STATUTE B.

MATRICULATION, RESIDENCE, DEGREES,
DISCIPLINE.

CHAPTER III.

DEGREES.

By repealing Section 6 of Chapter III and substituting therefor the following amended Section:—

"6. The University may grant admission to the complete degree of Master of Arts without fulfilment of the usual conditions to a man who has been admitted to some office in the University or a College, or who holds a post recognized by Ordinance for the purpose in an institution forming part of or connected with the University, if he has already been admitted to a degree in some other University or has such other qualification as may be approved by the Council."

CHAPTER IV.

TITLES OF DEGREES.

By repealing Section 3 of Chapter IV and substituting therefor the following amended Section:—

"3. The University may grant admission to the title of the degree of Master of Arts without fulfilment of the usual conditions to a woman who has been admitted to some office in the University or in Girton College or in Newnham College, or who holds a post recognized by Ordinance for the purpose in an institution forming part of or connected with the University, if she has already been admitted to a degree in some other University or has such other qualification as may be approved by the Council."
