WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of December, 1930 (C.W. 6108/30), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of February, 1913, to provide, *inter alia*, for the grant of combatant commissions as Lieutenant, Royal Marines, at our discretion, to any Warrant Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer or man who may perform some specially meritorious service or distinguished War Service:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 28th day of March, 1930, to provide for a reduction in the age of retirement from 55 to 50 for Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank and Warrant Officers of Your Majesty's Navy who were especially promoted to the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant on account of acts of gallantry or daring in the Service, and also for their exemption from passing any qualifying examination for promotion to the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant-Commander:

"And whereas we are of opinion that similar conditions should be attached to the grant of commissions in future as Lieutenant, Royal Marines, under clause 7 of Your Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of February, 1913:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following regulations:—

(i) The age for compulsory retirement of Officers specially promoted who in future obtain commissions in the Royal Marines under the provisions of clause 7 of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 11th day of February, 1913, to be 50 years, unless then holding a rank or appointment

in respect of which the age for compulsory retirement in the case of direct entry Officers exceeds 50 years, when such higher age limit shall be applicable to them.

(ii) These Officers to be exempted from passing such examinations as may be required to qualify direct entry Officers for promotion to higher rank."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The Patronage of the said Rectory is vested in the Trustee of the Will of the 10th Duke of Leeds deceased and the Reverend Philip Egerton Boswell is the present vicar thereof.

"2. There is also in the said County and Diocese the Vicarage of Wales the Parish whereof lies adjoining the said Parish of Harthill and contains according to the last census a population of 2,785 people. The nett annual value of the Benefice of Wales is £350. "4. There is also in the said County and Diocese the Vicarage of Anston with Woodsetts the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 2,611 people. The nett annual value of the Benefice of Anston with Woodsetts is £470. The Patronage of the said Vicarage is vested in the Lord Bishop of Sheffield and the Reverend Robert Hodgson is the present Vicar thereof.

"5. There is also in the said County and Diocese the Rectory of Treeton the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 2,318 people. "6. There is also in the said County and Diocese the Vicarage of Thorpe Salvin the Parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 377 people. The nett annual value of the Benefice of Thorpe Salvin is £350. The Patronage of the said Vicarage is vested in the Lord Bishop of Sheffield and the Reverend Arthur Easter Lewis is the present Vicar thereof.

"7. It appears to us under the provisions of the said Act of the 1st and 2nd Vict. Cap. 106 and the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign Cap. 49 the following alterations of the contents and boundaries of the above mentioned Parishes may advantageously be made (such alterations being in our opinion desirable owing to the fact that portions of the Parishes hereinafter more particularly referred to are in each case nearer to the Parish Church to which it is proposed to annex the same than to the Parish Church of the Parish to which they now belong and that such alterations will be for the convenience of the Inhabitants).

"8. The separation of those parts of the Parish of Harthill which are coloured red and edged round with purple on the plan attached hereto to which they now belong from that Parish and the annexation of the same to the adjoining Parish of Wales.

"9. The separation of that part of the said Parish of Harthill which is coloured red and edged round with blue on the said plan to be transferred from Harthill to which it now belongs and the annexation of the same to the said adjoining Parish of Todwick.

"10. The separation of that part of the Parish of Harthill which is coloured red and edged round with brown on the plan hereto attached, from that Parish and the annexation of the same to the said Parish of Anston with Woodsetts.

"11. The separation of those parts of the Parish of Treeton which are coloured yellow on the said plan from that Parish and the annexation of the same to the said Parish of Wales.

"12. The separation of that part of the Parish of Treeton which is coloured yellow and edged round with purple on the said plan from that Parish and the annexation of the same to the Parish of Thorpe Salvin.

"13. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said 1st mentioned Act of Parliament we the said Lord Bishop of Sheffield have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the portions of the Parishes above referred to and the mode in which it appears to us the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereto in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, Glebe dues and payments and in respect of the Patronage and the rights to pews

may be made with justice to all parties concerned and we do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents and in case you shall, on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith we request that Your Grace will be pleased to certify the same with the consents aforesaid by your report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

" SCHEME.

" 1. It is proposed to separate those parts of the Parish of Harthill which are coloured red and edged round with purple on the plan attached hereto from that Parish and annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Wales.

