"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Orders in Council bearing dates the 13th August, 1920, the 26th May, 1925, the 1st February, 1926, and the 5th November, 1929, sanction was given to the payment of Marriage Allowance for the legal wives and legitimate children, stepchildren or children adopted under the provisions of the Adoption of Children Act, 1926, of married Seamen, Marines and Reservists borne on the books of Your Majesty's Ships, and of Marines on shore strength, and of

ratings of the Shore Signal Service and Shore Wireless Service:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that Marriage Allowance should be paid for all statutorily adopted children, to or in respect of adoptors who are otherwise eligible for the Allowance."

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the issue of Marriage Allowance in respect of all children who may be statutorily adopted under the Adoption of Children (Scotland) Act, 1930, on or after 1st October, 1930, i.e. the date on which that Act became operative, or under any like Act which may thereafter be passed in and be applicable to any other part of the British Empire, such Allowance to be paid at the rates and under the conditions applicable to the children of men of Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WY HEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1927, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1930, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1930, amending the first-mentioned Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the firstmentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this Order that this Order should come into opera-

tion forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

- 1. Schedule VIII to the principal Order shall be amended by omitting paragraph 4 thereof and by substituting for paragraph 11 thereof the following paragraph—
- "11.—(1) An aircraft shall not start on a voyage to a place outside Great Britain and Northern Ireland from any place therein other than a Customs aerodrome.
- (2) An aircraft shall not, in the course of such a voyage as aforesaid, land at any place in Great Britain and Northern Ireland other than a Customs aerodrome specified in the application for clearance as hereinafter provided, unless compelled so to do owing to accident, stress of weather or unavoidable cause.
- (3) An aircraft shall not leave any Customs aerodrome from which it is about to start on such a voyage or at which it has landed in the course of such a voyage, unless the pilot of the aircraft has obtained clearance and authority for the aircraft to proceed from that aerodrome.
- (4) The pilot of every aircraft starting on such a voyage shall deliver to the proper officer of Customs and Excise at the Customs aerodrome from which the aircraft is about to start the journey log-book belonging to the aircraft and also the following documents in duplicate, namely—
 - (a) an application for clearance in the form prescribed by the Commissioners, specifying the Customs aerodromes (if any) at which it is intended that the aircraft shall land in the course of the voyage; and

(b) a manifest and declaration in the form prescribed by the Commissioners declaring what goods and stores (if any) are on board the aircraft; and the said documents, when signed by the said officer, shall be the clearance and authority for the aircraft to proceed from that aerodrome.

- (5) If an aircraft in the course of such a voyage lands at a Customs aerodrome, the pilot of the aircraft shall, before the aircraft leaves that aerodrome, deliver to the proper officer of Customs and Excise at that aerodrome—
 - (a) the journey log-book belonging to the aircraft;
 - (b) the clearance and authority for the aircraft to proceed from the Customs aerodrome which the aircraft last left; and
 - (c) a manifest and declaration in duplicate in the form prescribed by the Commissioners declaring what goods and stores (if any) have been loaded on board the aircraft at the aerodrome at which it has so landed;

and the said manifest and declaration when signed by the said officer, together with the said clearance and authority when countersigned by the said officer, shall be the clearance and authority for the aircraft to proceed from the aerodrome at which it has so landed.

(6) A pilot shall truly state in every manifest, declaration and application for clearance, which is delivered by him in accordance with this paragraph to the proper officer of Customs and Excise, the particulars required by the forms respectively prescribed by the Commissioners."

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1930.

(2) This Order shall come into operation provisionally as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cures (hereinafter called 'the said Benefices') of Moretonhampstead and North Bovey, both in the County of Devon and the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Moretonhampstead and North Bovey is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in the Right Honourable William Henry, Viscount Hambleden:

"And whereas the said William Henry, Viscount Hambleden, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Moretonhampstead and North Bovey, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Exeter for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, now Bishop of Exeter, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefices of Moretonhampstead and North Bovey which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the rights of Patronage or Advowsons so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arise or exist, that is to say, in the Parishes of Moretonhampstead and North Bovey:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Henry, Viscount Hambleden (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Moretonhampstead and North Bovey now vested in him, the said William Henry, Viscount Hambleden, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of All Saints, Branksome Park, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, both in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of All Saints, Branksome Park, and the said New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of All Saints, Branksome Park, and of the said New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of £2,000 towards providing an endowment for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of our Common Fund a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as the Minister shall have been duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Salisbury as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of All Saints, Branksome Park, and of the said New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Aldhelm, Branksome.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Aldhelm, Branksome, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of All Saints, Branksome Park, in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury, which is bounded upon part of the south west partly by the New Parish of Saint Luke, Parkstone, and partly by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, upon the west partly by the last mentioned New Parish, and partly by the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Heatherlands, upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Mark, Talbot Village, all in the said County and Diocese, upon the east partly by the New Parish of Saint Luke, Bournemouth, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, partly by the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Bournemouth, situate partly in the said County of Dorset and partly in the said County of Southampton and wholly in the said Diocese of Winchester, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Ambrose, Bournemouth, in the said County of Southampton and in the said Diocese of Winchester, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the remaining part of the south west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Ambrose, Bournemouth, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Branksome Park, at the junction of Poole Road with the road called The Avenue, and extending thence south westward along the middle of The Avenue, for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lindsay Road, and extending thence first north westward and then south westward along the middle of Lindsay Road for a distance of 66 chains or thereabouts to its junction with North Lodge Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of North Lodge Road for a distance of 7½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Archway Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Branksome Park, from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Parkstone.

