

aforesaid and contains according to the last census a population of 1,004 people. The nett annual value of the Benefice of Wickersley is £420. The Patronage of the said Rectory is vested in the Reverend Percy Ewart Warrington and the Reverend Henry Clark May is the present Vicar thereof.

"3. It appears to us that under the provisions of the Act 1 and 2 Vict. Cap. 106 and of the Act of the second and third years of the same reign Cap. 49 the following alterations in the boundaries of the above Parishes may advantageously be made (such alterations being in our opinion desirable owing to the fact that part of the Parish of Dalton hereinafter more particularly referred to is nearer to the Parish Church of the Parish of Wickersley to which it is proposed to annex the same than to the Parish Church of the Parish to which it now belongs and that such alterations will be for the convenience of the inhabitants of the said Parishes).

"4. The separation of a part of the Parish of Dalton which is edged round with green on the plan attached hereto from that Parish and the annexation of the same to the Parish of Wickersley aforesaid to which it adjoins.

"5. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the first mentioned Act of Parliament, we, the said Lord Bishop of Sheffield, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe lands, Tithes, Tithe rent charges and other Ecclesiastical dues and payments and in respect of Patronage and the right to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry feel satisfied therewith we request that Your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents aforesaid by your Report to His Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME ABOVE REFERRED TO.

"1. It is proposed to separate that part of the Parish of Dalton edged round with green on the plan attached hereto from the Parish of Dalton in the County of York and Diocese of Sheffield of which it now forms part, and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of Wickersley in the same County and Diocese.

"2. That the Incumbent of the Parish of Wickersley shall have the exclusive Cure of Souls within the said part of the Parish of Dalton proposed to be transferred as aforesaid.

"3. That the fees, for Marriages, Churchings and Burials and other Ecclesiastical dues, offerings and emoluments, received from the said part of the Parish of Dalton so transferred as aforesaid, shall henceforth belong to

the Incumbent of the Benefice of Wickersley to which it is proposed it shall be annexed.

"4. That no alteration shall be made as to the Patronage or the endowment of either of the Benefices affected by this Scheme.

"CONSENTS.

"I, the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley Lord Bishop of Sheffield, the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Dalton were the same now vacant and I, the Reverend Percy Ewart Warrington, the person or Patron entitled to present to the Benefice of Wickersley were the same now vacant, and I, the Reverend William Allanson Hick, Vicar of the Vicarage of Dalton aforesaid, and I, the Reverend Henry Clark May, Rector of the Rectory of Wickersley aforesaid, do hereby give our consents to the foregoing Representation and Scheme and the several matters and things therein stated and proposed.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh Lord Bishop of Lincoln, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"I, The Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act 1838 do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County and Diocese of Lincoln the Rectory or Benefice of Stamford Saint Peter with the Vicarage and Parish Church of All Saints, the Parish whereof contains a population (according to the census of 1921) of 3,729 or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 350 persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Stamford Saint Peter with the Vicarage of All Saints is £678 or thereabouts.