" 2. It is also proposed to separate that part of the Parish of Harthill which is coloured red and edged round with blue on the said plan from that Parish and annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Todwick.

" 3. It is also proposed to separate that part of the Parish of Harthill which is coloured red and edged round with brown on the plan attached hereto from that Parish and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Anston with Woodsetts.

" 4. It is also proposed to separate those parts of the Parish of Treeton aforesaid which are coloured yellow on the said plan from that Parish and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Wales.

" 5. It is also proposed to separate that part of the Parish of Treeton which is coloured yellow and edged round with purple on the said plan from that Parish and annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Thorpe Salvin.

" 6. That the Incumbent of a Parish to which any portion of a Parish shall be respectively annexed under the provisions of this Scheme shall have the exclusive charge of Souls within the limits of such portions.

" 7. That the fees for Marriages, Churchings, and Burials and other Ecclesiastical dues, offerings and emoluments received from the said portions so transferred shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice to which such portions shall be respectively annexed.

" 8. That no alterations shall be made as to the Patronage or the endowment of any of the Benefices affected by this Scheme.

The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge, on the 20th day of December, 1930, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTES TO ALTER AND AMEND THE STATUTES IN RELATION TO THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE MADE UNDER "THE UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT, 1923" (13 & 14 GEORGE V., CHAPTER 33).

We, the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

STATUTE A.

THE CHANCELLOR AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY.

CHAPTER III.

THE REGENT HOUSE.

By inserting in Section 3 the following additional paragraph:—

"(f) Holders of posts recognized by Ordinance for this purpose in institutions forming part of or connected with the University."

CHAPTER IV.

THE COUNCIL OF THE SENATE.

By repealing Section 4 of Chapter IV and substituting therefor the following amended Section:—

" 4. If any member of the Council, other than the Chancellor or the Vice-Chancellor, is absent from all the meetings of the Council in any term, the Council may by a resolution carried not later than the last meeting of that term by a majority of the whole Council approve the cause of his absence. If no such resolution has been carried, his

seat shall at the close of that term become and shall be declared by the Vice-Chancellor to be vacant."

STATUTE B.

MATRICULATION, RESIDENCE, DEGREES, DISCIPLINE.

CHAPTER III.

DEGREES.

By repealing Section 6 of Chapter III and substituting therefor the following amended Section:—

"6. The University may grant admission to the complete degree of Master of Arts without fulfilment of the usual conditions to a man who has been admitted to some office in the University or a College, or who holds a post recognized by Ordinance for the purpose in an institution forming part of or connected with the University, if he has already been admitted to a degree in some other University or has such other qualification as may be approved by the Council."

CHAPTER IV.

TITLES OF DEGREES.

By repealing Section 3 of Chapter IV and substituting therefor the following amended Section:—

"3. The University may grant admission to the title of the degree of Master of Arts without fulfilment of the usual conditions to a woman who has been admitted to some office in the University or in Girton College or in Newnham College, or who holds a post recognized by Ordinance for the purpose in an institution forming part of or connected with the University, if she has already been admitted to a degree in some other University or has such other qualification as may be approved by the Council."

BYELAWS AS TO TRADING IN STREETS BY LICENSED STREET TRADERS.

MIDDLESEX COUNTY COUNCIL ACT, 1930.

DRAFT BYELAWS.

Byelaws made by the Council of
in pursuance of the powers contained in section 17 of the Middlesex County Council Act, 1930, with respect to trading in streets within the
by licensed street traders.

No. 1.—For the purpose of the byelaws the following definitions shall have effect (1) "the Act" means the Middlesex County Council Act, 1930, (2) "the Council" means the Council of the
(3) "licensed street trader" means any person who is licensed by the Council as a street trader under the Act, and (4) "stall" means a barrow, cart, stall or other receptacle occupying a stationary position at a place in the carriageway or footway of a street and from or upon which any article or thing is sold or exposed or offered for sale.

No. 2.—Every licensed street trader shall have legibly and prominently displayed on his stall his name and address and the registered number of the stall or such other means of identification as may be prescribed by the Council.

No. 3.—All stalls shall be constructed so as to be easily and immediately removable without the necessity of undressing the stall, and shall not have attached thereto any accessories likely to cause damage to the street.