"II. And also all that continguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, which is bounded upon the east by the above described portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Branksome Park, upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Heatherlands, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Heather lands, from the said New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, at the junction of Ashley Road with Lake Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Lake Road for a distance of 61 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Alexandra Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Alexandra Road for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Branksome Park."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and the Patrons and the Incumbent of the said New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, have signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the Patrons and the Incumbent of the said New Parish of All Saints, Branksome Park, have offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas notwithstanding such objections the said Scheme has been approved by His

Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have pre-pared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Paul, Gloucester, partly out of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint James, Gloucester, partly out of the Parish of Matson, partly out of the Parish of Barnwood, partly out of the Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester, and partly out of the Parish of Hempsted, all in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, the said New Parish of Saint James, Gloucester,

the said Parish of Matson, the said Parish of Barnwood, the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester, and the said Parish of Hempsted are Cures wherein or in parts thereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, of the said New Parish of Saint James, Gloucester, of the said Parish of Matson, of the said Parish of Barnwood, of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester and of the said Parish of Hempsted which are mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and are delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of June, 1927, and published in the London Gazette on the 5th day of the following month provision has been made for the union into one Benefice of the Benefice of Saint Aldate, Gloucester, the Benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Gloucester, the Benefice of Saint Mary de Crypt with All Saints, and Saint Owen, Gloucester, and the Benefice of Saint Michael with Saint Mary de Grace, Gloucester, all in the said County and Diocese, and it was by the same Order provided, amongst other things, that out of the annual stipend payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint John the Baptist, Gloucester, a sum of £100 per annum shall upon such union taking effect be applied to the endowment of a proposed ecclesiastical District to be constituted within or near the City of Gloucester:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted is the District for which such endowment will be applied as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas it is provided by the said Order in Council dated the 27th day of June, 1927, that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District shall be vested in the Bishop of Gloucester for the time being:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Gloucester, of the said New Parish of Saint James, Gloucester, of the said Parish of Matson, of the said Parish of Barnwood, of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester, and of the said Parish of Hempsted which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester,' and that the said District shall ultimately be endowed in the manner which is contemplated by the said Order in Council dated the 27th day of June, 1927.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said lastly mentioned Order in Council, be vested in and exercised by the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or to any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester, comprising:—

REGULATIONS AMENDING THE REGU-LATIONS MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER S.4 OF THE PENSIONS (IN-CREASE) ACT, 1920, ON THE 1ST OCTO-BER, 1924.

INCREASE OF PENSION.

1. The Regulations made by the Treasury on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-four, under section four of the Pensions (Increase) Act, 1920, shall, in relation to a pensioner who has been in receipt of an increase of pension for a period of three years or upwards and the cost of whose pension is defrayed wholly out of moneys provided by the Parliament of the United Kingdom

without reimbursement of any part thereof from any other fund, have effect subject to the following modifications:-

(a) the declaration which under Regulation 8 of the said Regulations is to accompany an application for the continuance and reassessment of the increase shall be in the form set out in the Schedule to these Regulations instead of in the form set out

in the said Regulations; and

(b) Regulations 7 and 8 of the said Regulations shall, in relation to an increase of pension granted in pursuance of an application made after the date on which these Regulations come into operation, have effect as if a period of twentyfour months were substituted therein for the period of twelve months therein mentioned.

2. References in the said Regulations to children or to a child shall be construed as including step-children or a step-child and adopted children or an adopted child within the meaning of the Adoption of Children Act, 1926, the Adoption of Children (Northern Ireland) Act, 1929, and the Adoption of Children (Scotland) Act, 1930, and accordingly in Regulation 2 of the said Regulations the words "or step-children" and in Regulation 9 of the said Regulations the words "or stepchild" shall be deleted and the following shall be substituted for the note to para. (1) of the Declaration set out in the Schedule to the said Regulations-

"'Child' includes a step-child and a child adopted under statute but not a grandchild."

3. The said Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as the Pensions (Increase) Regulations, 1924 to 1930.
