a Private Chapel within the said township which the public are allowed to

"That adjoining the said Township of West Bretton is the Parish and Vicarage of Darton in the County of York and my Diocese of Wakefield.

." That the population of the said Vicarage and Parish of Darton is five thousand five hundred people or thereabouts for whom there is a Church affording accommodation for five hundred people and which is situated within two miles of the said Township of West Bretton and Baptisms Churchings Marriages and

Burials are performed therein.
"That the gross annual value of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Darton is Four

Hundred Pounds per annum.

"That the inhabitants of those portions of the Parish of Sandal which are coloured pink on the said plan are liable (subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act 1868) for the repair and maintenance of the Parish Church of Sandal and have a right to accommodation therein but they do not customarily resort thereto.

"That the inhabitants of those portions of the parish of Silkstone which are coloured blue on the said plan are (subject to the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act 1868) liable for the repair and maintenance of the Parish Church of Silkstone and have a right to accommodation therein but they do not custo-

marily resort thereto.

"That the Reverend Arthur Audley Parry Clerk, the Vicar and The Right Reverend Bishop John Taylor Smith K.C.B., C.V.O., D.D., formerly Chaplain General to the Forces The Reverend Herbert Dudley Lampen, Clerk, Master of Arts and Honorary Canon of Chelmsford Cathedral Henry Alexander Dashwood Esquire the Reverend Vernon Faithfull Storr, Clerk, Master of Arts and Canon of Westminster and John Henry Buxton Esquire the Patrons of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Sandal and the Reverend Walter Burns Graham, Clerk, the Vicar of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Silkstone, I, the Bishop of Wakefield being the Patron thereof and the Reverend Charles Randolph Purser, Clerk, the Vicar and The Right Honourable Wentworth Henry Canning Viscount Allendale the Patron of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Darton are respectively consenting parties to the foregoing Representation and to the Scheme hereinafter set forth.

"That it appears to me that the said portions of the Parishes of Sandal and Silkstone may under the provisions of the before mentioned Act be advantageously separated from the parishes to which they belong and be annexed to the said Parish and Vicarage of

Darton.

"That pursuant to the direction of the before mentioned Act of Parliament I have drawn out a scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations before proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, glebe lands, Tithes rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and right to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

"That those portions of the Parish of Sandal marked pink on the plan attached hereto shall be separated from the said Parish and Vicarage of Sandal and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Vicarage and Parish Church of Darton.

"That those portions of the Parish of Silkstone coloured blue on the said plan shall be separated from the Vicarage and Parish Church of Silkstone and be annexed for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Vicarage and Parish

Church of Darton.

"That the Cure of Souls and other Clerical duties within the said portions of the Parishes of Sandal and Silkstone coloured pink and blue on the said plan shall be transferred from the Vicars of Sandal and Silkstone respectively to the Vicar of the Parish of Darton.

"That all Ecclesiastical dues now receivable and rates and payments now payable by the Incumbents of Sandal and Silkstone respectively within the portions of the said Parishes proposed to be transferred respectively shall henceforth be respectively receivable and payable by the Vicar of the Parish of Darton.

"That the Patronage of the said Benefices and Parish Churches of Sandal Silkstone and

Darton shall not be altered.

"That the inhabitants of the said Parishes so proposed to be transferred as aforesaid shall be exempted from contribution to the repairs of the churches of Sandal and Silkstone to which they now belong and shall subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rate Abolition Act 1868 be liable for the repair and maintenance of the Parish Church of Darton and shall have the same right to accommodation in the Parish Church and Churchyard at Darton as the rest of the inhabitants of the said Parish of Darton.

"That there shall be no alteration in respect to endowments in respect of any of the said

Benefices concerned.

"That I do hereby submit the foregoing Representation and Scheme to your Grace and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with the same I request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents of the Patrons and Incumbents of the Parishes concerned to His Majesty in Council pursuant to the Act of Parliament before referred to.