No. 4.—No stall shall, except for the purpose of supplying artificial light to such stall, be connected physically in any manner with any other stall or premises, unless the Council otherwise permit in the case of a stall on the footway.

Provided that any connection for the purpose of supplying artificial light shall be readily detachable, and no such connection shall be less than eight feet clear above the carriageway or footway.

No. 5.—No stall in the carriageway, with the exception of a coffee stall, shall exceed 9 feet in length, 3 feet 6 inches in width, or 10 feet in height, measured from the ground level. No coffee stall in the carriageway shall exceed 12 feet in length, 7 feet in width, or 10 feet in height, measured from the ground level.

A stall on the footway including a coffee stall shall not exceed such dimensions as the Council may prescribe.

No. 6.—No part of any stall licensed to stand in the carriageway shall project over the footway.

No. 7.—Notwithstanding the provisions of byelaws 5 and 6, a stall may have an awning or roof projecting not more than 2 feet over the footway, but not over the carriageway except to such extent, not exceeding 2 feet, and in such streets as may be prescribed by the Council; such awning or roof including its supports, if any, shall be in every part not less than 8 feet above the footway, and no goods or articles shall be suspended from such awning or roof so as to reduce the headroom to less than 8 feet.

No. 8.—No goods or other articles whatsoever shall project beyond or be placed alongside or around any stall, or above the height of 10 feet measured from the ground level, but the space immediately beneath the stall may be used for the deposit of goods and other articles.

No. 9.—No stall shall be placed or stand in the carriageway of any street within 3 feet (measured along the length of any such street) of another stall, which space of 3 feet shall be kept at all times clear so as to enable persons to pass and repass without obstruction between the carriageway and the footway.

No. 10.—No stall shall be placed or stand wholly or in part or any street crossing or so near to any junction of two intersecting streets as to obscure the view of traffic turning into or out of such streets.

No. 11.—A licensed street trader or his assistant, if required by any person having reasonable cause to make the request, shall immediately remove his stall and goods temporarily, for so long a period as may be necessary from the space in front of any premises where its presence unduly obstructs or hinders the approach to or departure from such premises of persons or vehicles or the use of such space by any vehicle waiting for a reasonable period for the convenience of persons inhabiting or calling at the premises.

No. 12.—A licensed street trader or his assistant shall immediately remove his stall and goods temporarily for so long a period as may

be necessary if required to do so by an officer of the Metropolitan Police, or a duly authorised officer of the Council, in the event of an emergency, or in the exercise by the Council of any of its powers and duties.

No. 13.—A licensed street trader or his assistant shall remove the stall and goods with all reasonable despatch after the expiry of the time for trading specified in the licence.

No. 14.—Every licensed street trader shall produce his licence for inspection when requested to do so by an officer of the Metropolitan Police or a duly authorised officer of the Council.

No. 15.—A licensed street trader or his assistant, selling or exposing or offering for sale from any stall, articles of food for human consumption shall take all such steps as may be reasonably necessary to guard against the contamination of the food and shall not sell or expose or offer for sale for human consumption any article of food which is contaminated.

No. 16.—A licensed street trader or his assistant shall cause all refuse, scraps, waste material, litter or rubbish arising from the business carried on to be placed in suitable covered receptacles kept exclusively for that purpose and shall cause all such receptacles to be kept in a reasonably clean state, regard being had to the purpose for which they are provided.

No. 17.—Any stall not constructed in accordance with these byelaws but now being used in the Borough/Urban District for street trading shall be deemed for a period of one year from the date of confirmation of these byelaws, to be constructed in accordance with the byelaws.

No. 18.—During the period between half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise a coffee stall standing in or projecting into the carriageway shall be kept lighted with a lamp or lamps showing a red light so as to indicate sufficiently its position to any traffic which may be in the carriageway.

No. 19.—The days on which and times during which articles or things may be sold or exposed or offered for sale shall be such as may be prescribed by the Council in the licence.

No. 20.—Any person who shall offend against any of the foregoing byelaws shall be liable for every offence to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each day after written notice of the offence from the Council.

No. 21.—The amount of the charges which the Council are authorised to make under section 18 of the Act shall not exceed the following weekly rates:—

1s. in respect of each stall for which a licence is held for one day only in each week;

2s. in respect of each stall for which a licence is held for two days only in each week;

3s. in respect of each stall for which a licence is held for three or more days in each week;

This byelaw shall cease to be in force after the expiration of a period of two years from the date of confirmation of these byelaws.

(2) One month at least before applying for confirmation of any such byelaws a Council shall serve a notice in writing of their intention to apply for confirmation thereof on every recognised organisation representative of street traders in the { Borough
Urban District } and shall take all reasonable steps either by the distribution or the posting of notices in streets in which street trading is carried on to make their intention known to street traders who may be affected by the operation of such byelaws. Every such notice shall state that any objections or representations which any person desires to make in relation to such byelaws should be addressed to the Under Secretary of State, Home Office, Whitehall, S.W.1.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 1ST JANUARY, 1931.)

Authorisation of Landing of an Animal for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto, which is intended for exceptional purposes, is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II (Quarantine) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of Part VI of the Animals (Importation) Order of 1930, and of this Order.

Definition of Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, are hereby defined as an Imported Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the detention of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto.

Examination before Landing.

3. No such animal as aforesaid shall be landed except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry, which licence shall not be granted unless and until the animal has been examined by a Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry and certified by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease.

Regulations applicable to the Animal on Landing.

4.—(1) The animal on being landed, shall forthwith be moved direct and without avoidable delay from the quay to the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto, and shall be there detained for a period of twenty-eight days. During the said period the animal shall be kept separate from all other animals and no other animals shall be moved into such premises.

(2) The animal shall not be removed from the premises described in the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than under the authority of the licence from an Inspector of the Ministry required under Article 40 (8) of the Animals (Importation) Order of 1930.

(3) A copy of every licence authorising the movement of the animal described in the First Schedule hereto shall be forwarded to the

Ministry by the Inspector who grants the licence.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF WOLVERHAMPTON.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following byelaws and regulations were made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wolverhampton as the Local

Authority, under Section 46 of the Tramways Act, and in pursuance of all other powers and authorities vested in them in that behalf, on the 24th day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF WOLVERHAMPTON.

Interpretation.

(1) Throughout these Bye-laws and Regulations the expression "Corporation" means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wolverhampton; the expression "Transport System" means the Trolley Vehicle and Motor Omnibus System worked by the Corporation, whether situate within the Borough of Wolverhampton or in any other District where the Corporation have running powers; the expression "Carriage" means any Trolley Vehicle or Motor Omnibus owned and used by the Corporation for the purpose of the conveyance of passengers; the expression "Passenger" means every person being conveyed or attempting to be conveyed by a carriage; the expression "Conductor" means any Officer or Servant of the Corporation having charge of a carriage; and the expression "Driver" means any Officer or Servant of the Corporation driving or helping to drive a carriage. The expression "interior of a carriage" shall not include the upper deck of covered carriages.

Extent.

(2) The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Corporation and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

Entering and leaving Carriages.

(3) Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the platform or other place of entrance or exit provided for that purpose, and not otherwise. When a carriage stops, no person shall board the carriage until all passengers desiring to alight therefrom shall have done so.

(4) No person shall enter, or mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave, any carriage which is in motion.

Conduct.

(5) No person shall smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in the interior of any carriage, except in a compartment or on seats specially set apart for the purpose.

(6) No passenger or any other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage or while upon any station, waiting room or premises used in connection with the Transport System, play or perform upon any musical instrument or distribute advertisements, pamphlets, notices, handbills, or tracts of any kind, or beg or collect money, alms or subscriptions, or sell or attempt to sell any article or play any game, or gamble, or throw down and leave in or upon any carriage any waste paper or other refuse, or deposit remnants of food or fruit, or any other objectionable matter in or upon any carriage.

(7) No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself offensively whilst in or upon any carriage, station, waiting room, or premises used in connection

with the Transport System or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

(8) No person shall spit or commit any nuisance in, on, or against any carriage, station, waiting room, or premises used in connection with the Transport System.

(9) No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the seats, cushions, curtains, or linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on any carriage, or break or scratch any window of, or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this Bye-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these Bye-laws and Regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Objectional Persons.

(10) No person in a state of intoxication, or affected with any dangerous, contagious or infectious disorder, nor any person who from any other cause is in the opinion of the Conductor, unfit to be a passenger, shall enter or mount upon any carriage, and any such person found in or upon any carriage shall leave the carriage immediately on being requested to do so by the Conductor.

(11) A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the Conductor, soil or injure the seats, linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or who, in the opinion of the Conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to any passenger, shall not mount, enter, or remain on or in any carriage, and may be prevented from so doing, and any such person, if found on or in any carriage, shall, on request of the Conductor, leave the same upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned: Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers no person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a carriage under the provisions of this Bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

(12) Each passenger shall pay to the Conductor the fare legally demandable for the journey, whether the same shall or shall not be demanded, and shall accept a ticket therefor. Such ticket shall only be available on the vehicle on which it is issued (except in the case of return transfer or season tickets) and for the passenger to and for whom it is issued. Any person leaving a carriage shall be deemed to have completed his journey (except when transferring from one carriage to another as provided by Bye-law 22 hereof).

Return transfer or season tickets shall only be available if used in accordance with the conditions upon which the same are issued.

Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any), when required so to do, to the Conductor or any duly authorised servant of the Corporation, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

No person shall alter, cut, tear or deface his ticket so as to render the number or any material portion thereof illegible.

Luggage.

(13) Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the Conductor, be placed on the carriage in such a position as the Conductor directs. The Conductor may decline to take into or upon the carriage any luggage which from its size or otherwise is not suitable for conveyance in such carriage.

Mode of Travelling.

(14) No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Corporation shall travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand on the upper deck, and any person so travelling or standing shall cease to do so immediately on request by the Conductor.

(15) No person shall hold or hang on, by, or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein or thereon otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers, except in the interior of the carriage with the consent of the Conductor.

(16) No person, except a passenger, or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage.

Full Carriages.

(17) When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the Conductor not to do so.

Firearms.

(18) No person shall place upon or travel in or on any carriage with loaded firearms, or any article, instrument or implement or any material or substance which may be dangerous or offensive to the passengers, or likely to cause a nuisance or to soil or damage any carriage or the clothing of any passenger.

Dogs.

(19) No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the Conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the Conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this Regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the Conductor, and in default of compliance with such request, may be removed by or under the direction of the Conductor.

Interference with Driver or Conductor.

(20) No person other than the Conductor or Driver, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty, shall change or remove the route indicators or interfere with the controller, brakes, switches, gears, lights, trolley, cord, or any part of a carriage or its equipment, and, except in case of emergency or accident, no person other than the Conductor or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance of his duty shall signal a carriage to start or stop.

(21) No person shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Conductor, Driver, or other servant of the Corporation acting in the performance

of his duties, upon or in connection with any carriage. No person shall in any way wilfully obstruct or impede any carriage.

Disabled Carriages.

(22) If at any time a carriage becomes disabled, or in any way damaged, or from any cause unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon request of the Conductor leave the carriage, and if such passengers have paid their fares, they shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available carriage the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person shall, except with the leave of the Conductor, enter a disabled or damaged carriage.

Reserved Carriages

(23) Where a carriage has been reserved for any special purpose and a conspicuous notice to that effect has been placed upon the carriage, no person other than a person for whose conveyance the carriage is reserved shall enter or attempt to enter such carriage.

Breach of Bye-Laws.

(24) Any person who shall commit, whilst in or on any carriage, any breach of these Bye-laws and Regulations, shall if the offence is continued, be liable, in addition to incurring the penalty hereinafter provided, to be immediately removed from the carriage by or under the direction of the Conductor, and if such person shall have paid his fare, he shall not be entitled to claim its return.

Conductors and Drivers to enforce Bye-Laws.

(25) Every Inspector, Conductor and Driver of a carriage shall, to the best of his ability, enforce these Bye-laws and Regulations and prevent any breach thereof.

Penalty.

(26) Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these Bye-laws and Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty Shillings.

Copies of Bye-Laws.

(27) There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use, and in or about each station, waiting room or premises used in connection with the Transport System, a printed copy of these Bye-laws and Regulations.

Repeal of existing Bye-Laws.

(28) From and after the date of these Bye-laws and Regulations coming into force, the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Wolverhampton, on the 1st day of August, 1923, shall be repealed, but without prejudice to any proceedings in respect of any contravention thereof.

Date of operation of Bye-Laws.

(29) These Bye-laws and Regulations shall come into force on the first day of March, 1931.
